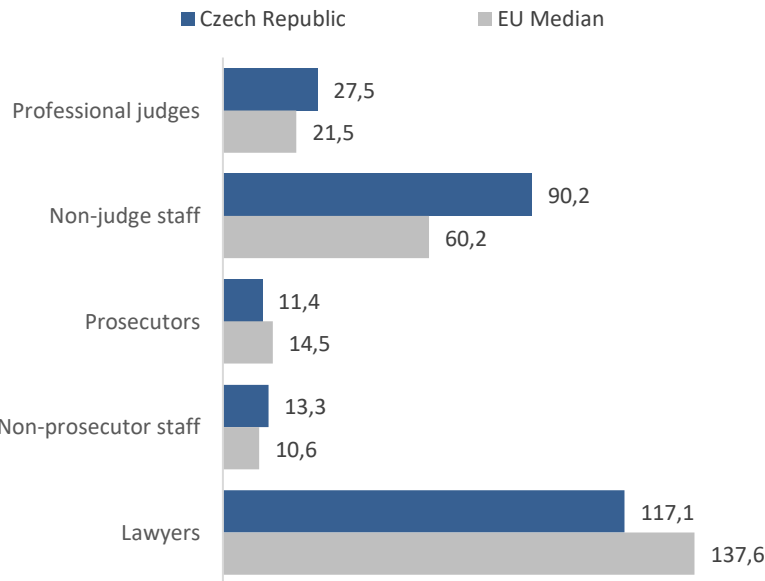

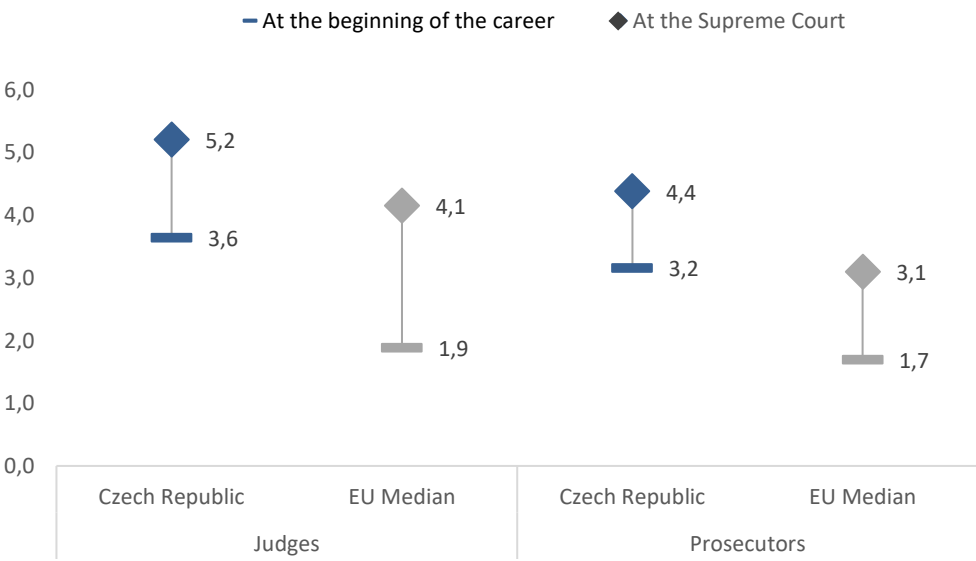

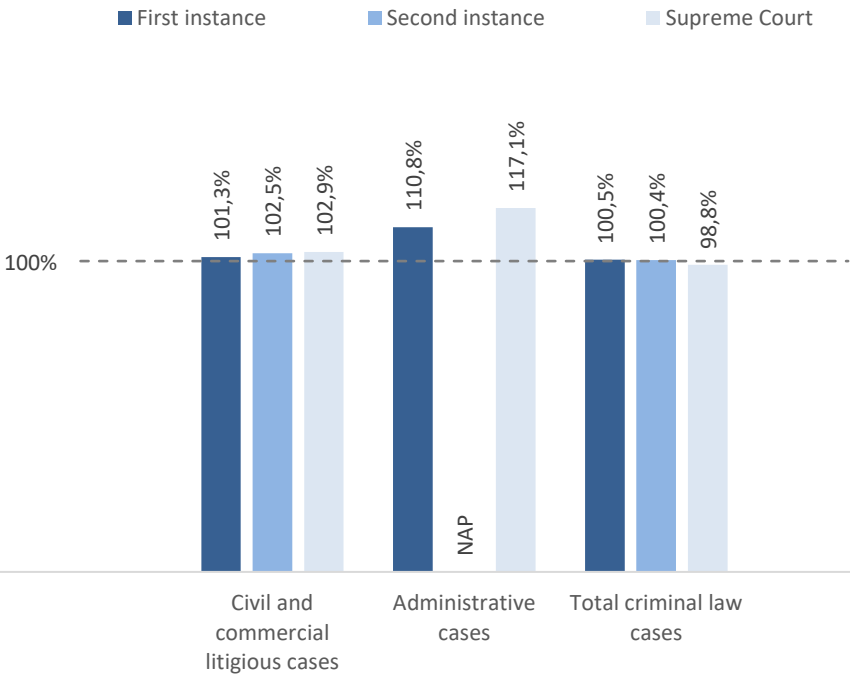


Gross salaries of judges and prosecutors vs average annual salary in 2023

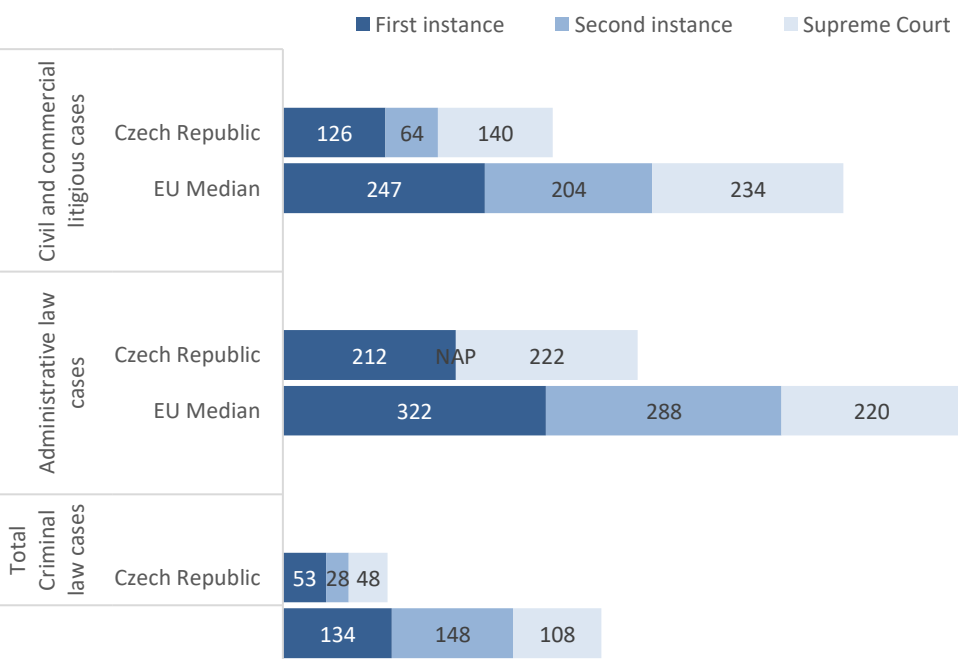

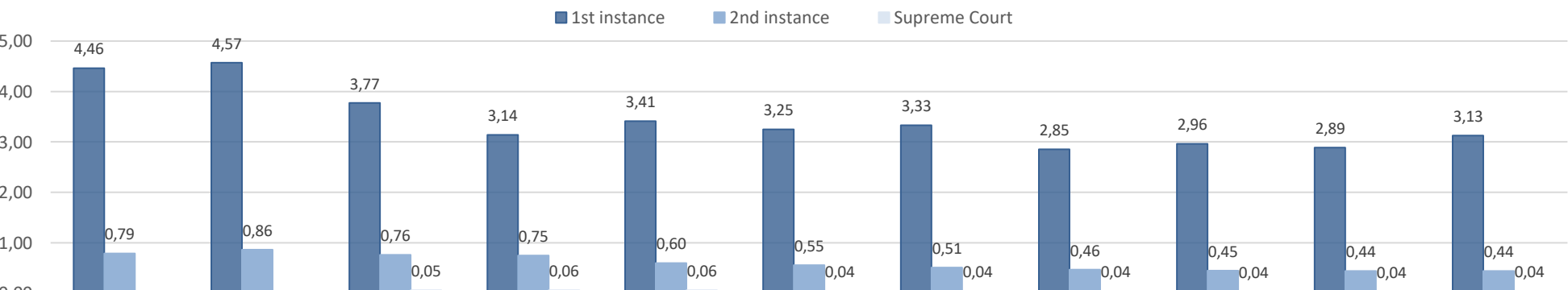


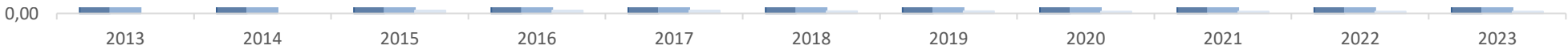
Disposition Time by instance and by matter in 2023 (days)

1. Judicial organisation in Czech Republic (2023 data)

The Czech Republic operates a four-tier court system.

