

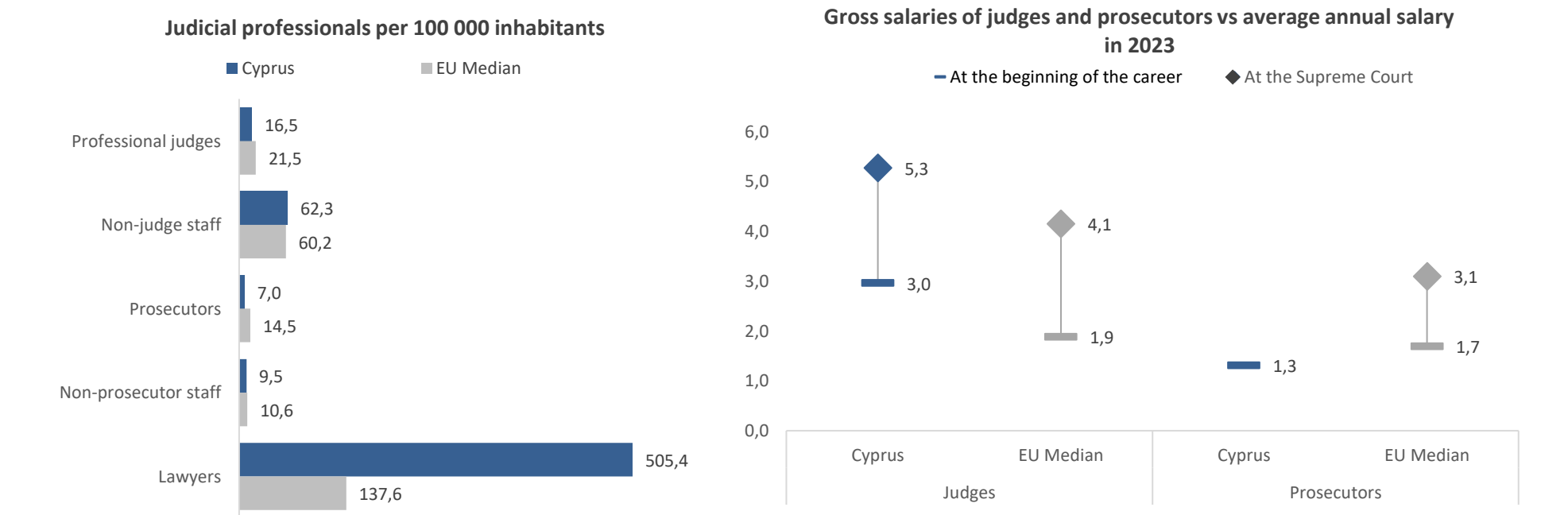

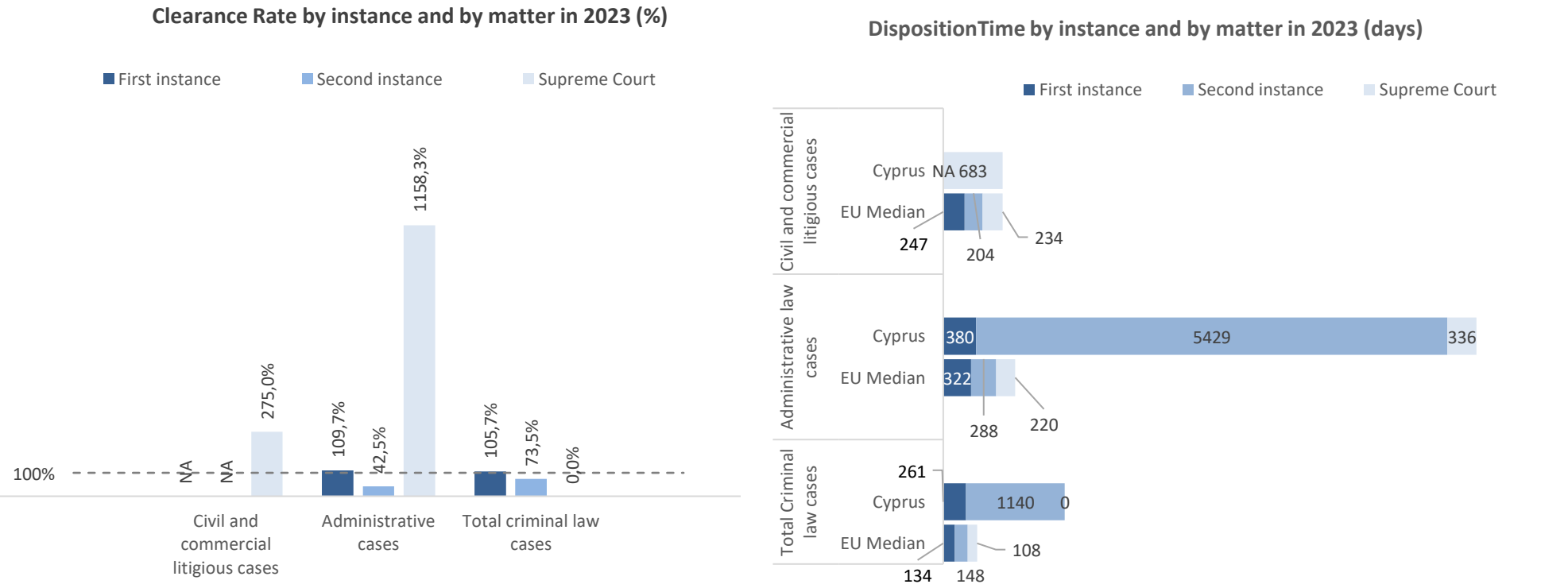

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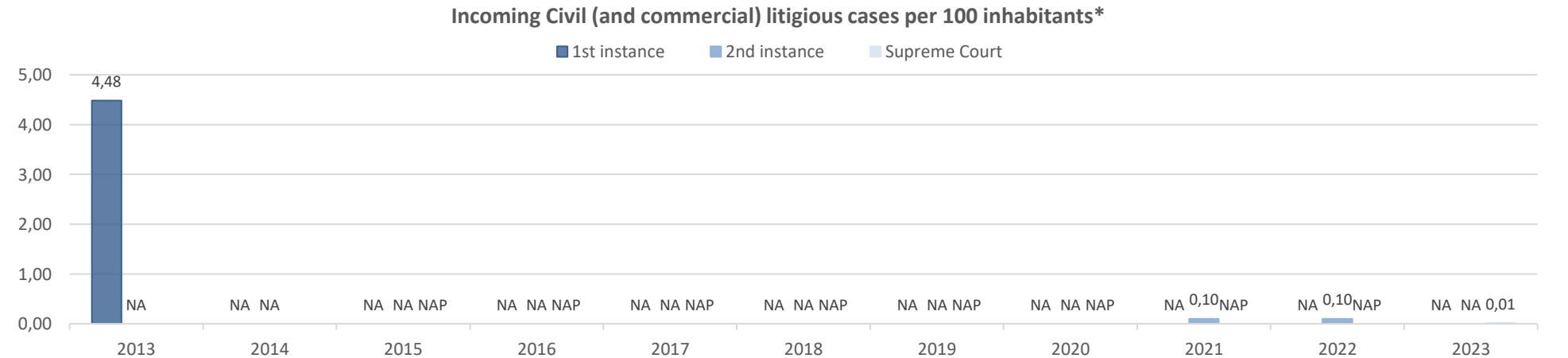

1. Judicial organisation in Cyprus (2023 data)

In 2023, In Cyprus there are in total 33 courts considered as legal entities, among which 13 are of general jurisdiction, while 20 are specilaised courts.

It is worth mentioning that in 2023 there was a core jurisdictional reform in Cyprus resulting in the establishment of a three-tier court system. Until 2023, there were only two instances in Cyprus. As of 1st of July 2023 a Supreme Constitutional Court and an Appeal Court were set up.

