ABRIDGED MEETING REPORT

Meeting details

The Steering Committee on Media and Information Society (CDMSI) held its 29th plenary meeting in hybrid format, in Strasbourg and online, on 17-19 June 2026 with Aykaterini Polyzou (Greece) as Chair. The meeting was opened by Roberto Olla, Head of Democratic Institutions and Freedoms Department, Directorate for Democracy, Directorate General of Democracy and Human Dignity, Council of Europe.

The agenda of the meeting is in Appendix 1. The full report of the meeting including the list of participants will be made available on the CDMSI website.

Total number of participants: 95. Gender distribution: 45 men (47%) and 50 women (53%).

The CDMSI:

Regarding standard-setting activities:

- **Welcomed the adoption** by the Committee of Ministers of Recommendation [CM/Rec \(2026\)4](#) of the Committee of Ministers to member States on online safety and empowerment of users and content creators and **took note** of the follow-up steps foreseen.
- **Took note** of the [report of the first meeting](#) of the Committee of Experts on safeguarding media pluralism in the online environment ([MSI-ePLU](#)) (3-4 March 2026, hybrid) and exchanged views on the preliminary outline for its “draft Recommendation on safeguarding media pluralism in the online environment”, and invited its members, participants and observers to provide contributions to the study by 15 July 2026.

- **Took note** of the [report of the first meeting](#) of the Committee of Experts on media regulators in a platform-based environment ([MSI-eREG](#)) (26-27 March 2026, hybrid), exchanged views on the preliminary outline for its “draft Guidance Note on media regulators in a platform-based environment”, and invited its members, participants and observers to provide contributions to the study by 15 July 2026.
- **Took note** and **exchanged views** on the ongoing work on a “Review report on the implementation of Council of Europe standards on defamation” and a “Compilation of promising practices at national level for the implementation of relevant aspects of the Recommendation [CM/Rec\(2024\)2](#) on countering Strategic Lawsuits against Public Participation (SLAPPs)” and **invited** its members to reply to the questionnaire by 8 July 2026.
- **Took note** and **exchanged views** on the progress of the work on a “Practical guide on building independent, sustainable, and pluralistic public service media (PSM)” and on the “Review report on the implementation of relevant aspects of the Recommendation [CM/Rec\(2022\)16](#) on combating hate speech”.
- **Took note** of the information provided by the Secretariat concerning follow-up activities relating to the [Guidance Note on the Implications of Generative AI for Freedom of Expression](#), the policy document [Resisting disinformation: 10 building blocks to strengthen information integrity](#) and the [Feasibility Study on Benefits and Challenges to Freedom of Expression in Immersive Realities](#), and **welcomed** the dissemination and awareness-raising activities undertaken in relation to these deliverables, while highlighting the importance of continued follow-up, promotion and translation into national languages.
- **Exchanged views** on the draft Study on how social media and other platforms shape opinion and action and **took note** of the “Study on shifting news authorities and democratic resilience: opportunities and risks associated with newsfluencers in Europe” and **agreed** to make it public online as an experts’ document and serve as preparatory paper for the work on social media.
- **Exchanged views** and **took note of** on the “Study on journalists in times of conflict: a shared duty to protect under the European Convention on Human Rights” and **agreed** to make it public online as an experts’ document.

Regarding the Council of Europe “[Journalists Matter](#)” Campaign for the Safety of Journalists:

- **Took note** of the progress report on the implementation of the Council of Europe [Journalists Matter Campaign](#) for the Safety of Journalists, including the outcomes of the [fourth meeting of National Focal Points](#) and the Annual Conference [Defending Truth – Comprehensive Approaches to Journalistic Safety and Quality Journalism](#), held in Chişinău, Republic of Moldova, in 22-23 April 2026, as well as of the forthcoming event [Youth Facing Disinformation - Why Journalists Matter](#), organised under the Monaco Presidency of the Committee of Ministers and to be held on 9-10 November 2026, at European Youth Centre and Palais de l’ Europe, in Strasbourg.
- **Welcomed** the progress achieved and **expressed support** for ensuring the sustainability of the mechanisms created under the Campaign, notably through a permanent network of National Focal Points.
- **Held a tour de table** to share information on steps taken and planned by member states as part of the Campaign.
- **Held the workshop** “Targeted Voices: Hate Speech against Women Journalists”, organised in the framework of the [Journalists Matter](#) Campaign and which also formed part of the third Council of Europe [No Hate Speech Week](#).

Regarding the work towards a legal instrument on foreign information manipulation and interference (FIMI):

- **Welcomed** the information provided by the Secretariat and by the CDMSI representative in the [PC-FIMI](#), Inge Welbergen (the Netherlands), concerning the CDMSI's contribution to the process leading to the Feasibility Study on the possible elaboration of a legal instrument on foreign information manipulation and interference (FIMI), including disinformation ([CM/Inf\(2026\)18](#)), as well as the subsequent [decision](#) by the Committee of Ministers and its follow-up.
- **Reiterated** its strong interest in this process towards a future legal instrument of the Council of Europe.
- **Highlighted** the importance of the past and future involvement of the CDMSI in this process, given the ongoing relevance of the freedom of expression perspective and expressed the Committee's willingness to contribute through timely and thorough consultations.

Regarding the appointment of a CDMSI representative to the [BIO-ALN](#):

- **Appointed** for the forthcoming terms of reference of the CDMSI (2026-2027), Ms Maja Zaric (Serbia) as **CDMSI representative** to the Drafting Committee on Risks and Harms of Online and Digital Addictions ([BIO-ALN](#)).

Regarding the future work of the CDMSI (2028–2031):

- **Took note** the information provided by the Secretariat on the process towards the adoption by the Committee of Ministers of the terms of reference for 2028–2031 and the role of steering committees in the process under the amended [CM/res\(2021\)3](#).
- **Exchanged views** on ideas and proposals for possible areas of work and deliverables.
- **Agreed** that members will submit their inputs by 15 September and instructed the Secretariat to collect the inputs received and prepare, in consultation with the Bureau, a revised proposal to be examined and agreed by the CDMSI at its 30th Plenary meeting.

Regarding the request for observer status

- **Examined** the application for observer status submitted by the [Global Media Registry](#) and the accompanying presentation delivered by Olaf Steenfadt, Founder and Managing Director.
- **Took note** of the objection raised by one CDMSI member and of the absence of the required quorum, and **agreed to decide, by written procedure** by 15 July 2026, on the granting of the observer status and, in the absence of unanimity, on the possible referral of the matter to the Committee of Ministers.