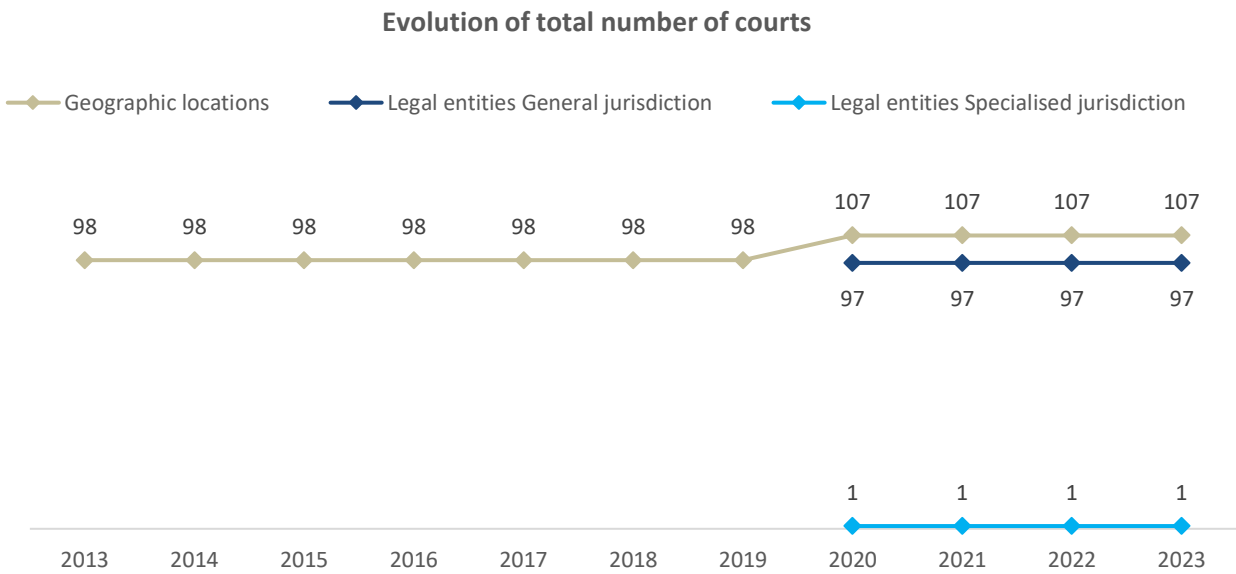
As of 2023, there are 98 courts recognized as legal entities. These include 97 courts of general jurisdiction and one specialized court, the Supreme Administrative Court, which serves as the highest instance for administrative cases.

Among the 97 courts of general jurisdiction, 86 operate as first-instance courts, 10 as second-instance courts, and one as a third-instance court.

Geographically, there are 107 court locations, with 89 functioning at the first-instance level. The discrepancy with the number of legal entities arises because 6 regional courts and 3 district courts maintain branch offices in other cities.

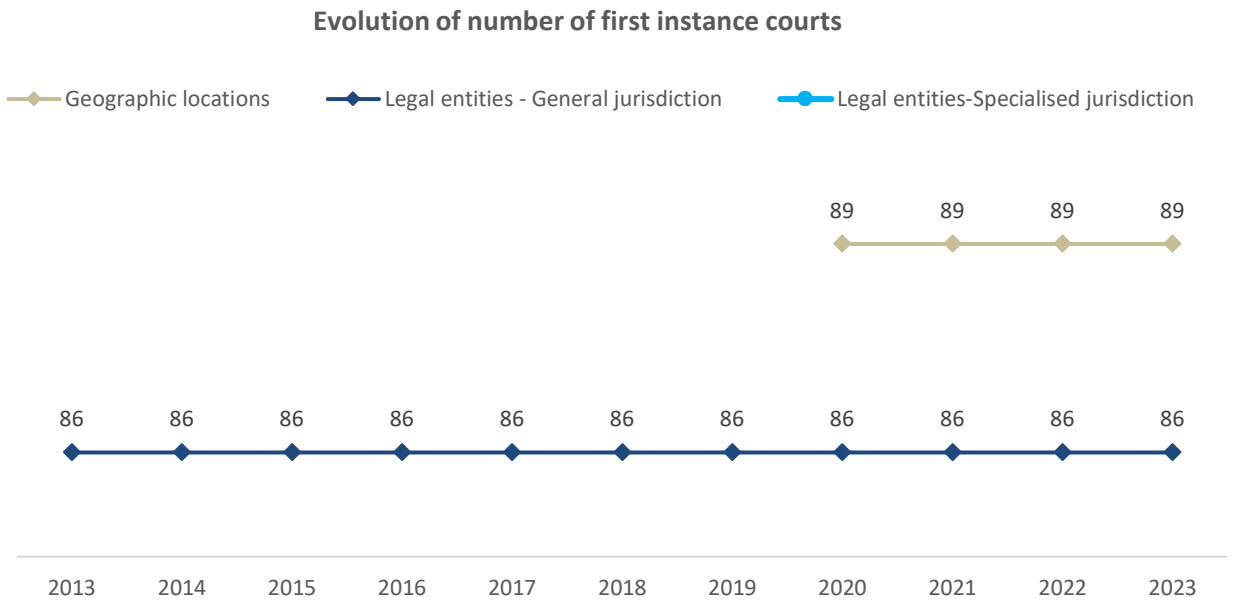

There are no specialized first-instance courts; however, judges within individual courts are specialized in specific areas. For example, at district courts, judges handle family, labor, and enforcement cases, while at regional courts acting as first-instance courts, judges specialize in insolvency and administrative cases.

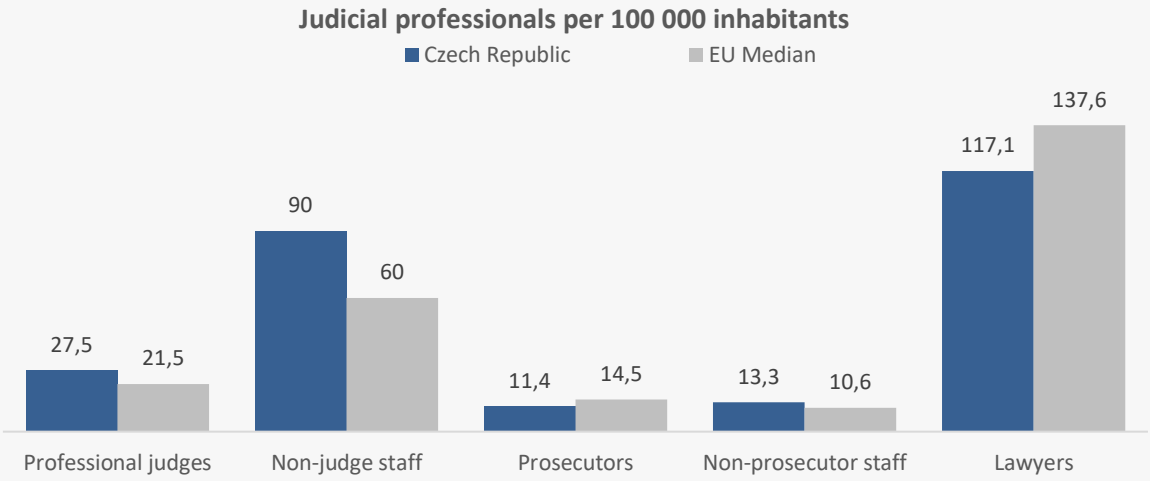
As previously mentioned, the Supreme Administrative Court is the only higher-instance specialized court.

