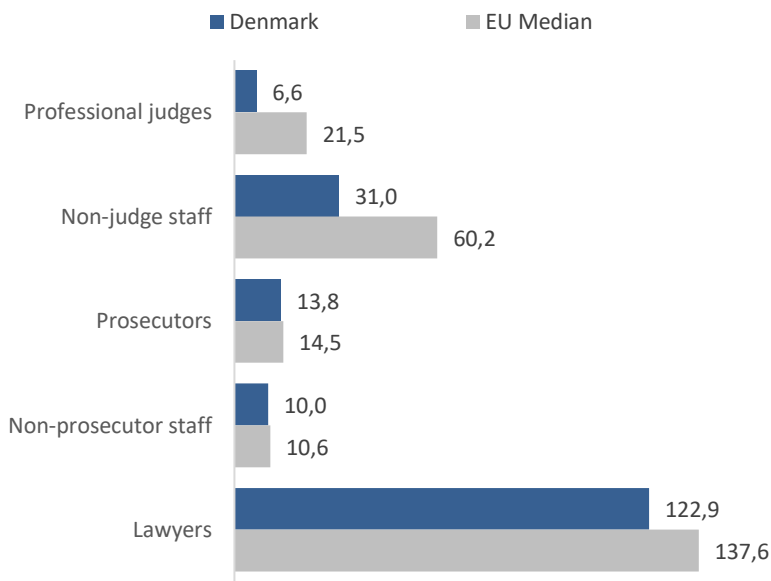

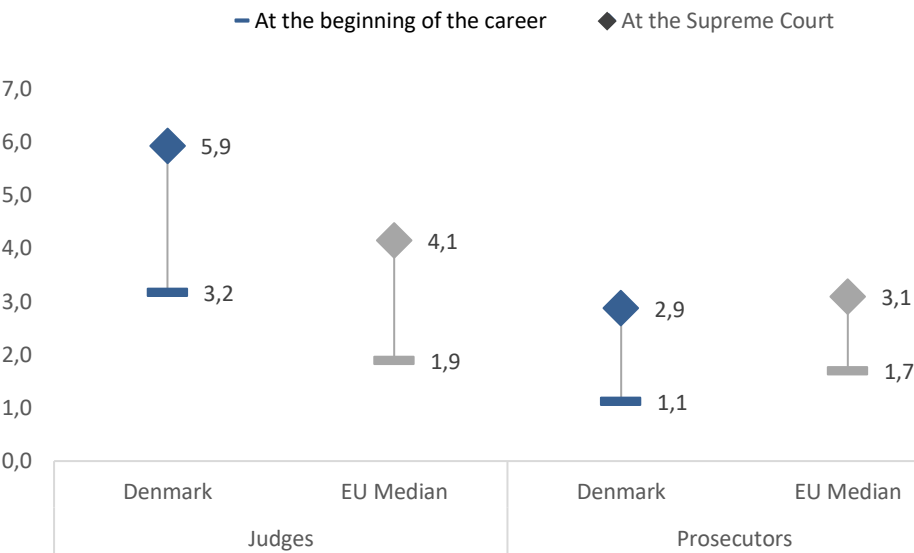

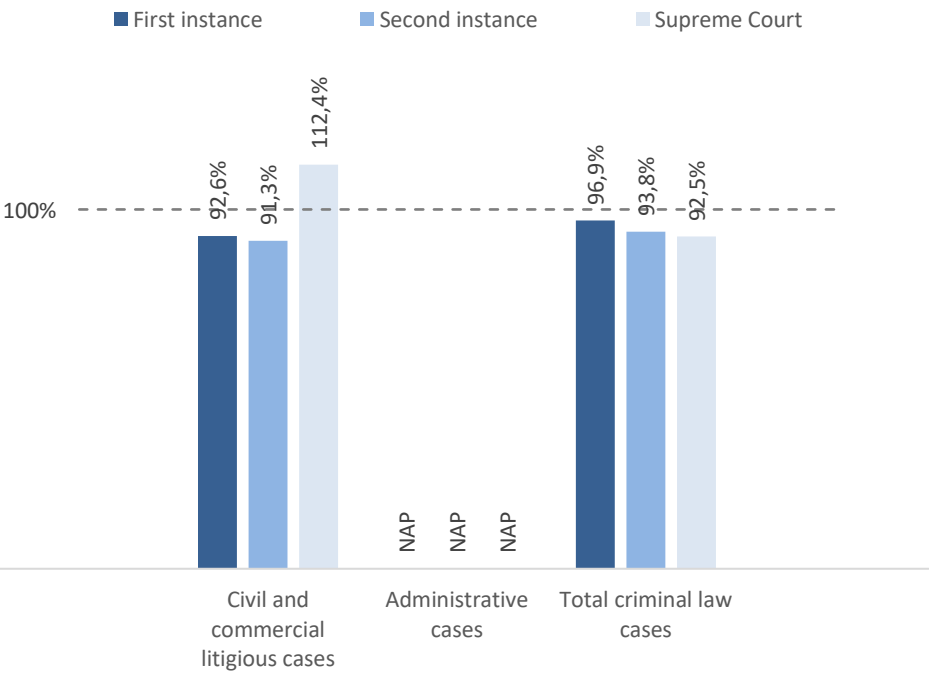


Gross salaries of judges and prosecutors vs average annual salary in 2023

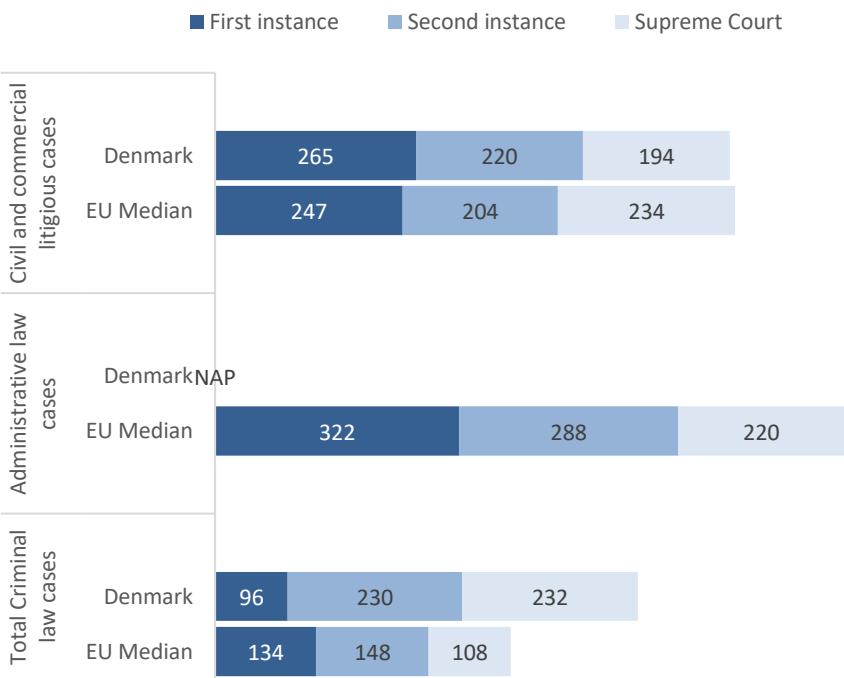

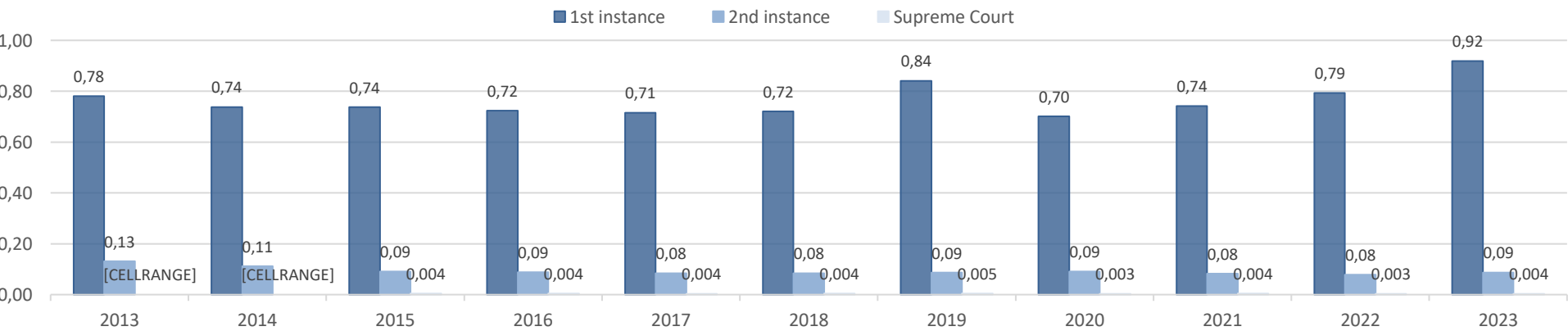


Disposition Time by instance and by matter in 2023 (days)

1. Judicial organisation in Denmark (2023 data)

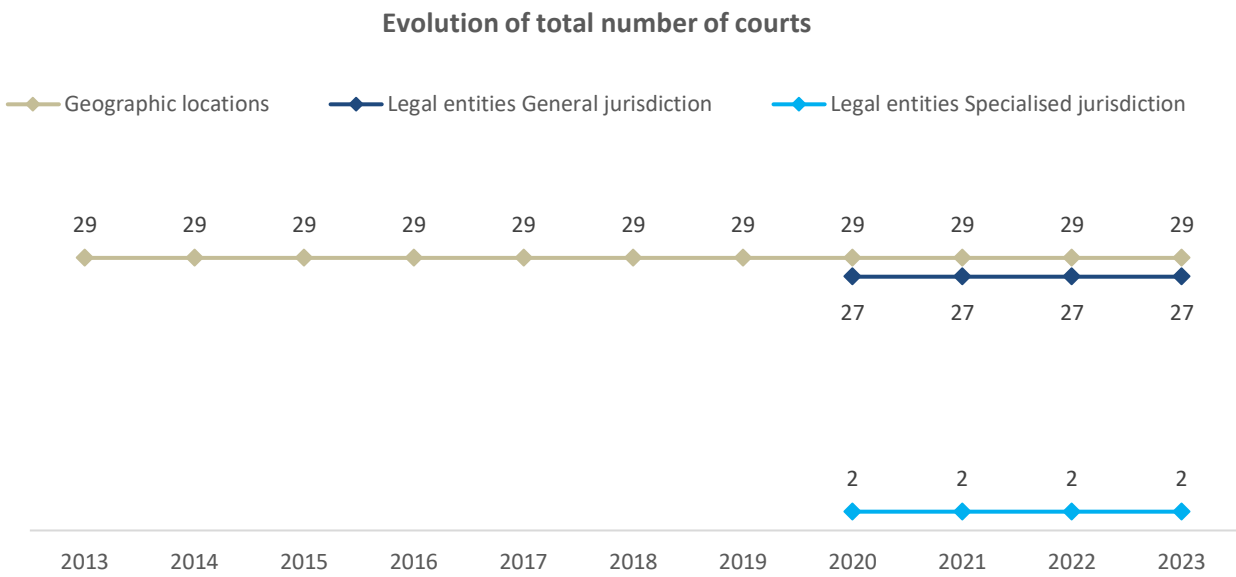
According to 2023 data, the Danish court system is composed of 29 legal entities, among which 27 are of general jurisdiction, while two have specialized competence. More precisely, the 27 courts of general jurisdiction encompass 24 District Courts intervening at first instance, two High Courts dealing with appeals, and the Supreme Court.

The Land Registration Court and the Maritime and Commercial Court are considered as first-instance specialized courts.

In terms of geographic locations, there are 29 courts among which there are 26 courts of first instance, which include the 24 District Courts as well as the Land Registration Court and the Maritime and Commercial Court.

