I refer to your correspondence dated 15 September 2022 transmitting the above entitled collective complaint and inviting the Government to submit written observations on admissibility.

I am obliged to the Committee for extending the time limit for the making of any such observations.

I confirm that the Government does not wish to submit any written observations as to the admissibility of this collective complaint.

To the extent that the complaint refers to Directive 2003/88/EC concerning certain aspects of the organisation of working time, we simply recall at this juncture that the Committee has made clear that "it is neither competent to assess the conformity of national situations with a directive of the European Union nor to assess compliance of a directive with the European Social Charter" (*Confédération générale du travail (CGT) v. France*, Complaint No. 55/2009, para. 33).