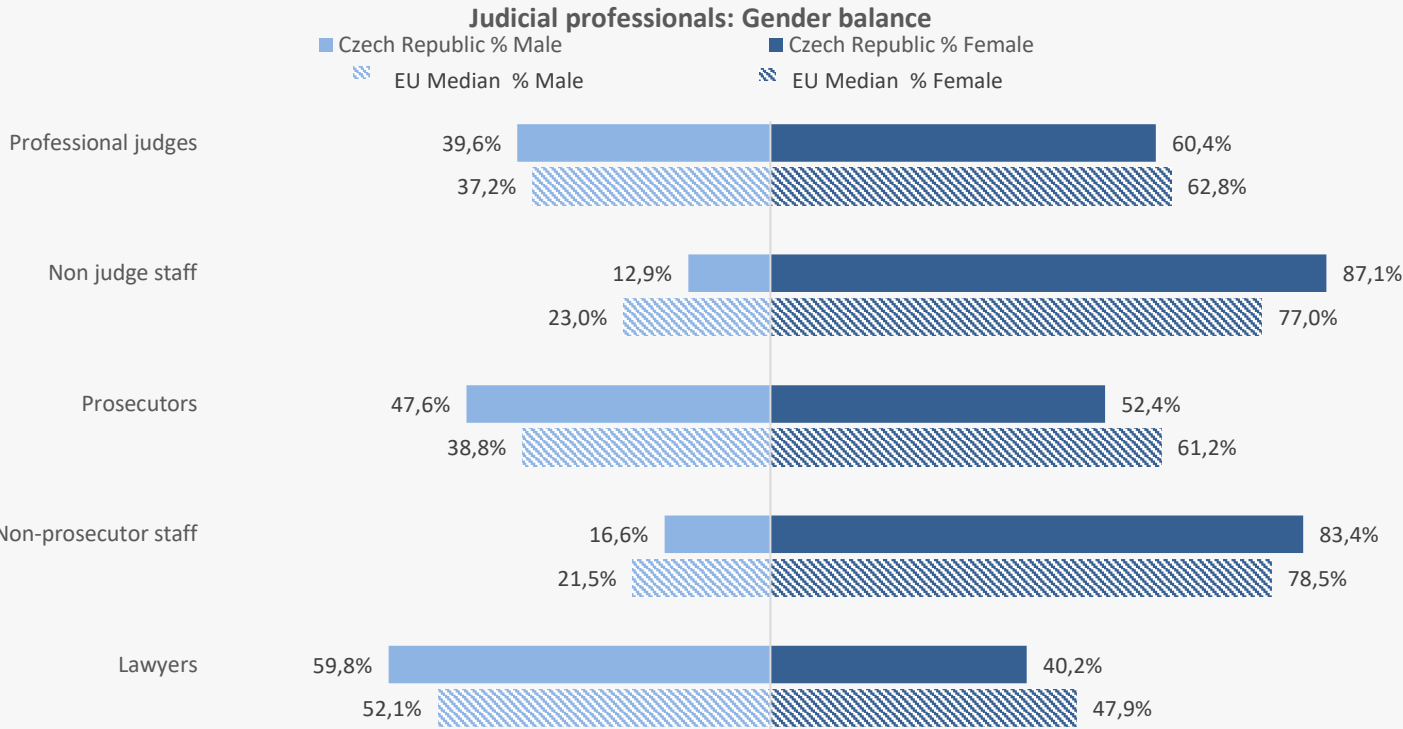

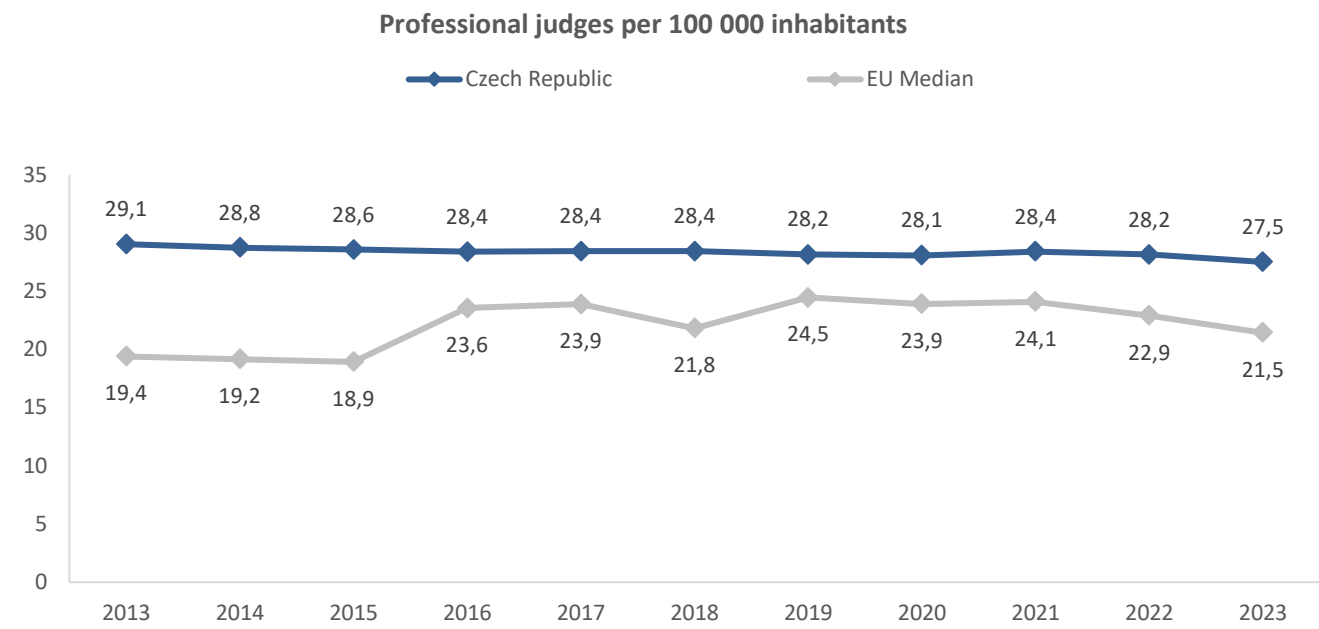

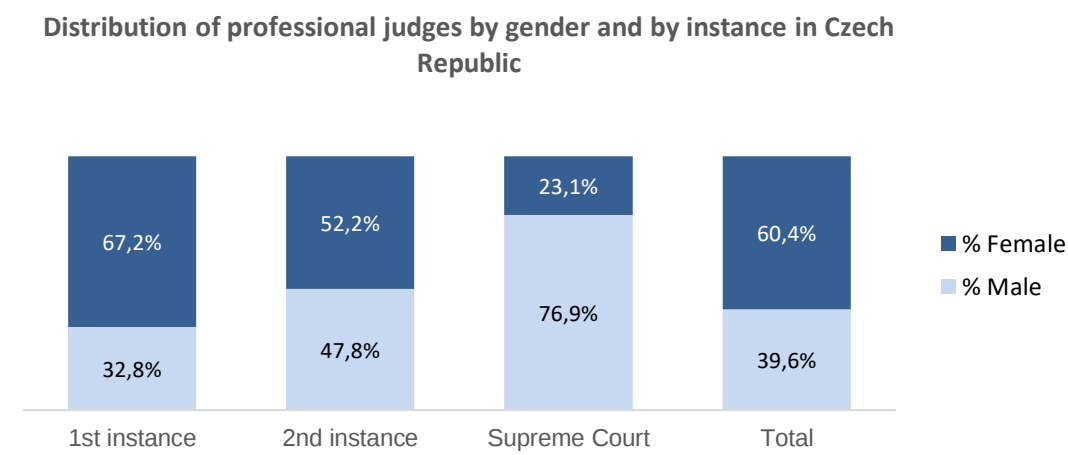
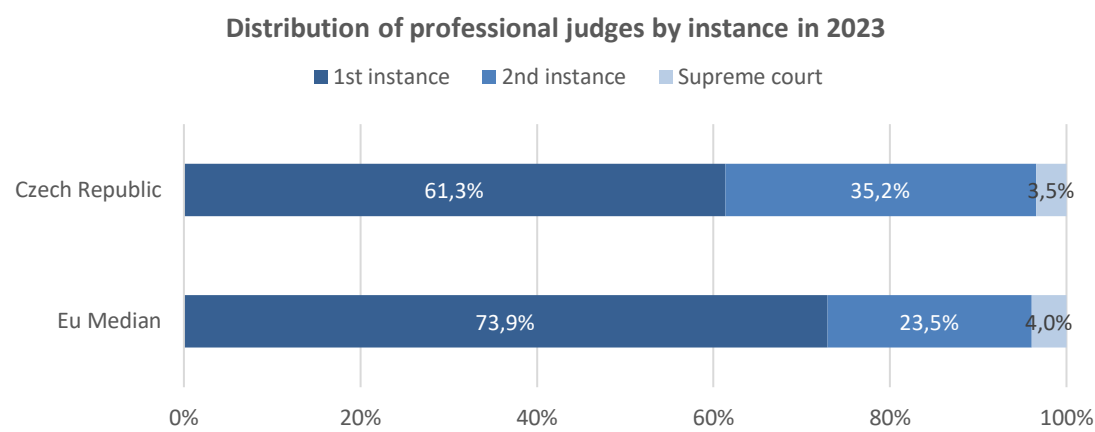


According to 2023 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in the Czech Republic is 3 001, which is -1,8% less than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in the Czech Republic, there are 27,5 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 21,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants)

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 1 812, which represents 60,4% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 1 841 are sitting in the first instance courts (of which 1 237 are female); 1 056 are sitting in the second instance courts (of which 551 are female) and 104 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of which 24 are female).