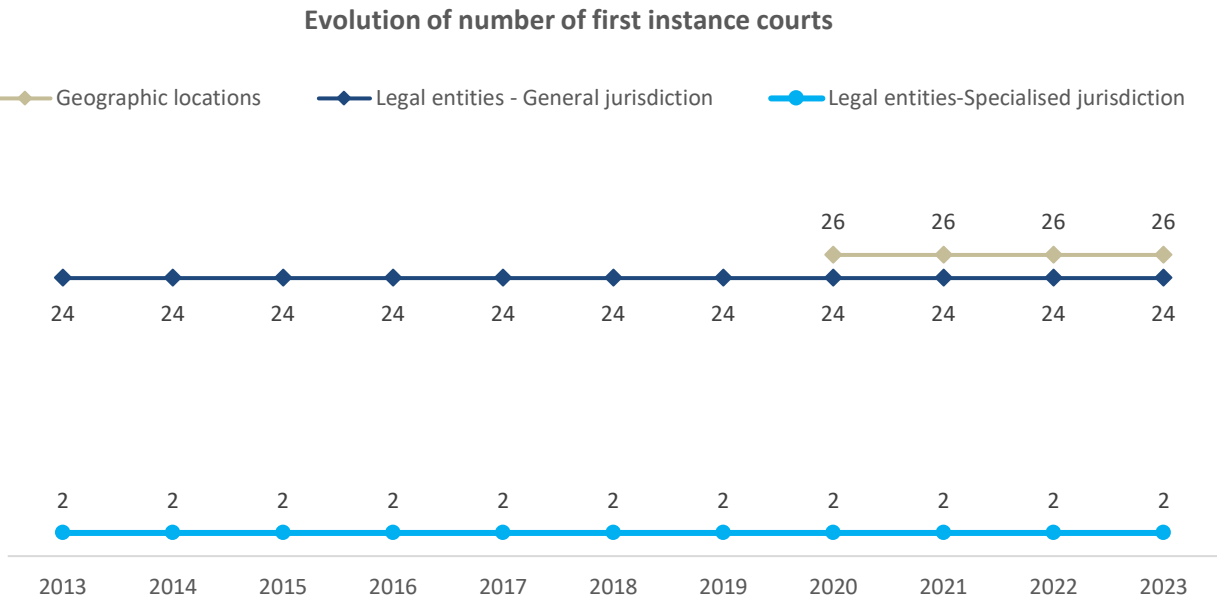

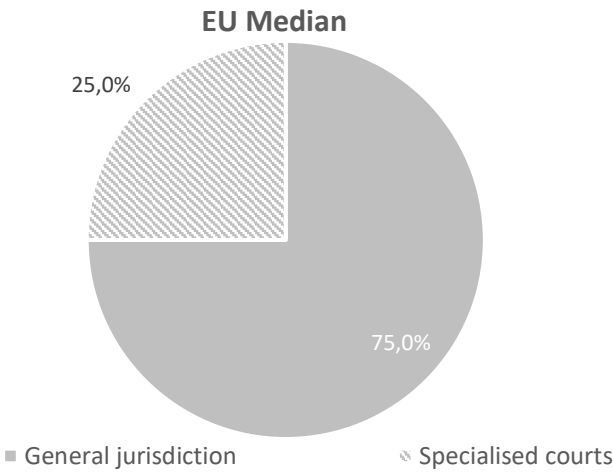
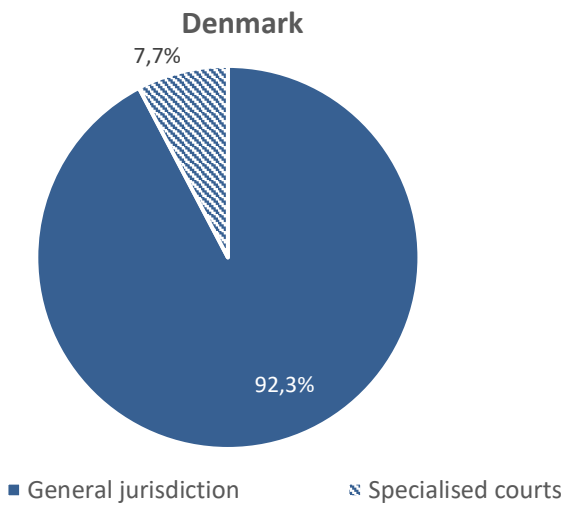

In Denmark, there are only two specialized courts acting as legal entities at first instance. The Maritime and Commercial Court handles commercial cases and, to a significant extent, insolvency cases, such as bankruptcies, though not exclusively. The Land Registration Court, on the other hand, was established in 2009.

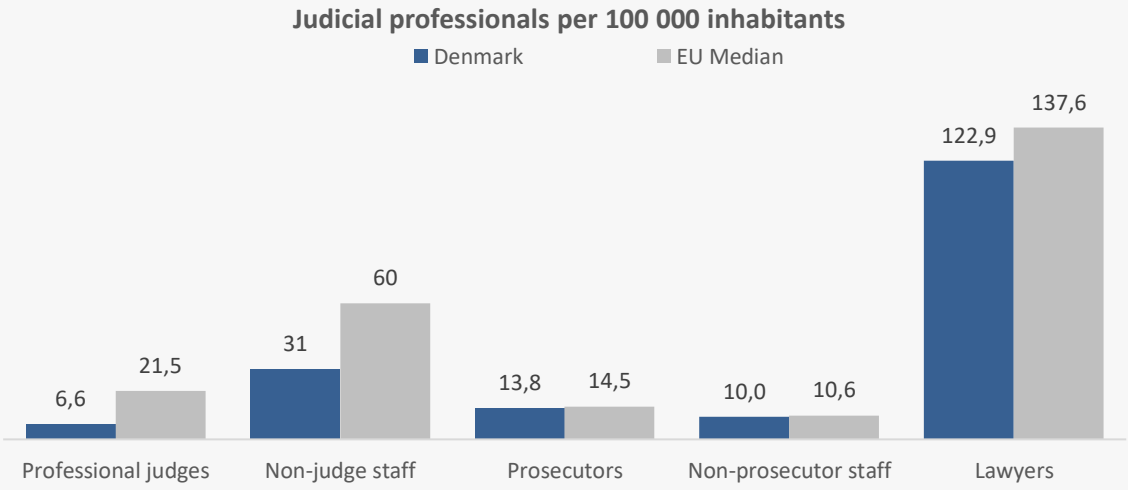
Juvenile courts do not exist as separate entities. Instead, cases involving juveniles fall under the jurisdiction of the District Courts, where a Juvenile Board ensures special care for such matters. Similarly, family courts are not independent legal entities but operate as sections within the District Courts. There is also one military court, but it does not fall under the authority of the Danish Courts Administration.

