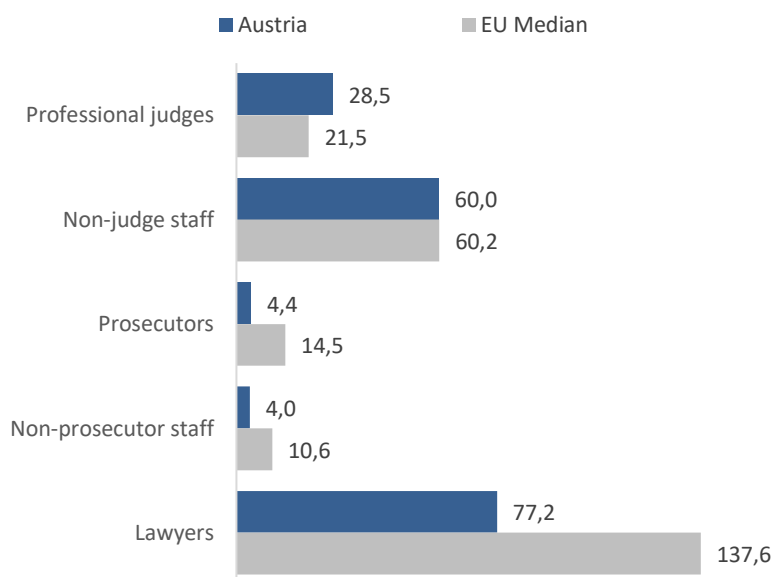

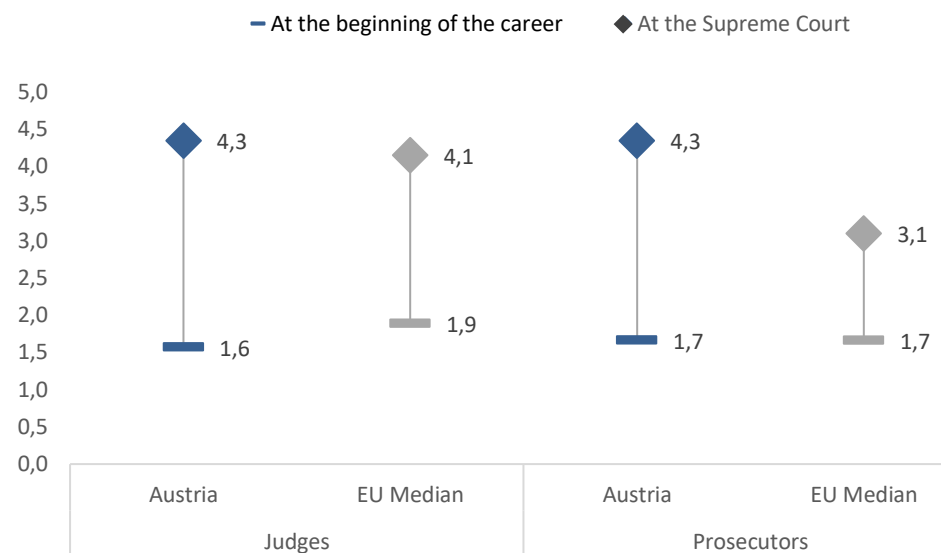

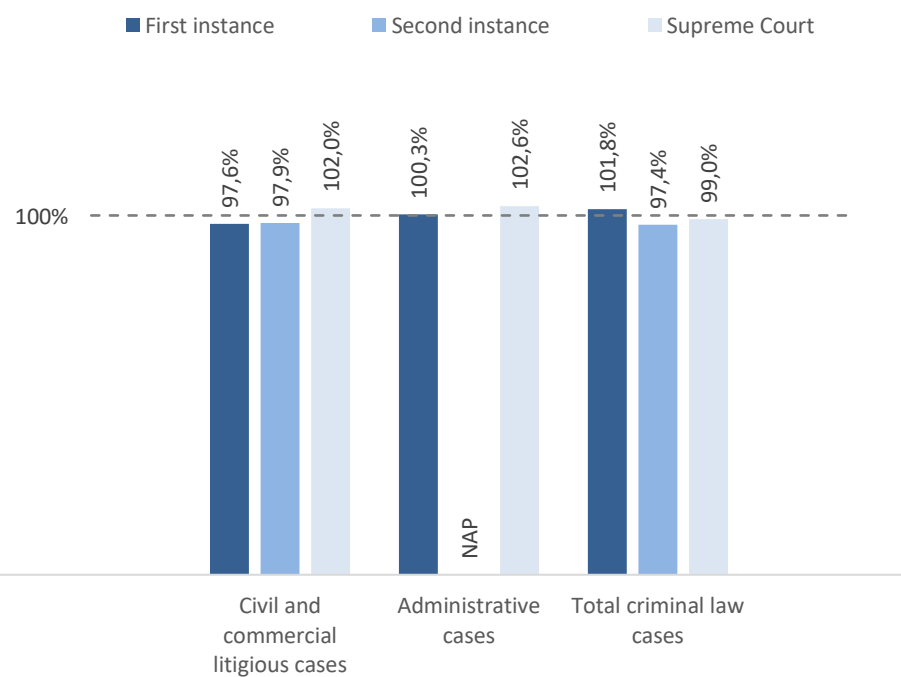


Gross salaries of judges and prosecutors vs average annual salary in 2023

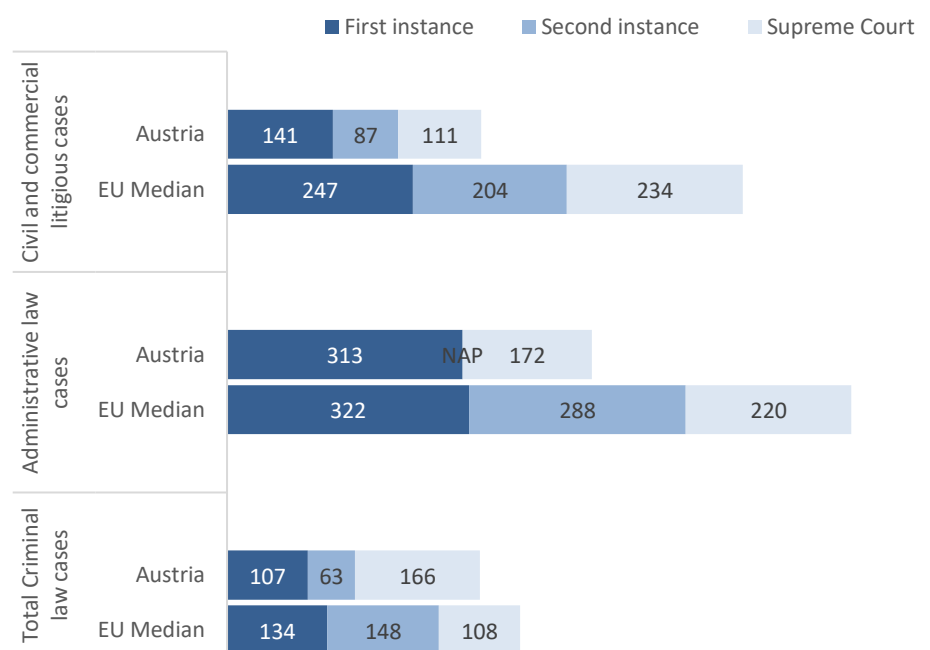

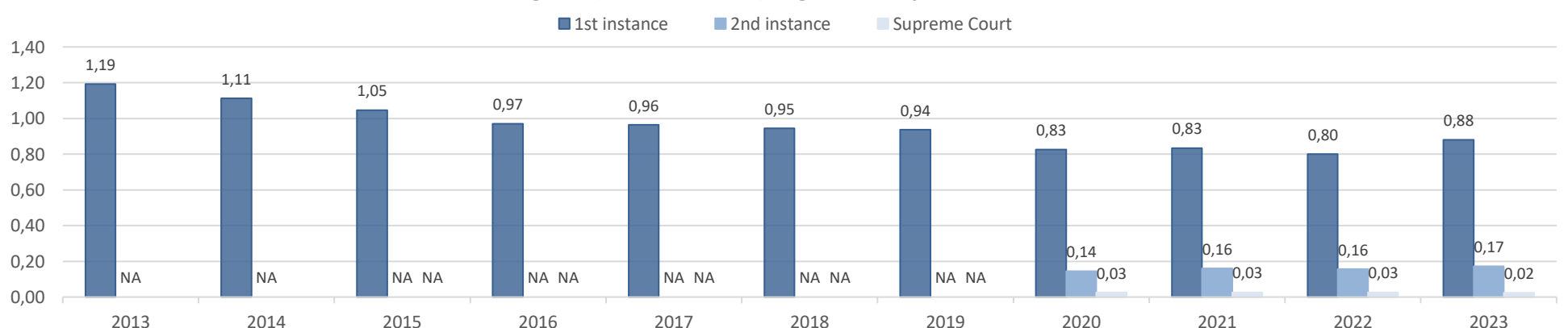


Disposition Time by instance and by matter in 2023 (days)

1. Judicial organisation in Austria (2023 data)

In 2023, Austria has 150 courts as legal entities, comprising 131 courts of general jurisdiction and 19 specialized courts.

Among the 131 courts of general jurisdiction, 126 function as first-instance courts, 4 as second-instance courts, and 1 as a third-instance court. Specifically, the 113 District Courts and 13 Regional Courts of General Jurisdiction serve as first-instance courts. It should be noted that 7 other Regional Courts, which have specialized jurisdiction, are not included in this count but are classified as specialized first-instance courts.

A distinctive feature of Austria's 20 Regional Courts is that, although they are primarily first-instance courts, some also have jurisdiction over appeals against decisions made by District Courts.

The 4 Higher Regional Courts handle appeals in all civil and criminal cases, while the Supreme Court is the highest instance for civil and criminal matters.