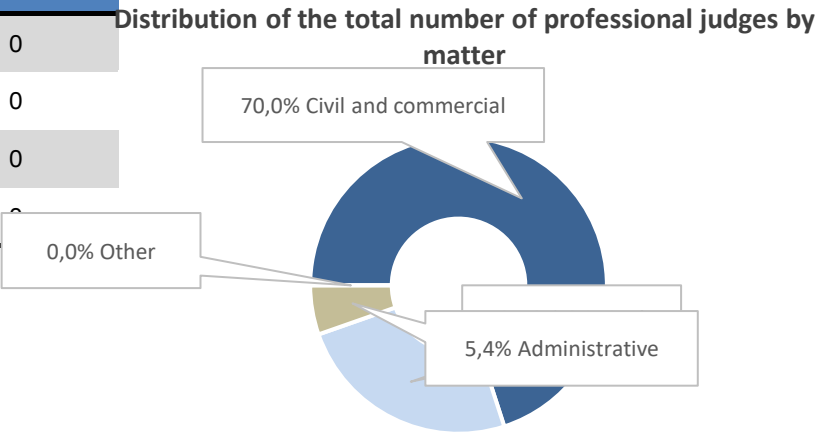
Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, the trend in the Czech Republic is similar. While the number of first-instance judges remains predominant, it is slightly lower than the EU average. Conversely, the number of second-instance judges is higher than the EU median, whereas the number of third-instance judges is slightly below it.

As regards the distribution of the number of judges among the different judicial instances, the Czech Republic presents some peculiarities which should be mentioned. Indeed, the Czech Republic has a four-tier system. The number of judges of the two High Courts is included in the number of second instance judges. This methodology of presentation of data is applied since 2013, while for the previous evaluations, magistrates of the High Courts were considered as third instance judges.

As regards the distribution male/female, it has to be specified that female judges have the majority at the first and second instance, but not at third instance (where thier percentage remains rather low).

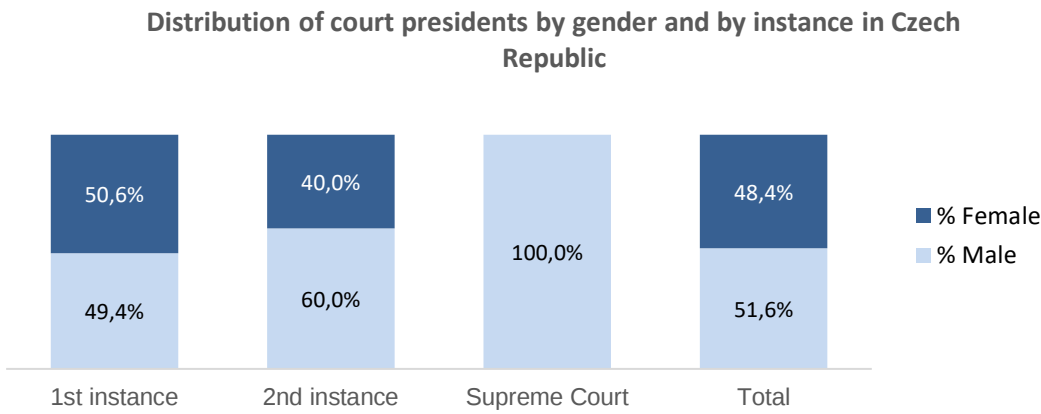

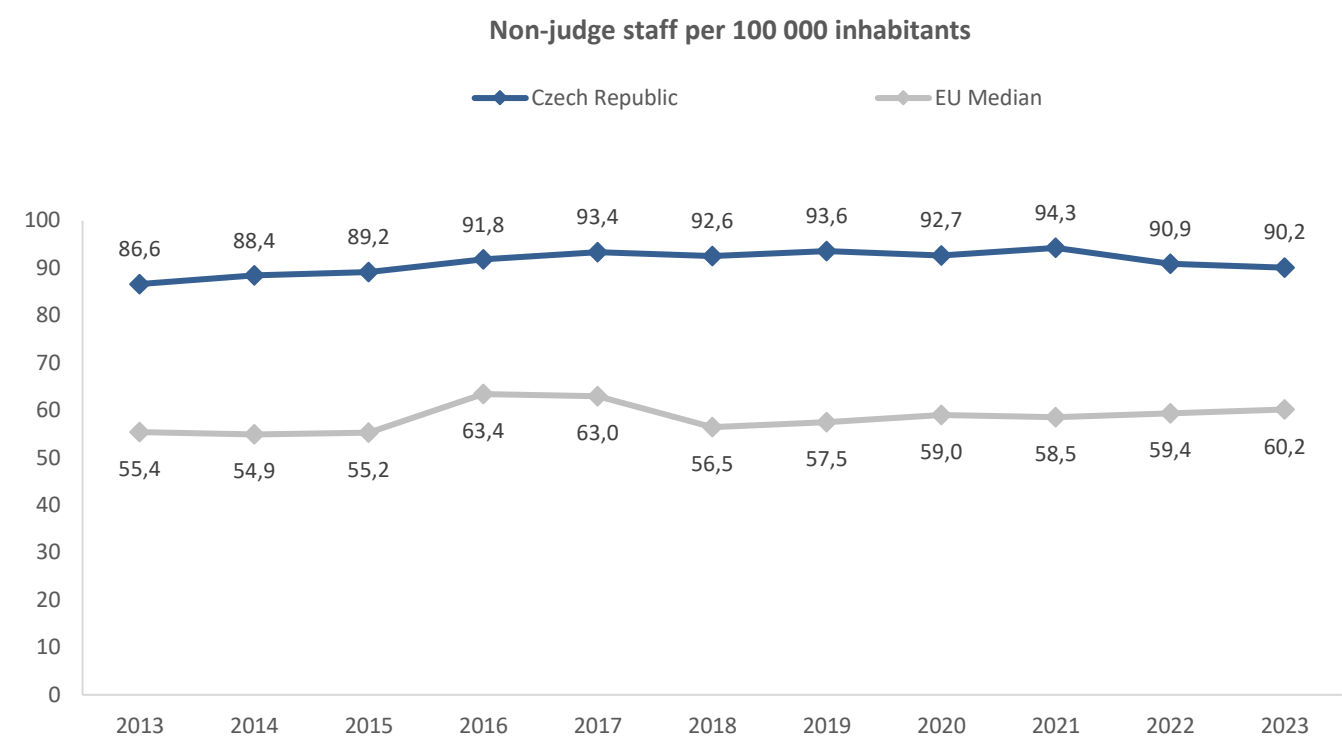


In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 46, which represents 48,4% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 83 are sitting in first instance courts (of which 42 are female); 10 are sitting in second instance courts (of which 4 are female) and 2 are sitting in Supreme Court (of which none is female).

In 2023, the Czech Republic has 9 827 non-judge staff (of which 8 560 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals a decrease of -0,4%.

In 2023, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has decreased (from 90,9 in 2022 to 90,2 in 2023).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 28,2 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2022 to 27,5 in 2023.

- In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:
- 2 509 Rechtspfleger (or similar bodies) with judicial or quasi-judicial tasks having autonomous competence and whose decisions could be subject to appeal (among which 2 109 are Female);
 - 4 473 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of which 4 226 are Female);
 - 2 163 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of which 1 814 are Female);
 - 636 technical staff (of which 389 are Female);
 - 46 other (of which 22 are Female);

The category “other” encompasses judicial trainees or staff in charge of court documentation, as well as press center and telephone exchange staff.

The judicial trainee is entitled to perform the acts of the court under the conditions and to the extent specified in factual and time plan of the preparatory service which is compiled by the chairman of the regional court after consultation with the advisory board for the education of trainees.

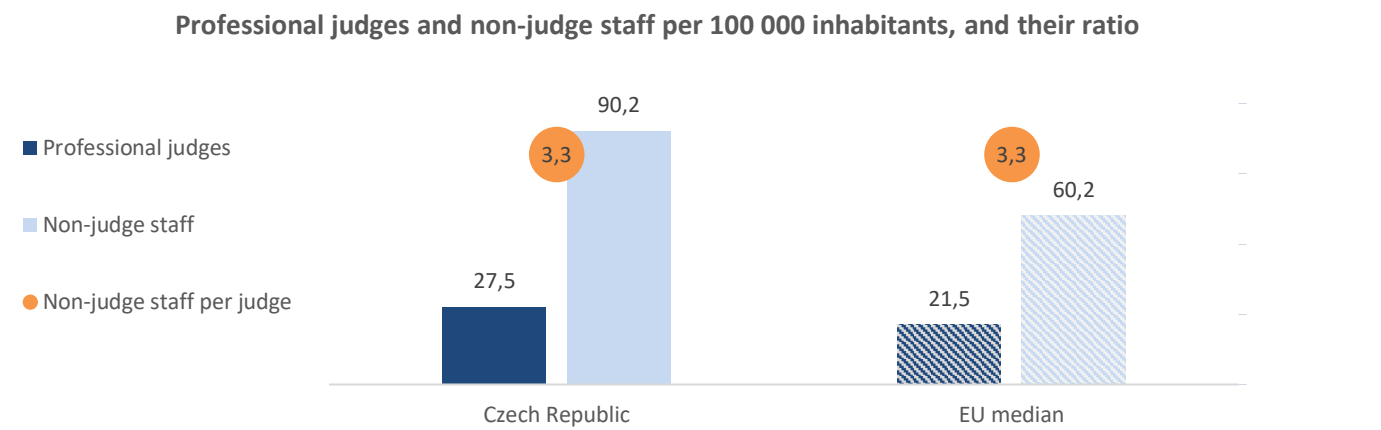
In accordance with the preparatory service plan, the trainee performs preparatory service at a district or regional court. The trainee is usually assigned to one judge. Familiarization with individual court agendas is ensured by the fact that the president of the court where the judicial trainee is currently located gradually assigns the trainee to individual court departments.

