Abridged report

Meeting details

The Steering Committee on Media and Information Society (CDMSI) held its 27th meeting in Strasbourg on 18-20 June 2025 with Maja ZARIĆ (Serbia) as Chair. The meeting was opened by Matjaz Gruden, Director, Directorate for Democracy, Directorate General of Democracy and Human Dignity, Council of Europe.

The agenda of the meeting is in Appendix 1. The full report of the meeting including the list of participants will be made available on the CDMSI website.

Total number of participants: 83. Gender distribution: 38 men (46%) and 45 women (54%).

The CDMSI:

Regarding standard-setting activities:

- **Welcomed** the progress made and provided further input on the draft deliverables of its two committees of experts:

- the [Committee of Experts on online safety and empowerment of content creators and users](#) (MSI-eSEC), mandated to deliver a *draft Recommendation on online safety and empowerment of content creators and users* before the end of 2025, which held its

third meeting on 27-28 March 2025. The outcome, progress and next steps were presented by Nicole Stellou, Chair of MSI-eSEC, Martin Husovec and Peter Noorlander, drafting Co-rapporteurs.

- the [Committee of Experts on the implications of generative artificial intelligence for freedom of expression](#) (MSI-AI), mandated to deliver a *draft Guidance Note on the implications of generative artificial intelligence for freedom of expression* before the end of 2025, which held its third meeting on 25-26 March 2025. The outcome, progress and next steps were presented by Andrin Eichin, Chair of MSI-AI, and Iva Nenadic, Murielle Popa-Fabre and Patricia Shaw, drafting Co-rapporteurs.
- **Agreed to submit** the draft deliverables of the Expert Committees to public consultation before the expert committees' fourth and last meetings, to be held in October 2025. The final versions of the two deliverables, as agreed by the two expert committees, also in the light of the comments received from various stakeholders, will be submitted to the CDMSI at its 28th meeting (December 2025) for consideration and approval. The two deliverables will subsequently be submitted to the Committee of Ministers - the future recommendation, for adoption, and the guidance note, for notification.
- **Took note** of and **exchanged views** on the updates provided by the Secretariat on the ongoing work on other expected CDMSI deliverables, including on:

- **“Ten steps to counter disinformation - Strategy and practical tools based on existing Council of Europe standards and other instruments”**, on which a presentation of the preliminary draft was delivered by Konrad Bleyer-Simon and Urbano Reviglio, Research Associates at the Centre for Media Pluralism and Media Freedom, European University Institute. The CDMSI were informed that an expert workshop to gather feedback on the best approach for further developing the document will be held on 4 July 2025;
- **“Indicators for media and information literacy (MIL) strategies at national level”**, An update on the progress of the deliverable was provided by the Council of Europe Secretariat. In particular, it was highlighted that a [workshop](#) gathering international experts to discuss the most appropriate ways to shape the structure, content, and methodology of this deliverable took place on 22-23 May 2025;
- **“Feasibility Study on Immersive Reality Applications and their Implications for Freedom of Expression”**, which findings were presented by Brittan Heller, International Law, Technology, and Human Rights expert.

Agreed to provide further input on available draft deliverables during the summer period, based *inter alia* on domestic consultations with competent national - government and non-government – stakeholders.

Regarding the Council of Europe [“Journalists matter” Campaign for the Safety of Journalists](#):

- Took note of:

- the information provided by the Secretariat on recent developments, including the updated number of designated National Focal Points (41), national coordination structures in the area of journalists' safety (27) and countries implementing national action plans (11);
- the outcomes of the [Annual thematic conference: Effective Prosecution of crimes against journalists - Building the paradigm against impunity](#) - (29 April 2025, Luxembourg) and the [Third meeting of the National Focal Points](#) - (30 April 2025, Luxembourg), organised under the Presidency of Luxembourg;
- next steps, including next year's Annual thematic conference focusing on the "Prevention pillar" of the Recommendation [CM/Rec\(2016\)4](#) on the protection of journalism and safety of journalists and other media actors, to be held under the Moldovan Presidency of the Committee of Ministers, and the preparations of the Campaign's mid-term review.

- Held a **tour de table** where CDMSI members shared information on steps taken and planned by member States as part of the Campaign.

Regarding the follow-up to the CDMSI's previous work:

- Held an exchange of views regarding the mid-term review of the [CDMSI Terms of reference for 2024-2027](#) including proposed new expert committees to work under its authority and a number of proposed revisions to the CDMSI Terms of Reference for the second biennium (2026-2027) for the purpose of increased clarity and in light of ongoing developments and activities carried out in the Organisation. Also took note of the detailed exchanges held with the members of the Bureau upon elaboration of the proposals made.
- Took note of the follow-up given to the Recommendation [CM/Rec\(2022\)16](#) of the Committee of Ministers to member States on combating hate speech and participated in the Hate Speech and Media Seminar "*Old habit, new fronts: tackling hate speech against journalists and other media actors*", a thematic session organised by the CDMSI Secretariat, as part of the Plenary agenda, in the framework of, and jointly with the participants to, the "[No Hate Speech Week](#)".
- Took note of and agreed to disseminate the publication "Limiting the Use of Criminal Law to Restrict Freedom of Expression: A Guide on Council of Europe Standards" that was originally prepared by a consultant under the project [Enhancing Institutional Capacities on Freedom of Expression and Information \(EFEx\) in Bosnia and Herzegovina](#).
- Took note of the participation of Maja ZARIĆ, as Chair of the CDMSI, in the Third Meeting of the Secretary General with Presidents of the Intergovernmental Committees of the Council of Europe, held on 24 April 2025, and the main outcomes of the the exchanges held.
- Took note of recent country-specific developments in the field of freedom of expression and participation in events of relevance for the CDMSI circulated in writing by the CDMSI members and Secretariat.

- Took part to the morning session of the Council of Europe [Democracy's Firewall Hackathon](#) “Outsmart Disinformation, Protect Free Speech”, held on 20 June 2025 in the Hemicycle of the Palais de l'Europe, including a presentation delivered by Maja Zarić, Head of the CDMSI, in the first panel “First Democratic Debate: Disinformation and Gender Equality”.
