The Steering Committee on Media and Information Society (CDMSI) held its 24th meeting in Strasbourg on 29 November - 1 December 2023 with Mr. Taavo Lumiste (Estonia) as Chair.

Regarding standard-setting activities

The CDMSI

- **welcomed the completion of the work** by the Committee of Experts on Strategic Lawsuits against Public Participation ([MSI-SLP](#)) on the draft *of the Committee of Ministers to member States on countering the use of strategic litigation against public participation (SLAPPs)*, and its accompanying *Explanatory Memorandum*. The members **discussed and revised** the drafts in the light of the comments received in writing and the suggestions made during the meeting and took note of the positions expressed by some member States on specific points of the draft recommendation. Taking into account these positions, the CDMSI **approved** the draft recommendation and **agreed to transmit** it to the Committee of Ministers, as revised, together with the accompanying draft Explanatory Memorandum, for consideration and final adoption of the former and taking note of the latter

- **Discussed, revised and adopted** the draft *Guidance Note on countering the spread of online mis- and disinformation through fact-checking and platform design solutions in a human rights compliant manner*, elaborated by the Committee of Experts on the Integrity of Online Information ([MSI-INF](#))
- **Discussed and adopted** the draft *Guidelines on the responsible implementation of AI in journalism*, elaborated by the Committee of Experts on Increasing the Resilience of Media ([MSI-RES](#))
- **Endorsed** the report on *Good practices for sustainable media financing*, elaborated by the [MSI-RES](#).
- **Took note of** the report of the fourth meeting of the [MSI-SLP](#) (17-18 October 2023, in person);
- **Took note of** the report of the fourth meeting of the [MSI-INF](#) (18-19 September 2023, in person);

Regarding prospects for future work

The CDMSI

- **The CDMSI took note** of the information provided by the Secretariat on the **future terms of reference for the CDMSI and the two committees of experts subordinate to the CDMSI** approved by the Committee of Ministers for the second biennium (2024-2025): the Committee of Experts for online safety and empowerment of content creators and users (**MSI-eSec**), in charge of the elaboration, before the end of 2025, of a *Draft Recommendation on online safety and empowerment of content creators and users* and the Committee of Experts on the impacts of generative artificial intelligence for freedom of expression (**MSI-AI**), instructed to elaborate, before the end of 2025, *Draft Guidelines on the implications of generative artificial intelligence for freedom of expression*.
- The CDMSI also **took note of the developments related the revision of the administrative structure of Council of Europe**, as part of the follow-up to the Reykjavik summit, as a result of which the work of the CDMSI and the Media and Internet Governance Division would be transferred from the Directorate General of Human Rights to the Directorate General on Democracy and Human Dignity, as part of a new Department of Democratic Institutions and Freedoms.

Regarding the Council of Europe Campaign for the Safety of Journalists “Journalists matter”- the Riga Conference on Freedom of Expression

The CDMSI

- **held an exchange of views** on the conclusions and key messages of the conference: [‘The Pen is Mightier than the Sword? Meeting today’s challenges to freedom of expression and the safety of journalists’](#), jointly organised by the Latvian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Ministry of Culture and the Ombudsman's Office, together with the Council of Europe, on 5-6 October 2023 in Riga.
- **took note** of the information provided by the Secretariat on the official launch, on 5 October, in the framework of the Riga Conference, of the Council of Europe [Campaign for the Safety of Journalists](#) ‘Journalists Matter’, an event which provided a forum to discuss the escalating threats faced by journalists both online and offline and the need to engage in a multi-stakeholder dialogue and take effective action towards a sensible improvement of the situation.
- **was informed** by the Secretariat about the [first meeting](#) of [the appointed national focal points](#) for the Campaign which focused on exchanges of best practices for protecting journalists and outlined plans for future action; the Committee took note that the next meeting for national focal points was scheduled for June 2024, when national focal points are expected to inform and exchange on plans of action, strategies and measures agreed on domestic level for the duration of the Campaign as part of its ‘national chapters’.

Regarding digital governance

The CDMSI

- **Held an exchange of views** with Mr Thomas Schneider, member of the CDMSI Bureau and Chair of the CAI, on the latest developments in the work of the [CAI](#) on a future Council of Europe [Framework] Convention on Artificial Intelligence, Human Rights, Democracy and the Rule of Law.
- **Took note** of the latest developments in the framework of the **Digital Partnership** and in particular the [Informal Exchange held by the Committee of Ministers](#) in September 2023 on immersive realities and their impact on human rights, the rule of law and democratic principles. Moreover, the CDMSI **held an exchange of views** with Ms Irene Kitsara, European Standardisation Initiatives Director, IEEE, who outlined the joint IEEE-Council of Europe joint report on Metaverse. A synopsis of the report was shared with the participants. The report is of particular interest to the CDMSI in view of its future work on the impact of the immersive realities on the freedom of expression.
- **Took note** of the Council of Europe's participation in **EuroDIG 2023**, held on 19-21 June 2023 in Tampere. The Council of Europe made significant contributions to relevant sessions underlining the Organisation's commitment to human rights, rule of law, and democracy.
- **Took note** of the Council of Europe's participation in the **Internet Governance Forum 2023**, in Kyoto on 8-12 October, and was informed about the sessions organized by the Council of Europe in the field of cybercrime, artificial intelligence, and the Metaverse. The Deputy Secretary General of the Council of Europe took part in the High-level opening ceremony, as well as in the Council of Europe's sessions on AI, the IGF being an occasion to continue discussion at a global level on the future Council of Europe framework Convention on AI.

Moreover, the CDMSI:

- **Took note** of the ongoing work of the Media and Internet Governance Division on [Media and Information Literacy \(MIL\)](#), welcomed the presentation of Ms Martina Chapman, independent consultant in Media and Information Literacy, and discussed the digital media tool (quiz) developed with the aim of increasing awareness around freedom of expression and information challenges facing users in the digital space.
- **Took note** of the updates provided by the Secretariat on the draft Compilation of promising practices at national level and tools for the implementation of relevant aspects of the [Recommendation CM/Rec \(2022\)16 of the Committee of Ministers to member States on combating hate speech](#) and **welcomed the related presentation** of Dr Jennifer Jackson-Preece, Associate Professor of Nationalism at the European Institute, Department of International Relations, London School of Political Science and Economics.
- **Took note** of the information provided on attended events and activities by the CDMSI Youth Rapporteur, Mr Marius Jitea, in relation to youth, the digital space and freedom of expression.

- **Took note** information provided by Ms Maja Capello, Head of Department for Legal Information at the [European Audiovisual Observatory](#), on recent developments in the audiovisual field, was informed about the planned legal reports for 2024 including those on artificial intelligence and video games, and of the updates of the [tracking table](#) used to follow the implementation of the [Audiovisual Media Services Directive \(AVMSD\)](#).
- **Took note** information provided by Ms Emmanuelle Machet, Head of Secretariat of the [European Platform of Regulatory Authorities \(EPRA\)](#), on the latest events and meetings of the EPRA, notably on the future of content delivery and the ongoing cooperation with the Council of Europe on the [EQUIROM](#) project and the steps for cooperation on regulatory capacity building projects.