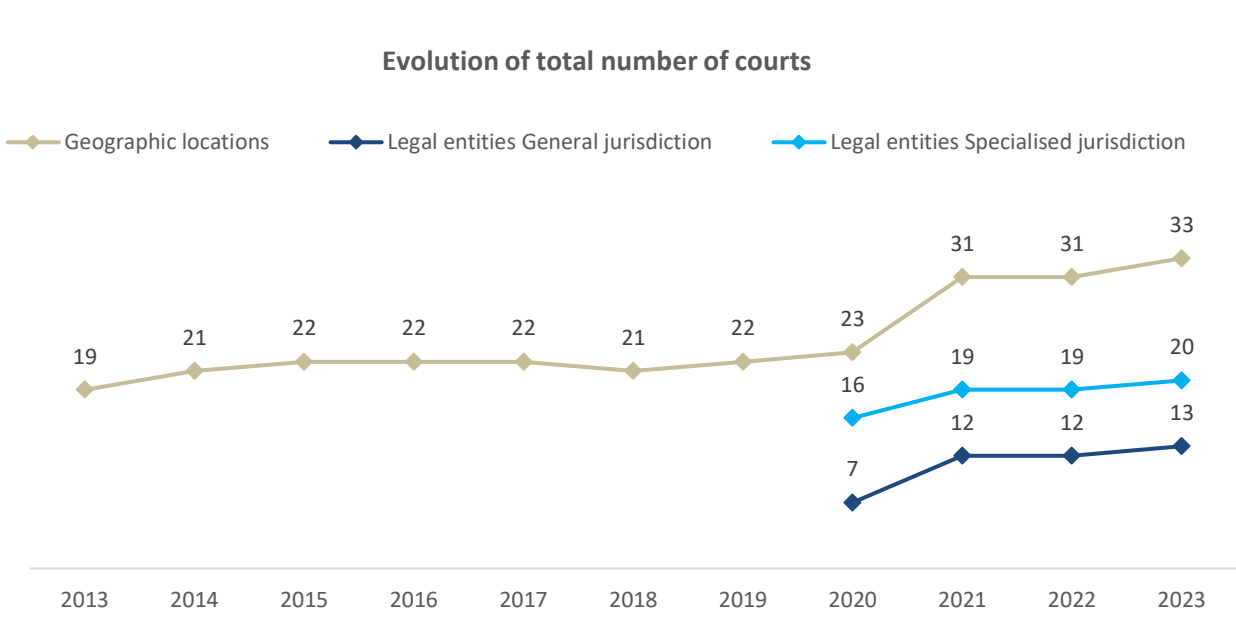
Accordingly, courts of general jurisdiction are organised in the following way: 13 courts act at first instance, the newly established Appeal court has competence to hear civil, criminal and revisional (administrative law) appeals, while the Supreme Court decides, at third and last instance on civil or criminal cases on points of law.

Concerning the 20 specialised courts, 19 are competent at first instance and one intervenes at a higher instance, namely the Supreme Constitutional Court. The latter has jurisdiction for the review of constitutionality of laws, but it also acts as a supreme administrative court.

In terms of geographic locations, in 2023 there are 33 courts in Cyprus, among which 30 act at first instance.

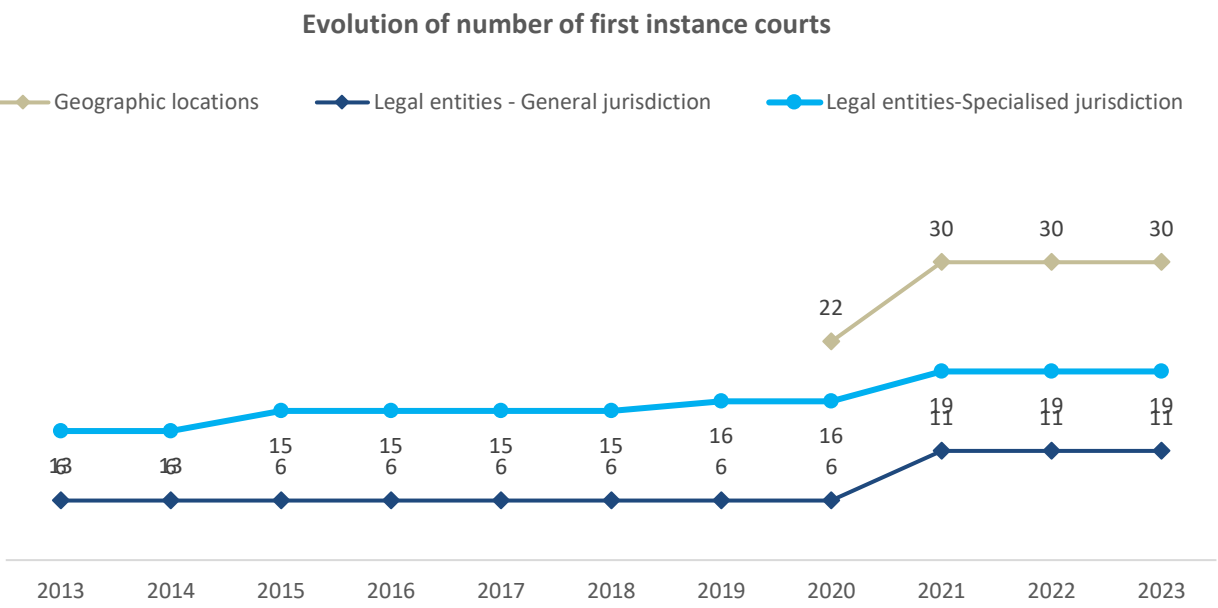

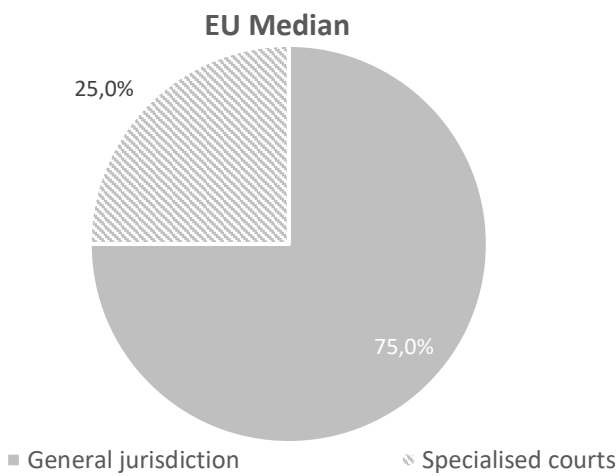
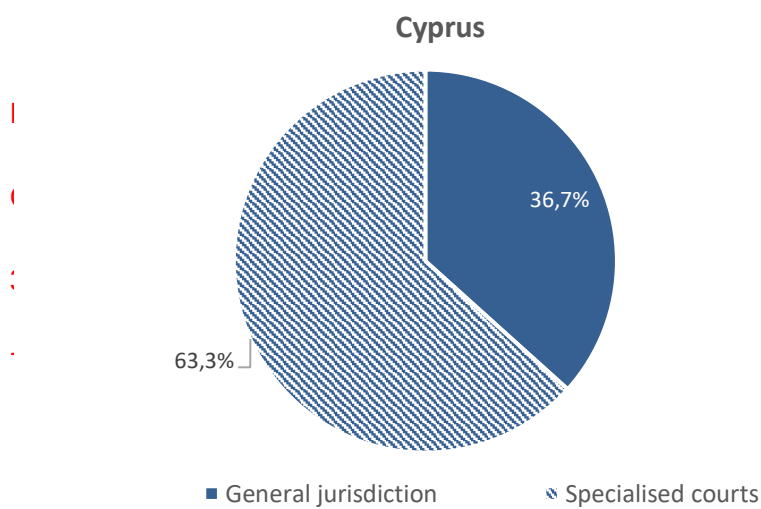
In 2023, Cyprus adopted a three-tier court system, following the establishment of an Appeal court and the Supreme Constitutional Court. Accordingly, the number of geographic locations increased by two, the number of specialised courts by one and the number of legal entities of general jurisdiction also by one.

Distribution of first instance general jurisdiction and specialised courts



The distribution between first instance general jurisdiction courts and first instance specialised courts in Cyprus is 36,7% - 63,3%. Compared with the distribution tendency in EU (75,0% - 25,0%) one can notice that specialised courts are predominant in Cyprus, in contrast with teh situation in the EU.

In 2023, there are 19 specialised courts of first instance in Cyprus among which 4 have competence in labour law, 4 intervene in family law, 3 are rent and tenancies courts, 1 is specialised in administrative law, 1 deals with military matters, 5 are Juvenile courts and the Administrative court for international protection is categorised as "other specialised court".

