VOTING PROCESS

The votes will be held by secret ballot, which may be held electronically.

The names of the candidates (in alphabetical order), their letter of candidature and CVs are published on the Congress website and made available at the distribution desk. An alphabetical list of candidates is displayed in the voting area.

In case of a non-electronic secret ballot, two tellers per ballot box, chosen by lot immediately after the announcement of the election, are responsible for the counting of the ballot papers.

Electronic voting is carried out with a member's badge (Hemicycle) or with a voting device (Room 1).

For non-electronic voting, a vote is only considered valid and counted when:

- it is made on the official ballot prepared for the election
- there is only one ballot paper in the voting envelope
- there are no marks on the ballot other than those necessary to complete it
- the ballot paper is intact
