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**Meeting details**

The Steering Committee on Media and Information Society (CDMSI) held its 25<sup>th</sup> meeting in Strasbourg on 18-20 June 2024 with Maja ZARIC (Serbia) as Chair.

The agenda of the meeting is in Appendix 1. The full report of the meeting including the list of participants will be made available on the CDMSI website.

The CDMSI:

**Regarding standard-setting activities**

- **Welcomed** the adoption by the Committee of Ministers of *Recommendation CM/Rec (2024)4 of the Committee of Ministers to member States on countering the use of strategic litigation against public participation (SLAPPs)* and of its accompanying *Explanatory Memorandum*, and took note of the follow-up steps foreseen, including that an European-wide anti-SLAPP conference will be hosted and

organised by the Council of Europe, together with the [European Centre for Press and Media Freedom \(ECPMF\)](#) and the [Coalition Against SLAPPs in Europe \(CASE\)](#), on 14 November 2024.

- Took note of and exchanged views on the report of the first meeting of the [Committee of Experts on the impacts of generative artificial intelligence for freedom of expression \(MSI-AI\)](#) (23-24 April 2024, hybrid) and of the discussions regarding the preliminary outline for its draft guidance note on the implications of generative artificial intelligence for freedom of expression, to be delivered by the end of 2025.
- Took note of and exchanged views on the report of the first meeting of the [Committee of Experts on online safety and empowerment of content creators and users \(MSI-eSEC\)](#) (9-10 April 2024, hybrid) and of the discussion about the preliminary outline for its draft Recommendation on online safety and empowerment of content creators and users, to be delivered by the end of 2025.
- Took note of and exchanged views on the updates provided by the Secretariat on the ongoing work on other CDMSI deliverables, including on “Ten steps to counter disinformation - Strategy and practical tools based on existing Council of Europe standards and other instruments”; the feasibility study on immersive reality applications and their implications for freedom of expression; and the “Indicators for media and information literacy (MIL) strategies at national level”.

#### **Regarding the Council of Europe “Journalists matter Campaign for the Safety of Journalists”**

- Took note of the information provided by the Secretariat on developments following the official launch, on 5 October 2023, including the updated number of designated *national focal points* (38) and the agenda and expected outcomes of their [second meeting](#), held back-to back with the Plenary; steps taken in a number of countries; the information available on the [Campaign’s website](#); welcomed the current status of received voluntary contributions received by Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, the Netherlands; synergies with the Division on Cooperation for Freedom of Expression to make use of existing projects and activities in South East Europe and Eastern Partnership to support the implementation of the campaign, including by developing national chapters thereof; and the upcoming thematic conference relating to the implementation of the “Protection Pillar” of the Recommendation [CM/Rec\(2016\)4](#) on the protection of journalism and safety of journalists and other media actors, to be held in Autumn 2024.
- Held a tour de table to enable CDMSI representatives to provide information on steps taken by member States under the Campaign.

#### **Regarding the follow-up to the Recommendation CM/Rec(2022)16 of the Committee of Ministers to member States on combating hate speech**

- Participated in the Hate Speech and Media Seminar “[Upholding Media Integrity: Fostering Tolerance and Combating Hate Speech](#)”, a thematic session organised by the Secretariat, as part of the CDMSI agenda, in the framework of the “No Hate Speech Week”.
- Endorsed the Compilation of promising practices at national level in combating hate speech and tools for the implementation of relevant aspects of the 2022 recommendation and welcomed the related presentation of Jennifer Jackson-Preece, Associate Professor of Nationalism at the European Institute and the Department of International Relations, London School of Political Science and Economics, who elaborated the documents together with the CDMSI and CDADI Secretariat.

## **Regarding the appointment of CDMSI rapporteurs on transversal issues and liaison contacts with partner Committees**

- Took note of the information provided by the Chair of the CDMSI on the meeting of the Secretary General of the Council of Europe with the chairs of intergovernmental committees, held on 1 February 2024, and the potential for cooperation between steering committees on issues of common interest, as well as the shared views on the importance of integrating the youth perspective in the committees' work,
- **Appointed:**
  - o Maja Zarić (Serbia) as Gender Equality Rapporteur
  - o Marius Jitea (Romania) as Youth and Children's Rights Rapporteur
  - o Tigran Dadunts (Armenia) as liaison person for the Steering Committee on Democracy [CDDEM](#)
  - o Inge Welbergen (the Netherlands) as liaison person for the Steering Committee on Anti-discrimination, Diversity and Inclusion [CDADI](#)
  - o Thomas Schneider (Switzerland) as liaison person for the Committee on Artificial Intelligence [CAI](#)

## **Regarding digital governance**

- **Took note:**
  - o of the latest developments in the framework of the [Digital Partnership](#), and in particular of the outcome of the Workshop with Digital Partners: *Protection human rights, democracy and the rule of law in the digital environment*, held on 21-22 May 2024, during which the secretariat presented the most recent relevant instruments elaborated by the CDMSI and current work on online safety, generative AI and immersive realities, likely to offer opportunities for cooperation with relevant and interested digital partners of the Council of Europe;
  - o of the Council of Europe participation in further events related to digital governance, in the framework of which the Secretariat presented recent and ongoing work of the CDMSI and explored, with participating partners, possible avenues for cooperation.
- **Discussed** the draft future Declaration of the Committee of Ministers in support of [World Summit on the Information Society \(WSIS\)](#) and agreed to submit the text to the members approval by written procedure, after the integration possible comments and suggestions sent to the Secretariat before 1<sup>st</sup> of July. The approved text will be then transmitted to the Committee of Ministers for adoption.
- **Held an exchange of views** with Ida Søndergaard Rasmussen, Senior Program Manager, Child Rights and Safety – Digital Empowerment Program Lead at the [LEGO Group](#), a member of the Council of Europe Digital Partnership.