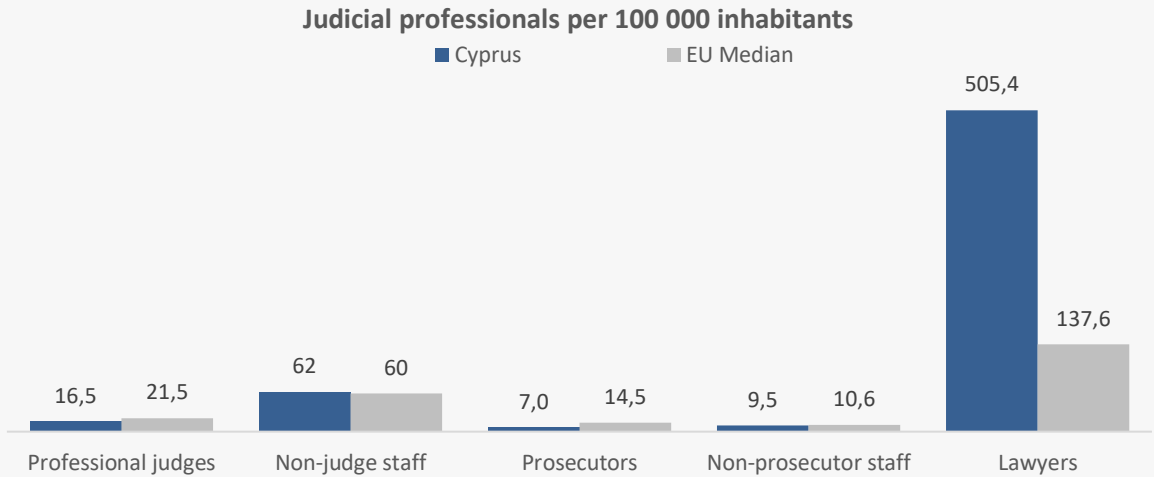
As already mentioned above, the Supreme Constitutional Court was established in July 2023. It has jurisdiction for review of constitutionality of laws, but it also acts as the supreme administrative court. Accordingly, it is considered as a specialised court acting at a higher instance.