The preparatory service includes adaptation courses, seminars and lectures organized by the Judicial Academy and educational activities organized by court for at least 2 days per month.

Starting from 2022 the title of “judicial trainee” has been replaced with “judicial candidate”.

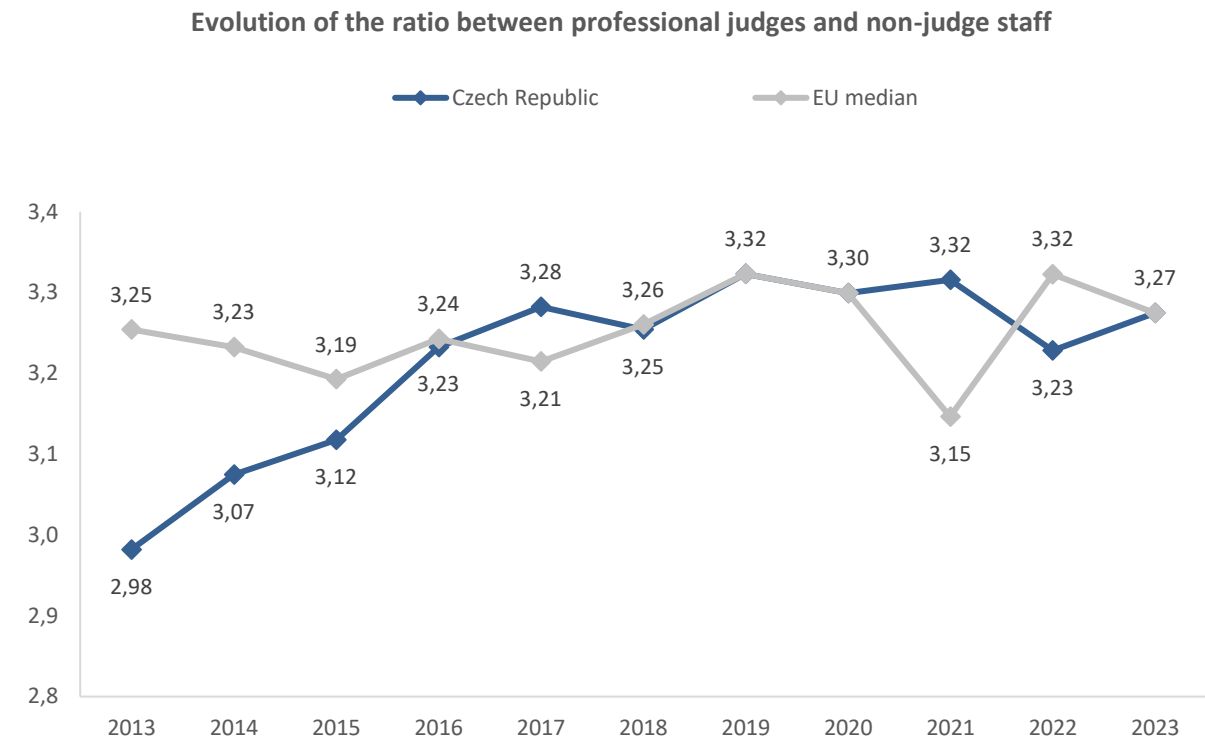


In the Czech Republic, there are 27,5 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 21,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 3,3 non-judge staff per judge.

There has been a small increase compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 3,2 non-judge staff per judge.

Evolution of the ratio between professional judges and non-judge staff

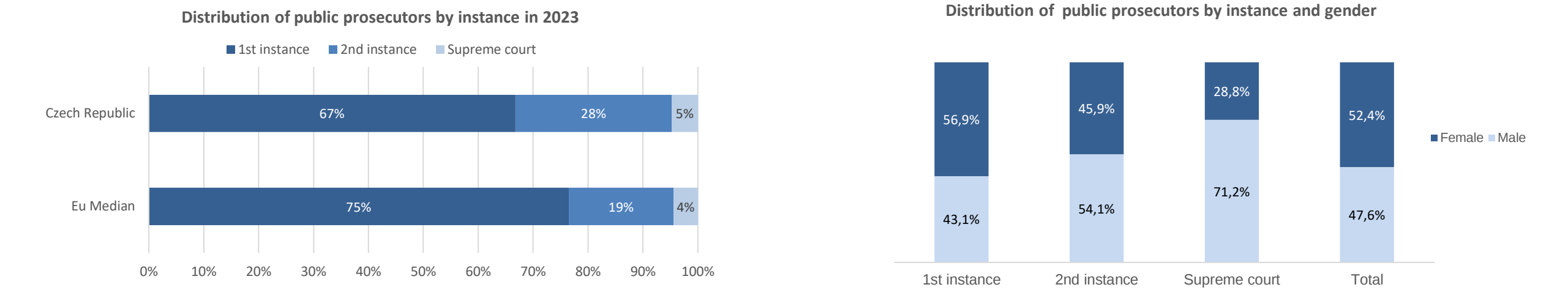

In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 653, which represents 52,4% of the total number of prosecutors.

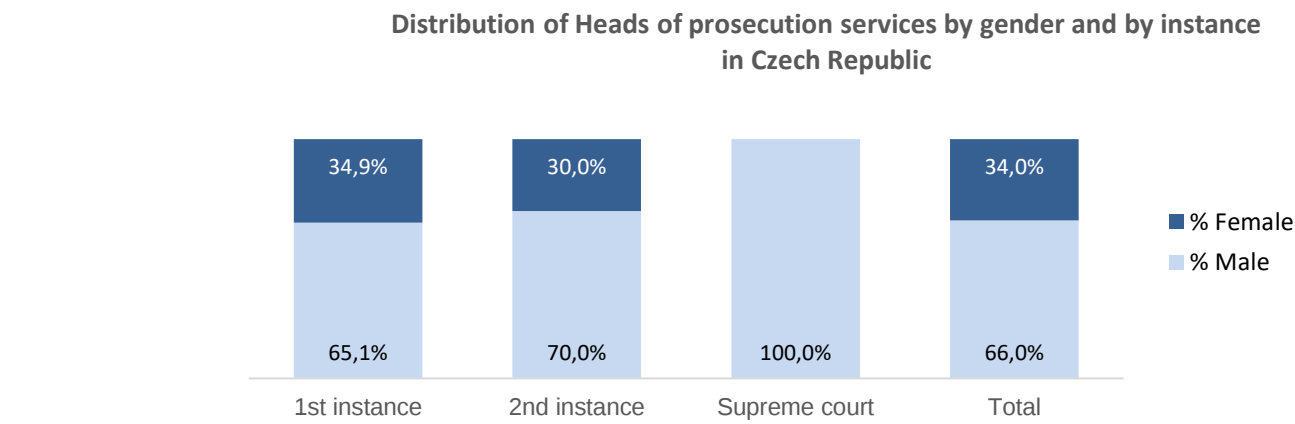
The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 832 in first instance (of which 473 are female); 355 are in second instance (of which 163 are female) and 59 in final instance (of which 17 are female).

As regards the distribution of the number of prosecutors among the different judicial instances, the Czech Republic presents some peculiarities which should be mentioned. Namely, the Czech Republic has a system of 4 levels of State prosecution offices: district, regional, high and supreme. The number of high public prosecutors is included in the number of prosecutors at second instance level.

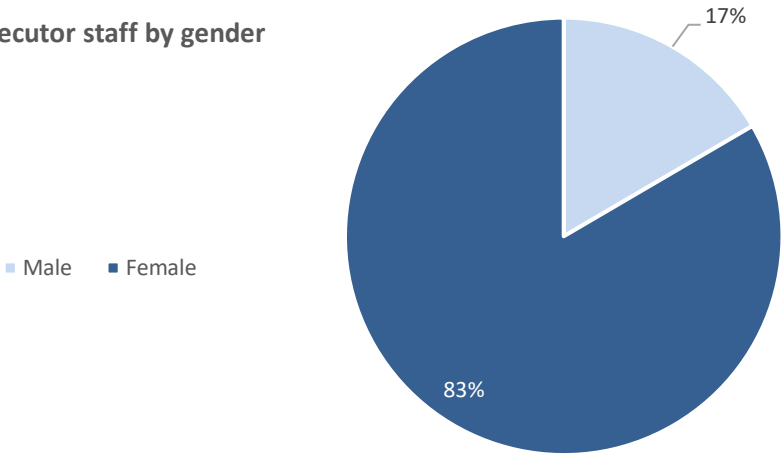
In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution services (all instances) is 33, which represents 34,0% of the total number of Heads of prosecution services.

