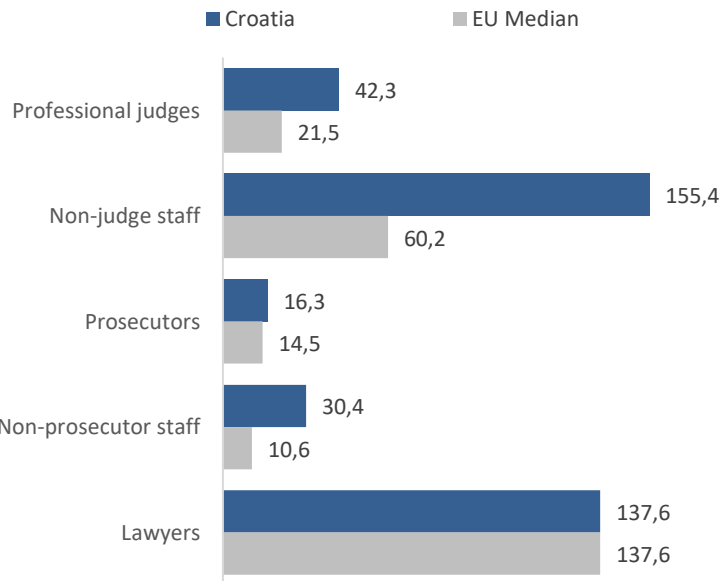

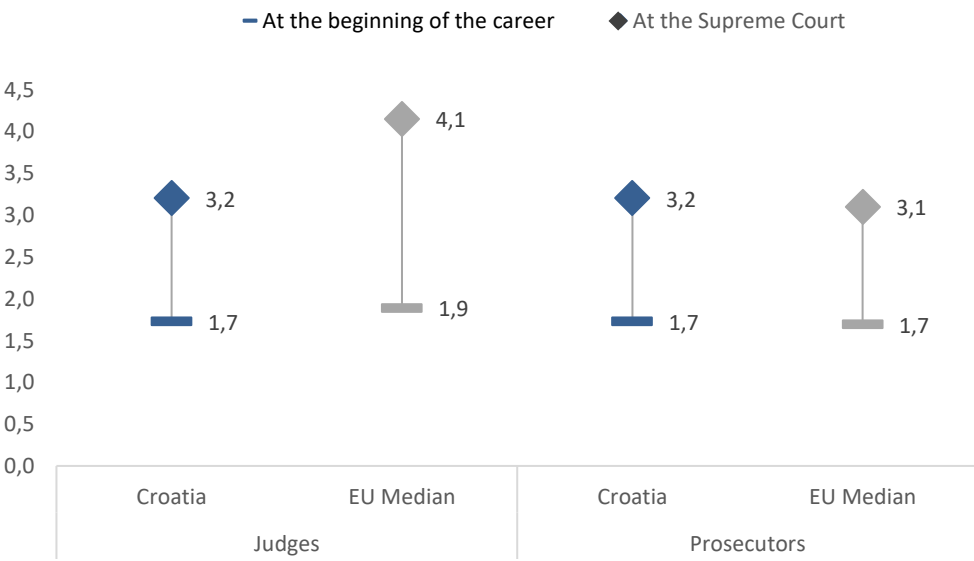

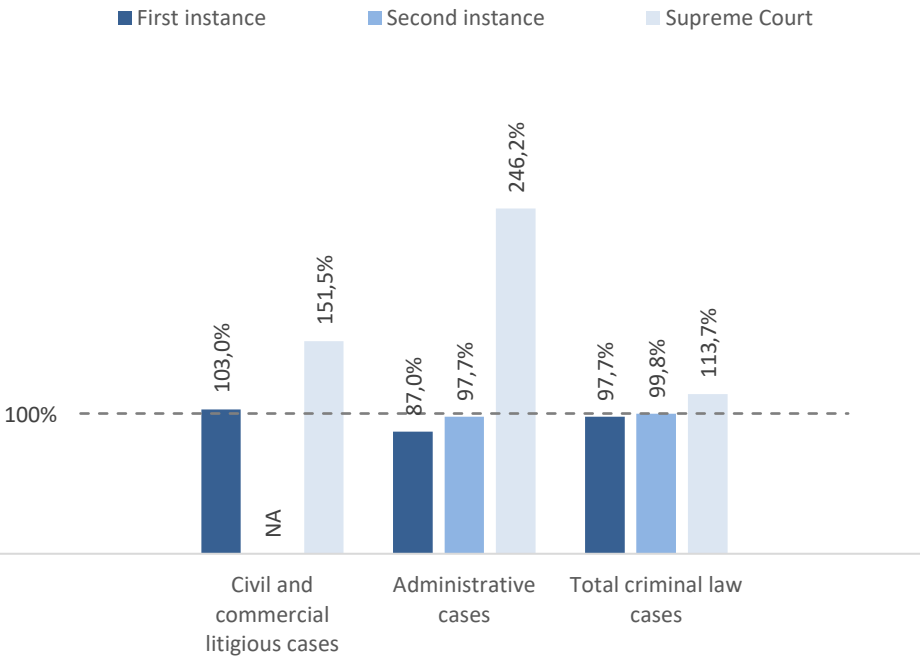


Gross salaries of judges and prosecutors vs average annual salary in 2023

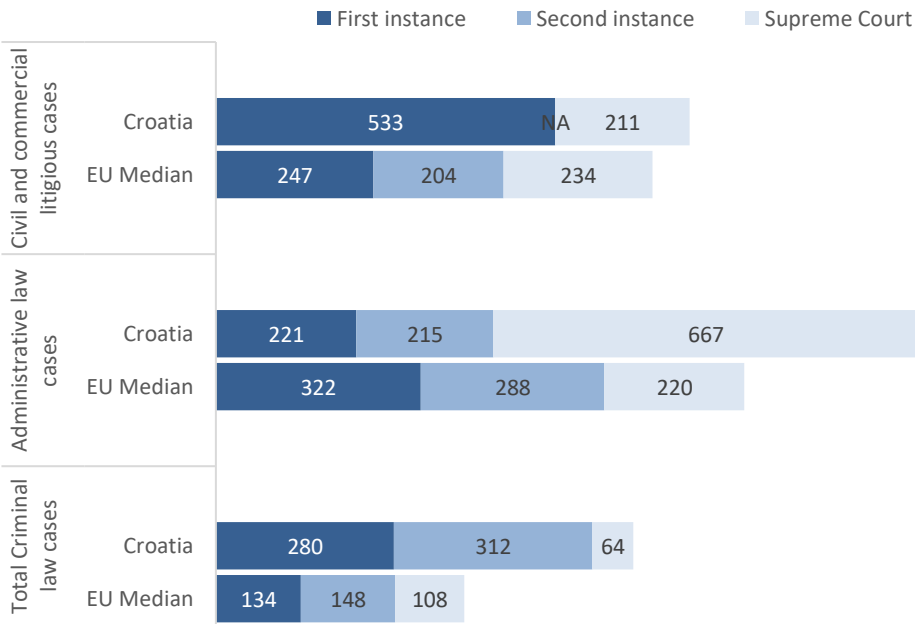

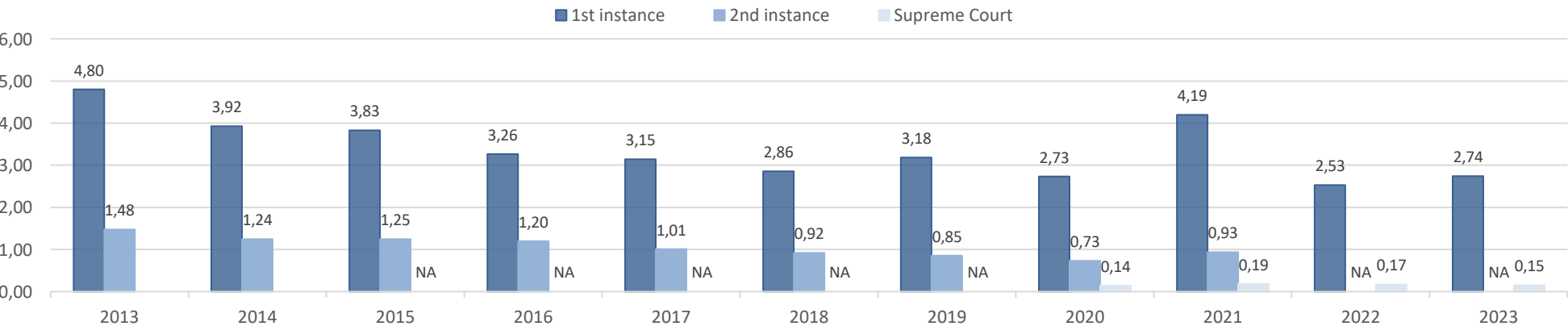


DispositionTime by instance and by matter in 2023 (days)