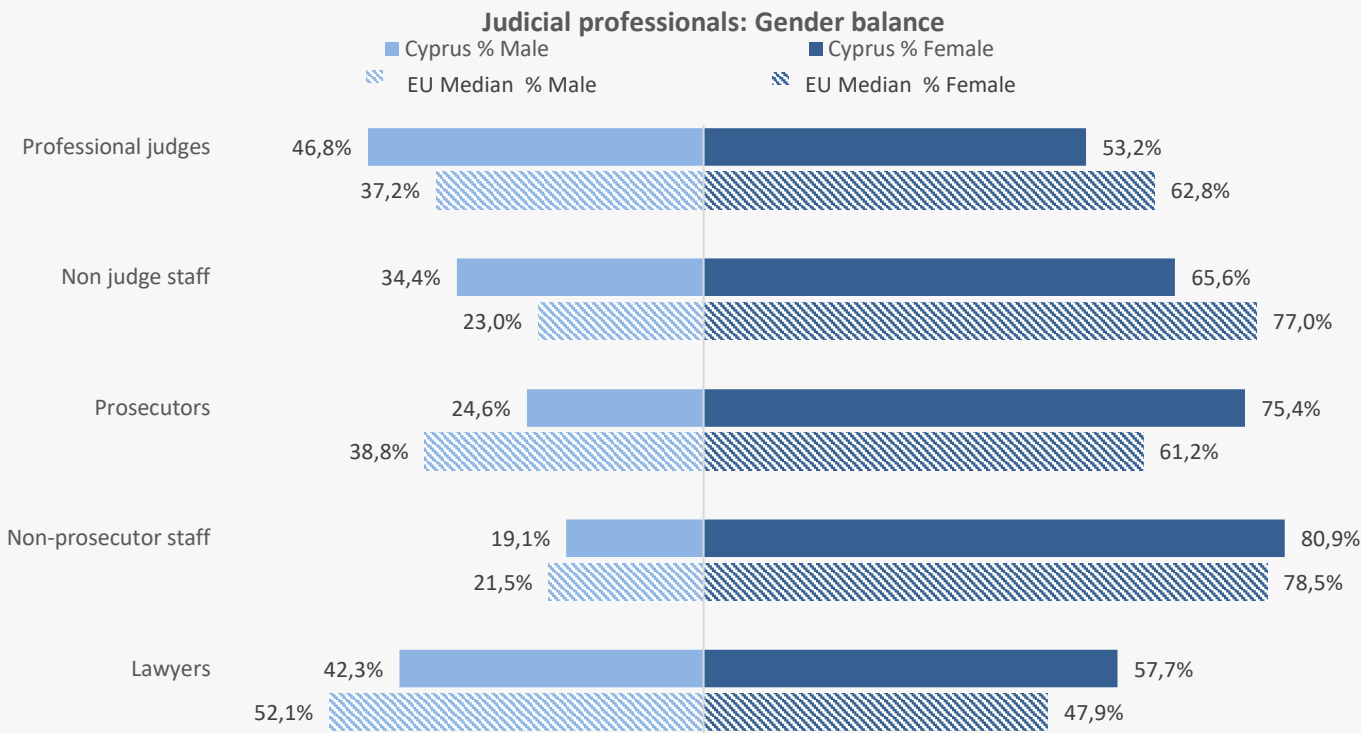

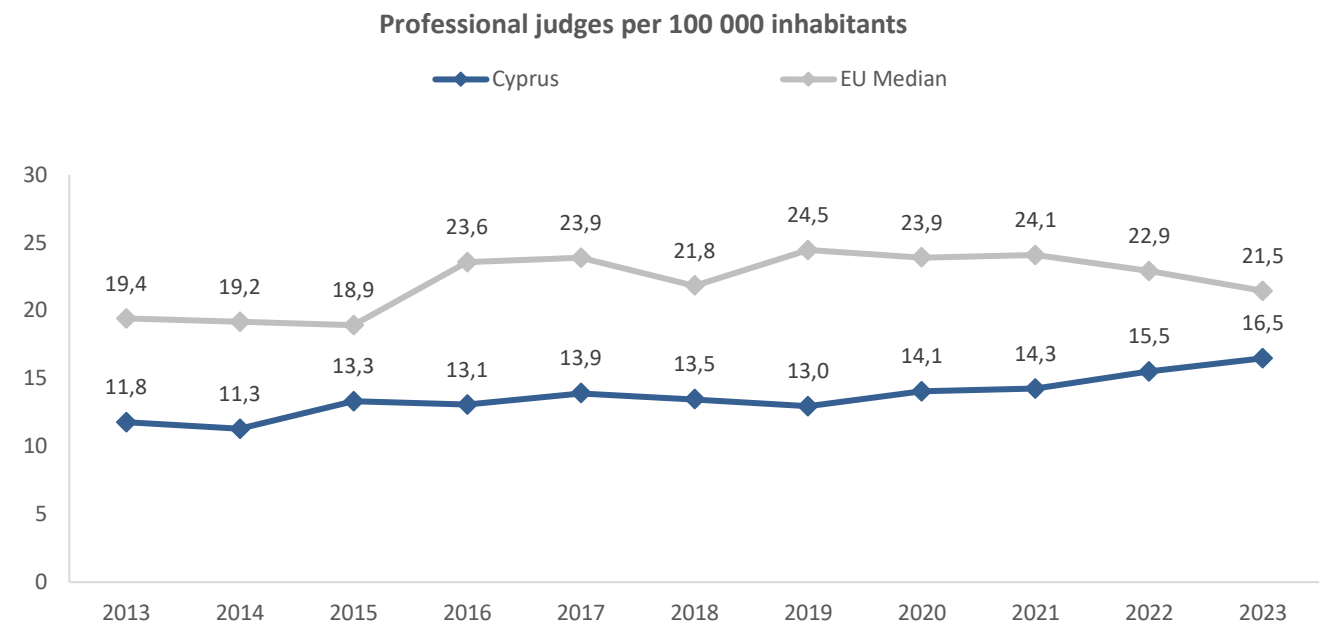

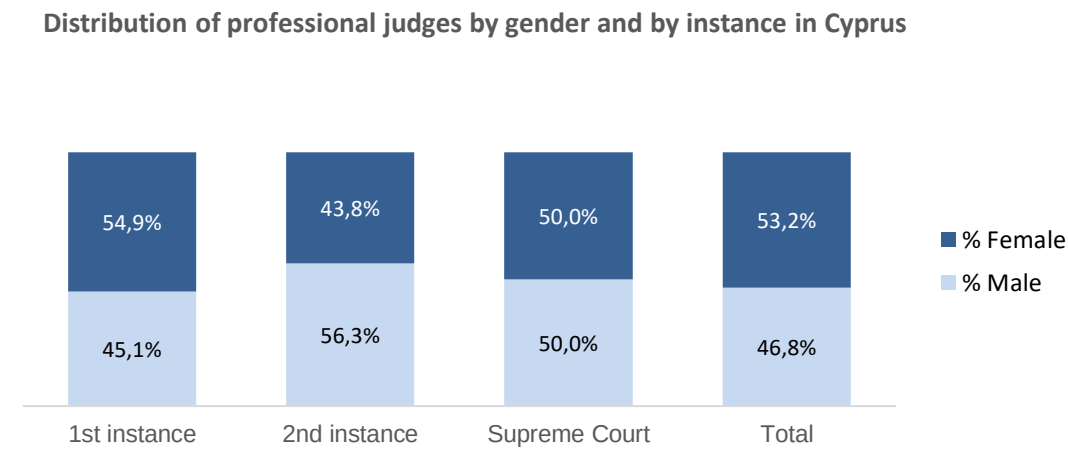
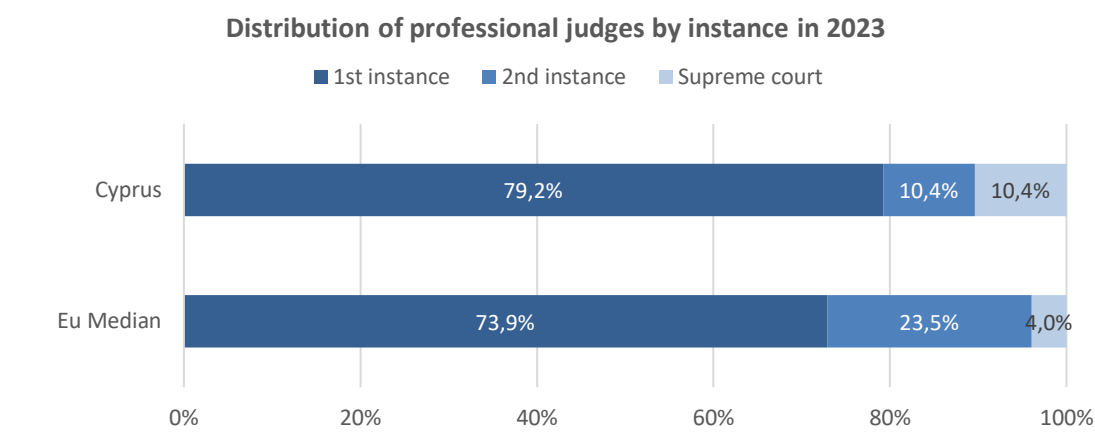


According to 2023 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Cyprus is 154, which is 7,7% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Cyprus, there are 16,5 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 21,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants)

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 82, which represents 53,2% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 122 are sitting in the first instance courts (of which 67 are female); 16 are sitting in the second instance courts (of which 7 are female) and 16 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of which 8 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, in Cyprus first instance judges prove to be more predominant than in teh EU. Conversely, there are half as many second instance judges as in the EU, while the percentage of Supreme Court judges is higher in Cyprus than in the EU.

As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of judges, the latter has been affected by the 2023 reform, namely the introduction of a three-tier court system. Judges are distributed among the different instances in the following way: at first instance are considered judges of the 11 first instance courts of general jurisdiction as well as those of the 19 specialised first instance courts; as second instance judges are counted those of the newly established Appeal court; data on last instance judges include the Supreme Court Judges (7) and the Supreme Constitutional Court Judges (9).

As regards the distribution male/female, it has to be specified that female judges do not constitute the majority at second instance only.

District judges deal with both criminal and civil cases. However they are assigned either civil or criminal jurisdiction for a specified period of time. For 2023 the numbers listed above are those of first instance district judges that deal solely for 2023 with criminal or civil cases accordingly.

The Appeal court is divided into chambers each one dealing with specific matters.

The Supreme court deals with Civil and Criminal cases. The Supreme Constitutional Court deals with constitutional cases and administrative cases at a last instance.

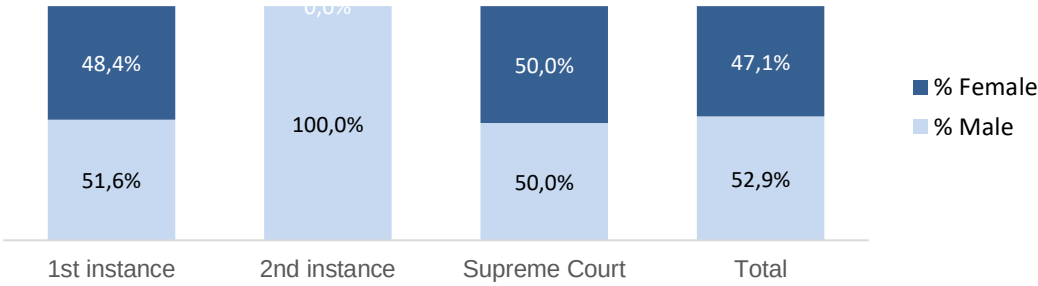
The category "Other" refers to the military court.

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Cyprus



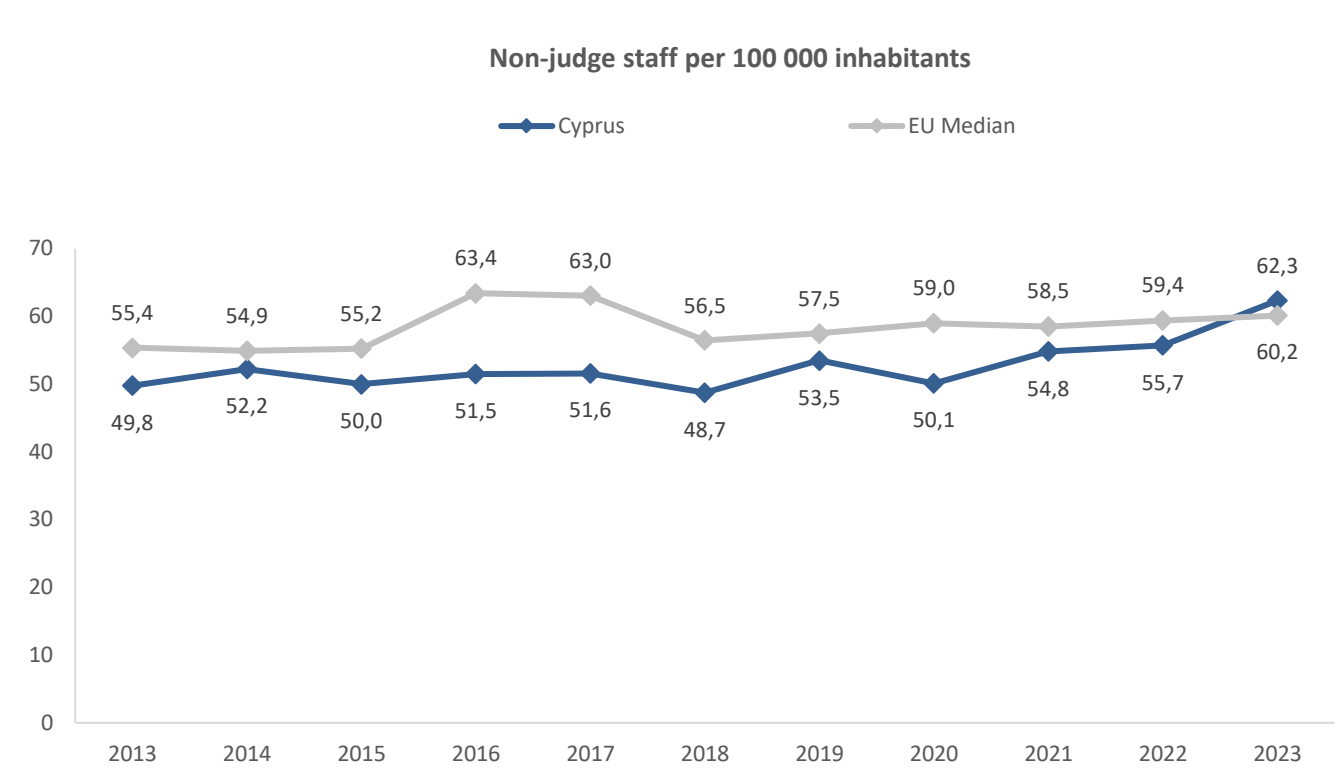
In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 16, which represents 47,1% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 31 are sitting in first instance courts (of which 15 are female); 1 are sitting in second instance courts (of which 0 are female) and 2 are sitting in Supreme Court (of which 1 are female).

It is worth recalling that following the 2023 reform, there are two presidents at the Supreme Court level - the one of the Supreme Court and the one of the Supreme Constitutional Court. Besides, on July 2023, as part of the judicial reform, a second instance Appeal court was established.

In 2023, Cyprus has 582 non-judge staff (of which 382 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 13,5%.

In 2023, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 55,7 in 2022 to 62,3 in 2023).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 15,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2022 to 16,5 in 2023.

