# Steering Committee for the Rights of the Child (CDENF)

Draft Abridged report of the 8th plenary meeting (Strasbourg, 14-16 November 2023)

### Opening of the meeting and adoption of the agenda

The Steering Committee for the Rights of the Child (CDENF) held its eight plenary meeting in Strasbourg (France) on 14-16 November 2023, with Rosário Farmhouse (Portugal) in the Chair.

The agenda of the meeting is contained in the Appendix. The full meeting report including the list of participants will be available on the CDENF website.<sup>1</sup>

At its plenary meeting, the CDENF

- took note of and approved its workplan, subject to the adoption of its new terms of reference for 2024-2027 by the Committee of Ministers;
- entrusted its Bureau, with the support of the Secretariat, to follow up on relevant activities of other Council of Europe Committees and bodies in view of ensuring CDENF contributions and representations as appropriate;
- took note of and exchanged on the first implementation report of the Council of Europe Strategy for the Rights of the Child (2022–2027), reflecting the transversal approach adopted throughout all priority areas, and instructed the Secretariat to integrate last contributions and circulate it to the CDENF for information;
- exchanged on the modalities for following the further implementation of the Strategy, notably its midterm review;
- **revised and adopted** its Opinions on PACE Recommendations 2262 (2023) "Preventing addictive behaviours in children" and 2263 (2023) "Mental health and well-being of children and young adults", to be transmitted to the Committee of Ministers;
- welcomed the adoption, on 6 September 2023, of Recommendation CM/Rec(2023)8 of the Committee of Ministers to member States on strengthening reporting systems on violence against children; the approval, jointly with the European Committee on Legal Co-operation (CDCJ) of the draft Recommendation on the Rights and the best interests of the child in parental separation proceedings and the adoption of its accompanying draft Explanatory Memorandum; the adoption of the Guide on Children's participation in decisions about their health, prepared jointly with the Steering Committee for Human Rights in the fields of Biomedicine and Health (CDBIO); and the finalisation of the report on Children as Human Rights Defenders;

- emphasised that the future priorities of the Council of Europe should be guided by the Strategy for the Rights of the Child (2022-2027);
- **elected** Solvor Bäcklund (Norway) and Alfredo Ferrante (Italy), as members of the Bureau for a second term of office of two years, and Marjo Malja (Finland) for a first term of office of two years, renewable once, starting on 1 January 2024;
- took note of the relevant information and updates provided by the representatives of:
  - o the Council of Europe Children's Rights Division Co-operation Unit;
  - o the Consultation Group on the Children of Ukraine (CGU);
  - the Committee of the Parties to the Convention on the Protection of Children against Sexual Exploitation and Sexual Abuse (Lanzarote Committee);
  - the Committee of Experts on Roma and Traveller Issues (ADI-ROM);
  - o the Coordinator for the Rights of the Child of the European Commission;
  - o the Child Rights International Network (CRIN);
- took note of the following dates for upcoming meetings: CDENF<sup>2</sup>

#### Strategic Objective 1: Freedom from violence for all children

- **took note** of the information presented by Maria Vargova (Slovakia), Chair of the Committee of Experts on the prevention of violence (ENF-VAE), on the progress achieved by the Committee;
- agreed on the questionnaire to review the implementation of CM/Rec(2009)10 on Council of Europe
  policy guidelines on integrated national strategies for the protection of children from violence, to be
  circulated to CDENF Delegations for replies by 31 January 2024;

#### Strategic Objective 2: Equal opportunities and social inclusion for all children

- **took note** of the information provided by the Secretariat on progress achieved with regard to the preparation of a mapping study on children's access to quality mental health care, which would now be finalised in 2024;

#### Strategic Objective 3: Access to and safe use of technologies for all children

took note of the information provided by the Secretariat on progress achieved with regard to the
preparation of a Report on the rights of the child and artificial intelligence and proposed next steps;

## Strategic Objective 4: Child-friendly justice for all children

- held a joint session with the European Committee on Legal Co-operation (CDCJ) in order to approve the draft Recommendation on the protection of the rights and best interests of the child in parental separation proceedings and adopt its draft Explanatory Memorandum as prepared by their joint committee of experts, the Committee of Experts on the Rights and the Best Interests of the Child in Parental Separation and in Care Proceedings (CJ/ENF-ISE). Following a final reading and amendments, the CDENF approved the recommendation and adopted its Explanatory Memorandum, and so did the CDCJ.
- decided, jointly with the CDCJ, that this draft Recommendation should be submitted for adoption by the Committee of Ministers together with the future draft recommendation on the protection of the rights and best interests of the child in care proceedings which will be finalised by the end of 2024, given the proximity of the two recommendations. This would also coincide with the completion of the implementation tools still to be prepared for both recommendations;
- **took note** of and **welcomed** the publication of a Mapping study on multidisciplinary and interagency child-friendly justice models responding to violence against children "Barnahus: a European journey", produced with the support of the Icelandic Presidency of the Committee of Ministers;

#### Strategic Objective 5: Giving a voice to every child

- adopted the Guide to children's participation in decisions about their health;
- exchanged on the possible follow-up to be given to the Guide; notably through the possible
  development of appropriate child-friendly materials, and agreed to explore options for translation of
  the guide into other national languages;
- **revised** and **approved** the Report on children as defenders of human rights in view of its publication;
- **held** an exchange of views on the conclusions and the follow-up to the report;
- **heard** a presentation by the Head of the National System for the Integral Development of the Family (SNDIF) of Mexico, on the Mexican methodology for child consultations;

#### Strategic Objective 6: Children's rights in crisis and emergency situations

- took note of a presentation on the first results stemming from the survey carried out among national
  delegations to review the implementation of Recommendation CM/Rec(2019)11 on effective
  guardianship for unaccompanied and separated children in the context of migration and exchanged
  on key points for the upcoming implementation review report, to be adopted in 2024;
- took note of the information provided by the Secretariat on the methodology developed for the targeted child consultations to feed into the implementation review, and of the option for interested Delegations to still join this exercise;
- held a thematic exchange on Children's rights and the environment, with online participation of the following experts:
  - Velina Todorova, Member of the UN Committee on the Rights of the Child;
  - Aoife Nolan, President of the European Committee of Social Rights;
  - Nicola Wenzel, Vice-Chair and Rapporteur of the Drafting Group on Human Rights and Environment (CDDH-ENV) of the Steering Committee for Human Rights (CDDH);
  - Natalia Kobylarz, Senior Lawyer at the Registry of the European Court of Human Rights (in person).
- adopted this abridged report at the end of the meeting.