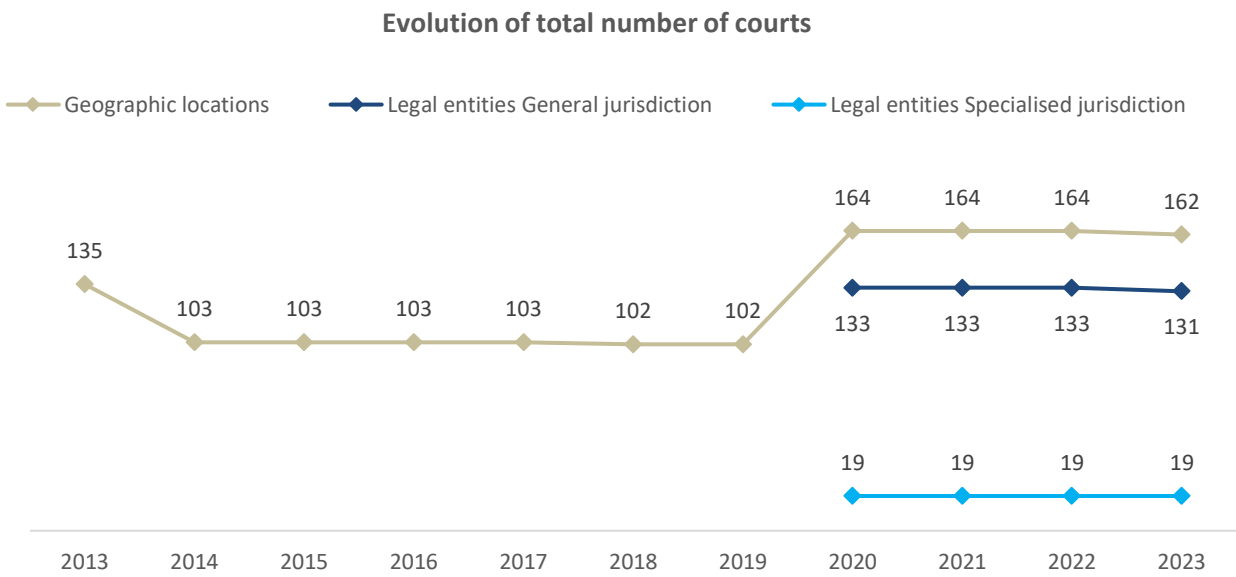
The Supreme Administrative court is the highest instance in administrative matters.

Among the 19 legal entities of specialised jurisdiction, 18 are of first instance and are competent for all legal matters not reserved to District courts. Within this total we have the 7 Regional courts of specialised competence.

Geographically, Austria has 162 court locations, of which 156 are first-instance courts.

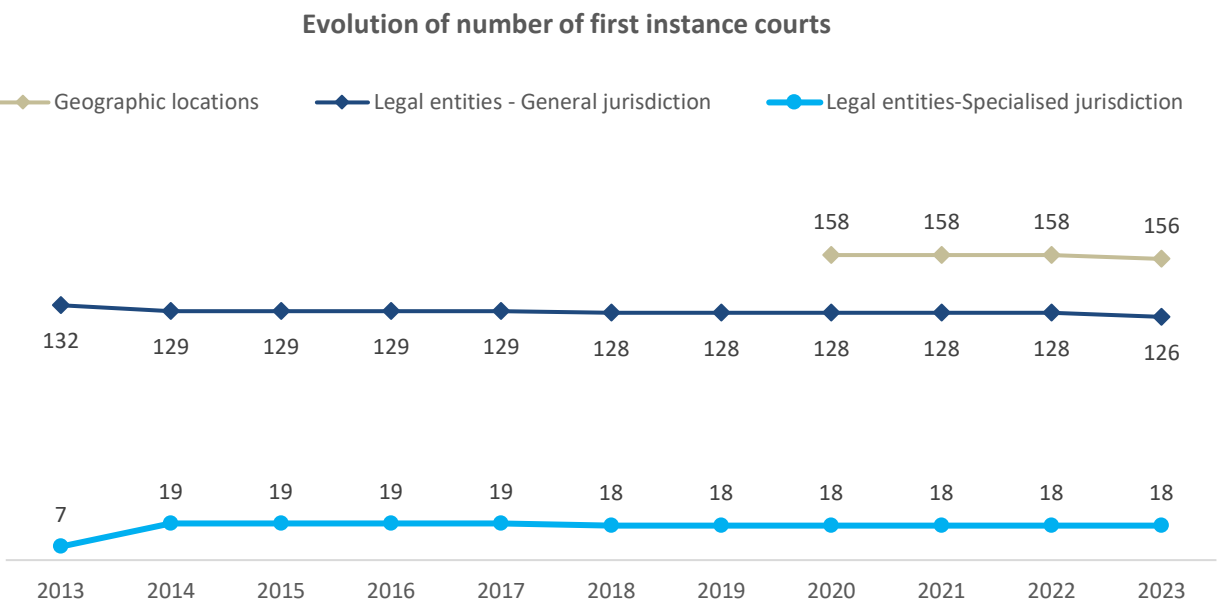

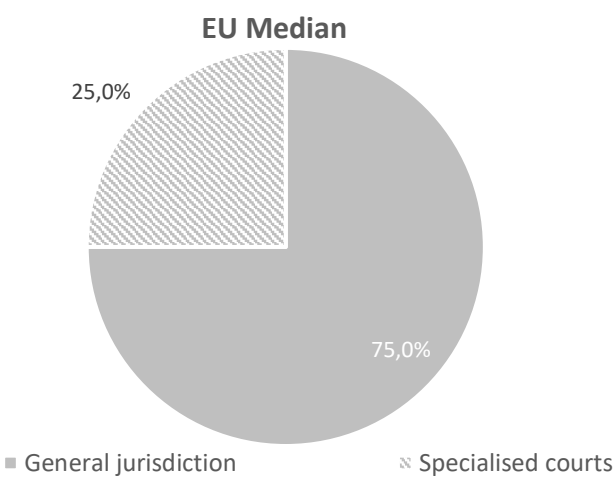
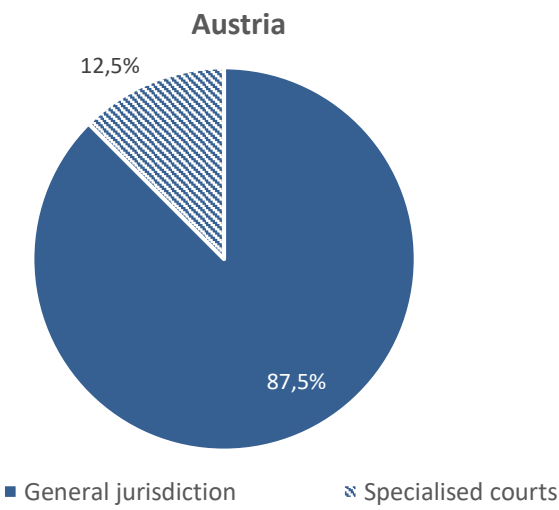

The distribution between first instance general jurisdiction courts and first instance specialised courts in Austria is 87,5% - 12,5%, which is close to distribution tendency in EU: 75,0% - 25,0%.

As a rule, every court handles all judicial issues; however, in the largest Austrian cities, certain courts are specialised. In Vienna, there are six specialised courts (civil cases, criminal cases, commercial cases [2x], labour and social welfare cases, administrative cases), and in Graz, there are two (civil cases, criminal cases).

Since there are special courts for civil law cases in Vienna and Graz, which cannot be individually selected here, and because of the Court for Labour and Social Welfare cases in Vienna (Arbeits- und Sozialgericht Wien), which is competent for labour and some social welfare cases, the total number of individual courts does not correspond to the total number of specialised courts.

The two "other specialised first instance courts" are the two civil law courts (in Vienna and Graz), while the two specialised criminal courts, also located in Vienna and Graz, focus on the enforcement of criminal sanctions.

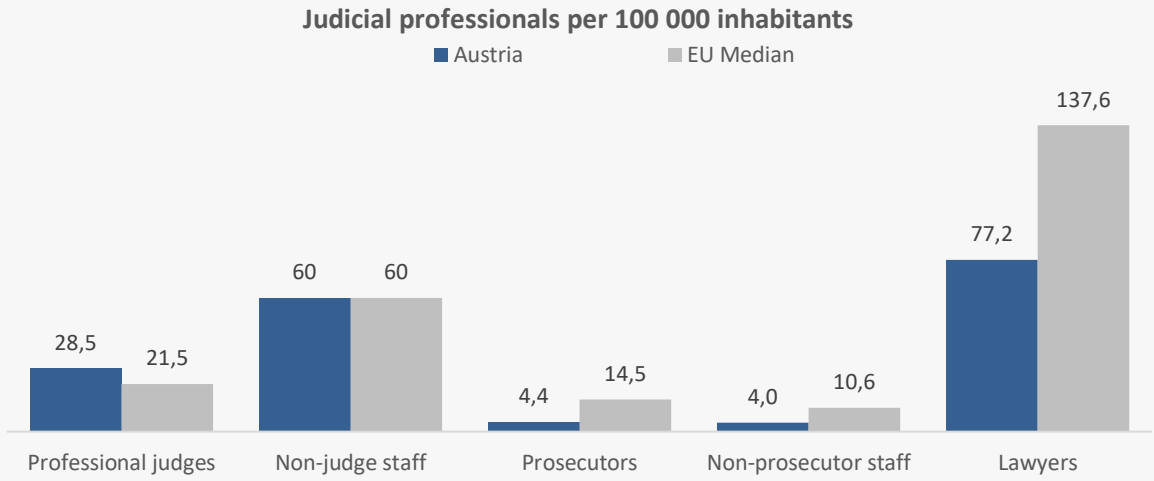
It is noteworthy that one commercial court in Vienna, both civil law courts in Vienna and Graz, and both courts specialised in the enforcement of criminal sanctions, also serve as second instance courts. Since January 1st, 2014, there have been 11 newly established courts for administrative law in Austria: 9 regional administrative courts, 1 Federal administrative court, and 1 Federal Tax Court.

