## **CDDG WORKPLAN AND TIMETABLE 2022 (update)**

The CDDG is invited to take note of the information and dates contained in this document.

Secretariat Memorandum prepared by the Directorate General of Democracy Democratic Governance Division The following table, initially approved at the CDDG's 14<sup>th</sup> meeting (29-30 November 2021), provides an updated overview of meetings and their dates for 2022. It is to be noted that:

- the GT-BG (regarding the draft recommendation on principles of good democratic governance) and the GT-DD (regarding the draft report on new forms of deliberative democracy) would complete their work in 2022 and the drafts would be submitted for approval to the CDDG at its 16<sup>th</sup> meeting (28-29 November);
- as previously agreed by the CDDG, the working group that is to prepare a draft "Report on green public administration aimed at collecting and disseminating good practice and case studies and identifying guidance for administrations at local, regional and national level" (specific task iii) might, in principle, begin its work before the end of the year; in this perspective, the CDDG adopted terms of reference for this working group at its 14<sup>th</sup> meeting (see CDDG(2021)20). The exact schedule of work and members whose participation costs would be borne by the Council of Europe remained to be determined in due course. At its meeting on 24-25 March, the Bureau considered that the work of the GT-BG and GT-DD should nonetheless be given top priority in 2022.
- Technically speaking, the hybrid format is to be privileged for an unpredictable period, that
  is as long as special anti-Covid measures are in place in some countries and all CDDG
  members are not able to resume travels to Strasbourg; hybrid meetings in Paris are difficult
  to hold due to technical limitations.

It is recalled that starting from 2022, the programming of the intergovernmental committees' activities and their respective terms of reference is based on a quadrennial approach. Budgets are still adopted on a two-year basis by the Committee of Ministers, therefore the terms of reference are actually <u>approved</u> for the first biennial period and <u>approved</u> on a <u>provisional basis</u> for the second period of two years. This means that changes can be proposed by the CDDG to the Committee of Ministers for the second half of the Biennium, in particular.

It is also recalled that in accordance with Resolution CM/Res(2011)24 on intergovernmental committees and subordinate bodies, their terms of reference and working methods, subordinate bodies should be encouraged to rely on information technologies and written consultation in their work.

The table below recalls the CDDG's specific tasks for the period 2022-2025, according to its terms of reference.