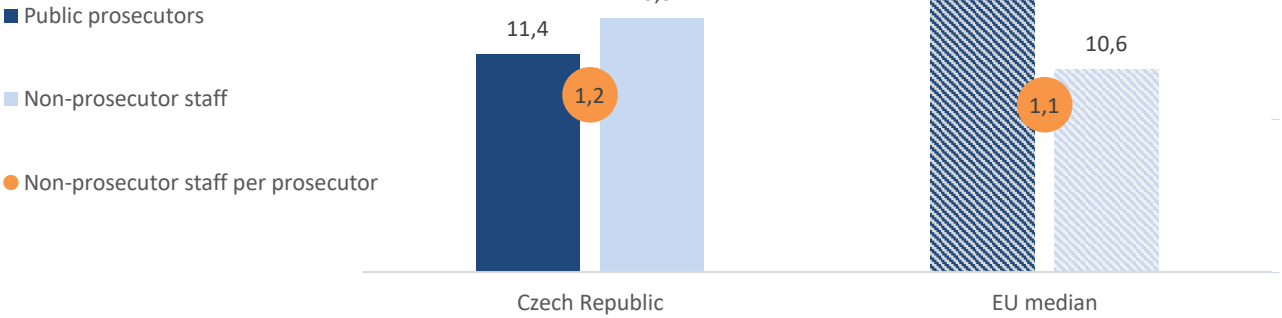
Non-prosecutor staff by gender

Public prosecutors and non-prosecutor staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio

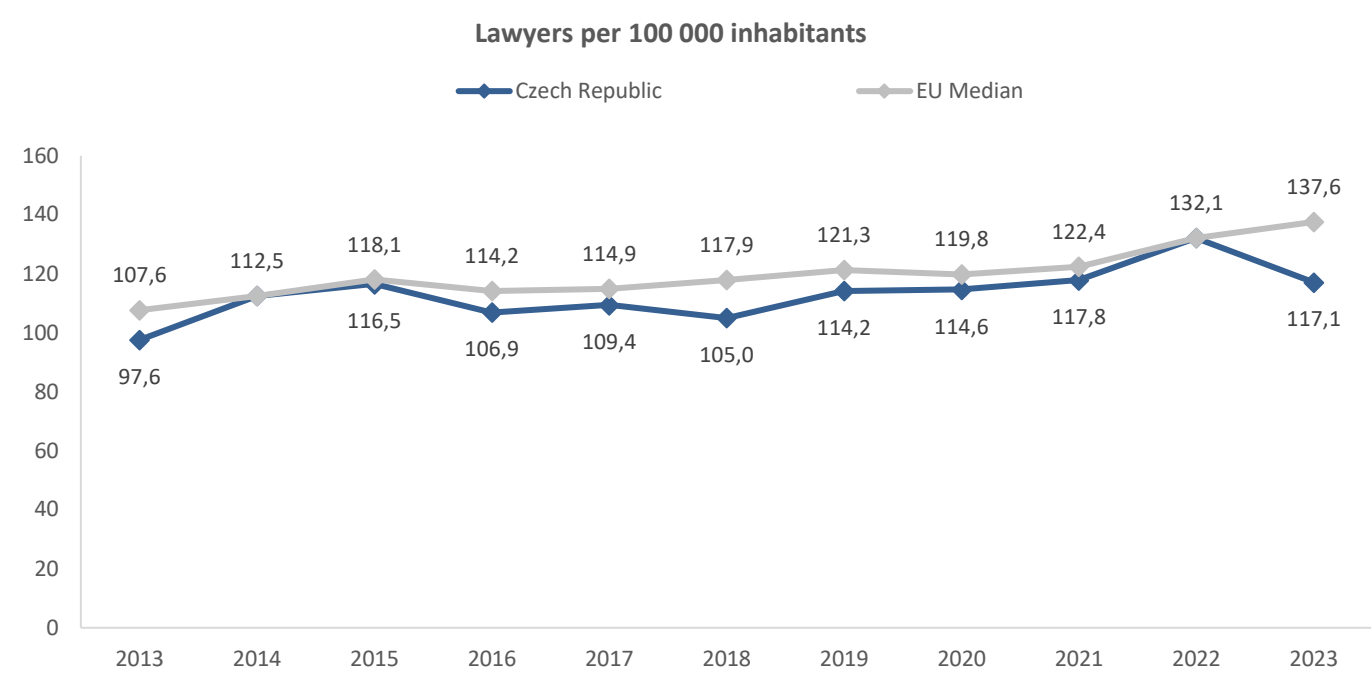

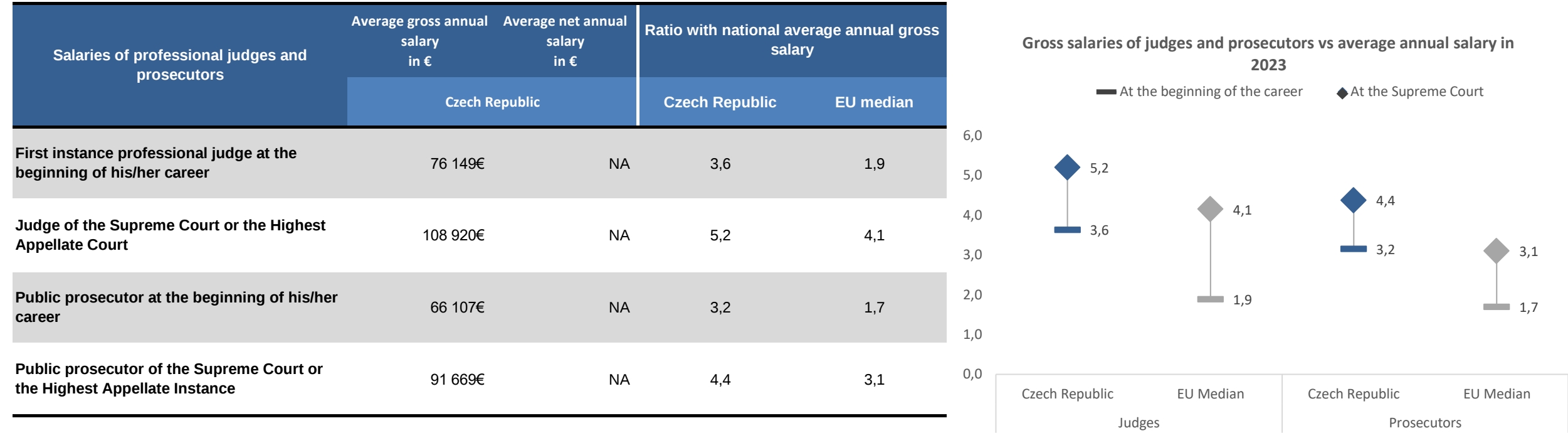

In 2023, there are 12 766 lawyers, which is -10,9% less than in 2022.
There are 5 129 female lawyers which is 40% of the total.

The Czech Republic has 117,1 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is below the EU median of 137,6 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.



Salaries of professional judges and prosecutors at beginning of a career and at the highest instance



In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 144 856€.

According to 2023 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Czech Republic is 76 149€, which is quite above the EU median of 58 128€. (31% above)

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 3,6 times higher. (the EU median is 1,9)

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 58 623€ to 266 974€. Czech Republic's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is -8% below the EU median of 118 595€

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 101 592€.

In 2023, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Czech Republic of 66 107€ is quite above the EU median of 49 953€. (32% above)

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 3,2 times higher. (the EU median is 1,7)

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 456€ and the maximum is 199 670€. The Czech Republic's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is -2% below the EU median of 93 759€

According to the Czech Ministry of Justice, they cannot provide additional comments on the salary increases in 2023 for judges in the Czech Republic. However, it is worth noting that judicial and prosecutorial salaries were previously frozen. This freeze was later deemed unconstitutional by the Constitutional Court, which led to a substantial increase in salaries, particularly for first-instance judges and public prosecutors, starting in 2023.