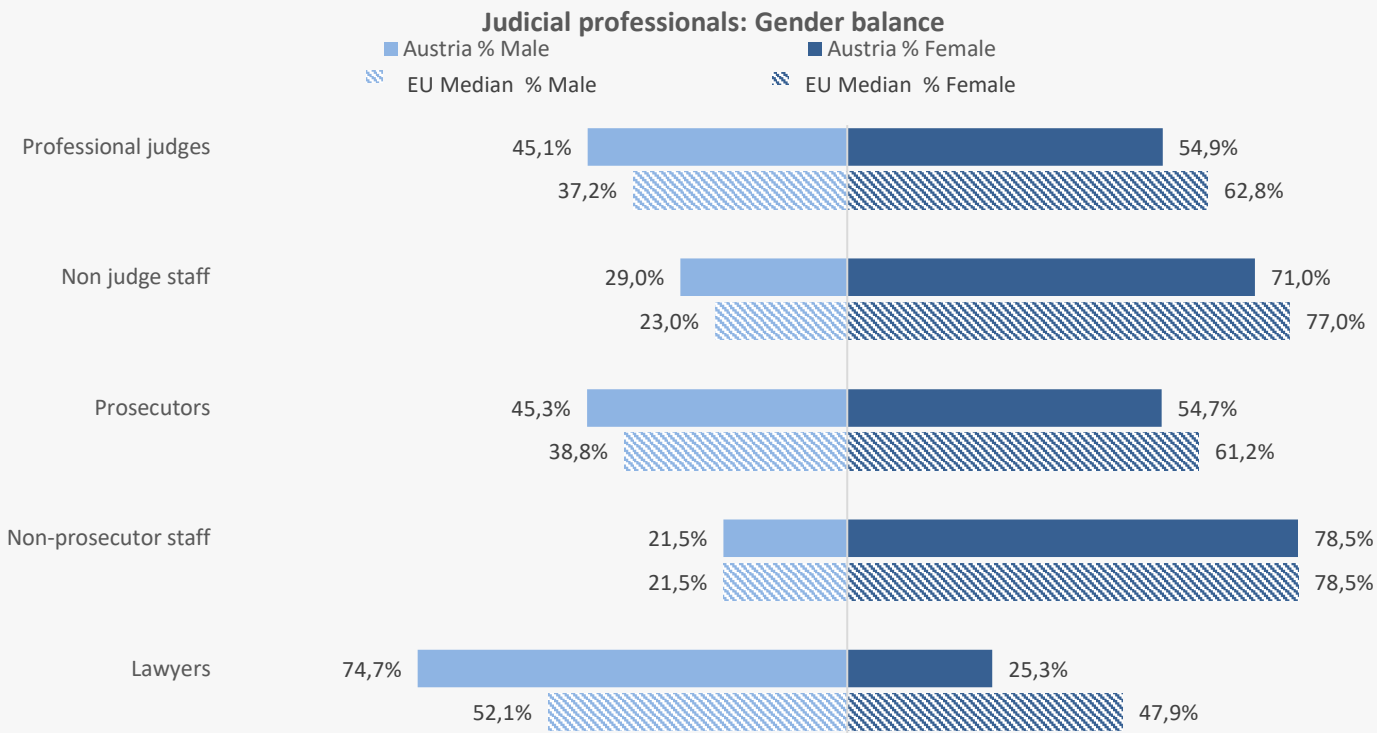

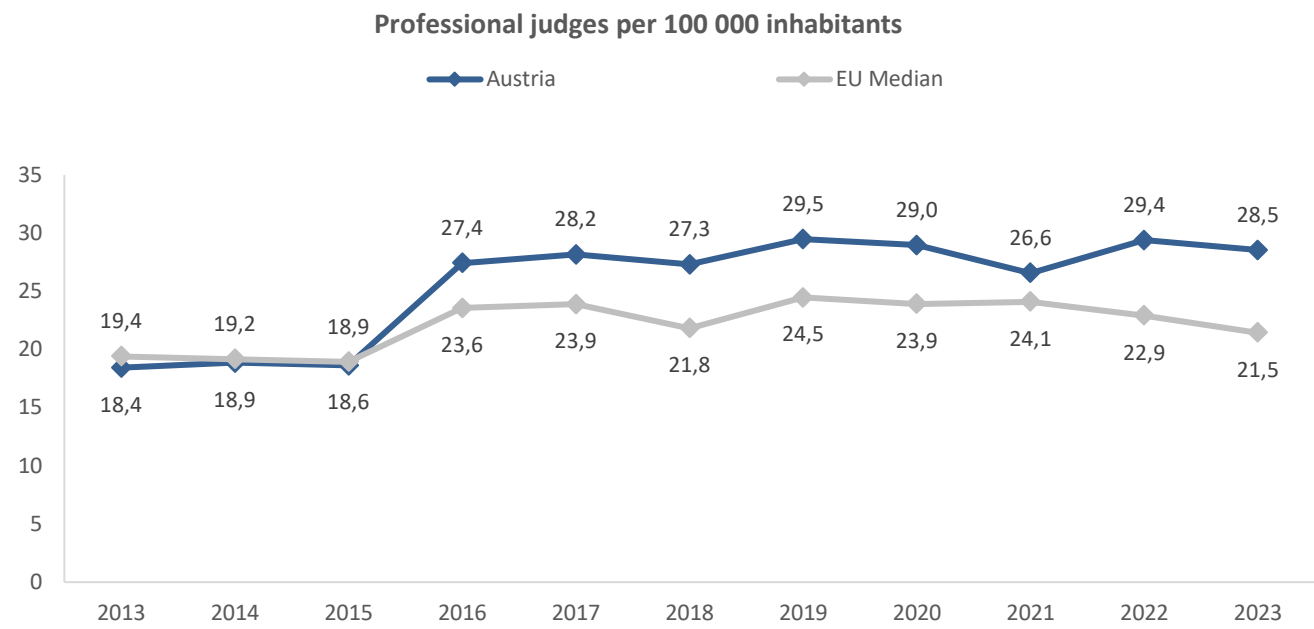

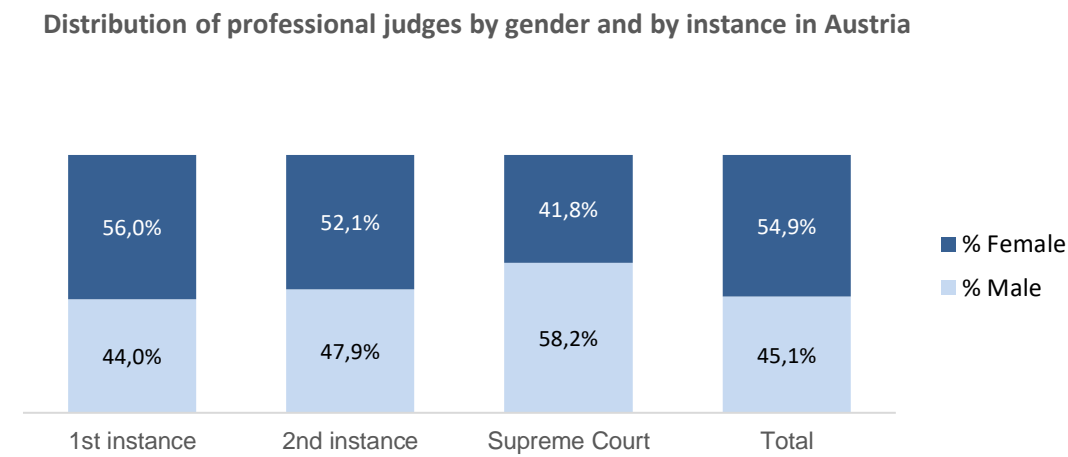
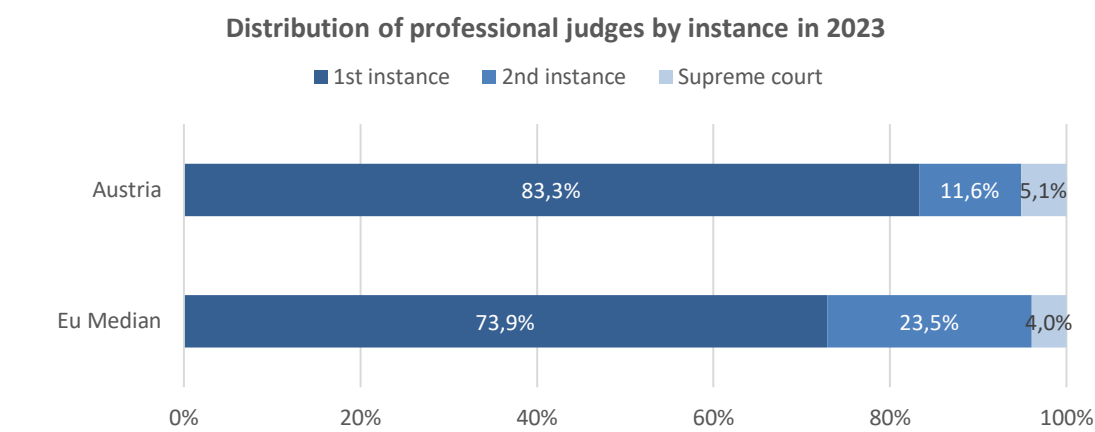


According to 2023 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Austria is 2 614, which is -2,4% less than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Austria, there are 28,5 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 21,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants)

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 1 434, which represents 54,9% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 2 177 are sitting in the first instance courts (of which 1 220 are female); 303 are sitting in the second instance courts (of which 158 are female) and 134 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of which 56 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, Austria has more first instace judges than the EU median, while the second instance judges are less numerous than the EU median.

In Austria, the way judges are assigned to different levels of the judiciary has some unique features. First-instance judges work in District Courts, some Regional Courts, and Administrative Courts. Second-instance judges work in some Regional Courts and Courts of Appeal. At the highest level, judges serve in the Supreme Court and the Supreme Administrative Court.

As regards the distribution Male/Female, it has to be specified that female judges constitute the majority at first and second instance, but not at the level of the Supreme court.