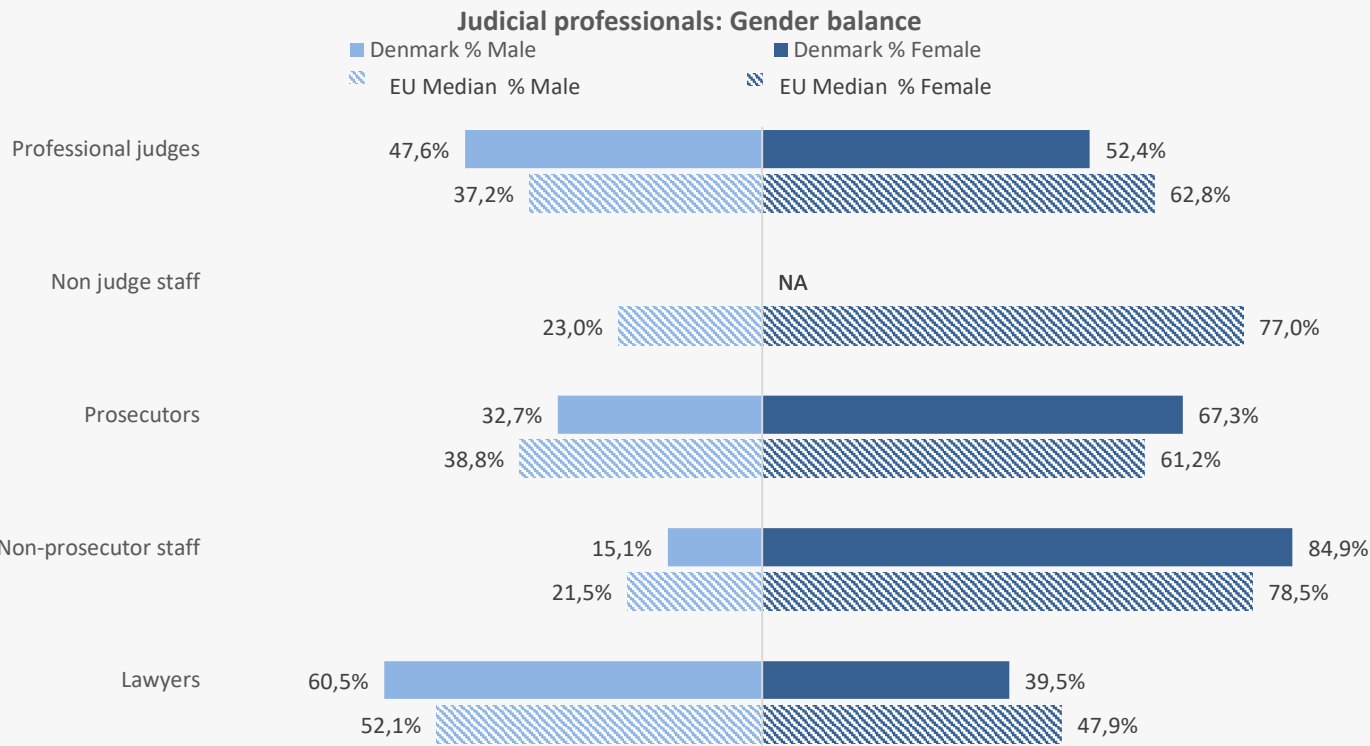

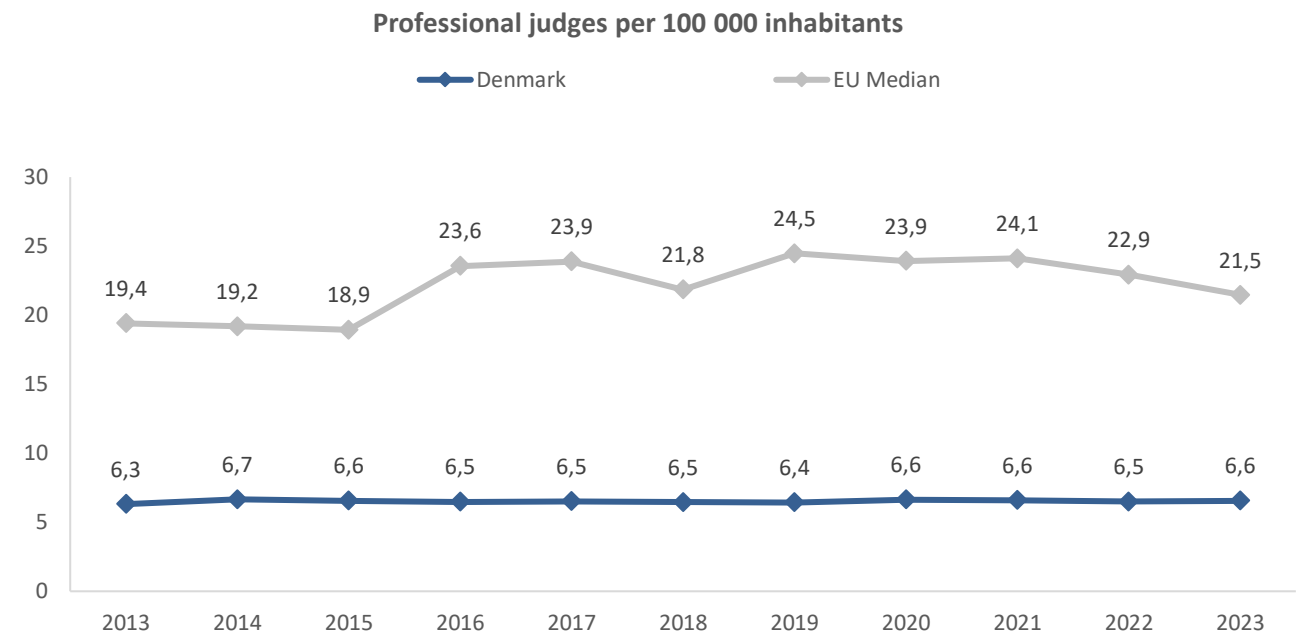

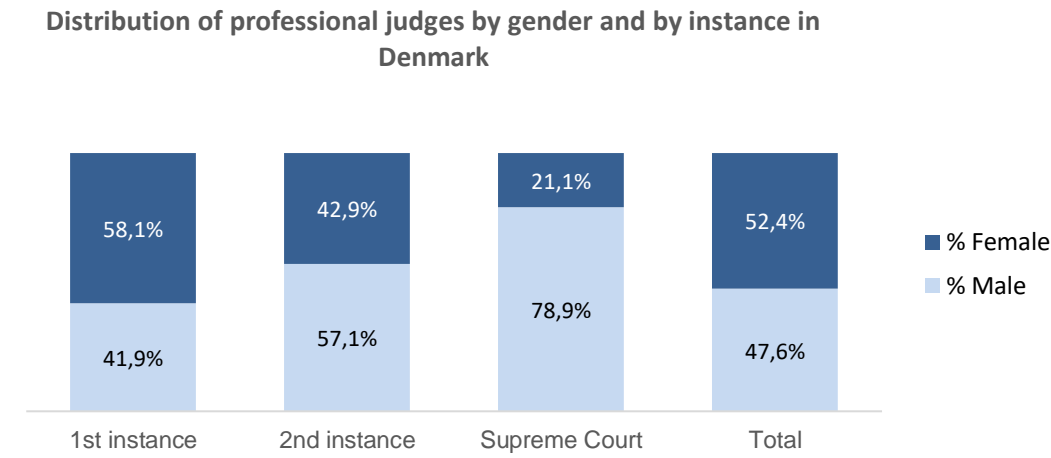
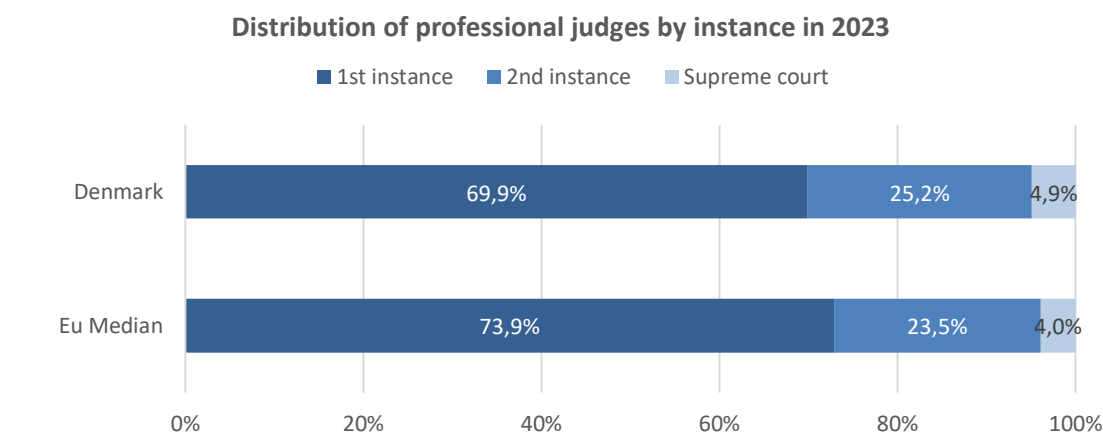


According to 2023 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Denmark is 389, which is 1,0% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Denmark, there are 6,6 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 21,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants)

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 204, which represents 52,4% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 272 are sitting in the first instance courts (of which 158 are female); 98 are sitting in the second instance courts (of which 42 are female) and 19 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of which 4 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, a similar trend is observed in Denmark. However, the predominance of first-instance judges is less pronounced, while the number of judges at the second and third instances is relatively higher.