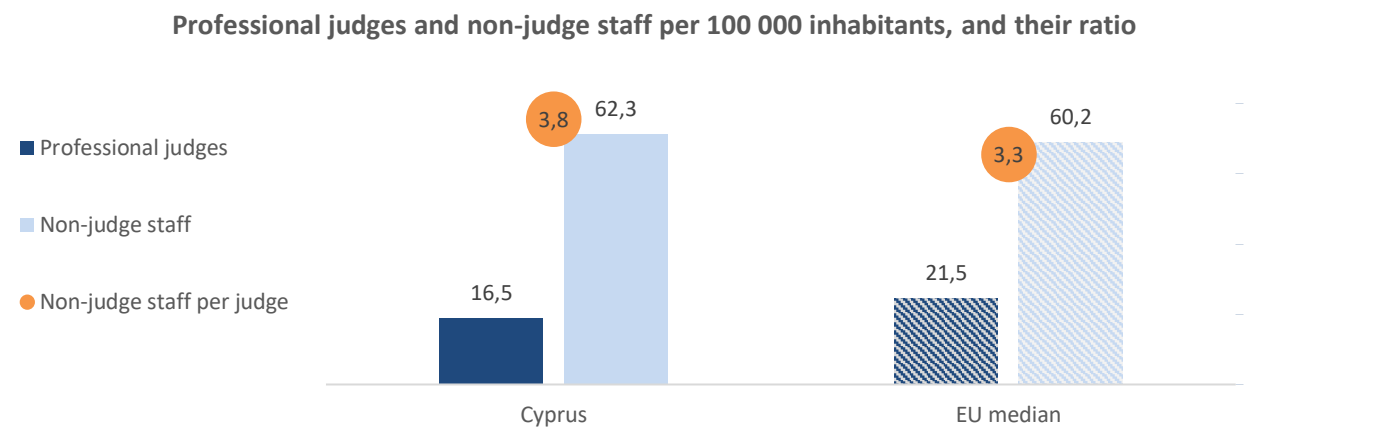
- 172 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of which 159 are Female);
- 176 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of which 150 are Female);
- 185 technical staff (of which 52 are Female);
- 49 other (of which 21 are Female);

The observed variation in the number of "4. technical staff" is due to the establishment of the Appeal court in 2023 and the employment of new staff.

The category "5. Other" includes court bailiffs.

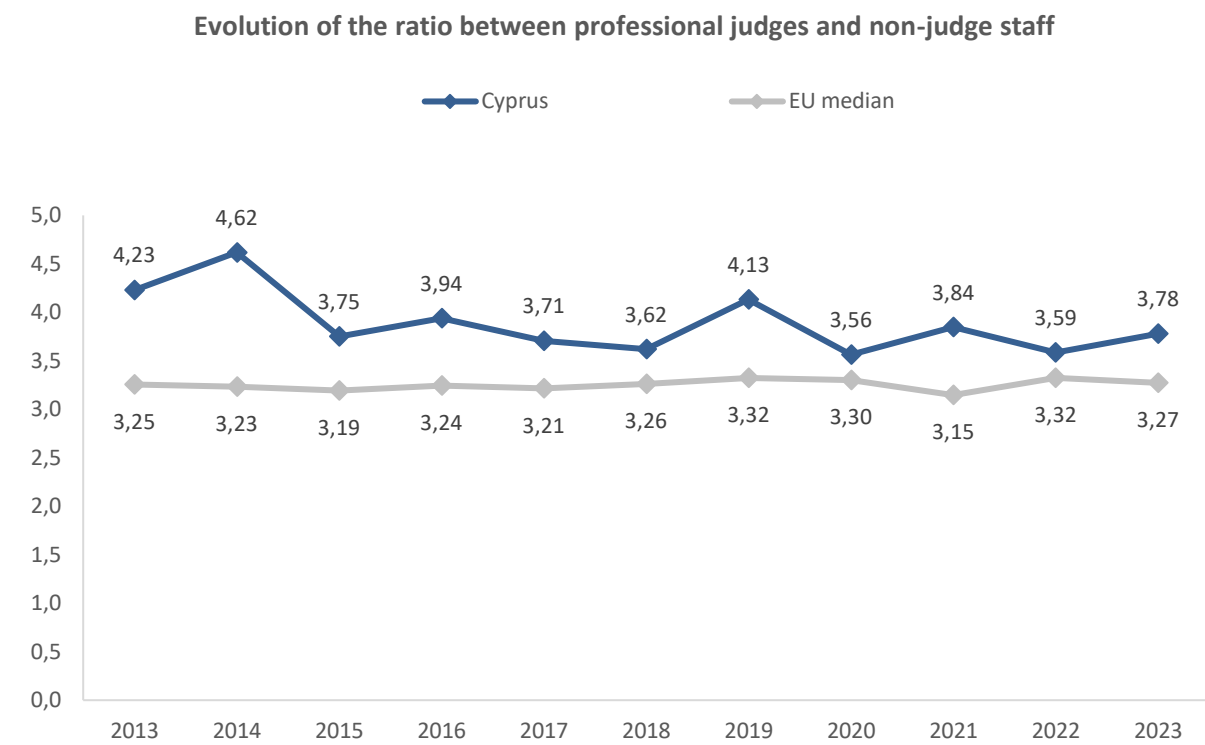

In Cyprus, there are 16,5 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 21,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 3,8 non-judge staff per judge. There has been a significant increase compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 3,6 non-judge staff per judge.

In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 49, which represents 75,4% of the total number of prosecutors.

The total number of prosecutors cannot be distributed among the different judicial instances. All public prosecutors can appear before all courts.

As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of public prosecutors, it should be noticed that in the Criminal section of the Legal Service of the Republic there are both counsels of the Republic as well as public prosecutors, who are in charge of handling criminal cases before criminal courts. Only the number fo public prosecutors is communicated in the table.