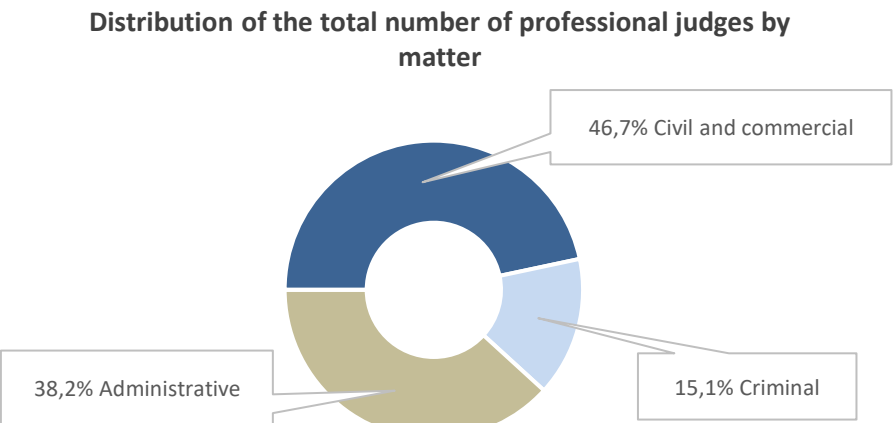

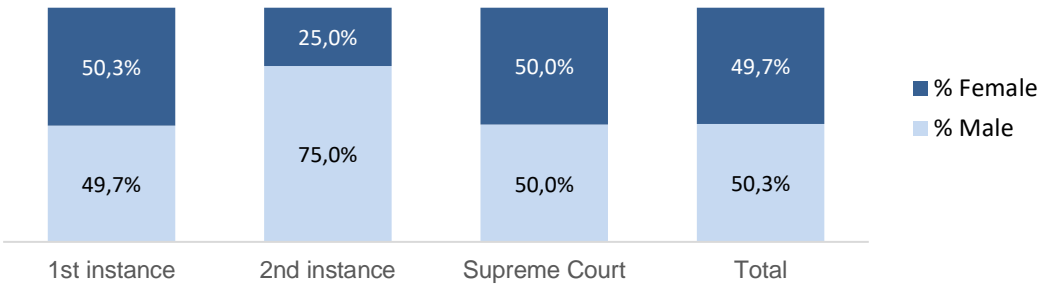

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Austria



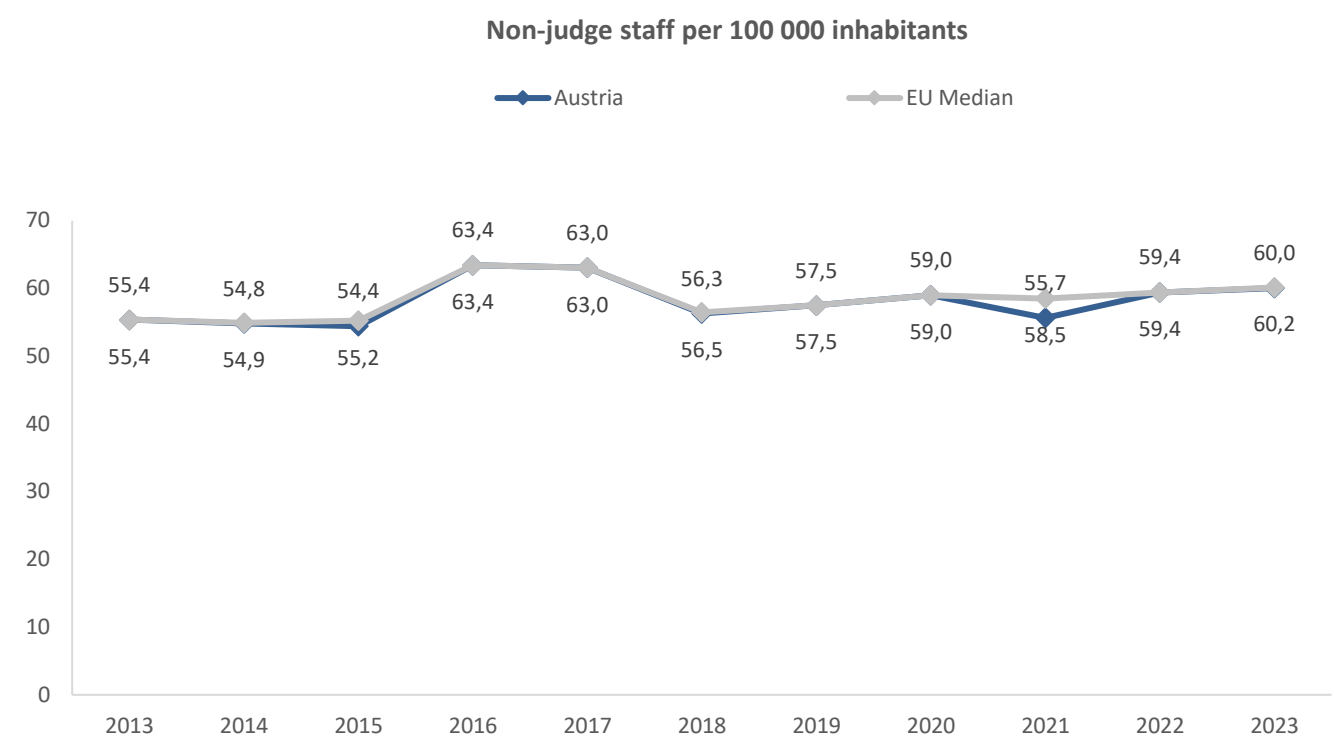
In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 74, which represents 49,7% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 143 are sitting in first instance courts (of which 72 are female); 4 are sitting in second instance courts (of which 1 is female) and 2 are sitting in Supreme Court (of which 1 is female).

Starting from 2022, data correspond to persons exercising the function of court president. Previous data were expressed in full time equivalent.

In 2023, Austria has 5 498 non-judge staff (of which 3 901 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 1,6%.

In 2023, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 59,4 in 2022 to 60,0 in 2023).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 29,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2022 to 28,5 in 2023.

In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:

- 697 Rechtspfleger (or similar bodies) with judicial or quasi-judicial tasks having autonomous competence and whose decisions could be subject to appeal (among which 453 are Female);
- 767 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of which 504 are Female);
- 3 484 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of which 2 582 are Female);
- 105 technical staff (of which 38 are Female);
- 445 other (of which 324 are Female);

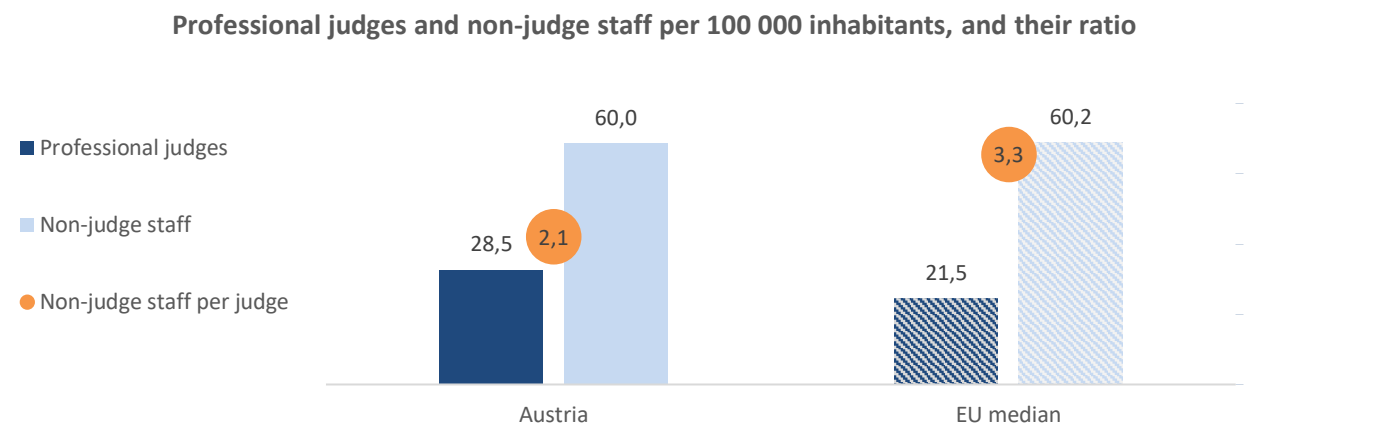
Starting in 2021, the classification of “Kanzlei” staff has changed. They are no longer categorized as “other staff” but are now included under “staff in charge of various administrative tasks and court management.” Additionally, the definition of “technical staff” has been expanded to include personnel working in courts’ IT departments. As a result, the category of “other staff” now exclusively comprises trainees (including those training as Rechtspfleger) and staff representation members. Most trainees focus on case file management, while a smaller group receives training in IT support. In recent years, significant efforts have been made to improve the methodology for presenting data related to Q52 and to ensure greater alignment with the CEPEJ categorization.

Non-judge (judicial) staff: this category includes personnel tasked with assisting judges, such as registrars, who handle case preparation, provide support during hearings, and assist in drafting decisions. The reported number has increased this year as case managers are now included in this category by the competent department. Previously, counting case managers was challenging, but it has now become feasible.

Other non-judge staff: there has been a significant increase in the number of Rechtspfleger candidates compared to the previous year, with a large proportion of these candidates being female.

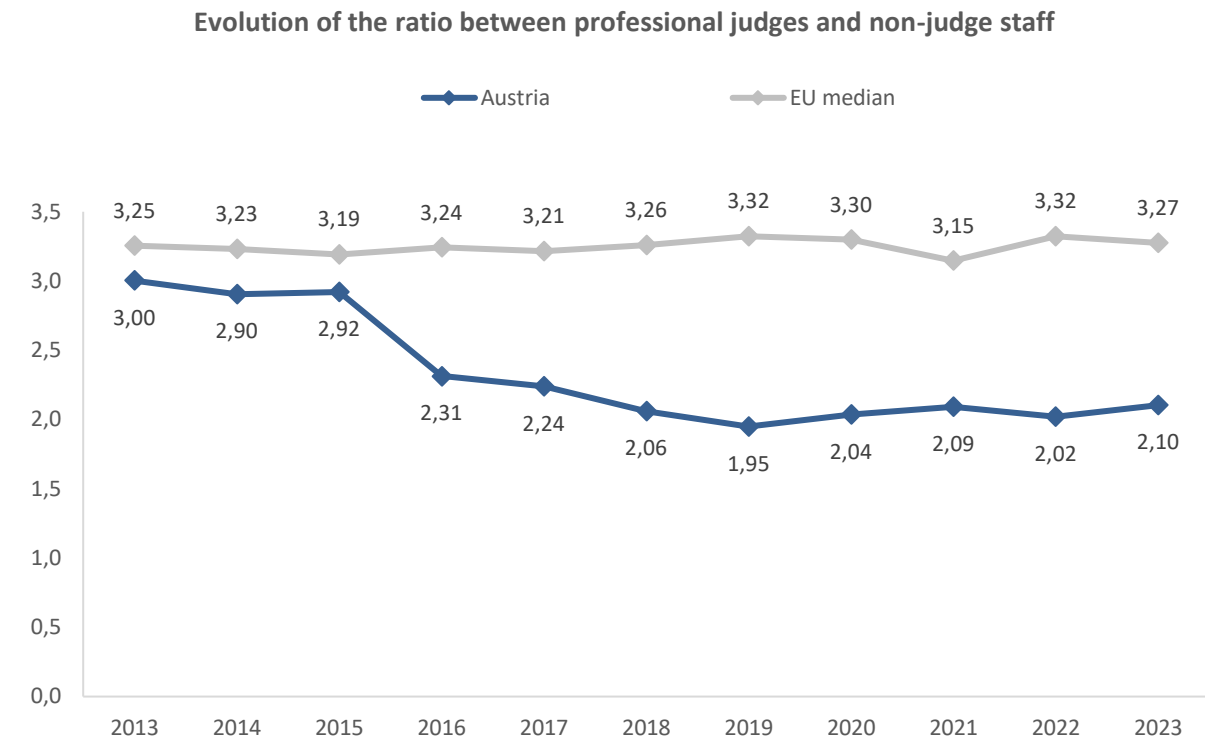

In Austria, there are 28,5 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 21,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 2,1 non-judge staff per judge. There has been a small increase compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 2,0 non-judge staff per judge.