As regards the distribution male/female, it has to be specified, the number of female judges exceeds that of male judges only at the first-instance level.

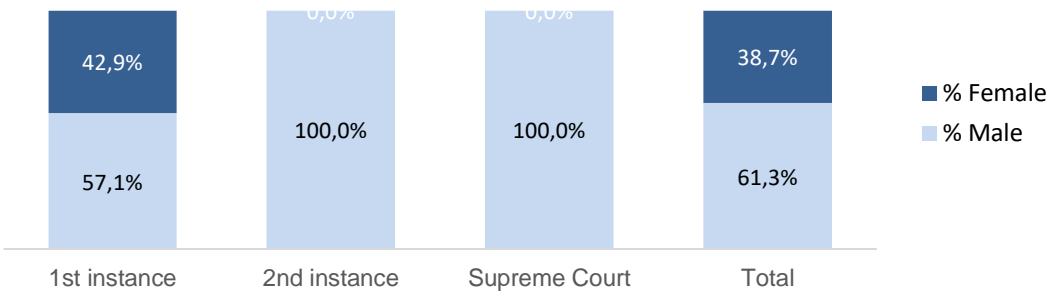

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Denmark

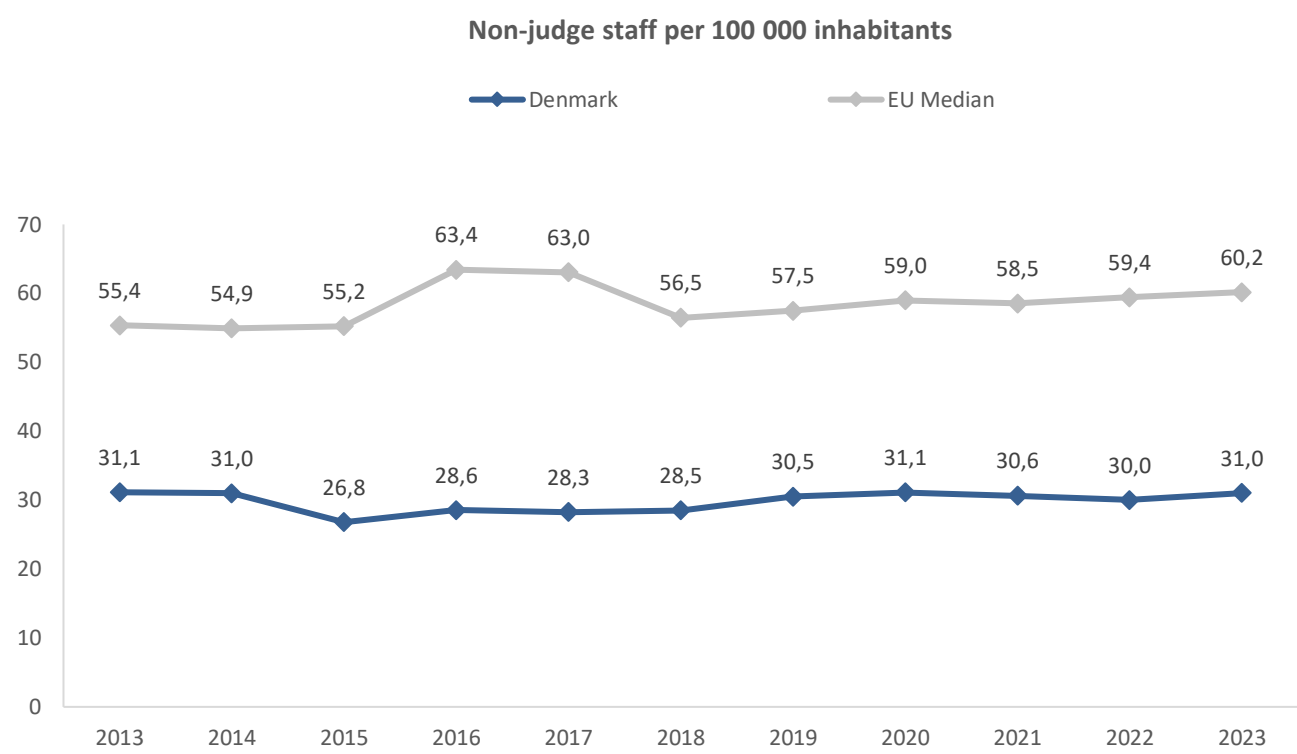


In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 12, which represents 38,7% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 28 are sitting in first instance courts (of which 12 are female); 2 are sitting in second instance courts (of which none is female) and 1 is sitting in Supreme Court (he is a man).

In 2023, Denmark has 1 840 non-judge staff. The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 3,4%.

In 2023, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 30,0 in 2022 to 31,0 in 2023).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 6,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2022 to 6,6 in 2023.