1. Judicial organisation in Croatia (2023 data)

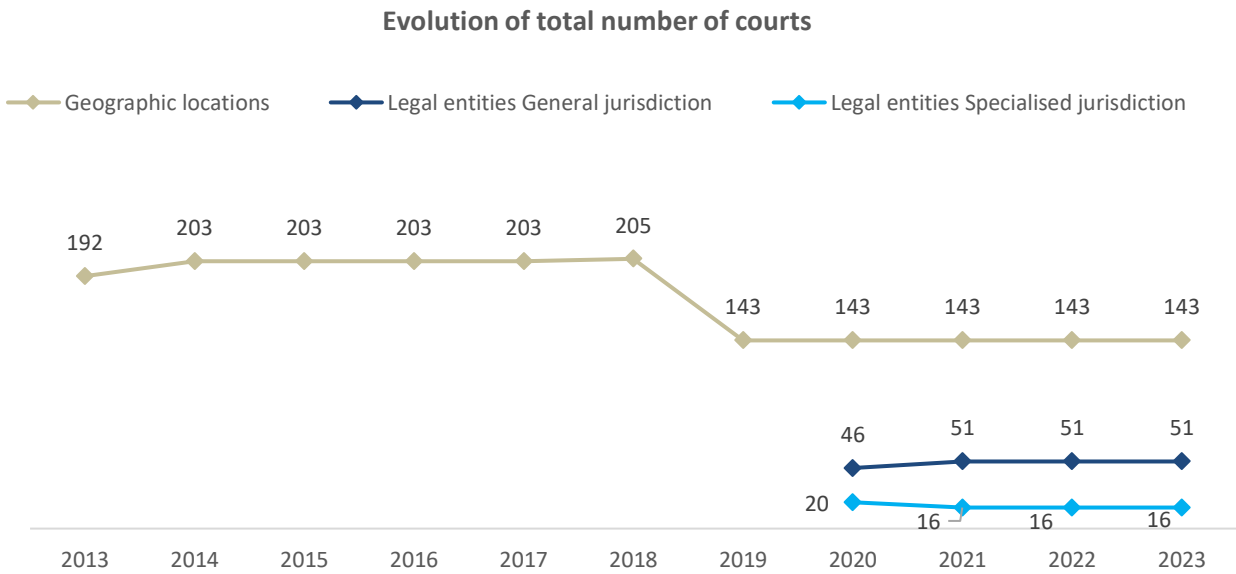
The judicial map comprises a total of 67 courts as legal entities, distributed across 143 geographic locations. These include both general jurisdiction and specialised courts.

There are 51 courts of general jurisdiction, categorised into 33 first-instance courts, 17 second-instance courts, and 1 highest-instance court.

Specialised courts account for 16 legal entities, consisting of 14 first-instance courts and 2 higher-instance courts. Among these are 9 commercial courts (including 1 higher instance), 1 labour court, and 4 administrative courts (including 1 higher instance).

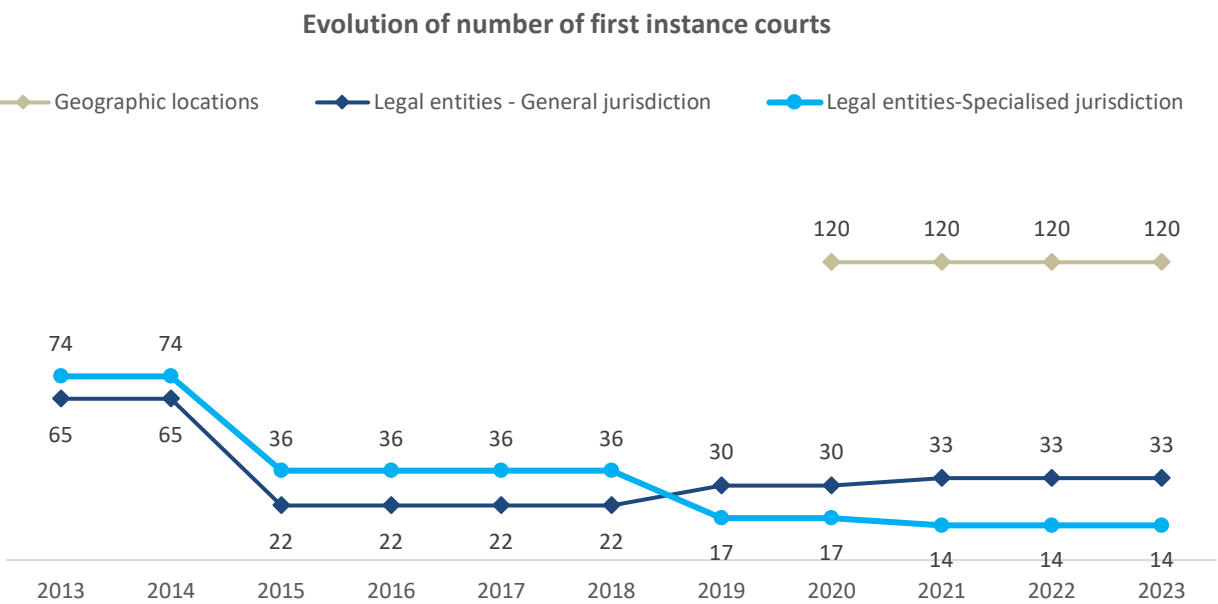

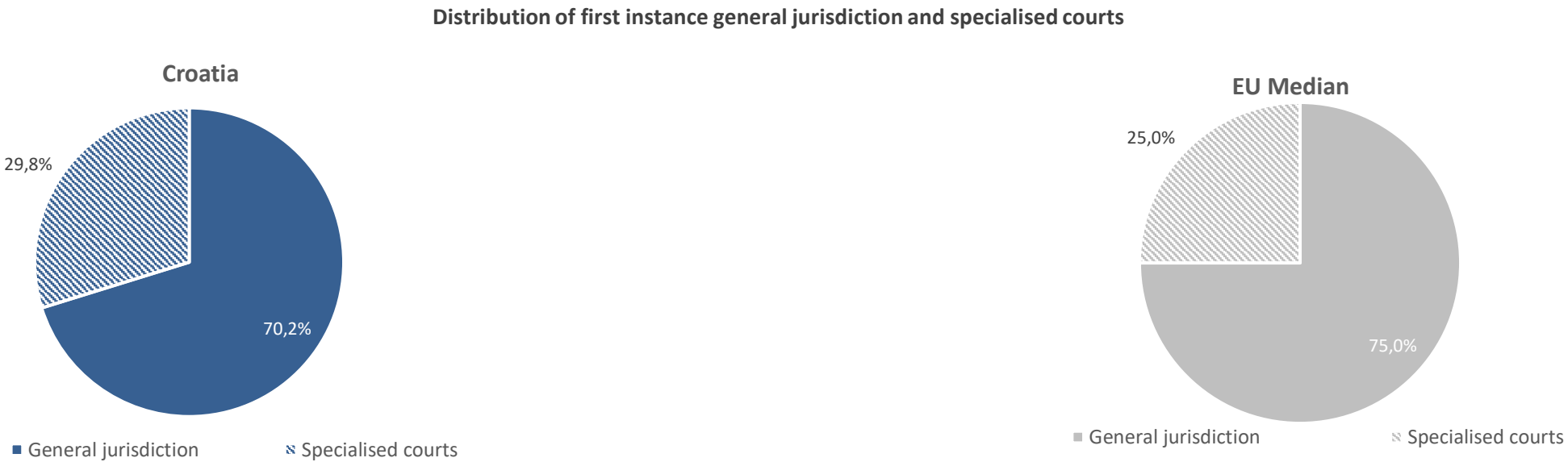

The reform of the judicial map implemented in 2015 reduced the number of Misdemeanour Courts from 63 to 22. Consequently, under the Act on Territorial Jurisdiction and Seats of Courts (Official Gazette, No. 128/14), there are currently 22 functioning Misdemeanour Courts.

On January 1, 2019, the new Courts Areas and Seats Act came into effect. The most significant organisational measure introduced by this Act was the merging of Misdemeanour Courts into Municipal Courts. Additionally, several Municipal Courts that had been closed after 2015 were reopened. As a result, there are now fewer first-instance specialised courts than in 2018, but more general jurisdiction courts.



The distribution between first instance general jurisdiction courts and first instance specialised courts in Croatia is 70,2% - 29,8% (distribution tendency in EU: 75,0% - 25,0%).