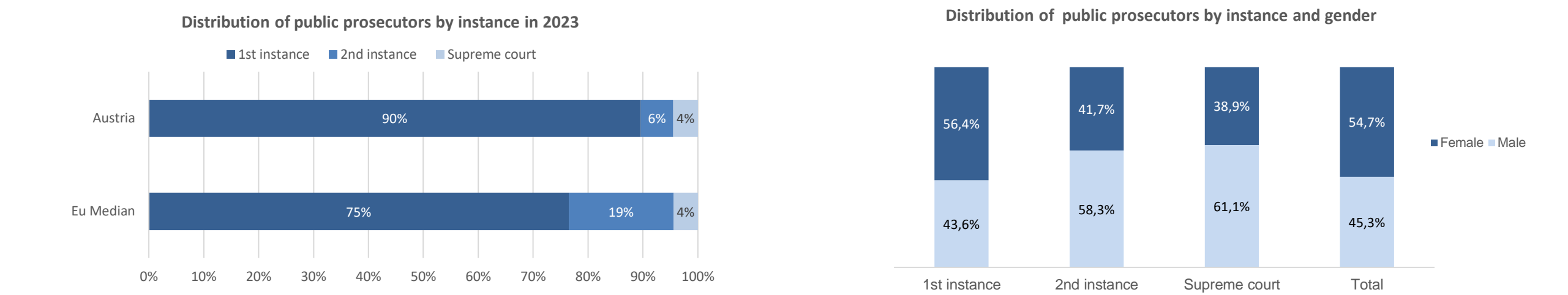

In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 221, which represents 54,7% of the total number of prosecutors.

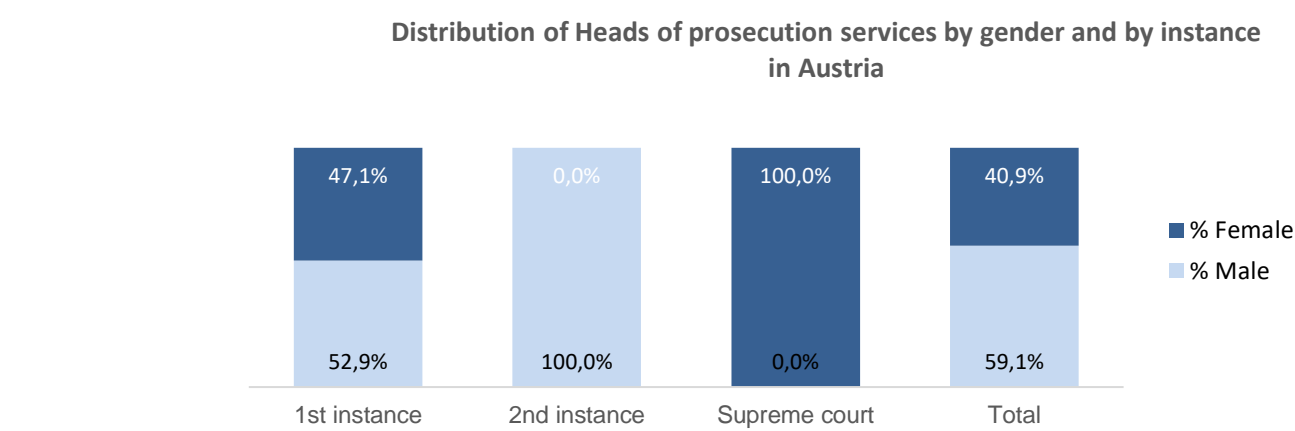
The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 362 in first instance (of which 204 are female); 24 are in second instance (of which 10 are female) and 18 in final instance (of which 7 are female).

As regards the distribution male/female, it has to be specified that female prosecutors constitute the majority only at first instance.

In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution services (all instances) is 9, which represents 40,9% of the total number of Heads of prosecution services.