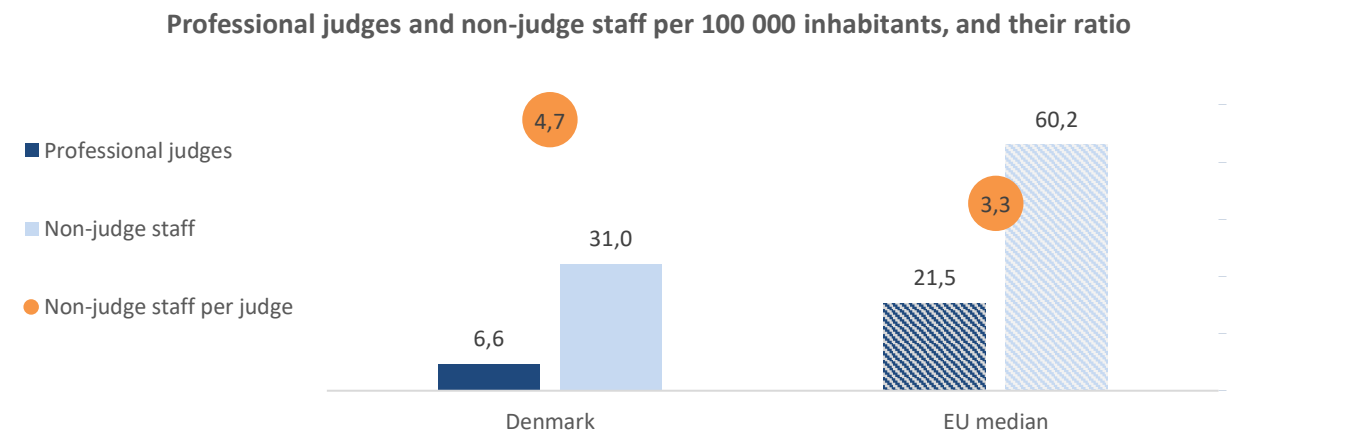

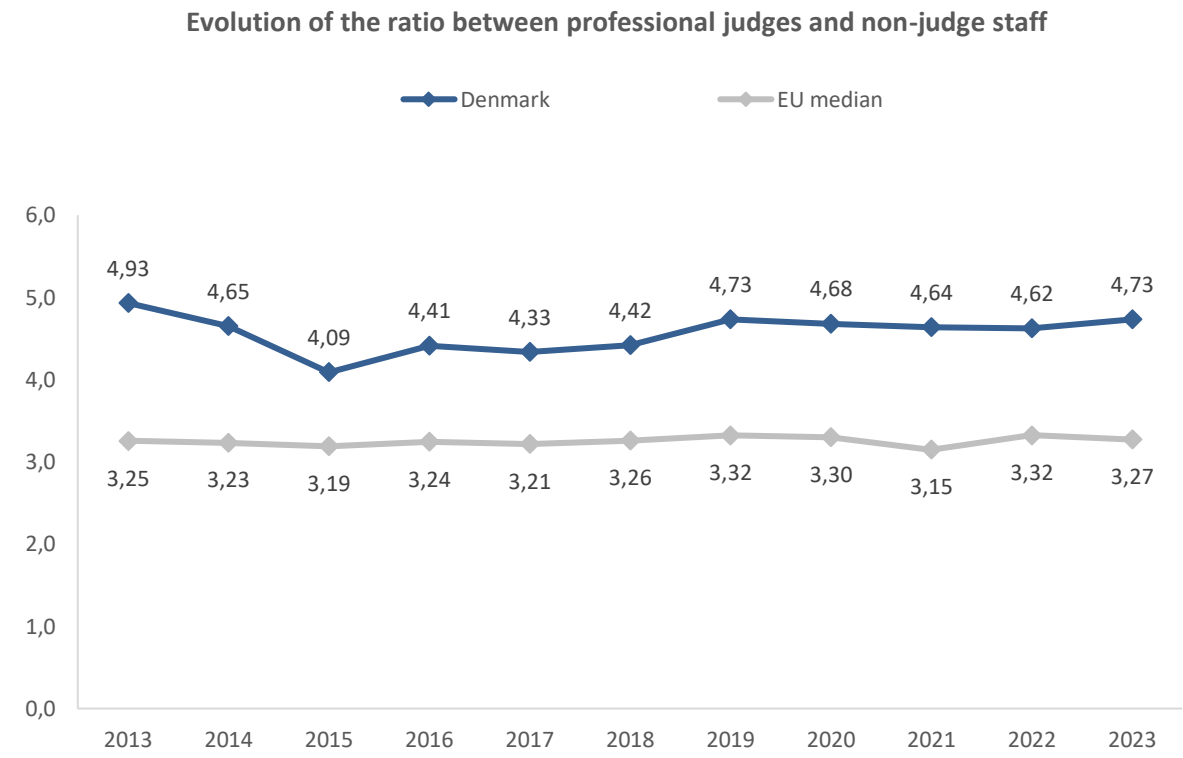

In Denmark, there are 6,6 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 21,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 4,7 non-judge staff per judge. There has been a small increase compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 4,6 non-judge staff per judge.

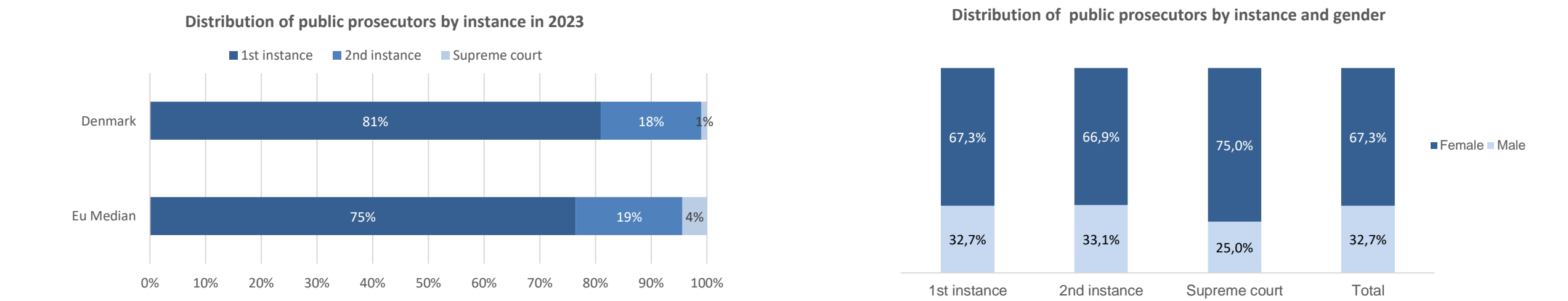

In this cycle, the total number of female prosecutors (all instances) is 551, which represents 67,3% of the total number of prosecutors.

The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 663 in first instance (of which 446 are female); 148 are in second instance (of which 99 are female) and 8 in final instance (of which 6 are female).

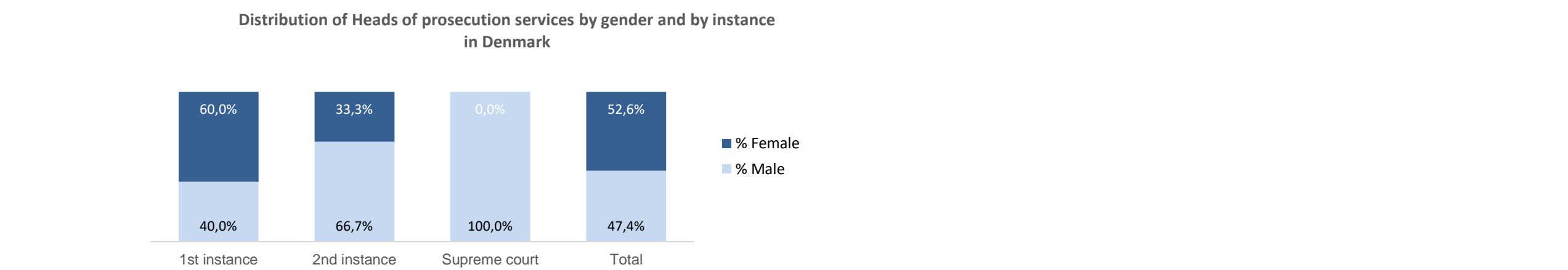
As regards the distribution male/female, it has to be specified that female prosecutors are the majority at all instances (more than 65% at all three instances).

The reported number represents the actual number of employees in full-time equivalents as of December 2023. Full-time equivalents are calculated based on allocations made on the 1st of each month, which means an exact figure for December 31st is not available. Therefore, the figure for December 1st, 2023, has been used and scaled up to reflect an annual total. The data on the number of employees in the Danish Prosecution Service, as well as their distribution, is recorded in Polpai, a database that includes all employees in both the Danish Police and the Danish Prosecution Service.

