25th meeting (6-7 November 2023)

Report

Hybrid meeting - in person and via Zoom

1. Opening of the meeting

Ms Hanne Juncher, the Director of the Information Society and Action against Crime, Directorate of Human Rights and the Rule of Law, opened the meeting welcoming the members of the Bureau of the CDMSI. Ms Juncher underlined the importance of the standard setting work of the Council of Europe and the timeliness of the CDMSI standard-setting instruments. Moreover, she highlighted the success of the launch of the Campaign for the Safety of Journalists that took place in Riga, Latvia, on 5October 2023.

2. Adoption of the agenda and order of business

The Bureau members adopted the <u>agenda</u> of the meeting (Appendix 1) and agreed on minor changes in the order of business.

All Bureau members were present at this meeting, and the gender distribution was four men (57%) and three women (43%).

3. Tour de table

The Bureau members engaged in a tour de table, commenting on country-specific developments in relation to freedom of expression, the media and other topics covered in CDMSI's previous work. Bureau members were informed in particular about current Media and Literacy (MIL) projects and workshops in Serbia, the suspension of license of TV stations in the Republic of Moldova and training courses on hate speech that took place in Romania.

4. Council of Europe Campaign for the Safety of Journalists - Riga Conference on Freedom of expression

The CDMSI Chair, Mr Taavo Lumiste, the Vice-Chair, Ms Inge Welbergen, and the CDMSI Secretariat presented the key highlights of the Riga Conference: "The Pen is Mightier than the Sword? Meeting today's challenges to freedom of expression and the safety of journalists" jointly organized by Latvia and the Council of Europe. They recalled that the conference held in Riga, Latvia, on 5-6 October 2023 was aimed at addressing the critical issues surrounding freedom of expression and the safety of journalists, spotlighting their crucial role for the functioning of the democracy (see Conclusions and Key Messages). The event witnessed, on

5 October, the official launch of the Council of Europe's <u>Campaign for the Safety of Journalists</u>, a response to the escalating threats faced by journalists both online and offline. The Campaign launch featured a powerful play depicting the tragic killing of the Maltese journalist Daphne Caruana Galizia, accompanied by the testimony of her son, Matthew Caruana Galizia and related exchanges.

Mr Taavo Lumiste, the Chair of the CDMSI, commended the success of the discussions at the Riga launch event, and noted the importance of stressing that combating disinformation also protects quality journalism, rather than hinders it. Ms Inge Welbergen, Vice Chair of the CDMSI, commended the diversity of stakeholders involved in the Conference and the practical and useful value this added to discussions.

The event hosted high-level officials from the organising partners on the Latvian side: the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Ministry of Culture, the Ombudsman's office, as well as the Deputy Secretary General of the Council of Europe, representatives of the PACE, the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities and the Office of the Human Rights Commissioner. Various panels hosted speakers from various circles: journalists, including the partners to the Council of Europe Platform to promote the protection of journalism and safety of journalists, government and international organisations (the European Union, OSCE), national parliaments, legal and human rights sectors, academia, NGOs, local and regional media, and experts in digital technology and communication.

The Bureau members were also informed about the first meeting of the appointed National Focal Points for the Campaign which followed the conference in the afternoon of 6 October 2023. The meeting served as a platform for representatives of various member States to engage in discussions and introductions related to the Campaign's objectives, roadmap, and subsequent activities, both at the European and national levels. National Focal Points shared insights into national safety measures for journalists, discussed ongoing challenges, and articulated their expectations from the Campaign. Experts highlighted successful safety initiatives from various countries, showcasing protective mechanisms in the Netherlands, legal support in North Macedonia, and training programs in Norway. National Focal Points were invited to initiate dialogue with relevant actors at national level and to inform at their next meeting, to be held in June, 2024, on the steps agreed domestically for transposing the Campaign at the national level and any related initiative, national action plans, cooperation mechanisms and structures etc. The Secretariat recalled that the Council of Europe was committed to supporting and facilitating initiatives at national, regional, and European levels, fostering dialogue and collaboration among National Focal Points.

5. Future work of the CDMSI

The Bureau members had an exchange of views on the proposed terms of reference for the work of intergovernmental structures in the next quadrennium (2024-2027). They took note that the proposed CDMSI terms of reference had been approved by the Group of Rapporteurs on Human Rights of the Committee of Ministers (GR-H), and that their final adoption by the Committee of Minsters was foreseen for the end of November. Most tasks to be entrusted to the CDMSI and its two new expert committees under the new terms of reference have been classified either as priority 1 or 2 for the Organisation, reflecting their importance for the Council of Europe's overall work.