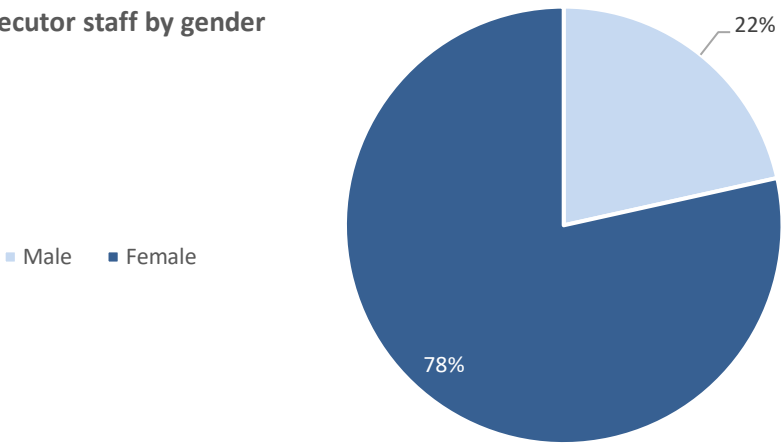

Non-prosecutor staff by gender

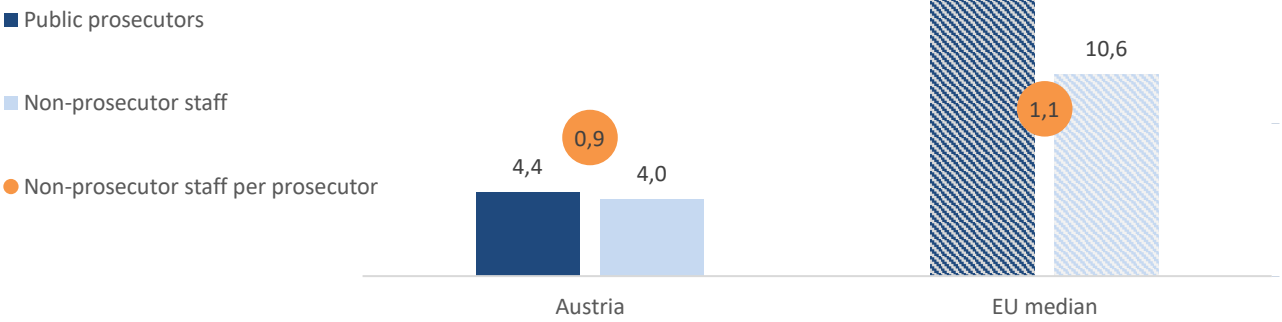

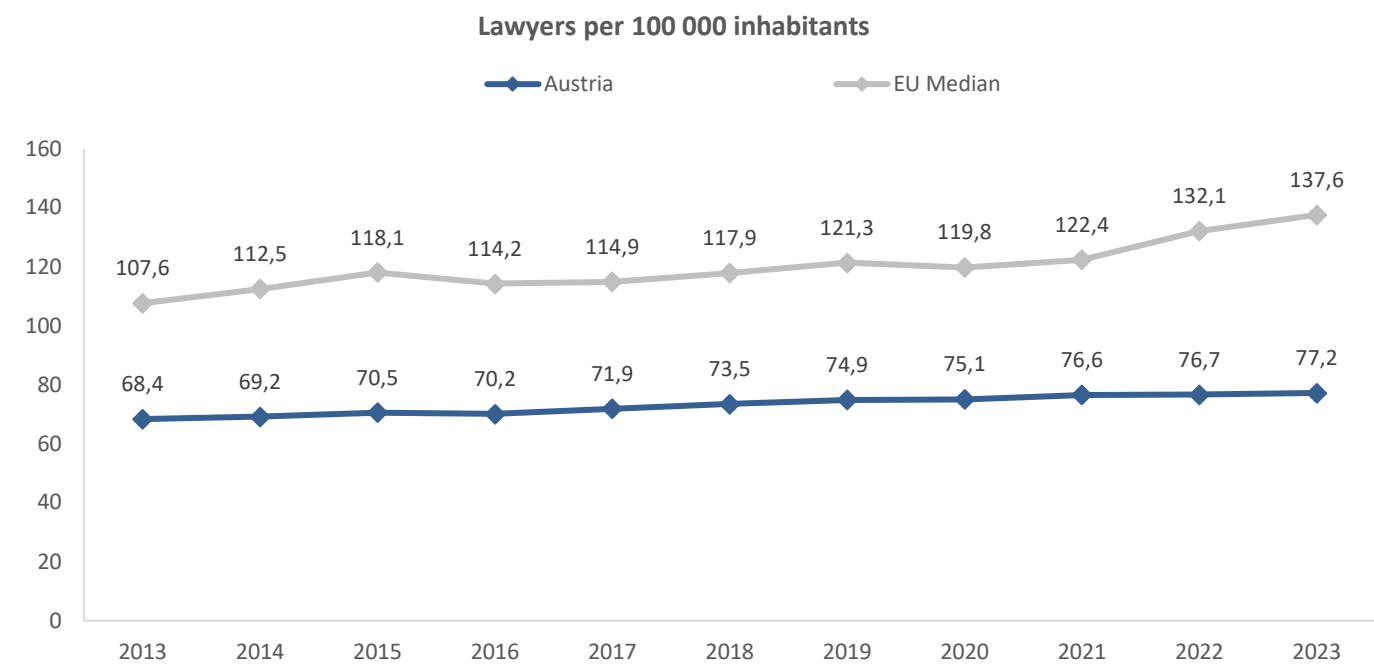

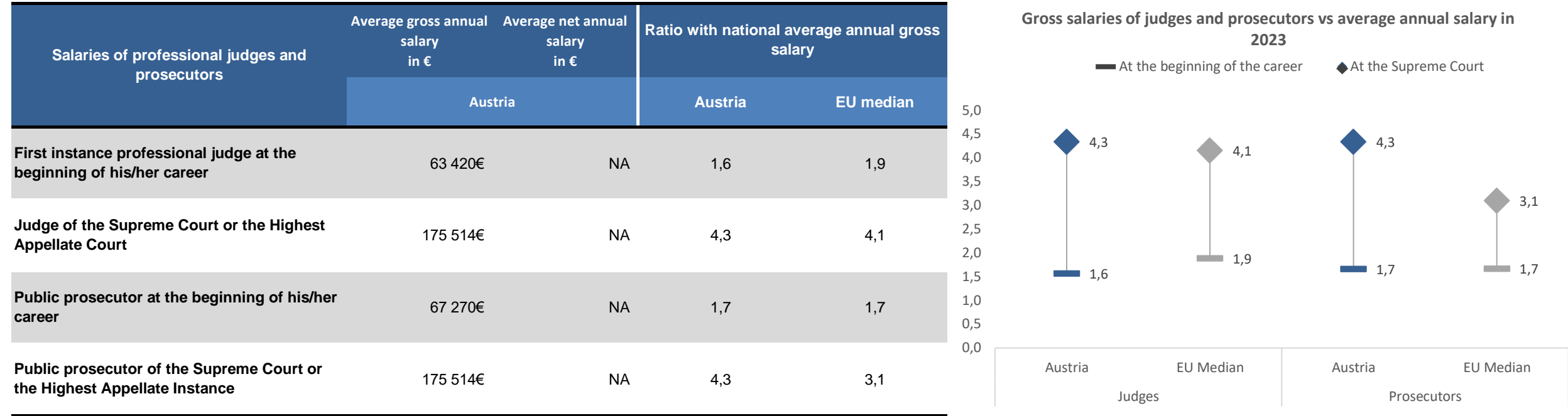


In 2023, there are 7 073 lawyers, which is 1,3% more than in 2022.
There are 1 786 female lawyers which is 25% of the total.

Austria has 77,2 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is below the EU median of 137,6 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

Statistics from the Austrian Bar Association (Österreichischer Rechtsanwaltskammertag) as of December 31, 2023 (accessible at www.oerak.at) include only lawyers registered on the Austrian lawyers' list and established European lawyers listed under the Lawyers' Directives as of that date. The data do not include legal advisors, as this profession or type of service provider does not exist in Austria.

Salaries of professional judges and prosecutors at beginning of a career and at the highest instance



In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 144 856€.

According to 2023 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Austria is 63 420€, which is slightly above the EU median of 58 128€ (9% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 1,6 times higher (the EU median is 1,9).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 58 623€ to 266 974€. Austria's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is 48% above the EU median of 118 595€.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 101 592€.

In 2023, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Austria of 67 270€ is quite above the EU median of 49 953€ (35% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,7 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 456€ and the maximum is 199 670€. Austria's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is 87% above the EU median of 93 759€.

Judges and prosecutors are assigned to specific pay grades based on their position within the judicial system (e.g., regional courts, supreme court, administrative courts) and receive a corresponding base salary as stipulated in § 66 RStDG and § 190 RStDG, with salaries increasing every four years by a fixed amount up to a maximum.

Senior roles, such as heads of district courts, vice presidents or presidents of courts of first instance, and heads of senior or regular public prosecutor's offices, are entitled to a service allowance ranging from EUR 171.90 to EUR 1,332.30 (as of December 31, 2022), which is included in the monthly salary.

In principle, the salary covers all additional work performed by judges and prosecutors in terms of both volume and time.

For administrative courts, a first-instance professional judge at the start of his/her career earns a gross annual salary of EUR 86,440 (net EUR 55,850), while a judge of the Administrative Supreme Court earns approximately EUR 150,000 gross annually.

The Public Authority's Liability Act (Amtshaftungsgesetz) governs the liability of the state and other legal entities for the misconduct of their employees when exercising public authority.

This includes liability for damages caused during court proceedings and decisions, such as those arising from undue delays, wrongful arrests, or wrongful convictions. Liability under the Act requires proof of both wrongfulness and fault. However, in cases of wrongful arrest or criminal conviction, compensation may also be sought under the Penal Law's Compensation Act (Strafrechtliches Entschädigungsgesetz), which does not require proof of fault by the authorities.

Procedures for claiming compensation are outlined in §§ 8 ff. Amtshaftungsgesetz and §§ 9 ff. Strafrechtliches Entschädigungsgesetz. An injured party may, free of charge, request the legal entity responsible for the damages to issue a written statement within three months, indicating whether the claim is accepted, partially accepted, or rejected. If the claim is denied in whole or in part, the injured party retains the right to file a complaint in court.

The regional court (Landesgericht) responsible for civil matters in the jurisdiction where the legal infringement occurred has exclusive jurisdiction over such claims. Compensation is financed from the general budget of the Public Authority, and liability is unlimited. Indemnities are provided exclusively in monetary form, with no fixed tariffs or standardized compensation amounts. Instead, the compensation awarded depends on the specific circumstances of each case, including the extent of the damage suffered and the degree of fault attributed to the Public Authority.

According to § 67 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CCP), victims are entitled to seek reimbursement for damages caused by a criminal act or compensation for the impairment of their legally protected interests. The extent of the damage or impairment must be determined ex officio, using the results of the criminal proceedings or through simple additional investigations. If an expert is appointed to assess bodily injuries or health-related damages, they must also evaluate the periods of pain experienced by the victim.

The payments made under the Public Authority's Liability Act, the European Convention on Human Rights, and the Penal Law's Compensation Act cannot be precisely quantified for individual cases due to varying circumstances. Only the total amounts can be reported.

In 2023, payments related to the Public Authority's Liability Act and the European Convention on Human Rights in judicial matters amounted to €1,004,651.63, while payments under the Penal Law's Compensation Act totaled €532,659.80. The more than 20% increase in payments compared to the previous year is attributable to the fact that these payments are determined by decisions of independent courts. Such decisions are beyond the control of judicial administration and are inherently subject to significant fluctuations.

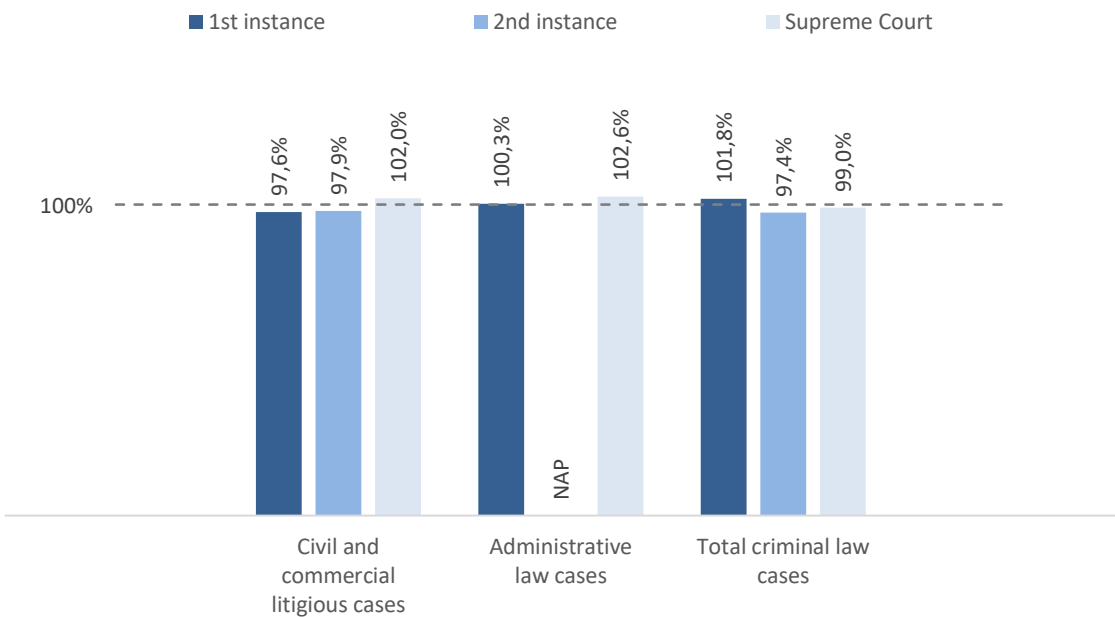

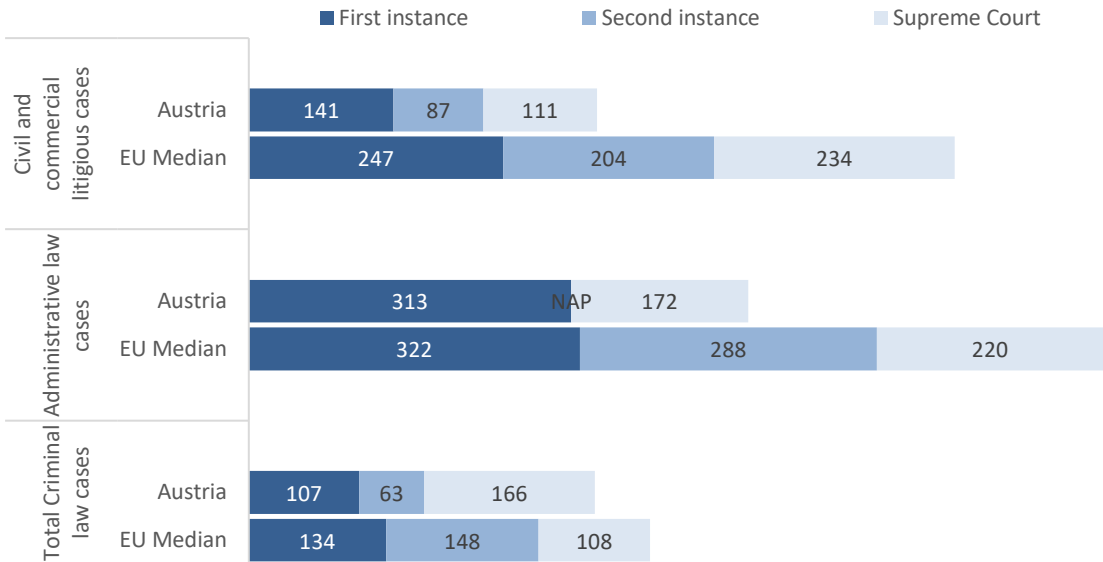

In 2023, Austria recorded the shortest duration for criminal proceedings (336 days for all the three instances together), consistent with the trend observed across the European Union.

Notably, civil proceedings in Austria were as brief as criminal ones, with an average duration of 339 days—significantly shorter than the EU average of 686 days.