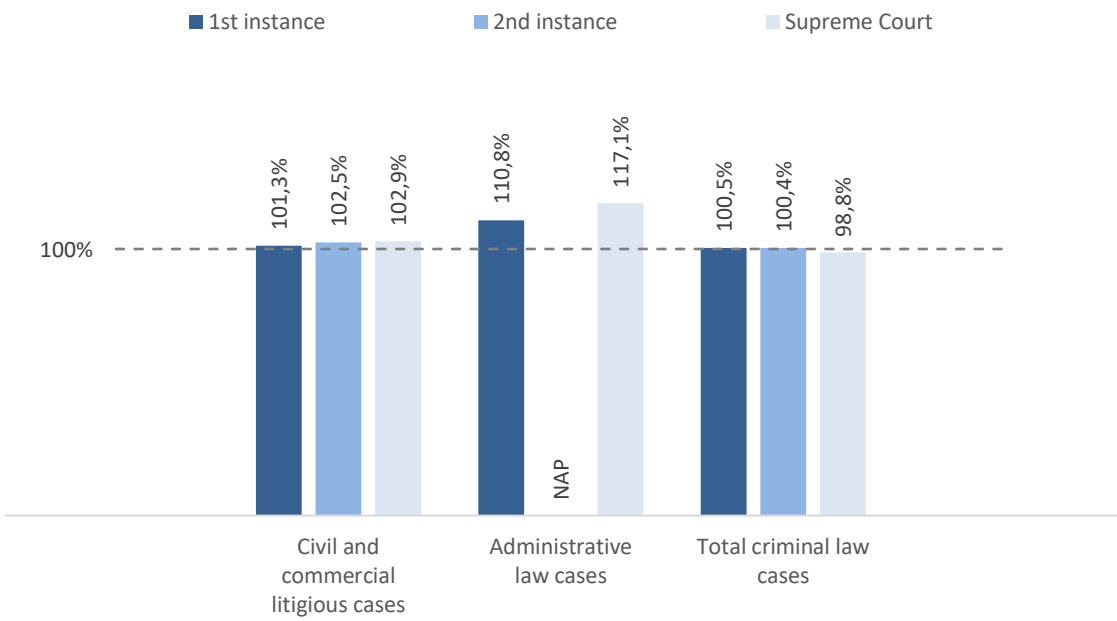
The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.

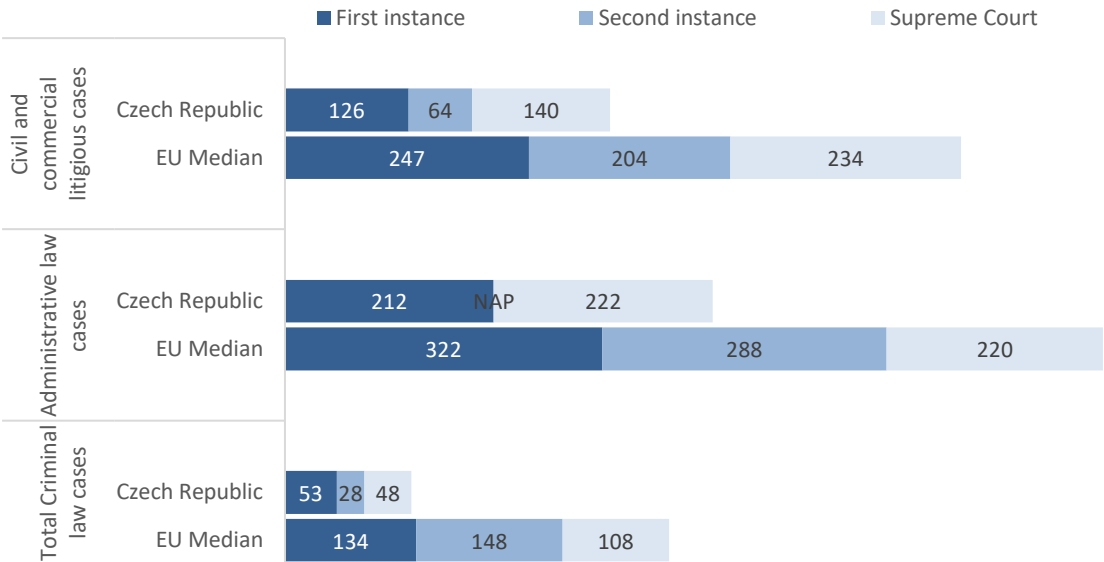

In 2023, a methodological change was implemented regarding insolvency cases. Insolvency proceedings are generally divided into two stages: the first stage occurs before the court determines whether insolvency exists, and the second stage begins once insolvency is established, often involving prolonged procedures such as debt relief, which typically spans around five years. Under the updated methodology, pending insolvency cases awaiting a court decision are now categorized as civil litigious cases. Cases pending resolution after an insolvency decision are classified under "other cases," ensuring they are properly accounted for in the total.

In 2023, criminal law cases, particularly at the second instance, were resolved the fastest in the Czech Republic, aligning with trends observed across the EU for the same reference year. Conversely, third-instance administrative law cases were the slowest in the Czech Republic, with durations slightly exceeding the EU median for this case type. Overall, the total length of proceedings in the Czech Republic remains well below the EU median across all matters, particularly for civil litigious and criminal law cases.

At the first instance, the Clearance Rate indicator is satisfactory across all case types, consistently exceeding the 100% threshold. Similarly, the Disposition Time for all case types is below the EU median.

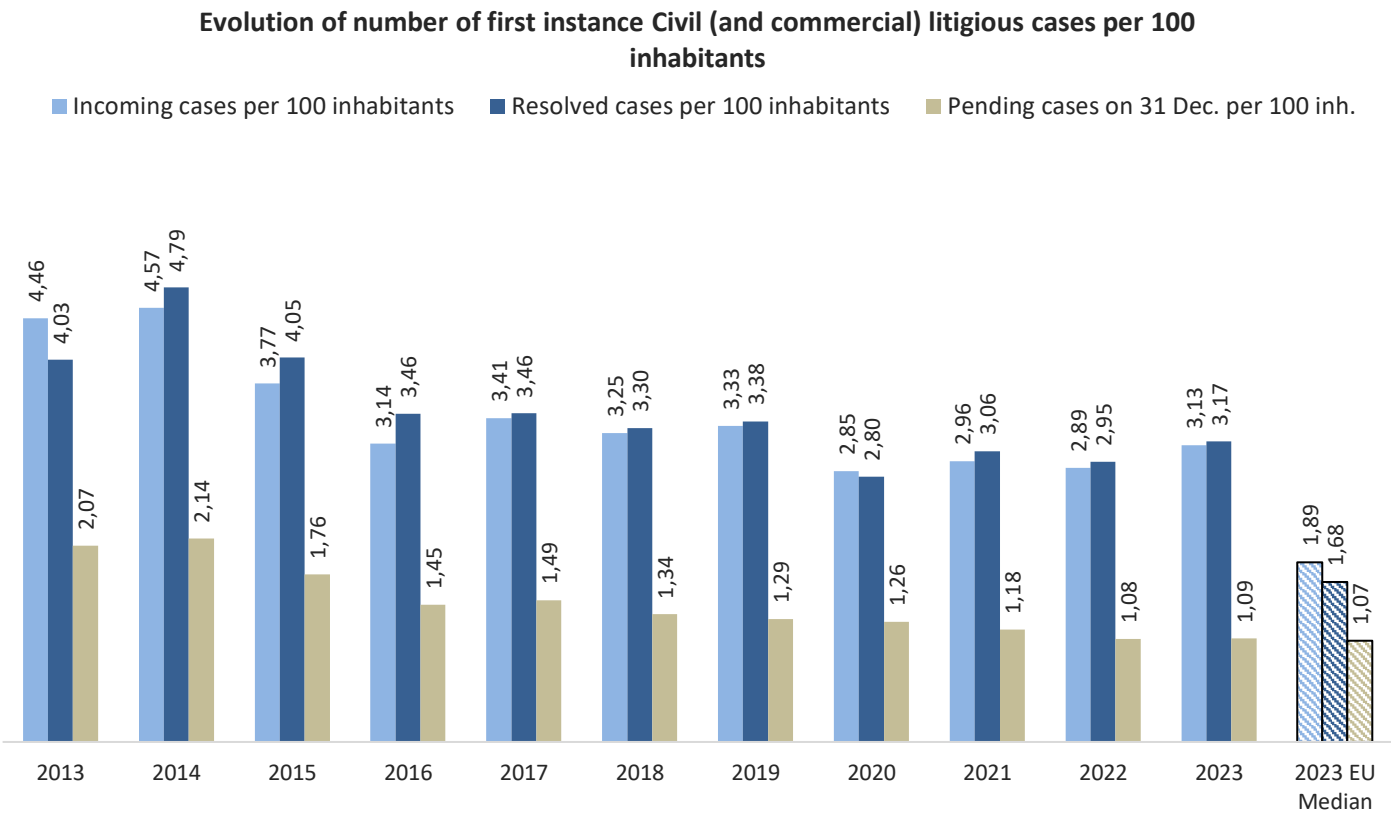
At the second instance, courts demonstrate efficiency as well, with Clearance Rates exceeding the 100% threshold for civil litigious and criminal law cases. Disposition Times at this level are also below the EU median for both case types.