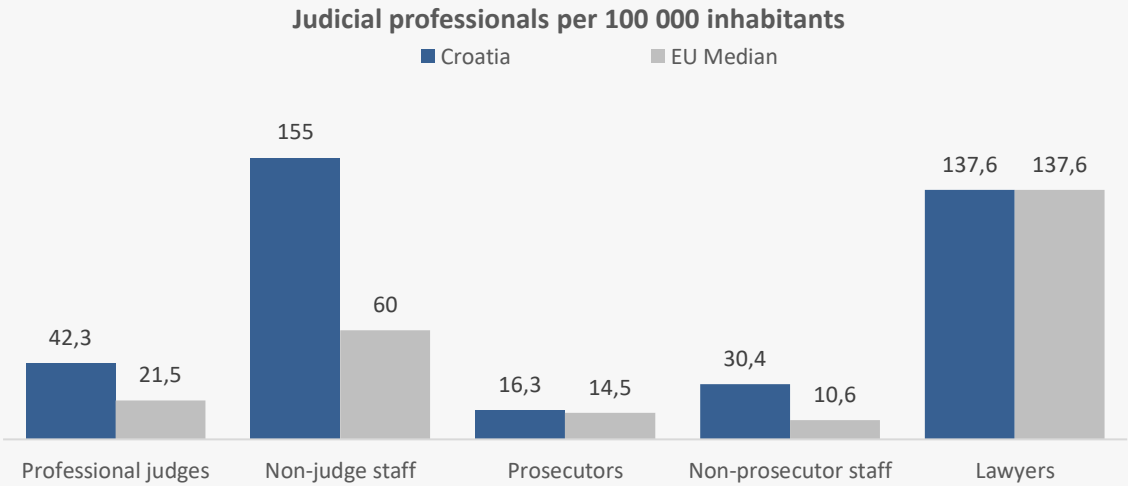

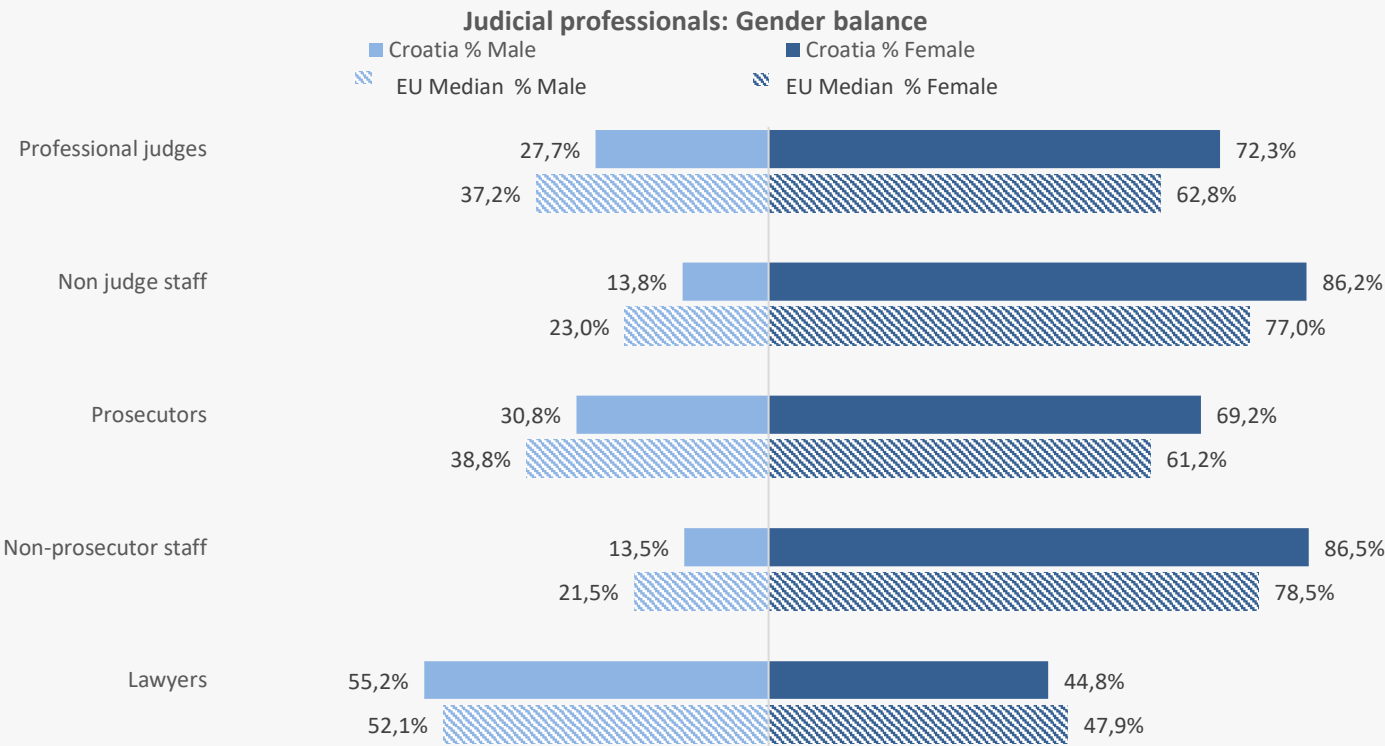

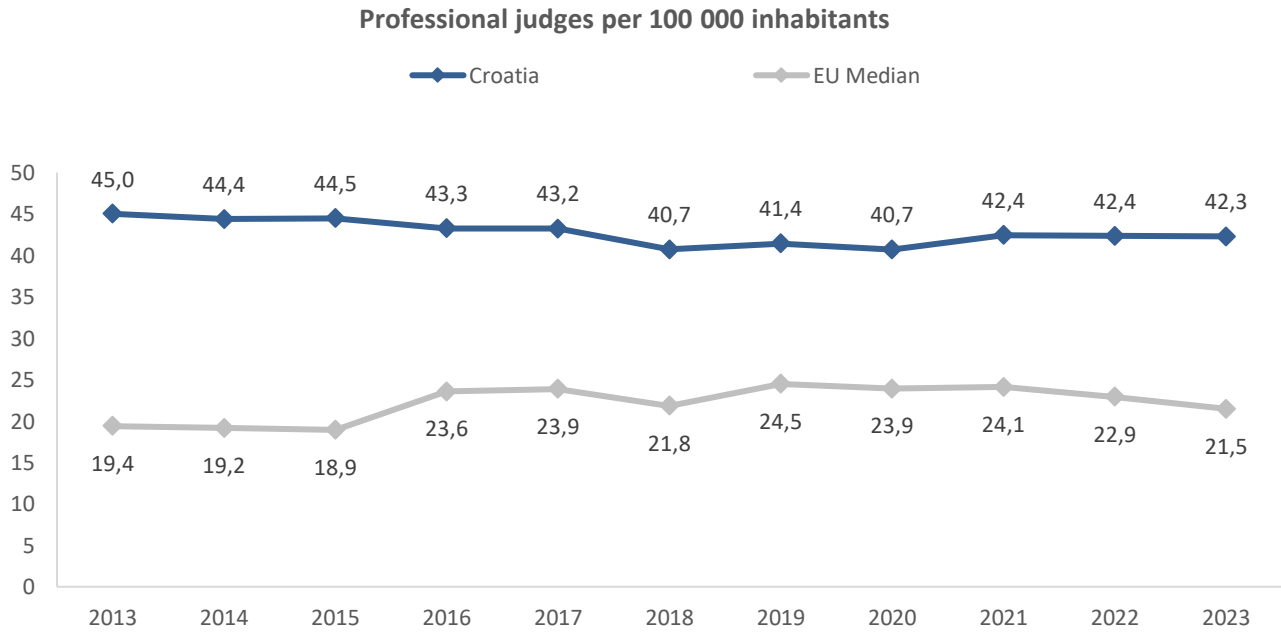

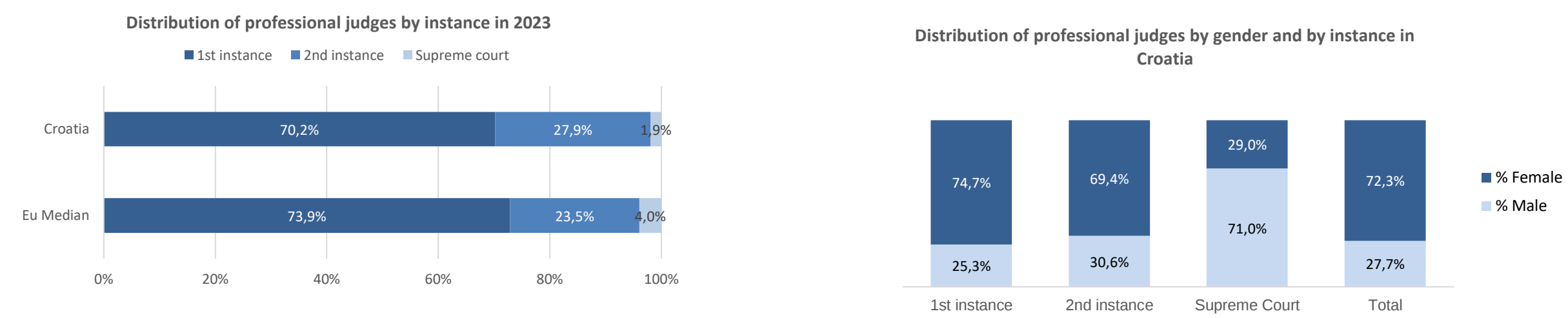
According to the 2023 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Croatia is 1 629, which is -0,1% less than in the previous cycle.

More precisely, in Croatia, there are 42,3 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is well above the EU median of 21,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants)

In the total number of judges, only data on actually working judges is presented (the total does not include judges on unpaid leave; judges on maternity leave; judges suspended after disciplinary procedure; judges transferred to other State body- for example to Ministry of Justice or Judicial Academy).

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 1 178, which represents 72,3% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 1 144 are sitting in the first instance courts (of which 854 are female); 454 are sitting in the second instance courts (of which 315 are female) and 31 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of which 9 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, the professional judges in Croatia are distributed among instances in a similar way. The number of judges at first instance is predominant, while judges at second and third instance are less numerous.