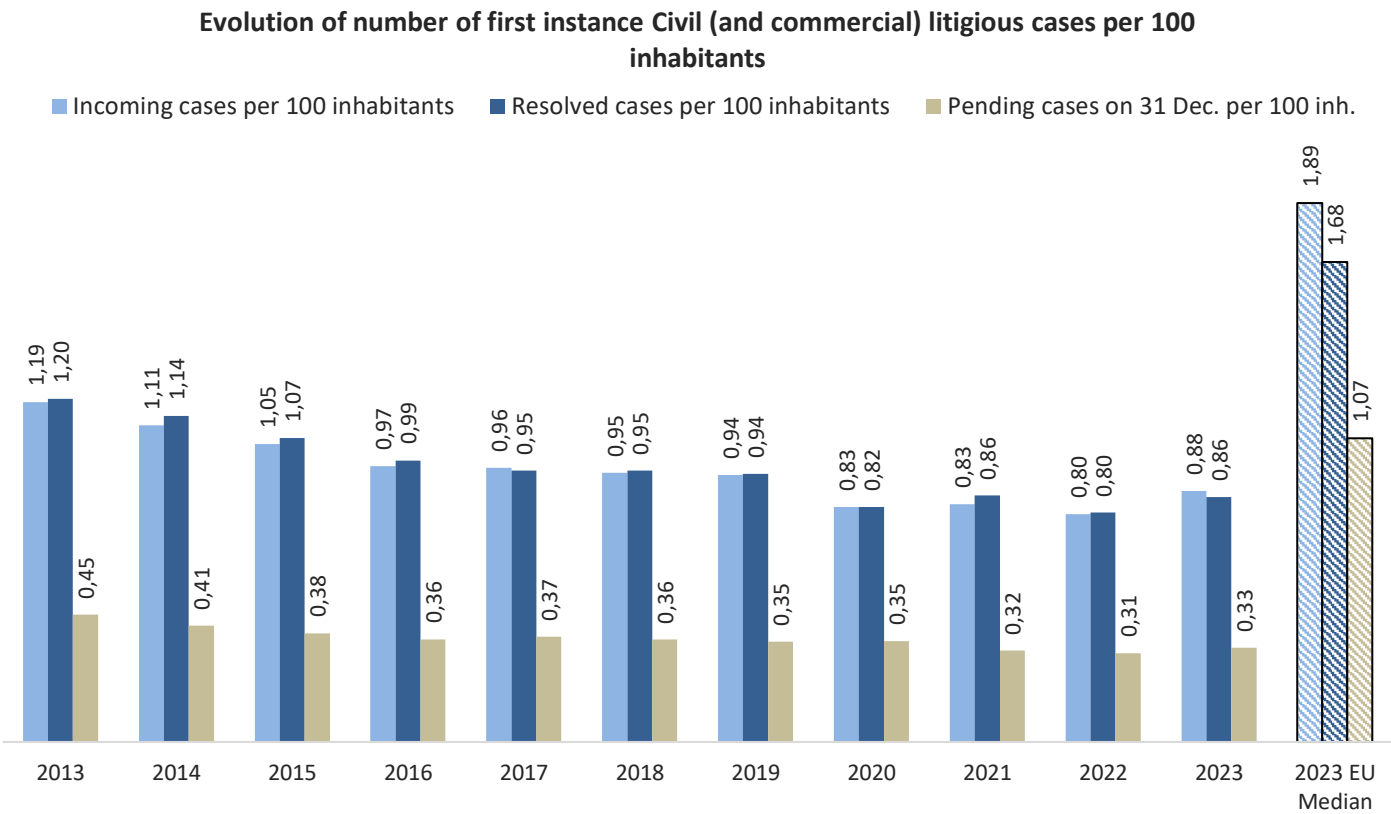
As in the EU, administrative proceedings in Austria were the longest among the three categories (criminal, civil, and administrative), but their duration was nearly half the EU average of 830 days. This can be attributed to Austria's two-instance system for administrative matters, consisting of a first and a final appellate instance.

Overall, in 2023, Austria's Clearance Rate exceeded the 100% benchmark in administrative law cases, first instance criminal, and in third-instance civil and commercial matters. Meanwhile, the Disposition Time indicator was below EU medians across most categories, except for third-instance criminal cases, where it slightly surpassed the median. In this regard, it should be recalled that Austria presents the peculiarity to encompass in the total number of third instance criminal cases data on administrative criminal cases before the Supreme Administrative Court.