The Secretariat provided information about the work of the future Committee of experts on online safety and empowerment of content creators and users (MSI-eSEC). The committee is to focus on different types of new online harms (many of) which have not yet been incorporated into national legal/regulatory frameworks. The future instrument is to develop a taxonomy of online harms and propose recommendations for States, platforms, content creators and users.

Moreover, a specific section on the protection of journalists in the digital environment might be included in the future recommendation.

The Secretariat furthermore presented the work of the future Committee of Experts on the impacts of generative artificial intelligence for freedom of expression (MSI-AI). MSI-AI will develop practical guidance about how these technologies operate and can be managed, how to capitalise on their potential while avoiding the risks they present for freedom of expression. A discussion ensued surrounding the risks of strategic dissemination of disinformation, manipulation and bias which stems from the use of generative artificial intelligence. The Secretariat also highlighted the necessity for complementarity with the work of the Committee on Artificial Intelligence (CAI) and other arms of the Council of Europe's relevant work.

The Bureau also exchanged on the possible creation of working groups or other solutions for preparing the deliverables which under the proposed Terms of reference will not be handled by the two future expert committees.

6. Elections

The Secretariat reminded the Bureau members of elections rules and procedure as per Resolution CM/Res(2021)3 on intergovernmental committees and subordinate bodies, their terms of reference and working methods. The Bureau discussed forthcoming elections for the CDMSI leading organs, which will be on the agenda of the 24th CDMSI plenary and agreed that there would be fixed a deadline for candidate nomination on the morning of the first day of the plenary (29 November 2023).

The Secretariat also recalled the rules governing the election of government members of the expert committees, to be held during the forthcoming plenary meeting, and informed the Bureau that a call for candidates for the future 7 member states representatives in each of the two new committees will be circulated in due time ahead of the plenary.

7. Ongoing standard setting work - CDMSI expert committees' work progress

7.1. Committee of Experts on Increasing Resilience of Media (MSI-RES)

The Secretariat updated the Bureau members on the two deliverables of the Committee of Experts on Increasing Resilience of Media (MSI-RES), the Draft Guidelines on the responsible implementation of artificial intelligence (AI) in journalism and Good practices for sustainable media financing. The Bureau members were informed of the updates and changes made in and after the final expert committee meeting (5-6 October 2023). It was noted, among others, that the Guidelines would use the definition of AI systems from the Draft Framework Convention on Artificial Intelligence to ensure the consistency of the Council of Europe's instruments. According to the rules of procedure, the finalised draft documents will be sent to the CDMSI for discussion and possible approval of the Draft Guidelines and endorsement of the recommendations made in Good practices at the 24th CDMSI plenary meeting. A deadline for written comments would be provided to the CDMSI delegates ahead of the meeting.

7.2. Committee of Experts on the Integrity of Online Information (MSI-INF)

The Secretariat informed the Bureau members of the fourth and final meeting of the Committee of Experts on the Integrity of Online Information (MSI-INF), which took place on 18-19 September 2023. The secretariat informed the Bureau that the experts reached an agreement regarding the content of the Draft Guidance Note on countering the spread of online mis- and disinformation through fact-checking and platform design solutions in a human rights compliant manner and its Explanatory Memorandum, that is providing a more detailed insight into the

principles underlying the Guidance Note. Moreover, the secretariat explained that most of the adjustments concerned the core definitions that have been reviewed taking into account the content of other legal instruments of the Council of Europe. According to the rules of procedure, the agreed draft documents will be sent to the CDMSI for approval ahead of the 24th CDMSI plenary meeting with a deadline for written comments.

7.3. Committee of Experts on Strategic Lawsuits against Public Participation (MSI-SLP)

The Secretariat updated the Bureau members on the draft Recommendation on countering the use of SLAPPs after the fourth and final meeting of the Committee of Experts on Strategic Lawsuits against Public Participation (MSI-SLP), held on the 17-18 October 2023. The draft Recommendation and accompanying draft Explanatory Memorandum were reviewed and finalised. Members, observers and participants to the MSI-SLP discussed and elaborated on the feedbacks received after their previous meeting, including during the public consultation phase. The Secretariat also provided information about the Report 'Countering SLAPPs: an imperative for a democratic society', unanimously adopted by Committee on Culture, Science, Education and Media of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe, on 10 October 2023. The Bureau members also heard comments from Mr Gerald Dunn, Secretary of the European Committee on Legal Cooperation (CDCJ), who informed the Bureau of remaining comments and suggestions received by the CDCJ Bureau on behalf of the CDCJ. The Bureau agreed that it was important to provide the opportunity to submit further comments on the draft Recommendation and its Explanatory Memorandum prior to their discussion and expected approval at the 24th CDMSI plenary meeting.