For third-instance proceedings, Clearance Rates surpass the 100% threshold for administrative law and civil and commercial litigious cases and are nearly 100% for criminal law cases. While Disposition Times for civil litigious and criminal law cases remain below the EU median, third-instance administrative law cases continue to slightly exceed the EU median.

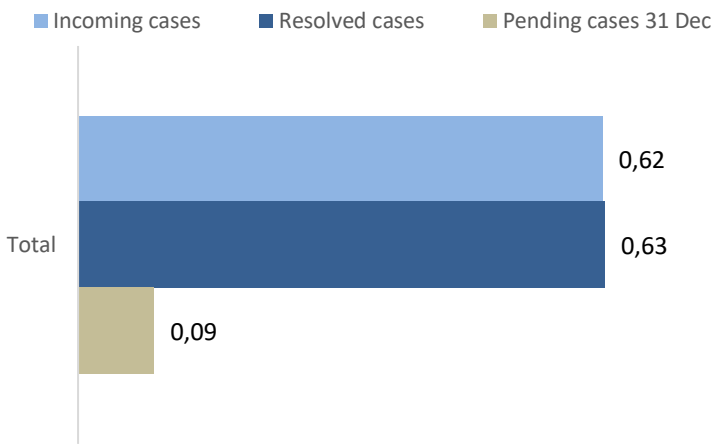

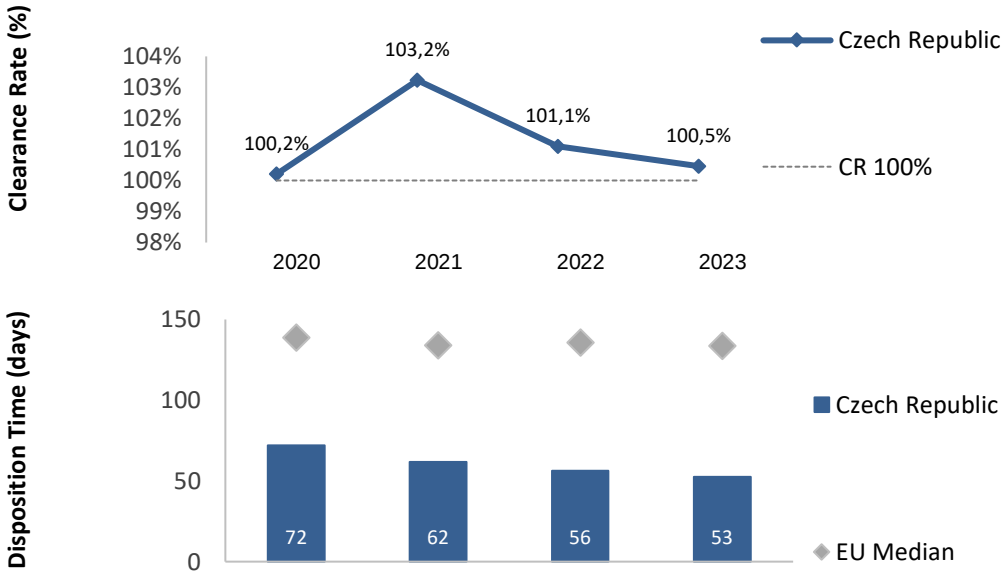

Some of the possible reasons include: (1) The prosecution involves a person exempt from the jurisdiction of law enforcement authorities or a person requiring official consent for prosecution, where such consent has not been granted by the authorized authority, unless the exemption or lack of consent is only temporary. (2) The prosecution pertains to a person below the age of criminal responsibility. (3) The prosecution targets an individual whose mental illness, developed after the commission of the offense, permanently prevents them from understanding the purpose of the criminal proceedings. (4) Various other circumstances.

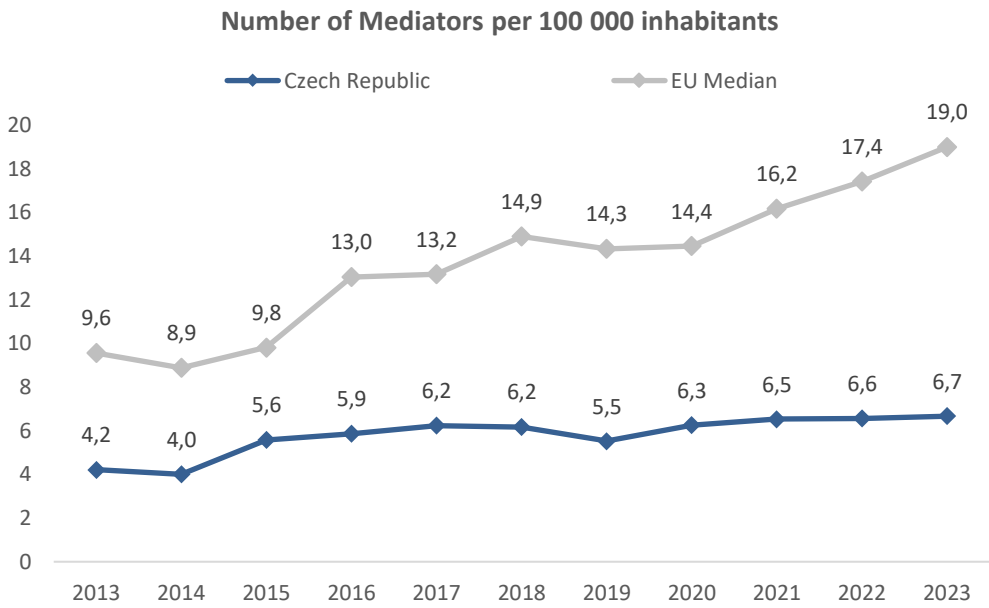

In 2023, there are 726 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 6,7 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation of the number of mediators between 2022 and 2023 is about 2,0%.

From the above mentioned number of mediators there are 362 mediators in criminal cases and 364 mediators in non criminal cases (of which there are 313 active mediators).

Registered mediators are individuals who have demonstrated their expertise and qualifications by passing a required exam and fulfilling additional legal requirements. According to the law, the Ministry will register a person who is capable of performing legal acts, possesses good repute and integrity, has obtained a master’s degree from a university in the Czech Republic (or an equivalent higher education degree from abroad, recognized under an international treaty binding the Czech Republic), has successfully passed the mediator exam or been recognized as qualified, and has not been removed from the list of mediators within the five years prior to submitting their application. A person is considered of good repute and integrity if they have not been legally convicted of intentionally committing a criminal offense or a negligent crime related to the performance of mediation activities. These conditions ensure that mediators maintain high standards of professionalism, competence, and ethical conduct.

Writing Assistance Tools

The use of writing assistance tools in courts depends on the type of agenda and the information system used. Some systems automatically generate documents based on templates, data, and selected procedural actions. Older systems use an external application called APSTR, which helps create documents but is only available for district courts.

Document templates are developed either by the Ministry of Justice or at the national level in cooperation with experts and court staff. These templates can be modified locally by individual courts or even by users, allowing for adjustments to specific court agendas. However, not all types of cases are covered by these templates.

Additionally, speech-to-text tools are available for all courts.

Recording of Court Hearings

Recording of court hearings is compulsory in all matters in the form of audio or audiovisual recordings since 2009. The recording of court hearing projects have been implemented slowly in terms of both hardware and software. The crucial aspect has been ensuring appropriate funding. In the previous three years, the court hearings projects have reached their peak.

Quantitative performance targets exist but they are not strictly binding. The Ministry of Justice in the Czech Republic uses "measures" (měřítka) as the sole numerical indicators for allocating judge and support staff positions across courts on an annual basis. Functioning similarly to case weights, these measures represent the notional number of cases that a judge or support staff member should handle in a year on a full-time basis; for example, in 2024, each district court judge is expected to manage 352 civil cases or 230 criminal cases annually. The measures are updated or confirmed each year by the systemisation commission, an informal body of representatives from regional, superior, and supreme court management, along with the Ministry of Justice. They are published in documents that accompany the Minister of Justice's annual allocation decision.

Universal across courts of the same level, these measures and historical case data guide the Ministry in distributing judge and staff positions among superior, regional, and district courts. Regional court presidents have the flexibility to adjust these allocations based on local conditions or specific court needs, while staffing for the Supreme Court and Supreme Administrative Court is managed through direct arrangements between their respective presidents and the Minister of Justice.

To improve the accuracy of these allocations, the Ministry of Justice is undertaking a project, supported by the European Commission's Technical Support Instrument, to gather empirical data on the labour intensity of various tasks performed by judges and support staff. This project aims to strengthen the factual basis for determining the measures.

Additionally, court presidents continuously monitor the performance of judges and support staff to ensure cases are processed within reasonable timeframes, upholding individuals' right to have cases heard promptly. However, the Ministry of Justice does not regulate or oversee this managerial and disciplinary authority, which is independently exercised by court management.