In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution services (all instances) is 10, which represents 52,6% of the total number of Heads of prosecution services.

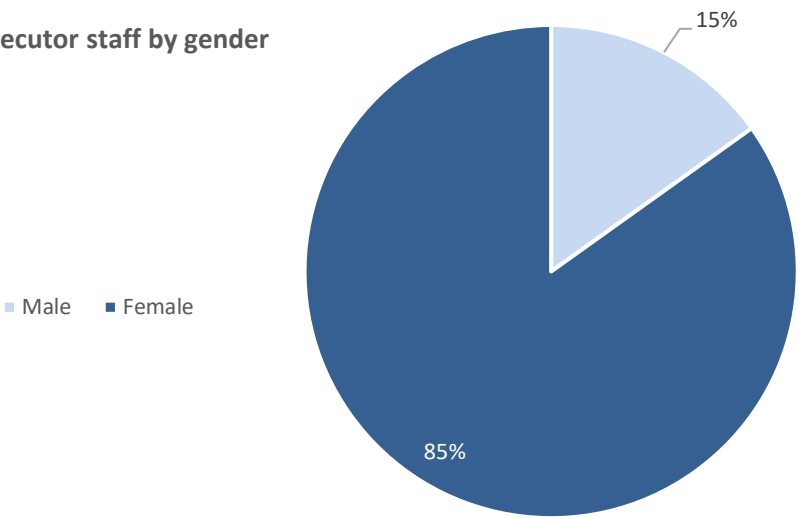
The total number of Heads of prosecution services is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 15 at first instance level (of which 9 are female); 3 at second instance level (of which 1 is female) and 1 at the highest instance level who is a man.

The head of the prosecution offices at the first instance level is the director of the prosecution service in each of the 15 police districts across Denmark, Greenland, and the Faroe Islands. At the second instance level, which includes the Court of Appeal, the heads of prosecution are the leaders of the three state prosecutors' offices: Copenhagen, Viborg, and the State Prosecutor for Special Crime. At the Supreme Court level, the head of the prosecution office is the Director of Public Prosecutions (Rigsadvokaten).