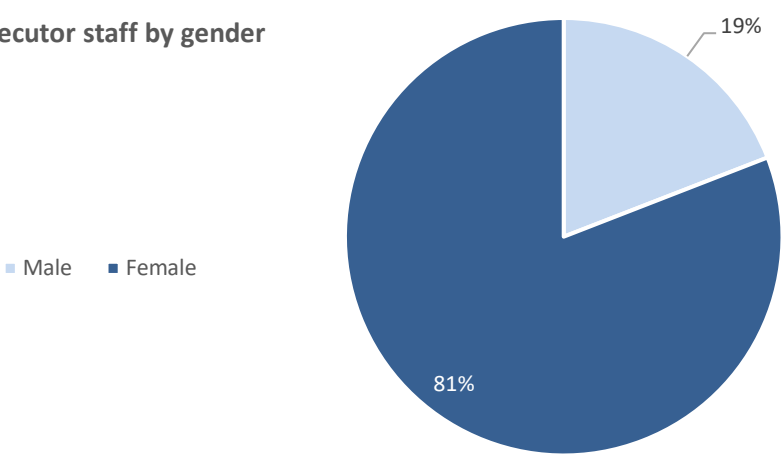

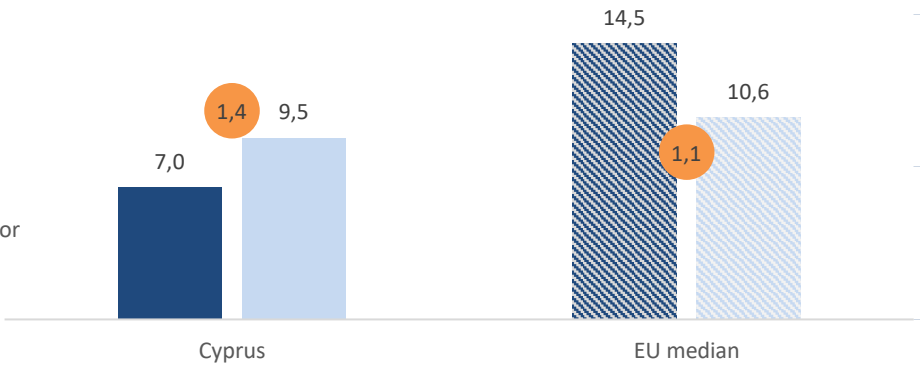

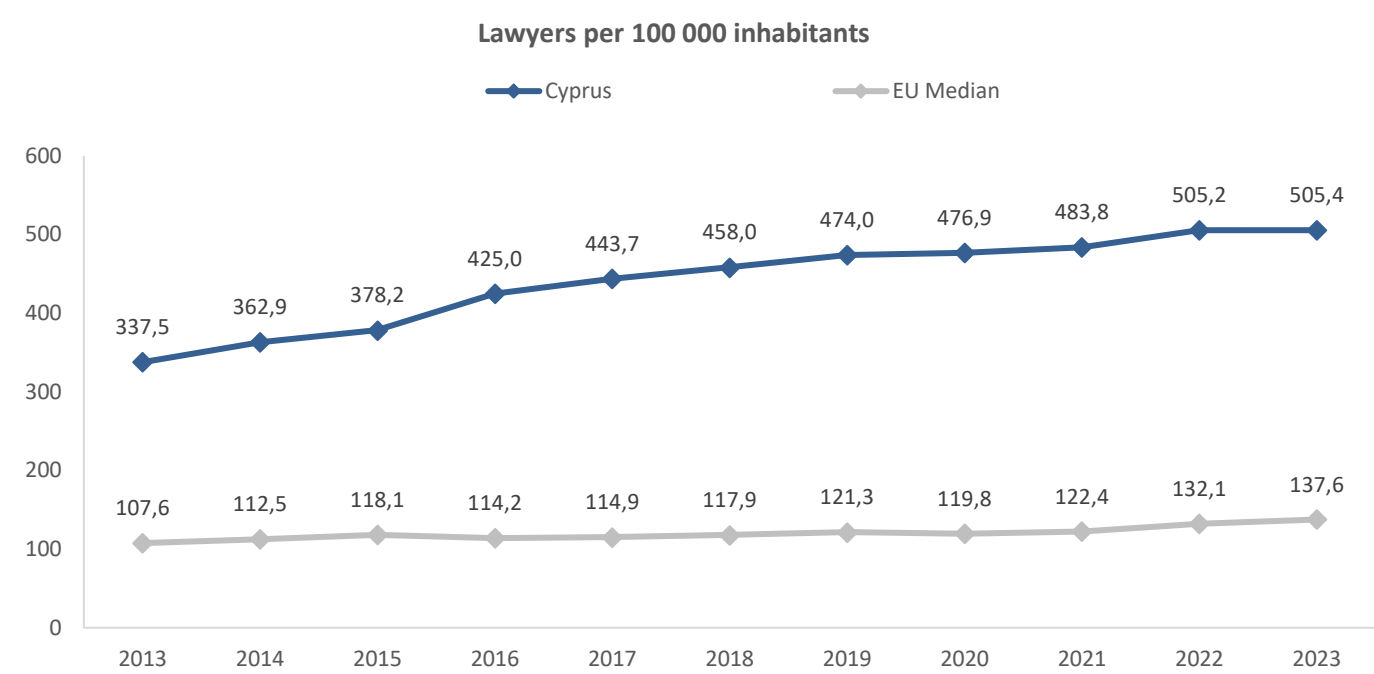
Public prosecutors and non-prosecutor staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio

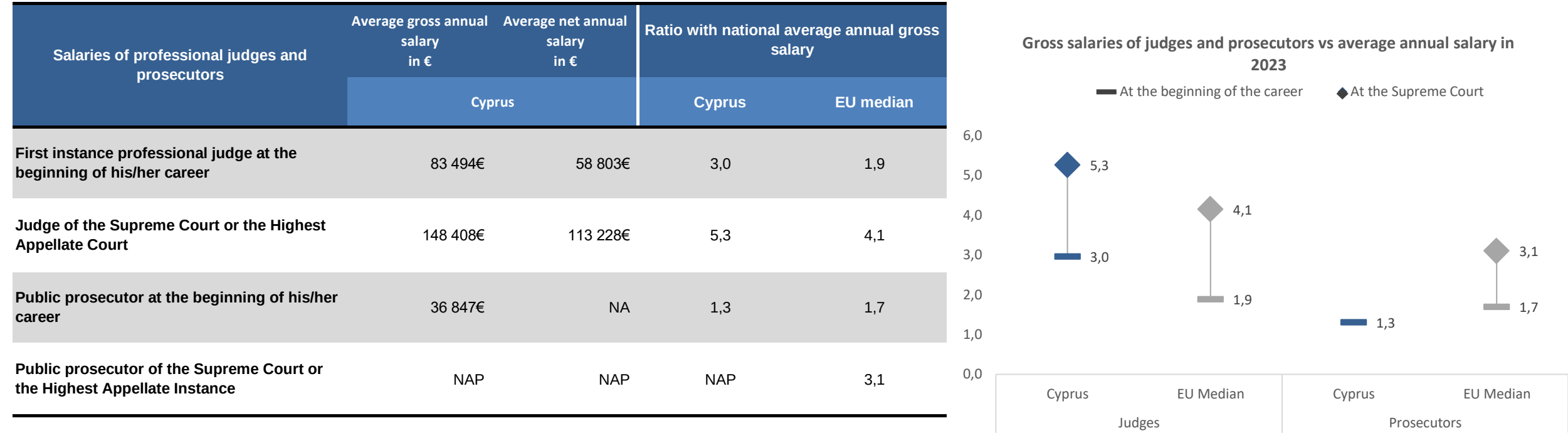


In 2023, there are 4 718 lawyers, which is 1,4% more than in 2022.

There are 2 720 female lawyers which is 58% of the total.

Cyprus has 505,4 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is above the EU median of 137,6 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

Salaries of professional judges and prosecutors at beginning of a career and at the highest instance



In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 144 856€.

According to 2023 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Cyprus is 83 494€, which is quite above the EU median of 58 128€. (44% above)

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 3,0 times higher. (the EU median is 1,9)

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 58 623€ to 266 974€. Cyprus's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is 25% above the EU median of 118 595€

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 101 592€.

In 2023, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Cyprus of 36 847€ is rather below the EU median of 49 953€. (-26% below)

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,3 times higher. (the EU median is 1,7)

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 456€ and the maximum is 199 670€. The EU median is 93 759€.

◦ Clearance Rate (CR) and Disposition Time (DT)

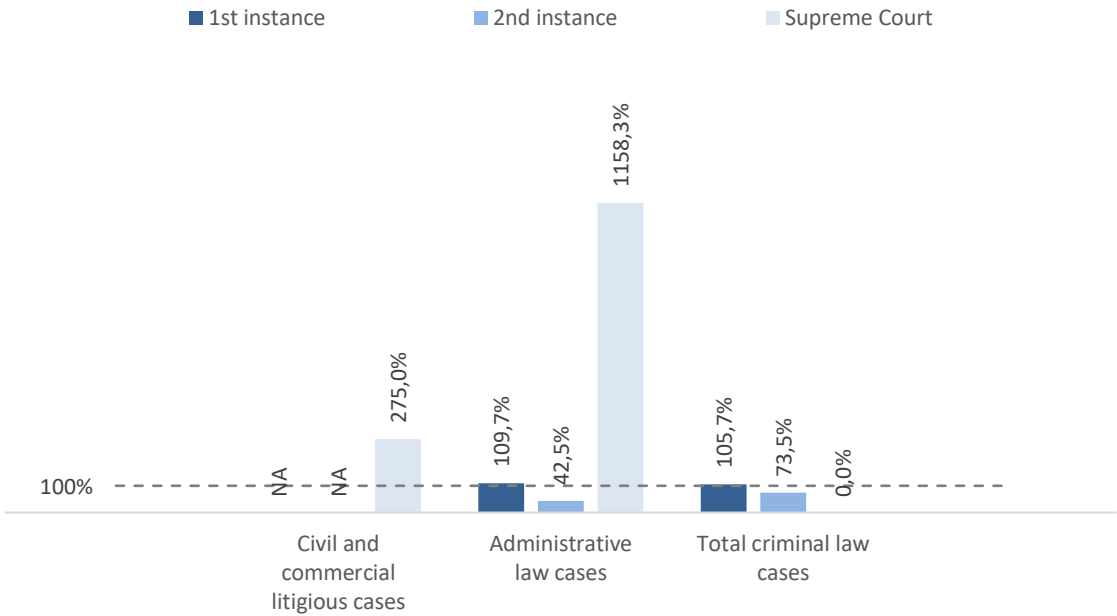
The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.

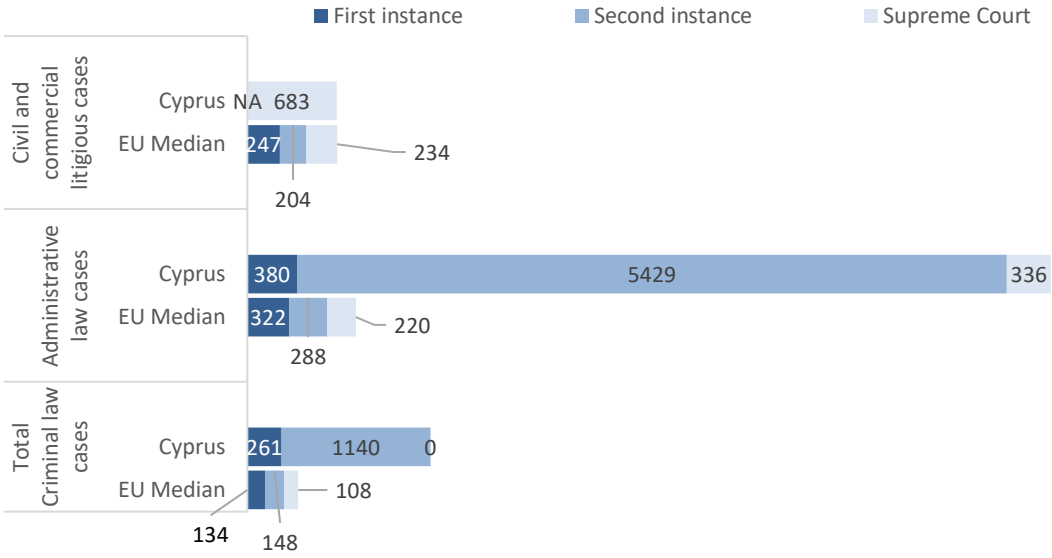

At the outset, it is worth recalling that in 2023 Cyprus adopted a three-tier court system with the establishment of the Appeal court and the Supreme Constitutional Court. Following the reform, appeals filed after 2018 were transferred to the new Appeal Court, while civil and criminal appeals filed before 2018 remained at the Supreme Court. The Supreme Constitutional Court is the third instance in administrative matters.

