PART I

NATIONAL POLICIES AND INTERNATIONAL CO-OPERATION FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COUNCIL OF EUROPE LANDSCAPE CONVENTION

Council of Europe Landscape Convention / Official website (coe.int)

Introduction

Adopted in Strasbourg by the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe on 19 July 2000, the European Landscape Convention was opened for signature by the Organisation's Member States in Florence on 20 October of that year. A Protocol amending the Convention (CETS No.219) came into force on 1st July 2021. The aim of the Protocol is to promote European co-operation with non-European States who wish to implement the provisions of the Convention by opening the Convention to their accession.

As the first international treaty devoted exclusively to all aspects of landscape, the Council of Europe Landscape Convention of the Council of Europe (ETS No. 176) addresses the Organisation's key challenges in the areas of human rights, democracy and the rule of law. The Member States of the Organisation signatories to the Convention have declared themselves "concerned to achieve sustainable development based on a balanced and harmonious relationship between social needs, economic activity and the environment", including the cultural dimension. Although each citizen must, of course, contribute to preserving the quality of the landscape, it is the authorities that are responsible for establishing the general framework that enables that quality to be assured. The Convention accordingly lays down the general legal principles that must guide the adoption of national landscape policies and the establishment of international co-operation in this area.

The Convention provides that existing competent Committees of Experts of the Council of Europe, set up under its Statute, are designated by the Committee of Ministers to monitor its implementation. Its Article 10 "Monitoring of the implementation of the Convention" states:

"1. Existing competent Committees of Experts set up under Article 17 of the Statute of the Council of Europe shall be designated by the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe to be responsible for monitoring the implementation of the Convention.

2. Following each meeting of the Committees of Experts, the Secretary General of the Council of Europe shall transmit a report on the work carried out and on the operation of the Convention to the Committee of Ministers. ...".

The Work Programme of the Convention adopted by the Council of Europe conferences on the Council of Europe Landscape Convention and the Steering Committee for Culture, Heritage and Landscape (CDCPP) is implemented by the Secretariat General of the Council of Europe which transmits a report on the work carried out, and on the operation of the Convention, to the Committee of Ministers.

Reference texts for the implementation of the Council of Europe Landscape Convention

The <u>reference texts</u> adopted by the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe for its implementation contribute to promoting definition and legal recognition of the landscape; ensuring that the landscape dimension is taken into account in national and international policies; international co-operation.

State of signatures and ratifications of the Council of Europe Landscape Convention

To date, 40 States have <u>ratified</u> the Council of Europe Landscape Convention: Andorra, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Georgia, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Republic of Moldova, Montenegro, Netherlands, North Macedonia, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, San Marino, Serbia, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Ukraine and the United Kingdom. One further State has signed it: Malta.

Action required

The Committee may:

– invite States, which so wish, to consider the possibility to sign or ratify the Council of Europe Landscape Convention, having regard to the entry into force of the Protocol amending the Convention (CETS No.219).

Implementation of the Work Programme of the Council of Europe Landscape Convention

The Work Programme of the Convention promotes participatory democracy based on the commitment and responsibility of stakeholders in the territory.

This programme provides for:

- 1. The organisation of biennial Council of Europe Conferences on the Council of Europe Landscape Convention, according to the terms of reference of Committees of Experts set up under Article 17 of the Statute of the Council of Europe designated by the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe to be responsible for monitoring the implementation of the Convention (Article 10 of the Convention Monitoring of the implementation of the Convention);
- 2. The annual organisation of one or more Council of Europe Meetings of the Workshops for the implementation of the Council of Europe Landscape Convention;
- 3. The monitoring the Information System of the Council of Europe Landscape Convention with the preparation of national and regional reports and thematic reports on public policies of Parties to the Convention (according to Recommendation CM/Rec(2013)4 on the Council of Europe Landscape Convention Information System of the Council of Europe and its glossary, adopted by the Committee of Ministers on 11 December 2013);
- 4. The organisation of the Sessions of the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe in the framework of the Council of Europe Landscape Alliance Award and of the Forums on the national selections of the Landscape Award (according to the Resolution CM/Res(2008)3 on the rules governing the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe and to the Resolution CM/Res(2017)18 on the Landscape Award Alliance of the Council of Europe, adopted by the Committee of Ministers on 27 September 2017);
- 5. The preparation of thematic reports and draft recommendations of the Committee of Ministers on natural, rural, urban and peri-urban areas, considered as outstanding, of everyday life and degraded, inland and maritime waters being taken into consideration;
- 6. The establishment of Working Groups supported by expertise, in order to prepare draft recommendations for the attention of the Committee and Committee of Ministers;
- The promotion of synergies on the themes of sustainable development (environment, society, economy and culture), democracy, human rights and rule of law;
- 8. A contribution to the global debates on sustainable development (United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development) and habitat.

1. Council of Europe Conferences on the implementation of the Council of Europe Landscape Convention

3. International Landscape Observatory of the Council of Europe

3.1. Information System of the Council of Europe Landscape Convention: National (and Regional) Landscape Policies

Summary

Since the adoption of the Council of Europe Landscape Convention, major progress has been made towards the establishment of landscape policies at national, regional and local levels.

To ensure exchanges of information between the States Parties to the Council of Europe Landscape Convention and its follow-up, a document setting out the landscape policies pursued in the Member States was produced on a regular basis by the Secretariat and presented on the occasion of the Council of Europe Conferences on the Convention.¹

The use of the <u>Information System</u> of the Convention and its <u>Glossary</u> (set up pursuant to Recommendation <u>CM/Rec(2013)4</u> of the Committee of Ministers to Member States), provides online access to information concerning national and regional policies.² The Glossary of the Information System of the Council of Europe Landscape Convention has been published by the Council of Europe publishing (European Spatial Planning and

The National Representatives have the possibility to give passwords to regional representatives. National (and Regional) Reports are already available for several States.

4. The Landscape Award of the Council of Europe

The Council of Europe Landscape Convention provides for a "Landscape Award of the Council of Europe" which recognises policy or measures which local or regional authorities or non-governmental organisations have adopted: to protect, manage and plan their landscape; which have proved to be lastingly effective; and which can thus serve as an example to other territorial authorities in Europe. According to Resolution CM/Res(2008)3 of the Committee of Ministers on the rules governing the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe, the <u>Award</u> is given by the Committee of Ministers based on proposals from the Committees of Experts of the Council of Europe in charge of monitoring the implementation of the Convention.

The work of the current and future <u>Sessions of the Award</u> is presented below.

6th Session of the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe (2018-2019)

- take into account the landscape issue in the actions taken to promote good governance and democratic citizenship, notably through awareness-raising, training and education;

- apply the principles of human rights and democracy in landscape policies;

 guarantee the right to participation by the general public, local and regional authorities, and other relevant parties including non-governmental organisations, with an interest in the definition, implementation and monitoring of landscape policies;

- include the 'landscape', as defined by the Convention, in indicators of sustainable development relating to environmental, social, cultural and economic issues;

- implement the principle of non-regression in order to ensure that landscape policies can only be subject to continuous improvement."