## **Regarding the work towards a legal mechanism to support the European drama series production:**

- **Welcomed** the presentation by Susan Newman-Baudais, Executive Director, Enlarged Partial Agreement – Eurimages, who provided valuable information on the background, context and objectives of the CDCPP work towards a future Convention of the Council of Europe on the co-

- production of European drama series (exploratory study and a proposal for a draft of a future convention);
- **Expressed** strong interest in this initiative and in a transparent and inclusive process in developing a future legal instrument of the Council of Europe;
  - **Highlighted** the importance of including the CDMSI in this process, given the relevance of the freedom of expression perspective, and **expressed** the committee's willingness to contribute through timely and thorough consultations.

**Regarding exchanges with representatives of relevant Council of Europe bodies and institutions:**

- **Exchanged views** with Irena Guidikova, Head of the Democratic Institutions and Freedoms Department, Directorate for Democracy, Directorate General of Democracy and Human Dignity, on focuses and priorities in the future work of the Freedom of expression and CDMSI Division and connections amongst different activities under the Department;
- **Exchanged views** with two representatives of [partner organisations](#) of the [Safety of Journalists Platform](#), William Horsley ([Centre for Freedom of the Media, CFOM](#)) and Flutura Kusari ([European Centre for Press and Media Freedom, ECPMF](#)), who presented the Platform's 2024 Annual Report "Press Freedom in Europe: Time to Turn the Tide" written by the partner organisations of the Safety of Journalists Platform.
- **Exchanged views** with Patrick Penninckx, Head of Digital Development and Governance Department, Council of Europe, on developments regarding AI-related work following the adoption of the *Council of Europe Framework Convention on Artificial Intelligence and Human Rights, Democracy and the Rule of Law*.
- **Took note** of the information provided by Alina Tatarenko, Head of Division for Cooperation on Freedom of Expression, Council of Europe, on projects currently implemented by the Division on freedom of expression issues in a number of member states, as well as future cooperation opportunities, including to ensure promotion and follow-up to the most recent Council of Europe instruments in the field, and to help the implementation of the 'Journalists matter' campaign at national level.
- **Exchanged views** with Urška Umek, Head of Democratic Institutions and Civil Society Division, on the work of the Steering Committee on Democracy (CDDEM); with Marie-Anne Persoons, Chair of the Steering Committee for Education (CDEDU); with Prof. Siobhan O'Sullivan, Chair of the Steering Committee for Human Rights in the fields of Biomedicine and Health (CDBIO); and with Jorge Orlando Soares da Silva Queirós, Chair of the European Steering Committee for Youth (CDEJ).
- **Exchanged views** with Valentina Grippo (Italy, ALDE), PACE General Rapporteur on Media Freedom and Safety of Journalists, regarding updates on the work of the [Committee on Culture, Science, Education, and Media](#), current reports under preparation and draft resolution proposals, including reports on propaganda, on freedom of expression on digital platforms and on media and sports. The support provided by the PACE to CDMSI work, including on strategic lawsuits against public participation and the Campaign for the Safety of Journalists, was underlined and the mutual commitment to continue this fruitful co-operation was expressed.
- **Took note** of the information provided by Maja Capello, Head of Department for Legal Information at the [European Audiovisual Observatory](#) (EAO), on recent developments in the audiovisual field, and

of the information provided by Geraldine Denis, Secretariat of the [European Platform of Regulatory Authorities](#) (EPRA), on the latest work, events and meetings of the EPRA.

#### **Regarding exchanges with representatives of other relevant external partners**

- **Exchanged views** with Georg Haibach, Principal Administrator, European Commission Directorate-General for Justice and Consumers, on the recent EU legal instruments on countering SLAPPs, namely the *Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council on protecting persons who engage in public participation from manifestly unfounded or abusive court proceedings* and the *Commission Recommendation (EU) 2022/758 of 27 April 2022 on protecting journalists and human rights defenders who engage in public participation from manifestly unfounded or abusive court proceedings*. The complementarity between these instruments and Council of Europe standards and initiatives on safety of journalists, including against SLAPPs was underlined, and avenues for cooperation in their implementation were discussed.
- **Exchanged views** with Audrius Perkauskas, Deputy Head of Unit “Audiovisual and Media Services Policy”, Directorate-General for Communications Networks, Content and Technology (CONNECT), European Commission, on the European Media Freedom Act (EMFA) and other EU legislative developments in the area of freedom of expression. CDMSI members and observers utilised this opportunity to discuss the Commission’s plans for the implementation of the EMFA and their relevance to non-EU member states and civil society organisations.
- **Took note** of the information provided by Andrew Moger, Chief Executive Officer, News Media Coalition, about the ongoing work in relation to the safety of journalists, notably the Primary Source Journalist project and discussed ways to explore further the challenges of primary source journalism in the CDMSI work.

#### **Regarding other business:**

- **Agreed** to hold its next plenary meeting on 4-6 December 2024, in the premises of the Council of Europe, in Strasbourg.