As regards the distribution male/Female, it has to be specified that female professional judges are significantly more numerous than male at all instances, except at Supreme Court level, where their representation is at 29%.

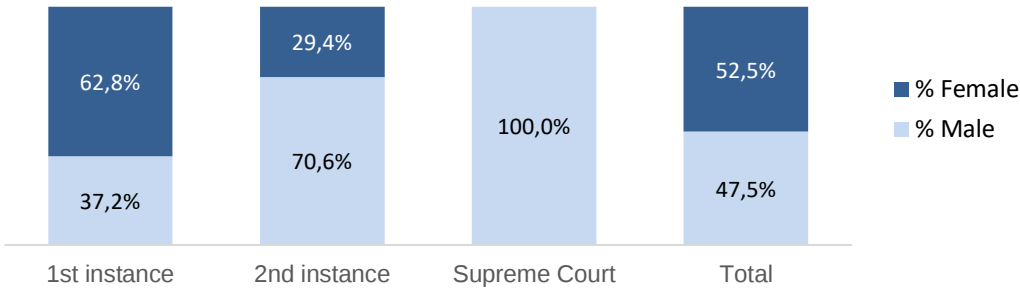

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Croatia

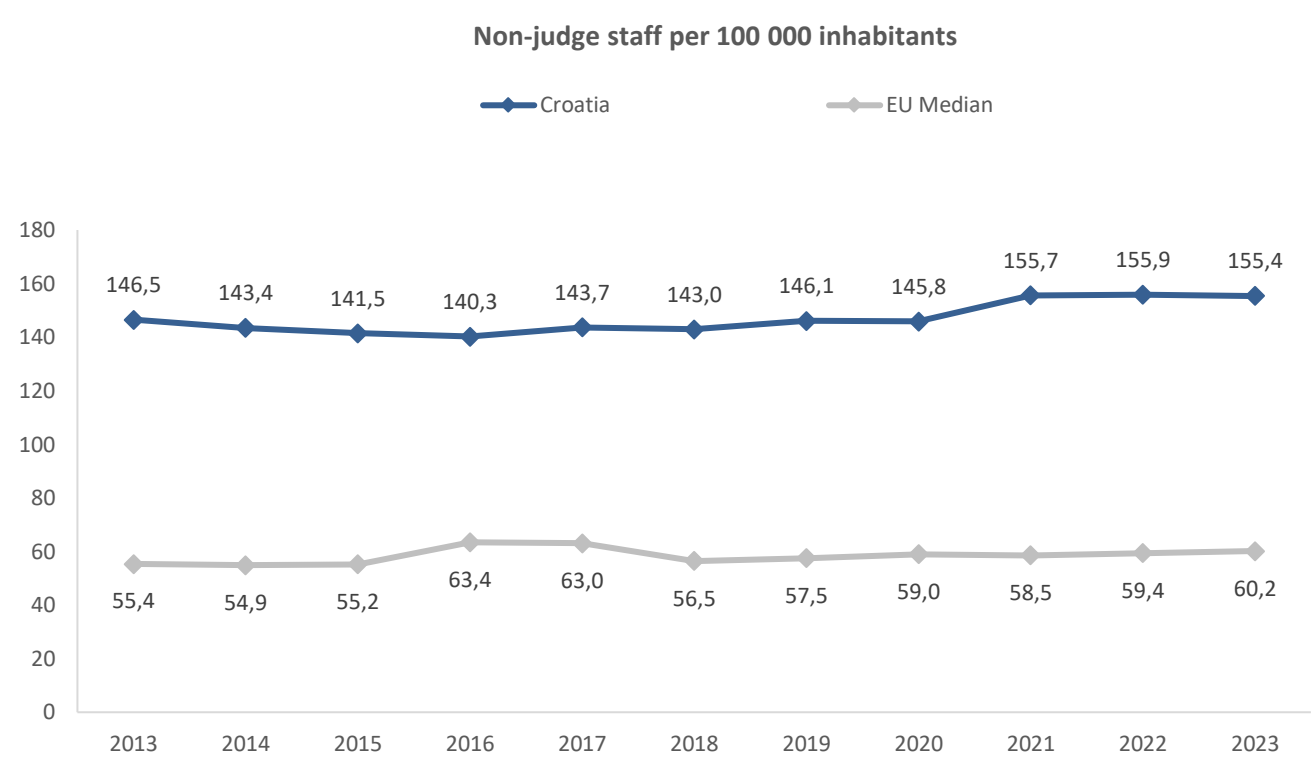


In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 32, which represents 52,5% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 43 are sitting in first instance courts (of which 27 are female); 17 are sitting in second instance courts (of which 5 are female) and 1 is sitting at the Supreme Court.

In 2023, Croatia has 5 989 non-judge staff (of which 5 162 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals a decrease of -0,2%.

In 2023, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has decreased (from 155,9 in 2022 to 155,4 in 2023).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 42,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2022 to 42,3 in 2023.

In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:

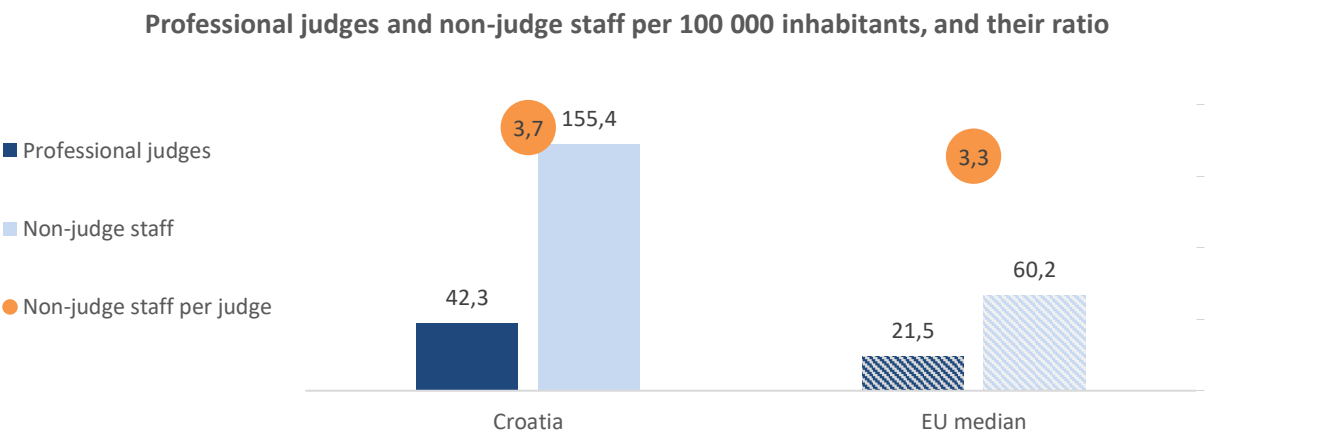
- 578 Rechtspfleger (or similar bodies) with judicial or quasi-judicial tasks having autonomous competence and whose decisions could be subject to appeal (among which 490 are Female);
- 4 166 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of which 3 805 are Female);
- 571 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of which 445 are Female);
- 674 technical staff (of which 422 are Female);

The total number of non-judicial staff is a result of a deduction and subsumes only actually working staff. Thus, the total does not include staff on unpaid leave; staff on maternity leave; staff suspended after disciplinary procedures; staff transferred to other State bodies (for example the Ministry of Justice or Judicial Academy). Besides, two non-judicial officials working half-time (for the reason of care for a child with special needs) are counted as 1 non-judicial official.

The fluctuation and variations in the number of Rechtspflegers in the Republic of Croatia can be attributed to their employment structure. Rechtspflegers initially serve a two-year term, which may then be extended for an additional five years. Following this period, they are either granted a permanent position or their employment concludes.