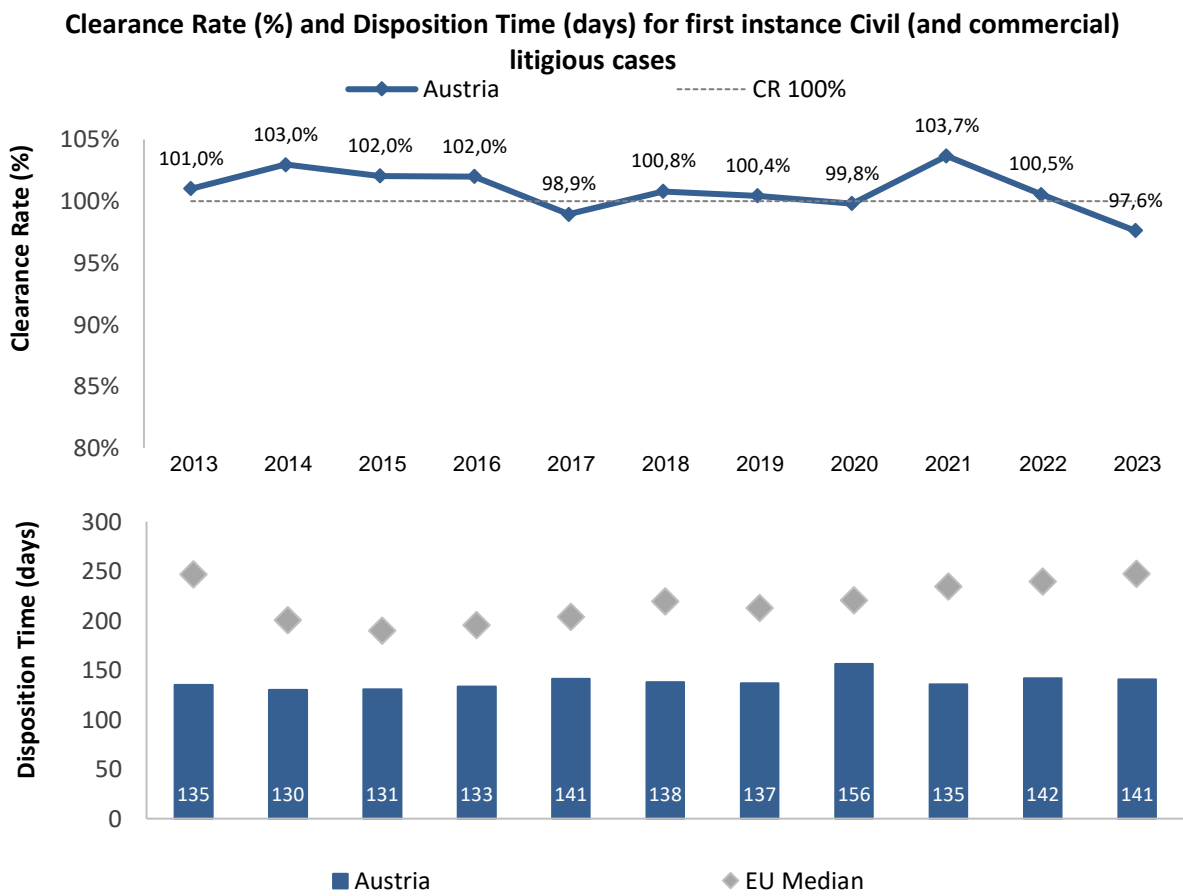

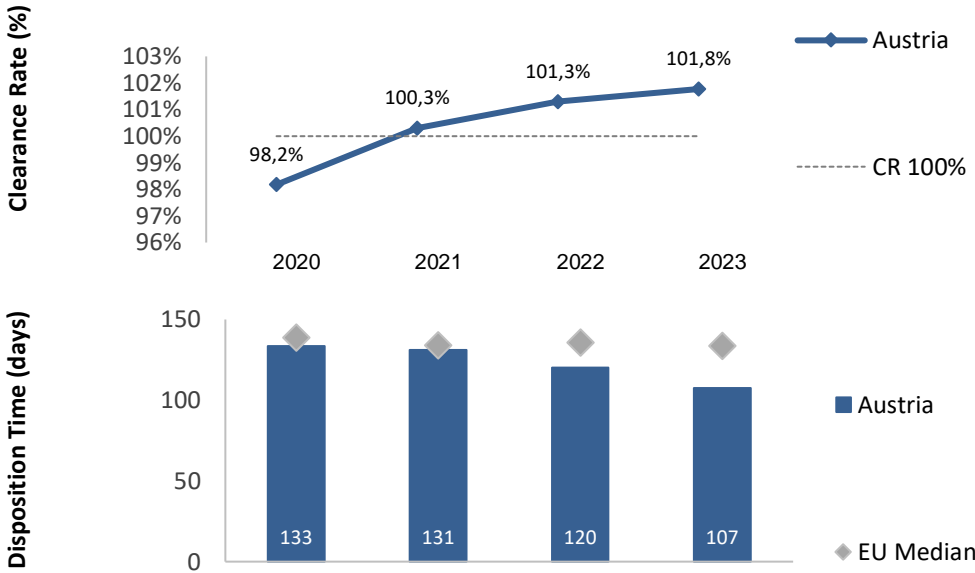

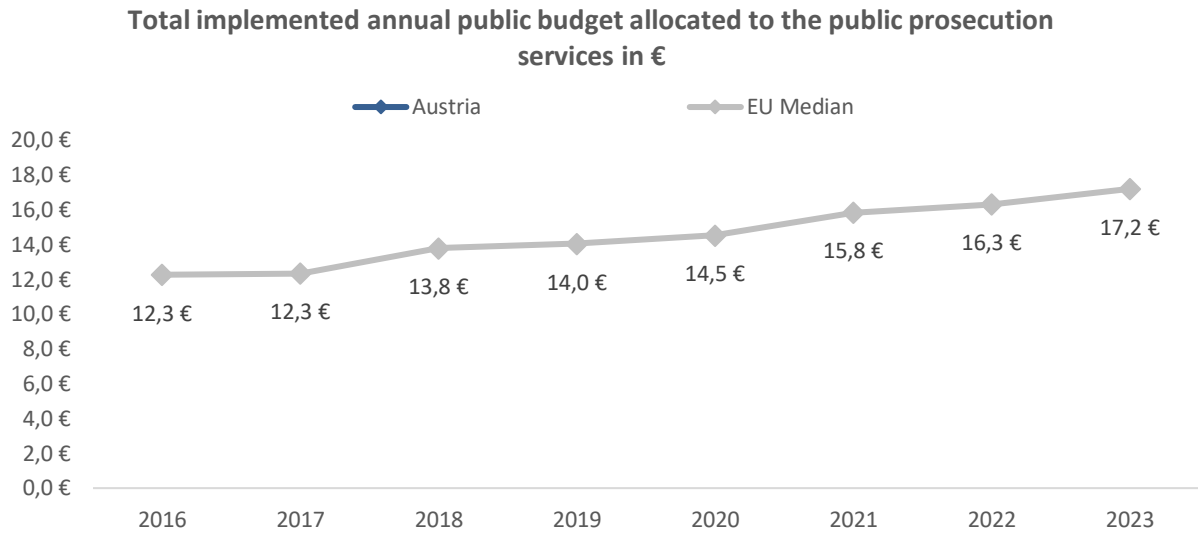

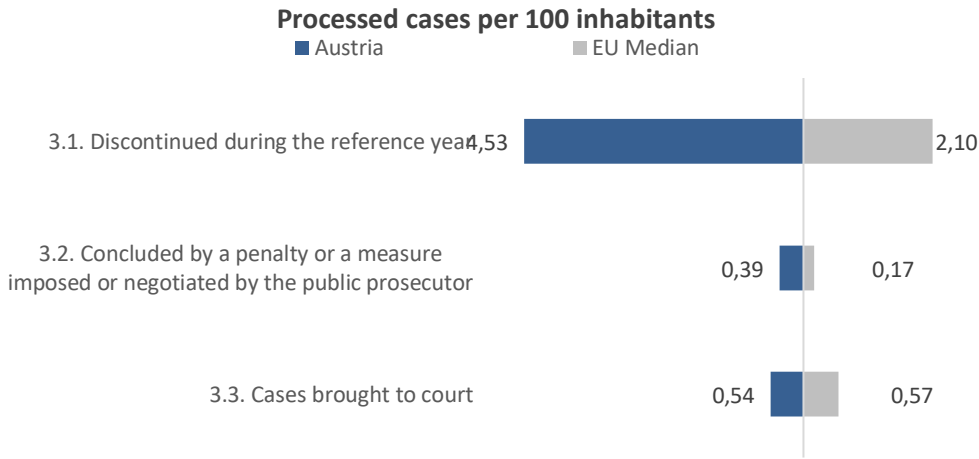
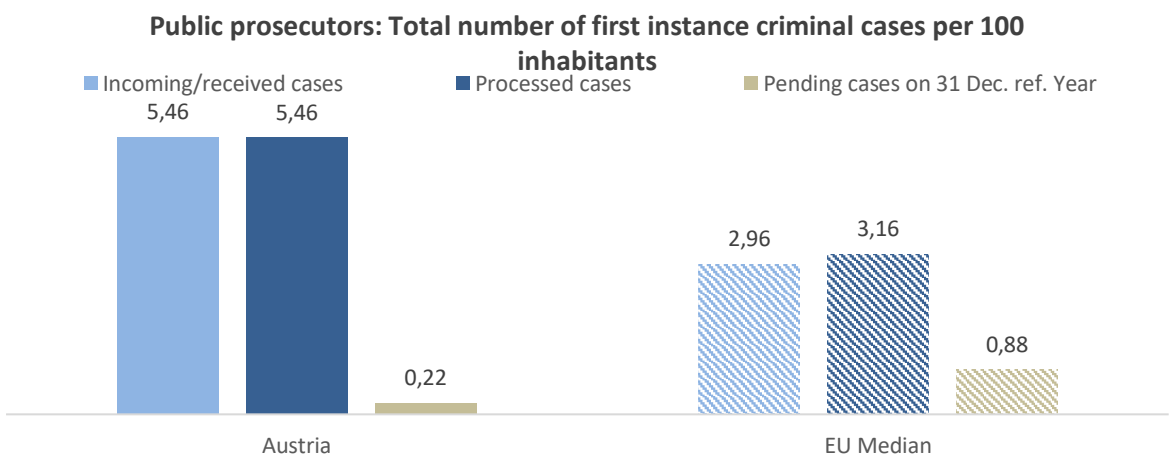
3.1.3 Discontinued by the Public Prosecutor for Reasons of Opportunity: Investigations discontinued for reasons of opportunity are counted based on the individuals for whom the investigation was discontinued. In cases where multiple persons are accused, the investigation may be discontinued for reasons of opportunity against more than one individual. As a result, the number of individuals is not provided, as it would be inconsistent with the case count reported in sections 3.1.1, 3.1.2, and 3.1.4.

The number of cases in which investigations were discontinued for reasons of opportunity is included in the totals for 3.1.1 and 3.1.2 but cannot be separately evaluated using the standard statistical tools of the Federal Ministry of Justice of Austria.

The number of cases discontinued for other reasons (section 3.1.4) includes cases where the offender is a fugitive, or where an investigation could not be initiated or continued due to legal reasons (e.g., diplomatic immunity of the offender). It also includes cases where investigations were not initiated because of a lack of initial suspicion, and all other cases that were discontinued but cannot be classified under the reasons mentioned above or the other reasons listed in section 3.1.

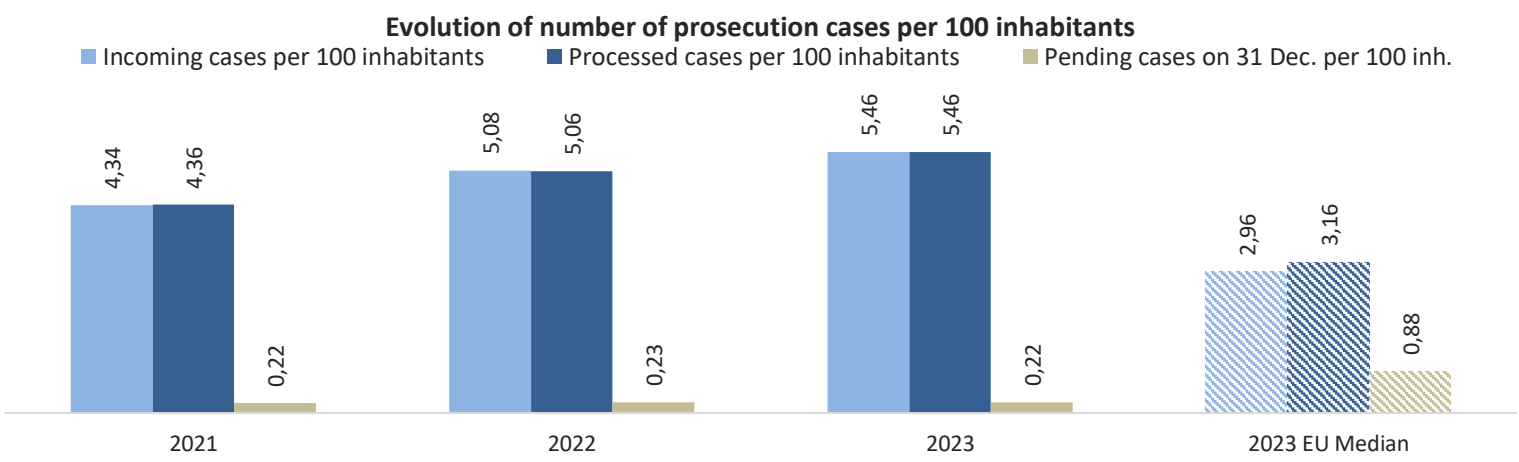

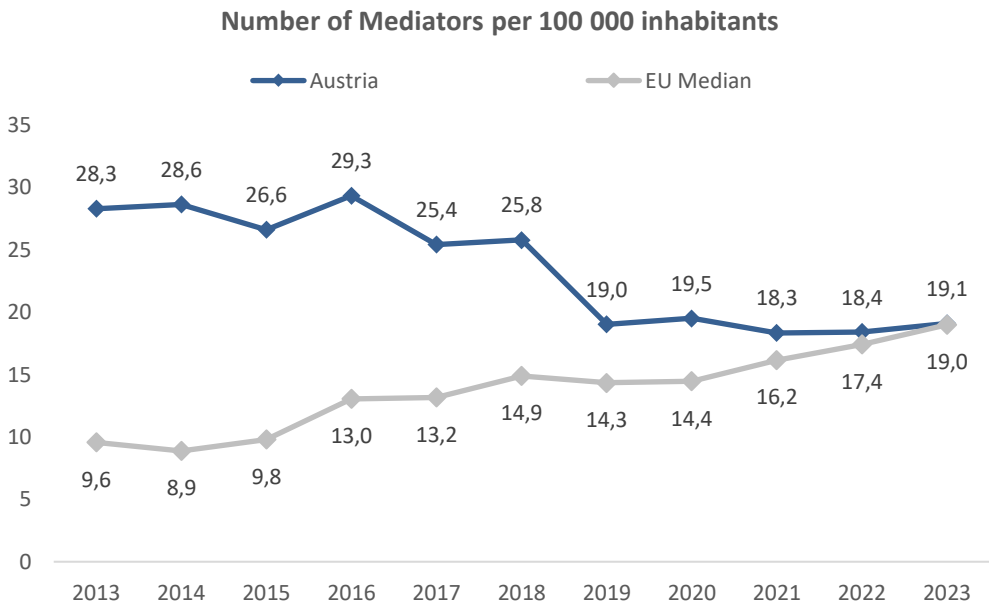

To become a registered mediator in Austria, an individual must meet the following requirements: 1) be at least 28 years old, 2) have completed appropriate mediation-specific training in accordance with the relevant regulations (ZivMediat-AV), 3) demonstrate trustworthiness, and 4) maintain professional liability insurance with a minimum coverage of €400,000. Applicants must submit a written application to Austria's Ministry of Justice, along with documentation proving that these criteria have been met. Once registered, mediators are required to pay a fee of €345 for the first five years and again every ten years thereafter to maintain their registration.