In civil matters, data are available only at the Supreme court level, while at first and second instance, the statistics do not allow distinguishing between litigious and non-litigious civil and commercial cases.

Because of the recent character of the reform, efficiency analyses are very difficult to be done. Indeed, the Clearance Rate and the Disposition Time values at second and third instances are flawed by the transitional period during which the competence of the Court of appeal and the Supreme court depends on cases' age.

Only first instance administrative and criminal cases can be analysed. One can notice that in both matters, the threshold of 100% Clearance rate has been exceeded, while the Disposition Time values are above the respective EU medians.

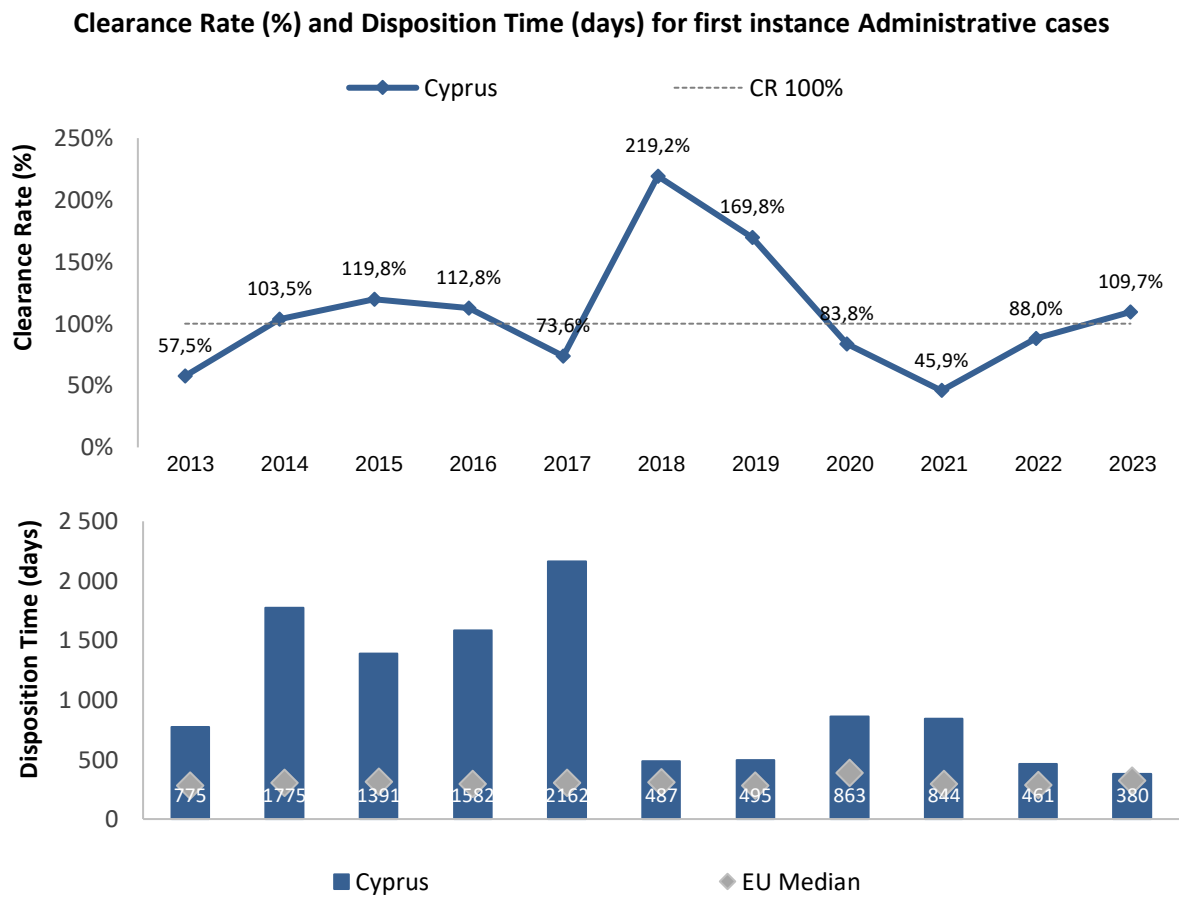

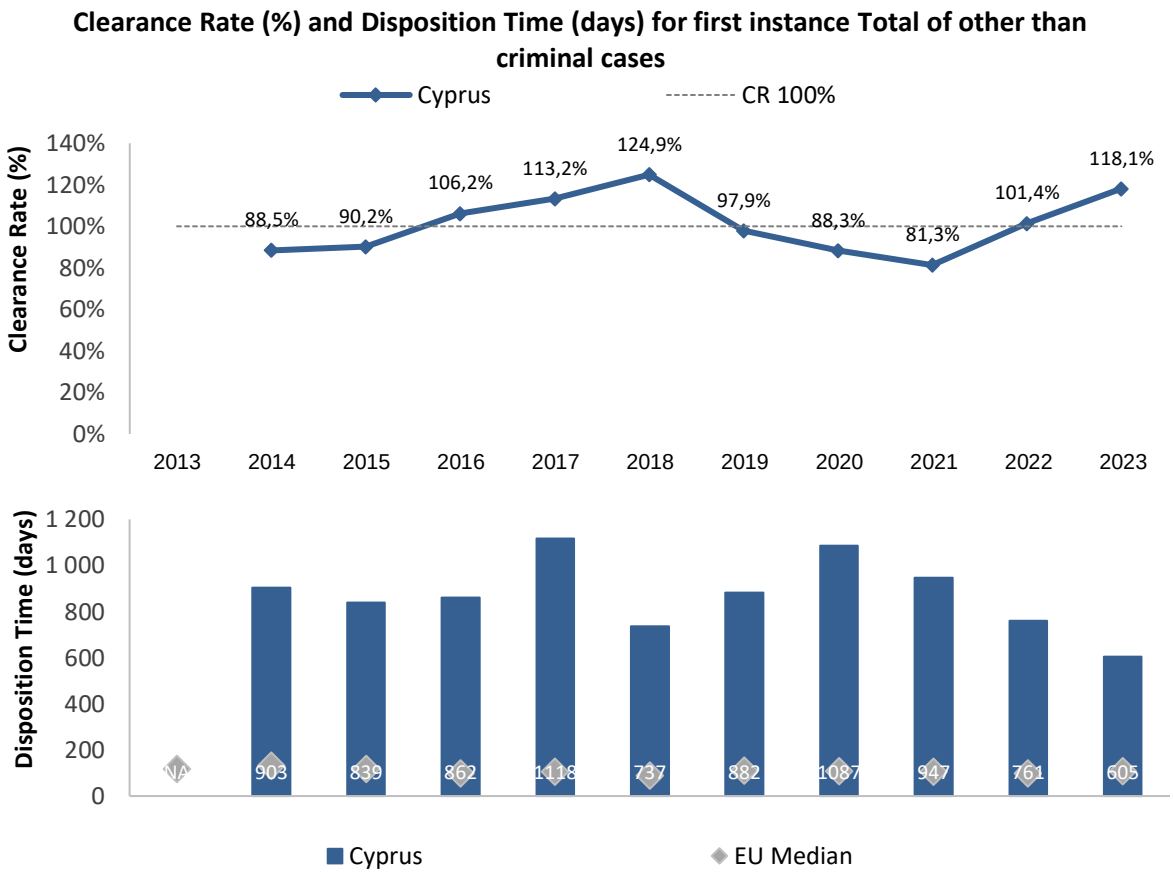

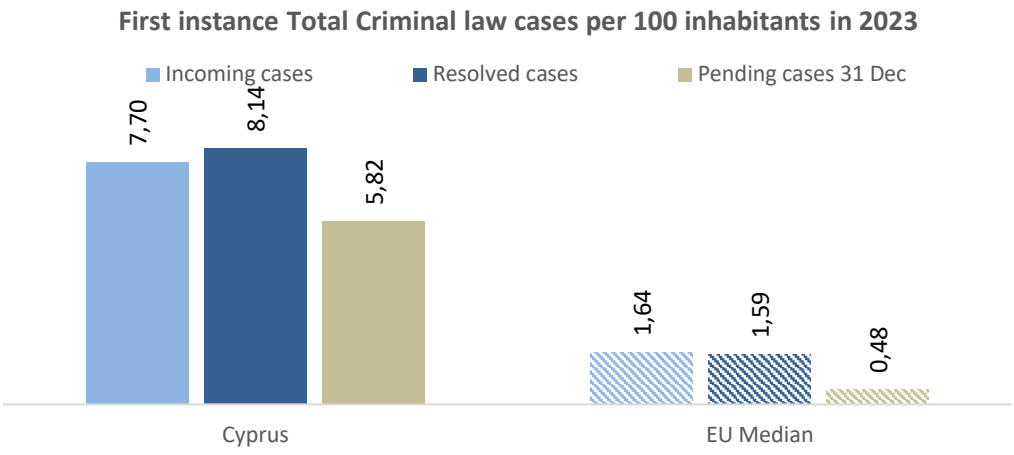

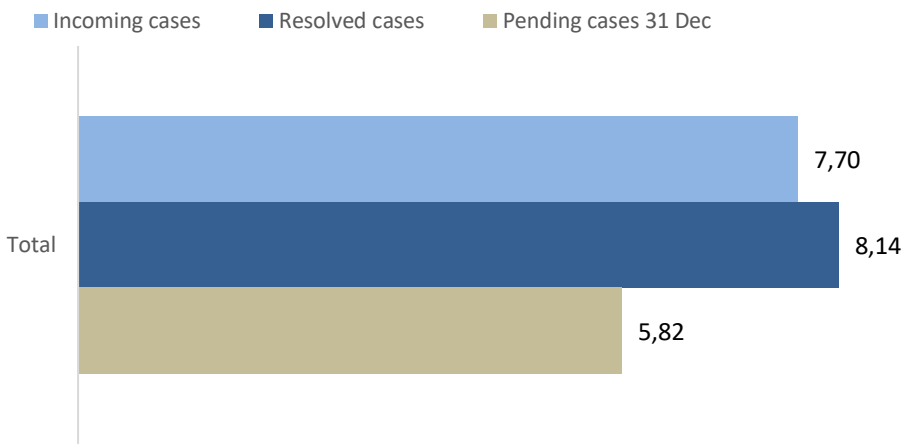

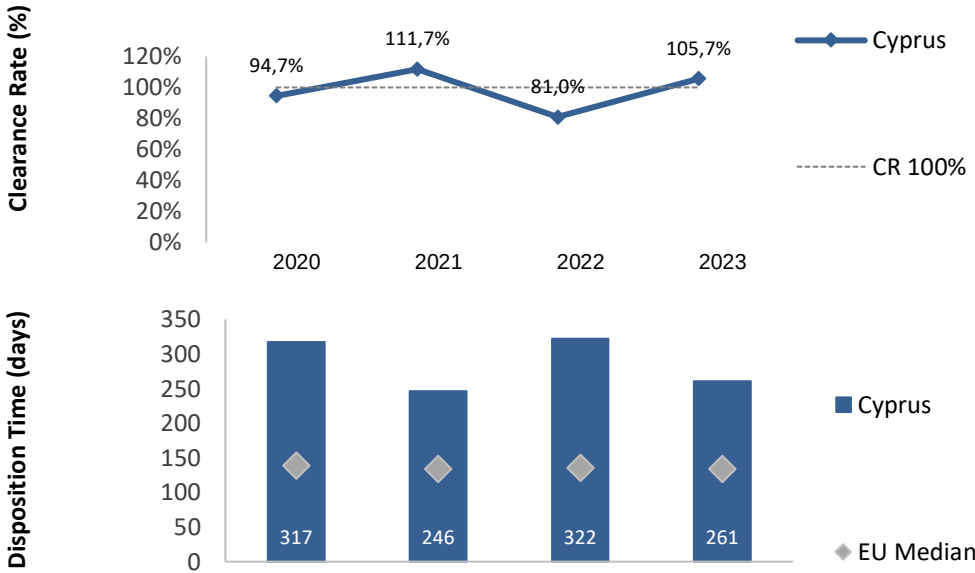

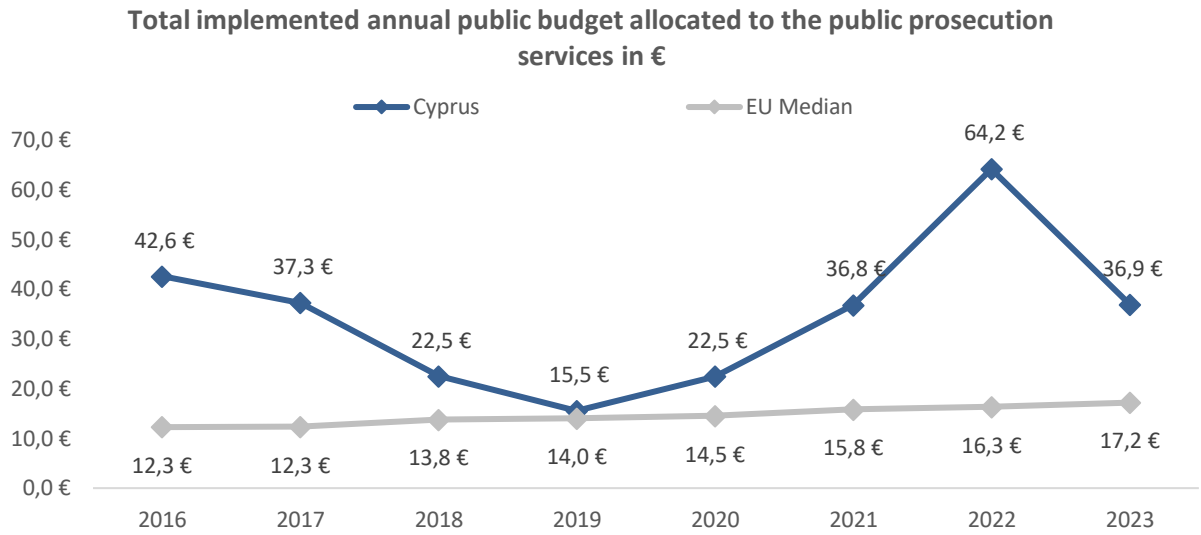

Data on accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation are not available.

According to the Mediation in Civil Matters Law of 2012 (Law 159(I)/2012), there are two Registers of Mediators which are kept by the Minister of Justice and Public Order: (1) the Register of Mediators where the mediation in question concerns commercial dispute and (2) the Register of Mediators where the mediation in question concerns civil dispute, other than commercial.

A person, in order to be registered in the Register of Mediators in commercial disputes must: (a) (i) be enrolled in the Roll of Advocates and holds an annual license of practicing as an advocate in accordance with the Advocate's Law, or (ii) be a member of the Cyprus Chamber of Commerce