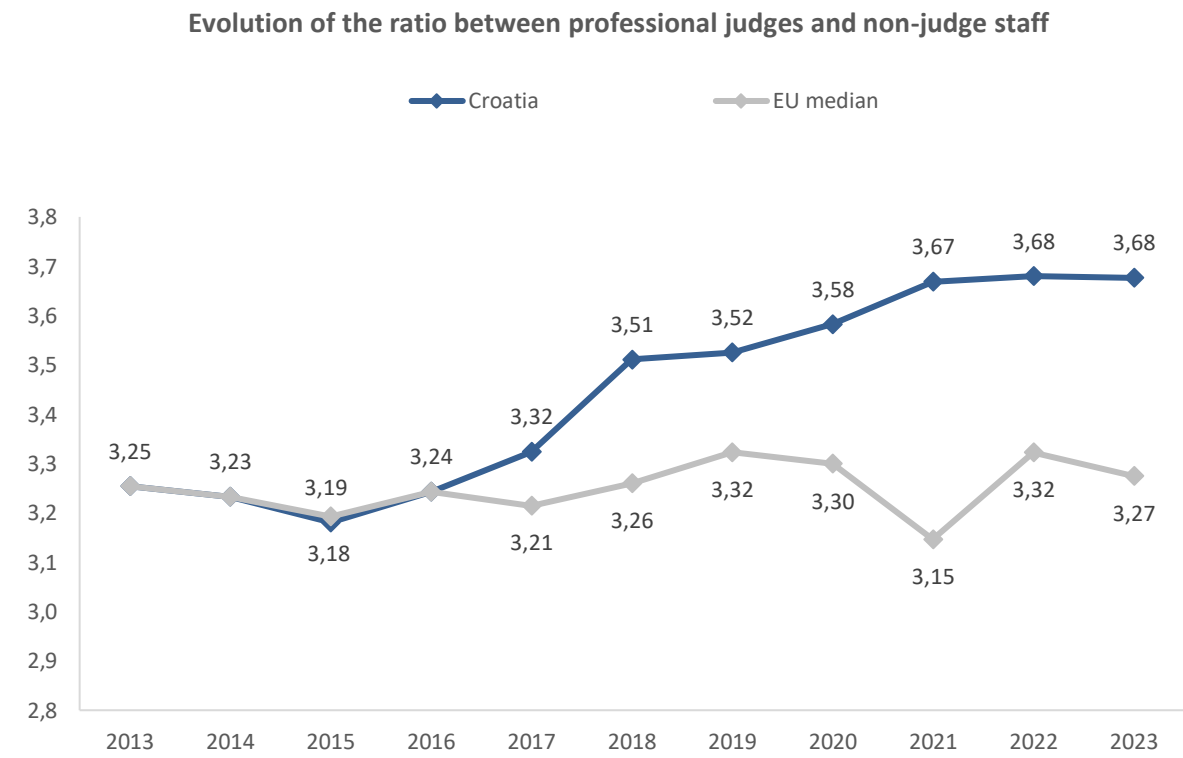

In Croatia, there are 42,3 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 21,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 3,7 non-judge staff per judge. There is no difference compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 3,7 non-judge staff per judge.

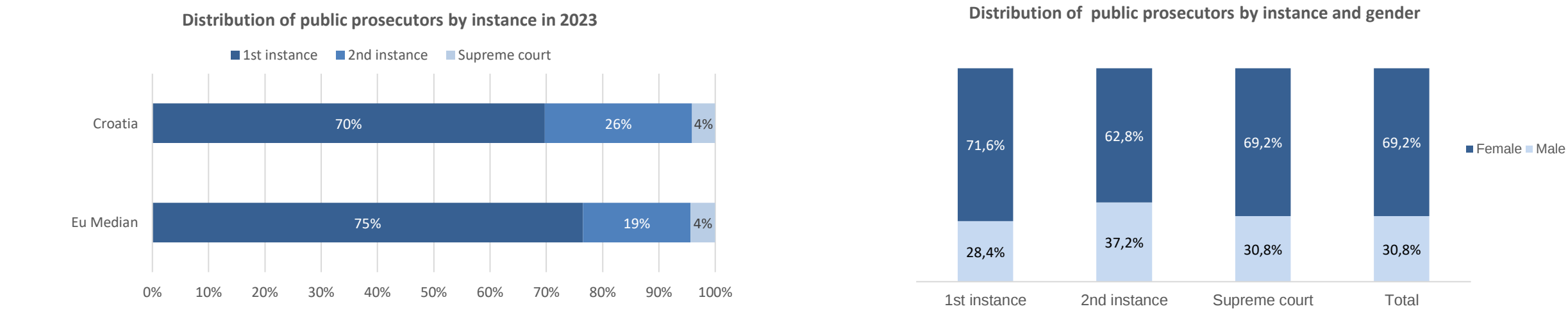

In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 434, which represents 69,2% of the total number of prosecutors.

The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 437 in first instance (of which 313 are female); 164 are in second instance (of which 103 are female) and 26 in final instance (of which 18 are female).

As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of public prosecutors, it should be noted that the provided data encompasses all officials in the public prosecutors' offices, including heads of the public prosecutors' offices (the Public Prosecutor of the Republic of Croatia, county and municipal public prosecutors, the head of the Bureau for Combating Corruption and Organised Crime) and all public prosecutors deputies.

As regards the distribution of the number of prosecutors among the different judicial instances, the number of prosecutors at the first instance level includes all municipal public prosecutors, their deputies, as well as the head of the Bureau for Combating Corruption and Organised Crime and deputies.

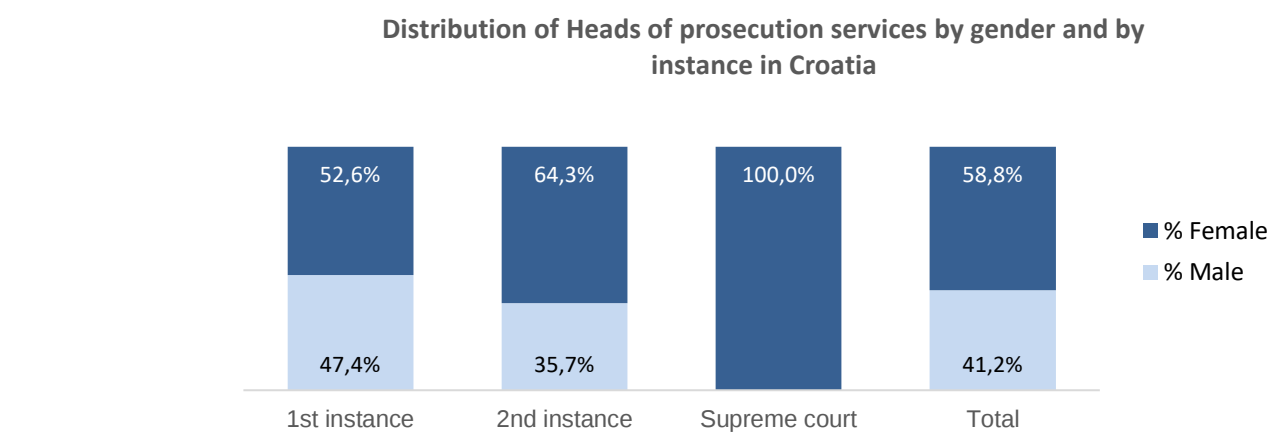
The number of prosecutors at the second instance (court of appeal) level includes all county public prosecutors and their deputies. The number of prosecutors at the Supreme Court level includes the Public Prosecutor and deputy prosecutors.

As regards the distribution male/Female, it has to be specified that the majority of public prosecutors at all instances are female, with the highest percentage of female public prosecutors at first instance level (71,6%).

In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution (all instances) is 20, which represents 58,8% of the total number of Heads of prosecution.

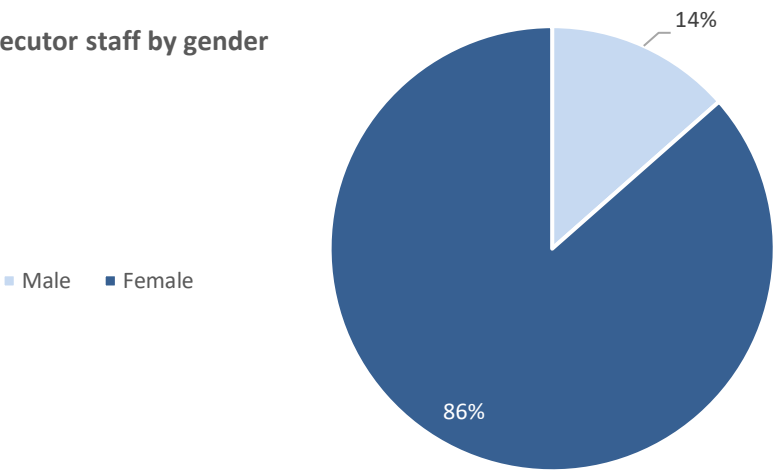
The total number of Heads of prosecution is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 19 at first instance level (of which 10 are female); 14 at second instance level (of which 9 are female) and 1 at the highest instance level (of which 1 are female).

The organisational structure of the public prosecution services comprises: the State Attorney of the Republic of Croatia, the Office for Combating Corruption and Organised Crime (USKOK), county State attorneys' offices and municipal State attorneys' offices. The number of public prosecutors' offices has been significantly rationalised. The number of Heads of the State attorneys' offices does not correspond to the number of municipal State attorneys' offices, because in some of these offices the Heads of offices were not appointed and, until such appointment is made, their duties are exercised by their deputies. The number of the first instance State attorneys' offices includes the number of the municipal State attorneys and Head of Office for Combating Corruption and Organised Crime (USKOK).