8. Digital Governance

8.1 <u>Council of Europe Committee on Artificial Intelligence (CAI)</u> - Information on latest developments in the work of the CAI

Mr Thomas Schneider, Chair of the Committee on Artificial Intelligence (CAI), provided information about the negotiation phase of the preparation of the Draft Framework Convention on Artificial Intelligence. In particular, he referred to the positions adopted by the European Union and the different point of views expressed during the negotiations regarding the scope of application of the Convention. In that context, members of the CAI have discussed whether the Convention should apply to both public and private sector actors equally. Moreover, Mr Schneider referred to other challenges that have been raised during the discussions in relation to national security rules that exist in some States.

8.2 Steps taken in the framework of the **Digital Partnership**

The Secretariat recalled how the Digital Partnership of the Council of Europe had been established and had developed and informed about the companies that are currently interested in collaborating with the Council of Europe. Moreover, the Bureau took note of the informal meeting of Committee of Ministers held on 14 September 2023 exploring the potential impact of immersive realities such as the Metaverse, on human rights, the rule of law and democracy. This meeting was also a first forum to discuss about the findings of the report the Council of Europe is jointly producing with IEEE on the Metaverse.

8.3 Council of Europe participation in events related to digital governance – EURODIG, IGF

The Bureau took note of the Council of Europe's involvement in <u>EuroDIG 2023</u>, held on 19-21 June 2023 in Tampere. The Council of Europe moderated the Opening Plenary, focusing on Digital Cooperation between African and European Parliamentarians. The discussions centred on countering cybercrime through collaboration among stakeholders. Beyond the initial

session, the Council of Europe's involvement extended to sessions addressing civil society oversight of law enforcement actions in cyberspace, underlining the organization's commitment to human rights, rule of law, and democracy in combating cybercrime. Additionally, the Council of Europe made significant contributions to sessions concerning Artificial Intelligence, focusing on trustworthy Artificial Intelligence, large language models for children and education, and the environmental impact of digital technologies. Moreover, the Council of Europe contributed to discussions about the impact of war and the protection of citizens during crises, drawing on the previously adopted Recommendation on Combating Hate Speech in May 2022.

In addition, the Bureau members were informed about the <u>IGF 2023</u> held in Kyoto on 8-12 October 2023. The Deputy Secretary General participated in the Council of Europe organised Artificial Intelligence Workshop and the High-Level Opening Ceremony, engaging with ministers and high-level representatives. Furthermore, the Council of Europe organised sessions on: Cybercrime, Immersive realities impact on human rights, rule of law and democracy and an Artificial Intelligence session addressing Artificial Intelligence impact on human rights, democracy, and the environment.

9. Preparation of the 24th meeting of the CDMSI: information and exchanges on issues of relevance to the CDMSI (planned exchanges)

The Secretariat informed the Bureau members of the updates, developments and projects which were planned to be discussed in the upcoming plenary of the CDMSI. Inter alia , the Bureau was informed of the planned presentation of the draft briefing note concerning the compilation of promising practices at national level of the implementation of Recommendation CM/Rec (2022)16 of the Committee of Ministers to member States on combating hate speech, jointly prepared with the Steering Committee on Anti-Discrimination, Diversity and Inclusion (CDADI). The Secretariat also provided information about the preparation of the No Hate Speech Week, to be held on the week of 17-21 June 2024. The Bureau members agreed to hold an exchange of views at their next Plenary meeting to enable members to provide relevant updates on national measures they have taken to prevent and combat hate speech, how they contribute to the implementation of the Recommendation, and to provide additional guidance on the finalisation of the compilation of promising practices.

The members of the Bureau were informed about the <u>Media and Literacy (MIL)</u> tool, a digital educational resource to raise awareness amongst users about their Convention rights and responsibilities in the digital environment, aiming to enhance users' autonomy and critical approach to navigating social media and other platforms and participating in public debate. The tool is currently being finalised and will be presented during the CDMSI plenary meeting.

Moreover, the Bureau was updated on the work of other sectors and bodies of the Council of Europe which will also be presented in the upcoming CDMSI plenary meeting.

10. Participation in events of relevance for the CDMSI

The Bureau was informed by the Secretariat on domestic, regional or international events of relevance for the CDMSI. These included, for instance, the recent <u>European Platform of Regulatory Authorities</u> meeting on the topic of <u>Public Service Media for the public good</u> and the future of content delivery. The CDMSI Secretariat presented its current work and its links to the EPRA's own work.

11. Other business

The Secretariat reminded that the next CDMSI plenary meeting will take place on 29 November - 1st December 2023 in Strasbourg
