

Terms of reference of the

Steering Committee on Media and Information Society (CDMSI)

Set up by the Committee of Ministers under Article 17 of the Statute of the Council of Europe and in accordance with [Resolution CM/Res\(2021\)3](#) on intergovernmental committees and subordinate bodies, their terms of reference and working methods.

Category: Steering committee

Duration: 1 January 2024 - 31 December 2027¹

Programme: Anchoring democratic values in European societies

Sub-programme: Freedom of expression and information – Safety of journalists

Main tasks

Under the authority of the Committee of Ministers, and bearing in mind the Council of Europe legal standards, the case law of the European Court of Human Rights and the findings and recommendations of the relevant monitoring mechanisms, the CDMSI steers the Council of Europe's work in the fields of freedom of expression, media, digital governance and other information society-related issues. The CDMSI advises the Committee of Ministers and takes part in standard-setting activities on all questions within its area of expertise, including freedom, independence, pluralism and diversity of media, safety of journalists, support for professional journalism, protection and promotion of human rights, in particular freedom of expression as protected by Article 10 of the European Convention on Human Rights, both online and offline. The CDMSI facilitates and promotes co-operation among Council of Europe member States by developing common policies, reviewing their implementation and fulfilling any other activity which might be assigned to it by the Committee of Ministers.

In particular, the CDMSI is instructed to:

- i. take due account of the Reykjavik Declaration² in conducting its activities and submit proposals for its implementation as appropriate;
- ii. take account of the relevant key findings and challenges set out in the Secretary General's 2023 Report on the state of democracy, human rights and rule of law "An Invitation to Recommit to the Values and Standards of the Council of Europe";
- iii. evaluate, plan and carry out standard-setting activities in areas within its expertise, including review and consolidation of existing instruments, in the light of the digital transformation;
- iv. promote and facilitate awareness raising on Council of Europe standards and their implementation by member States in its fields of competence;
- v. identify emerging issues and challenges to member States in areas within its expertise, conduct studies and legal analyses on freedom of expression and media-related issues, with a special focus on the challenges arising for freedom of expression from digital transformation and undue influence on democratic processes, and make proposals to the Committee of Ministers;
- vi. ensure follow-up to the conclusions and recommendations of the Council of Europe Conference of Ministers responsible for Media and Information Society (10-11 June 2021), and Committee of Ministers' decisions taken subsequent to the Ministerial Conference;
- vii. oversee the implementation of Recommendation CM/Rec(2016)4 on the protection of journalism and safety of journalists and other media actors: promote and disseminate the Implementation Guide to the Recommendation as a supporting tool to boost concrete measures and initiatives; co-ordinate a comprehensive campaign to promote the protection of journalism and the safety of journalists and support corresponding campaigns at national level; for the purposes of the campaign, provide guidance for the elaboration of national action plans on the safety of journalists and other media actors and facilitate best practices sharing in the field;
- viii. support the implementation of the documents adopted by the Council of Europe in the sphere of the freedom of expression and digital technologies, in the light of the most recent developments in the field;
- ix. co-operate with other relevant Council of Europe bodies such as the T-PD and the CDCJ in field of the protection of personal data and the right to private life where relevant;
- x. follow and, as appropriate, contribute to the substantive aspects of co-operation programmes with Council of Europe member States and support activities within national initiatives in the field of the media and information society;
- xi. take into consideration in its thematic work the European Convention on Human Rights and the evolving case law of the European Court of Human Rights;
- xii. follow the implementation of the non-binding instruments that it has prepared as well as conventions for which it has been given supervision by the Committee of Ministers; without prejudice to the mandates of intergovernmental committees of the Council of Europe that already follow the work of monitoring mechanisms, follow the activities of the relevant monitoring and other bodies or convention mechanisms;
- xiii. orient and oversee the activities carried out by its subordinate bodies, notably the Committee of Experts on online safety and empowerment of content creators and users (MSI-eSEC) and the Committee of Experts on the implications of generative AI for freedom of expression (MSI-AI) (cf. separate terms of reference);
- xiv. provide input to the Committee of Ministers in view of the regular, high-level dialogue with member States and partners on delivering on the Reykjavik Principles for Democracy;
- xv. raise-awareness about Council of Europe standards and tools in its field of competence in the member States and beyond, through the neighbourhood policy and in other international and global fora where relevant;

- xvi. hold an exchange of views annually in order to evaluate its activities and advise the Committee of Ministers and the Secretary General on future priorities in its sector, including possible new activities and those that might be discontinued;
- xvii. take due account of the following mainstreamed perspectives in the performance of its tasks: gender, youth, children’s rights, rights of persons with disabilities, and Roma and Traveller³ issues;
- xviii. where relevant, contribute to strengthening meaningful engagement with civil society organisations and national human rights institutions in its work;
- xix. in accordance with decisions CM/Del/Dec(2013)1168/10.2 of the Committee of Ministers, carry out, at regular intervals, within the limits of the available resources and bearing in mind its priorities, an examination of some or all of the conventions for which it has been given responsibility,⁴ in co-operation, where appropriate, with the relevant convention-based bodies, and report back to the Committee of Ministers;
- xx. contribute to the achievement of, and review progress towards, the UN 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, in particular with regards to Goal 5: Gender equality and Goal 16: Peace, Justice and Strong;
- xxi. where relevant, take account of, and propose effective responses to, the challenges posed in its field of competence by the Russian Federation’s war of aggression against Ukraine.