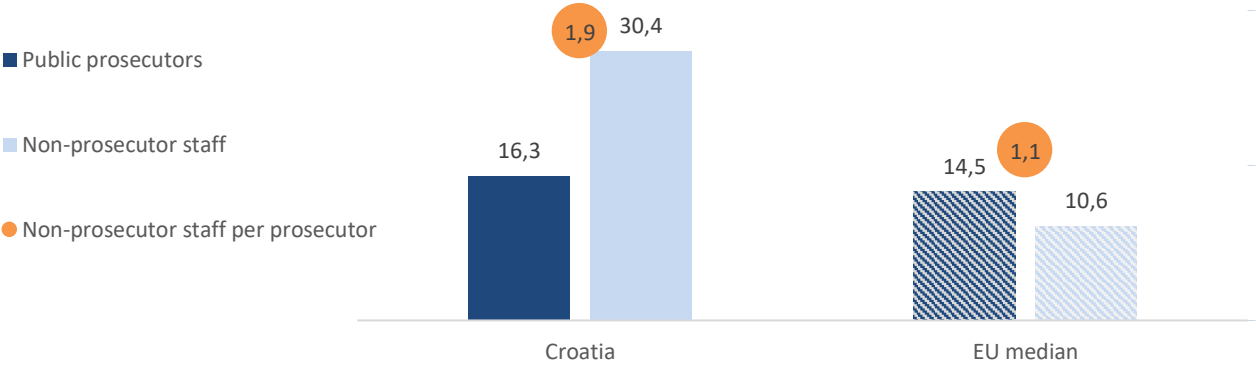
Non-prosecutor staff by gender

Public prosecutors and non-prosecutor staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio



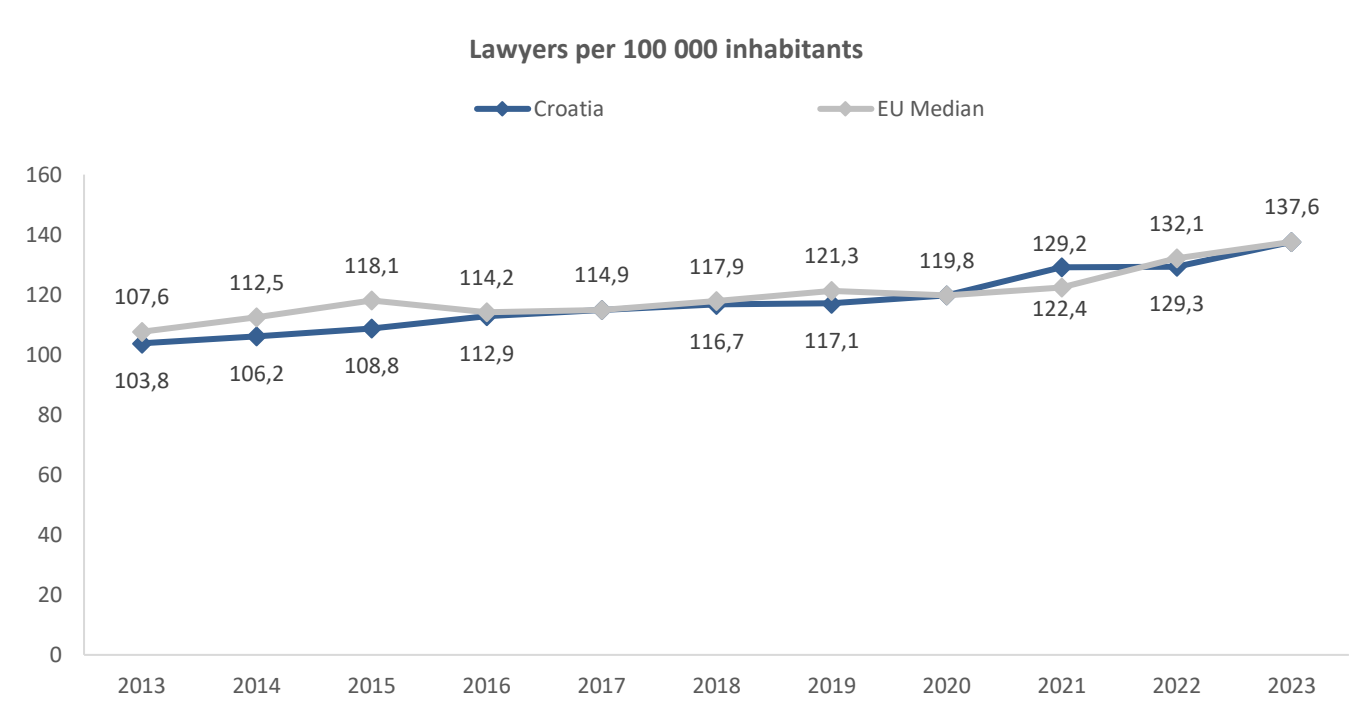

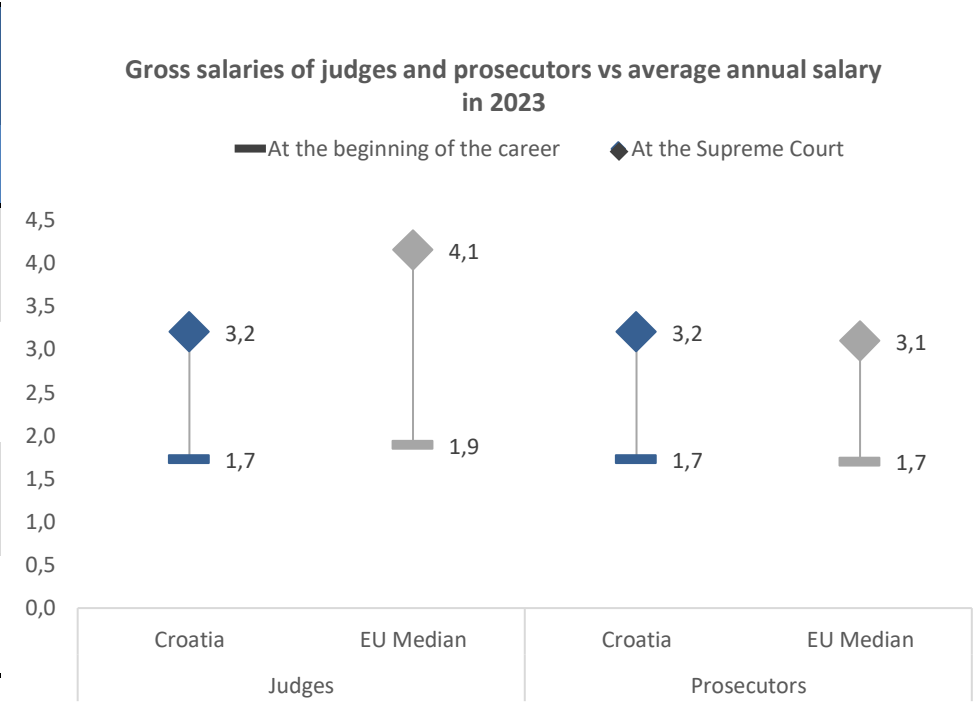
In 2023, there are 5 301 lawyers, which is 6,5% more than in 2022.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 144 856€.

According to 2023 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Croatia is 32 787€, which is rather below the EU median of 58 128€ (-44% below).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 1,7 times higher (the EU median is 1,9).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 58 623€ to 266 974€. Croatia's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is -49% below the EU median of 118 595€

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 101 592€.

In 2023, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Croatia of 32 787€ is rather below the EU median of 49 953€ (-34% below).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,7 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 456€ and the maximum is 199 670€. Croatia's absolute gross salary for prosecutors at the highest level is 35% below the EU median of 93 759€.

The term "wrongful arrest/detention" refers to compensation for an erroneous arrest and conviction. The Ministry, which also oversees peaceful resolution processes, reviews requests for compensation in cases of unwarranted arrest and conviction.

If the applicant rejects the Ministry's compensation offer, they have the option to file a complaint with the appropriate court. As a fair monetary settlement, the Ministry provides affected individuals with a compensation amount of HRK 280.00 (€37.16) per day of deprivation of liberty.

The total compensation paid in 2023 includes amounts determined through peaceful resolution proceedings and court judgments issued in 2023, which relate to cases from previous years.

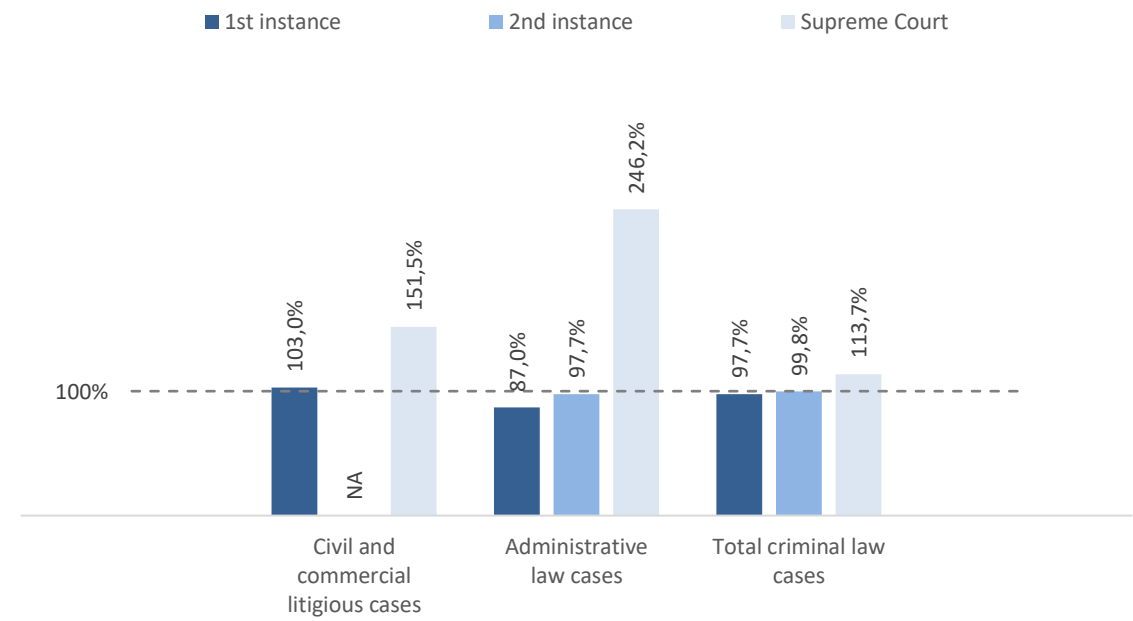
The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.

