The consultants reviewed the draft feasibility studies before being circulated to CDENF and CDCJ delegations for a last round of comments from 12 May until 4 June 2021.
- 6. In light of the comments received from CDCJ and CDENF delegations (document CJ/ENF-ISE(2021)7A and CJ/ENF-ISE(2021)7B), the draft studies have been further amended by the consultants in view of their consideration at the CDCJ and CDENF joint Bureau meeting.
- 7. CDCJ and CDENF Bureaus are invited to examine the revised draft studies (document CJ/ENF-ISE(2021)8B and CJ/ENF-ISE(2021)8B) and, subject to any further changes that may be required, approve them on behalf of the CDCJ and CDENF, and their publication.

8. Taking due note of the conclusions of the draft feasibility studies and recommendation provided by CJ/ENF-ISE (see item 5.2 and 6.2 of the 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting report), CDCJ and CDENF Bureaus are also invited to exchange views and provide guidance on the next steps to be undertaken by CJ/ENF-ISE.