and Industry or the Cyprus Scientific and Technical Chamber, is the holder of a recognized university degree and has attended a special training programme to become a mediator of total forty (40) hours, organized by the Cyprus Chamber of Commerce and Industry, or the Technical Chamber of Cyprus, or has attended an equivalent programme; (b) does not hold any public post, either permanent, or temporary, or by substitution in the public service; (c) has not been convicted of a serious criminal offence or an offence involving dishonesty or moral turpitude; (d) is not under a trusteeship or guardianship and s/he is not deprived of his/her legal capacity; (e) pay a registration fee of €30 in the Minister of Justice and Public Order.

A person, in order to be registered in the Register of Mediators in civil disputes other than commercial must: (a) be enrolled in the Roll of Advocates and holds an annual license of practising as an advocate in accordance with the Advocate's Law and shall submit to the Minister certification that he has attended a programme of training as a Mediator; (b) does not hold any public post, either permanent, or temporary, or by substitution in the public service; (c) has not been convicted of a serious criminal offence or an offence involving dishonesty or moral turpitude; (d) is not under a trusteeship or guardianship and he is not deprived of his legal capacity; (e) pay a registration fee of €30 in the Minister of Justice and Public Order.

Also, every person who is registered in the Registers of Mediators, must continue her/his training in mediation matters, attending at least twenty-four (24) hours of education every three (3) years from the date of his/her registration, and submit a relevant certification to the Minister.