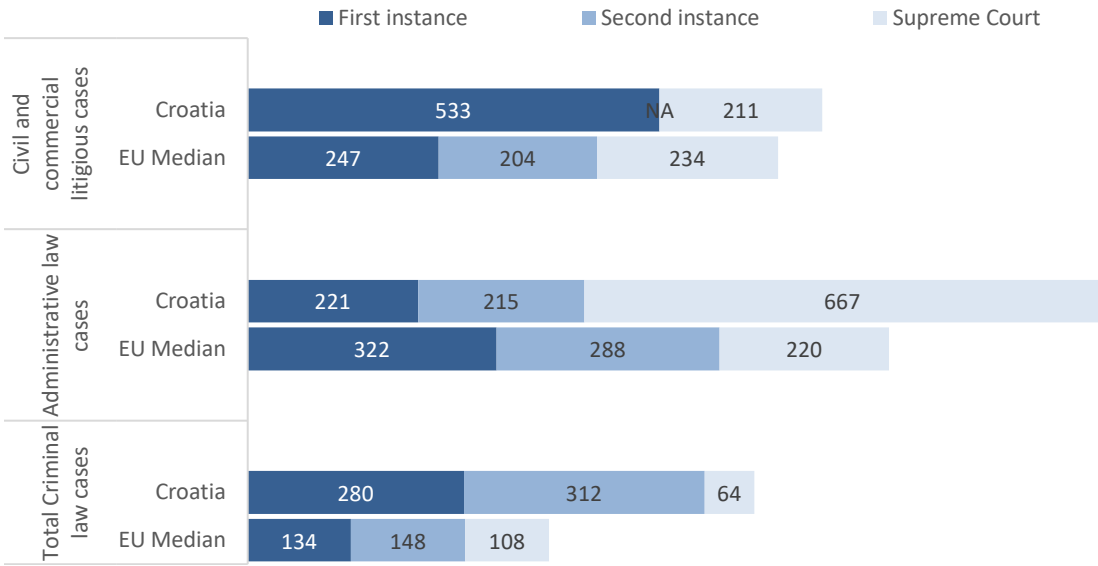

In 2023, the third instance total criminal law cases are resolved very effectively with a clearance rate of 113,7%. Also, their Disposition Time (64 days) is well below the EU median of 108 days. At first and second instance this category has a clearance rate slightly below 100% and a disposition time above the EU median. The increase in the number of criminal law cases in second instance courts is due to the County Courts not resolving more cases than they received in either 2022 or 2023. This has resulted in an increase in the number of pending cases, with a clearance rate of 91% in 2022 and 89% in 2023. The civil servants' strike in 2023 has resulted in an increase in pending cases that have been in the second instance court for more than two years.

As regards civil and commercial litigious cases, the Clearance Rate is above 100% at first instance and at 151,5% at third instance. Despite these high clearance rates, the Disposition Time for first-instance civil and commercial litigious cases remains considerably higher than the EU median, standing at 533 days compared to the EU median of 247 days.

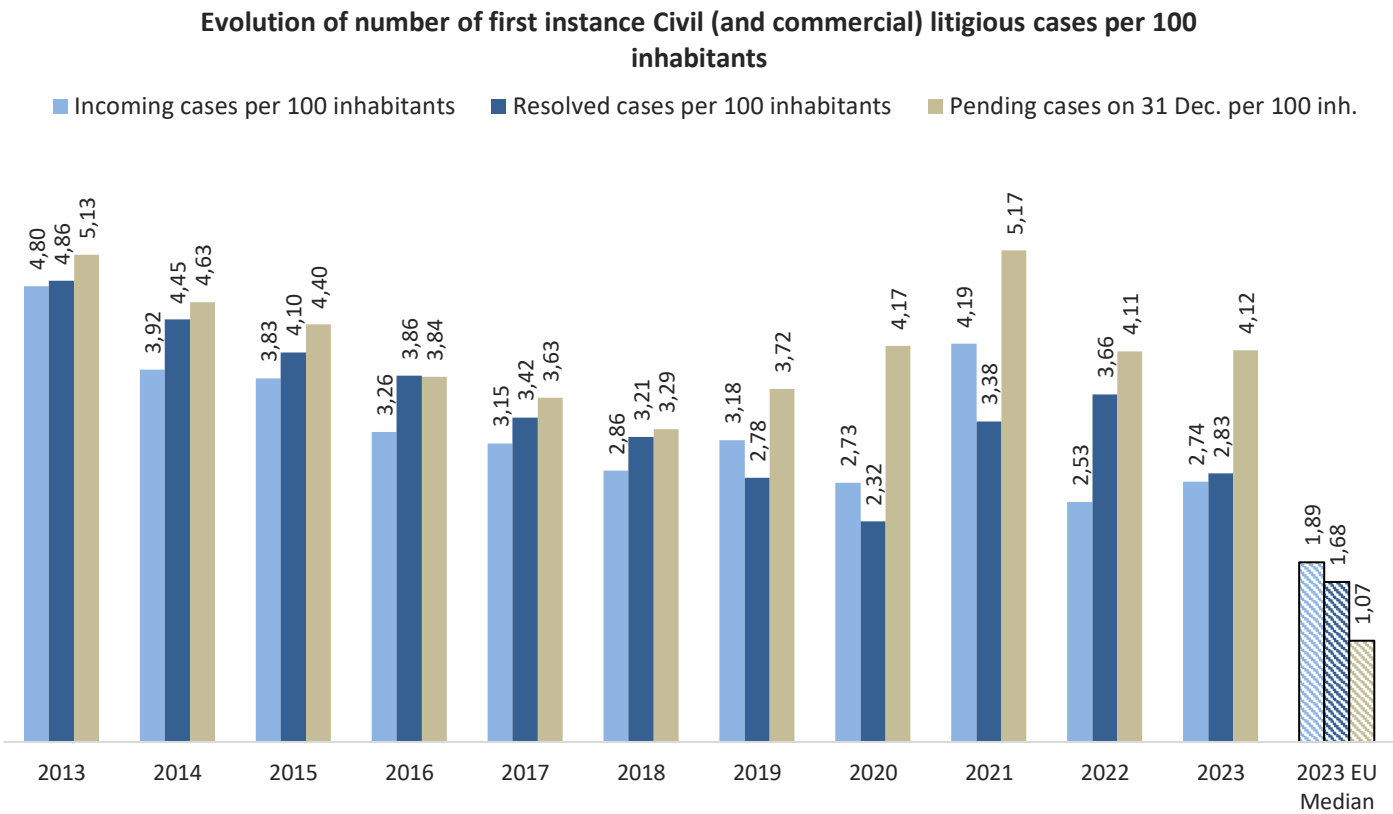
Finally, the highest Clearance Rate is recorded for third instance administrative law cases (246,2%). This category has also the longest Disposition Time among all types of cases and instances, averaging 667 days. It is important to note that these indicators were derived from a relatively small dataset: 26 incoming cases, 64 resolved cases, and 117 pending cases at the end of the year. At the first and second instances, administrative law cases have Clearance Rates below 100%, though their Disposition Times are shorter than the EU medians.

At the Supreme Court level, the Clearance Rate is above 100% for all matters and the Disposition Time is below EU medians, with the exception of administrative cases. Over several years, the Court has successfully reduced the number of pending cases at both the beginning and end of the year. This includes a marked decrease in the number of cases pending for more than two years since their arrival at the Supreme Court.

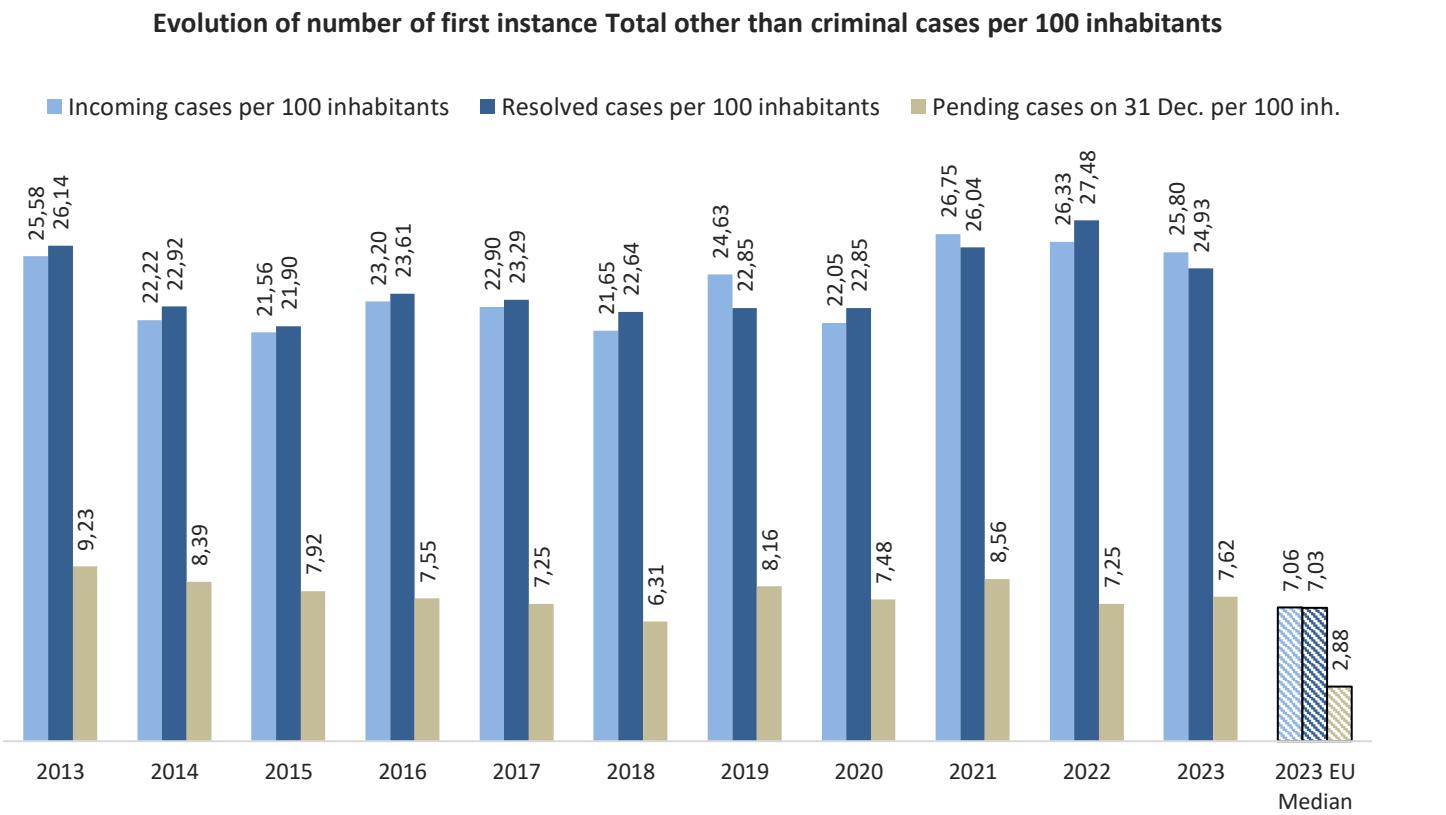

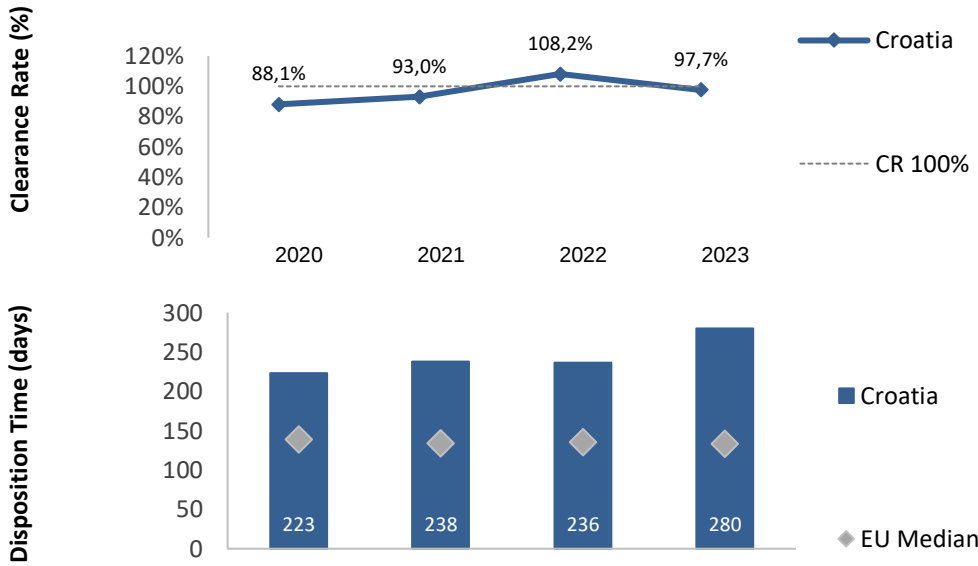

In 2023, there are 927 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 24,1 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation of the number of mediators between 2022 and 2023 is about 12,5%.

On June 29, 2023, the Law on the Peaceful Resolution of Disputes ("Official Gazette", No. 67/23; hereinafter: ZMRS) entered into force. Article 7, Paragraph 1 of this law stipulates that the title of mediator is acquired through registration in the Register of Mediators, maintained by the Center for Peaceful Resolution of Disputes (<https://cmrs.hr/>). The title is eliminated by removal from the Register.

The Act on the Peaceful Resolution of Disputes (Official Gazette, No. 67/23) introduces changes to the status of mediators. The Act does not require specific education or work experience for mediators but mandates registration in the Register of Mediators, maintained by the Centre for Peaceful Resolution of Disputes, to acquire the status of a mediator. This replaces the previous system where registration was voluntary.

A mediator in court mediation, as per the Civil Procedure Act, is appointed from a court-maintained list. At first-instance courts, mediators are selected by the president of the court, whereas at higher courts, mediation in legal remedies cases is conducted exclusively by judge mediators. Judges in Croatia are not required to undergo mediator training.

Mediator training is now essential for registration in the Register of Mediators. Such training, along with trainer training, is conducted by authorised mediation institutions or those approved by the Centre. The Centre also issues and revokes approvals for mediation institutions, oversees training programs, and organises professional training for mediators.

The Ordinance on Mediation Institutions (Official Gazette, No. 100/23) regulates mediator training, distinguishing between basic and additional training.

Basic training: A minimum of 40 hours for groups of up to 24 participants, including theory, practice, and an exam.
Additional training: At least 20 hours for mediators already in the Register.
Trainer training: For mediators with experience in at least 10 procedures, lasting a minimum of 40 hours for groups of up to 12 participants, covering teaching methods, facilitation skills, and an exam.
Certified trainers may conduct training independently within registered mediation institutions.

8. Systems for measuring and evaluating the performance of courts and public prosecution services in Croatia (2023 data)

In Croatia, quality standards are determined for the judicial system at national level (e.g. quality systems for the judiciary and/or judicial quality policies). Specialised personnel within the courts and the public prosecution services is entrusted with implementation of these national level quality standards.

According to the Courts Act (Official Gazette, No. 28/13, 33/15, 82/15, 67/18, 126/19, 130/20, 21/22, 60/22), the president of the court evaluates judges annually based on Framework Criteria. These criteria assess the number of judgments delivered compared to the expected number, performance in various case types, adherence to deadlines for judgment delivery and drafting, judgment quality based on remedies in legal actions, and other judicial activities. The Framework Criteria, proposed by the General Assembly of the Supreme Court and adopted by the Minister of Justice, set the annual decision quota for each judge.

Under the State Attorney Office Act (Official Gazette, No. 67/18, 21/22), the performance of State Attorneys and Deputy State Attorneys is evaluated every three years based on: case resolution results (assessed using the Framework Criteria for the Work of Deputy State Attorneys and the average results of county or municipal state attorney offices over the preceding three years); quality of decisions (including the justified use of legal remedies; observing deadlines during procedures; other activities, experience, and adherence to the Code of Ethics for State Attorneys and Deputy State Attorneys. The Framework Criteria are adopted by the Minister responsible for judicial affairs, with prior input from the Chief State Attorney of the Republic of Croatia.

If a judge, without justified reason, fails to meet the required number of decisions under the Framework Criteria or performs improperly, the president must initiate disciplinary proceedings per the State Judicial Council Act.

Disciplinary proceedings for court presidents are initiated by the president of the higher court. Under the State Judicial Council Act (Official Gazette No. 116/10, 57/11, 130/11, 13/13, 28/13, 82/15, 67/18, 126/19, 80/22), penalties for disciplinary offenses include rebuke, a fine of up to one third of the salary earned in the previous month in a period of one to three months, a fine of up to one third of the salary earned in the previous month in a period of four to six months, a fine of up to one third of the salary earned in the previous month in a period of seven to twelve months or dismissal from duty.

If justified reasons exist for a judge's failure to meet the Framework Criteria, the president must document these reasons and forward the decision to the higher court president. Judges can object to the decision within three days of receipt, and the court president must resolve the objection within eight days, either rejecting it or issuing a new decision.

If the objection is rejected, the judge may appeal to the president of the higher court within eight days. The higher court president may confirm or overturn the decision, but the judge cannot seek further legal remedies against this final decision.