Non-prosecutor staff by gender

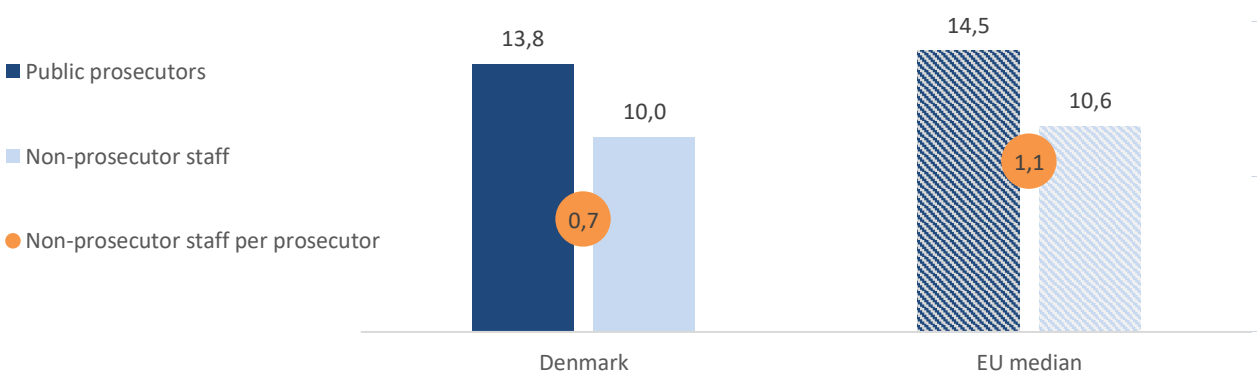

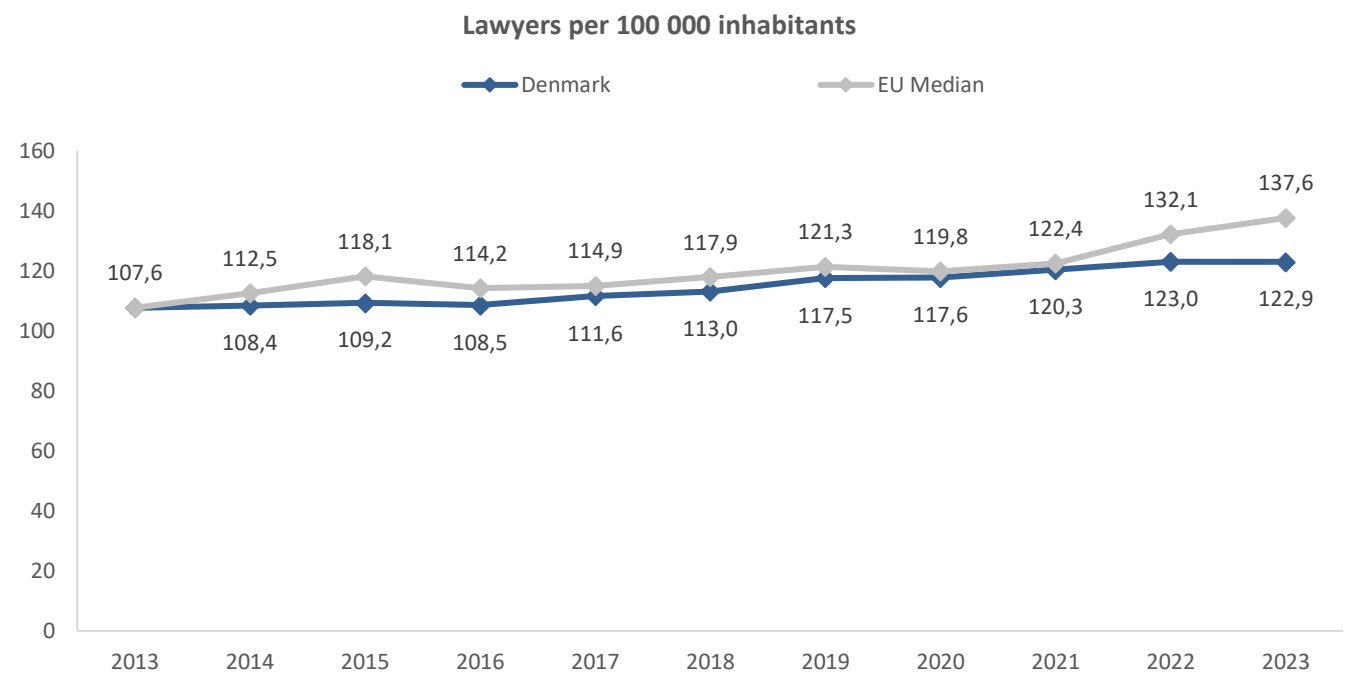

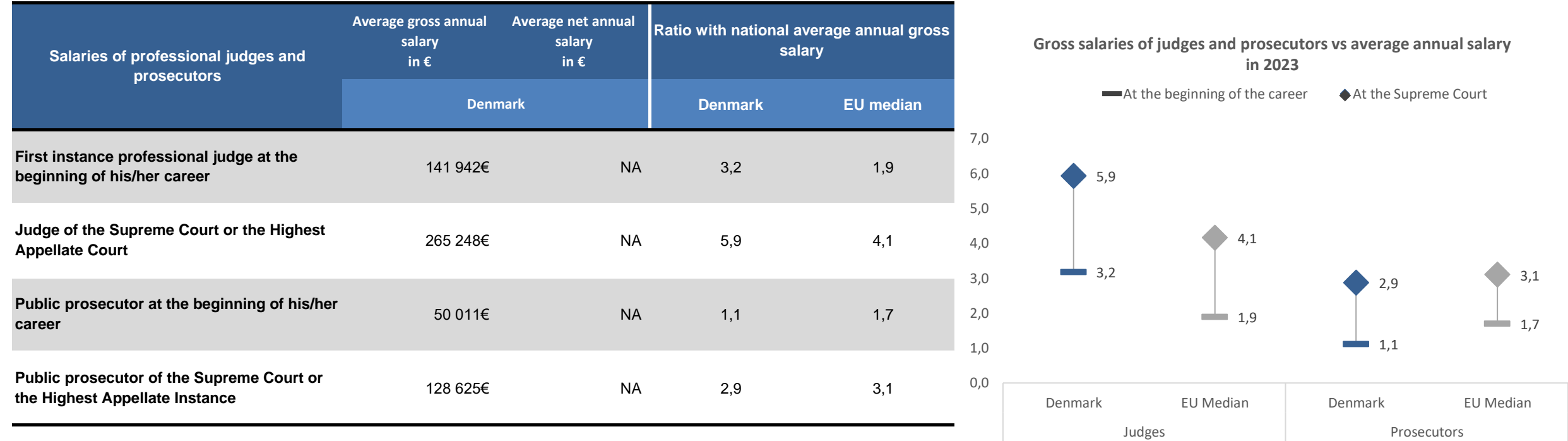
In 2023, there are 7 290 lawyers, which is the same than in 2022.

There are 2 880 female lawyers which is 40% of the total.

Denmark has 122,9 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is below the EU median of 137,6 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

The data from 2023 was also reported last year. Due to the implementation of a new member system at the Danish Bar and Law Society, currently it is not possible to access the total number of female/male lawyers practicing as of January 1st 2022.

Salaries of professional judges and prosecutors at beginning of a career and at the highest instance



In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 144 856€.

According to 2023 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Denmark is 141 942€, which is more than double the EU median of 58 128€. (144% above)

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 3,2 times higher (the EU median is 1,9)

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 58 623€ to 266 974€. Denmark's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is 124% above the EU median of 118 595€.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 101 592€.

In 2023, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Denmark of 50 011€ is around the EU median of 49 953€.

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,1 times higher (the EU median is 1,7)

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 456€ and the maximum is 199 670€. Denmark's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is 37% above the EU median of 93 759€.

The Danish authorities are unable to provide information on the net salary as the Danish tax system is progressive. This means the tax rate is based on income, and municipal taxes vary depending on the municipality. The employment terms for a new public prosecutor are governed by a collective agreement. In addition to the stated salary, a newly appointed public prosecutor receives an annual supplement of 17,388 DKK (approximately 2,330 EUR). This supplement compensates for the prosecutor's participation in the Local Prosecution Service's shift schedule (b-vagt).

The public prosecutor's base salary is determined centrally through the collective agreement and is based on factors such as years of experience, qualifications, job responsibilities, and the specific position. Beyond the base salary, additional locally negotiated supplements may apply, depending on the prosecutor's qualifications and specific responsibilities. Public prosecutors are also entitled to annual salary negotiations.

Professional judges are employed as "civil servants" who receive a lifelong pension.

According to the Danish authorities, the data has been compiled outside of the standard data model. While specifically developed data models have been tested, they carry a higher risk of undetected errors compared to using the standard model. As a result, the data in the table is associated with significant uncertainty. The figures showing condemned requests and total amounts represent the sum of cases and amounts that were either fully or partially granted. The € amounts are calculated using xe.com.

For the "Other" category, the figures represent the total numbers minus those for the three categories with separate figures: excessive length of proceedings, wrongful arrest, and wrongful conviction. There is no specific reason for the fluctuations in compensation requests and awards, though they can vary considerably from year to year.

The data is sourced from a case management system, which was not designed for statistical purposes. Consequently, registrations within different categories may differ significantly based on the case manager. However, the overall numbers of compensation requests, compensations granted, and amounts should be accurate. It is the categorization of these figures that carries uncertainty.

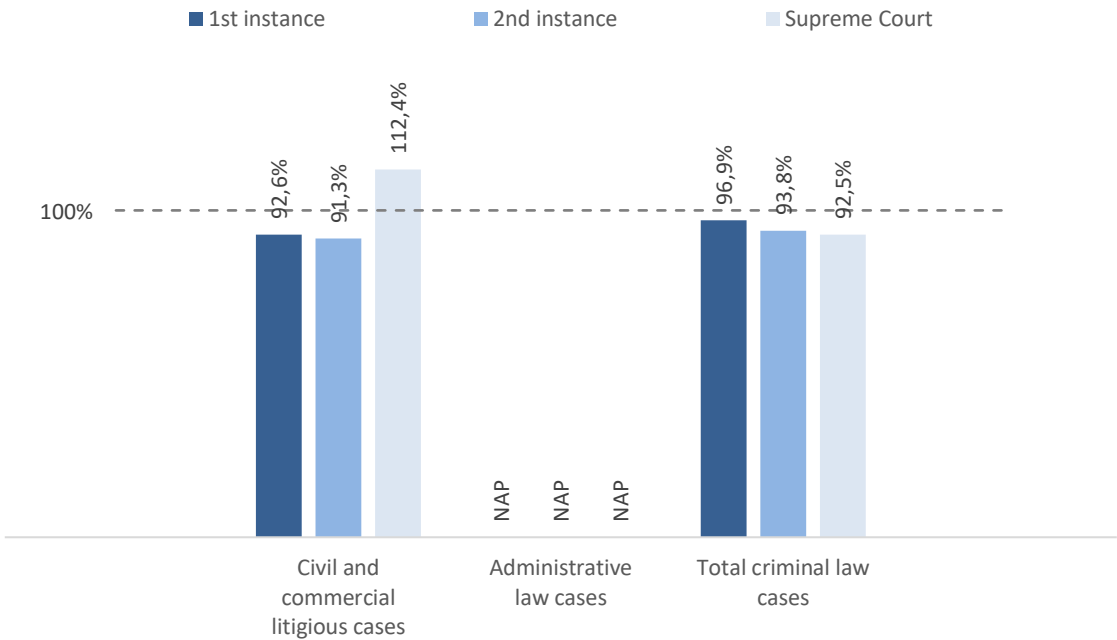
The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.

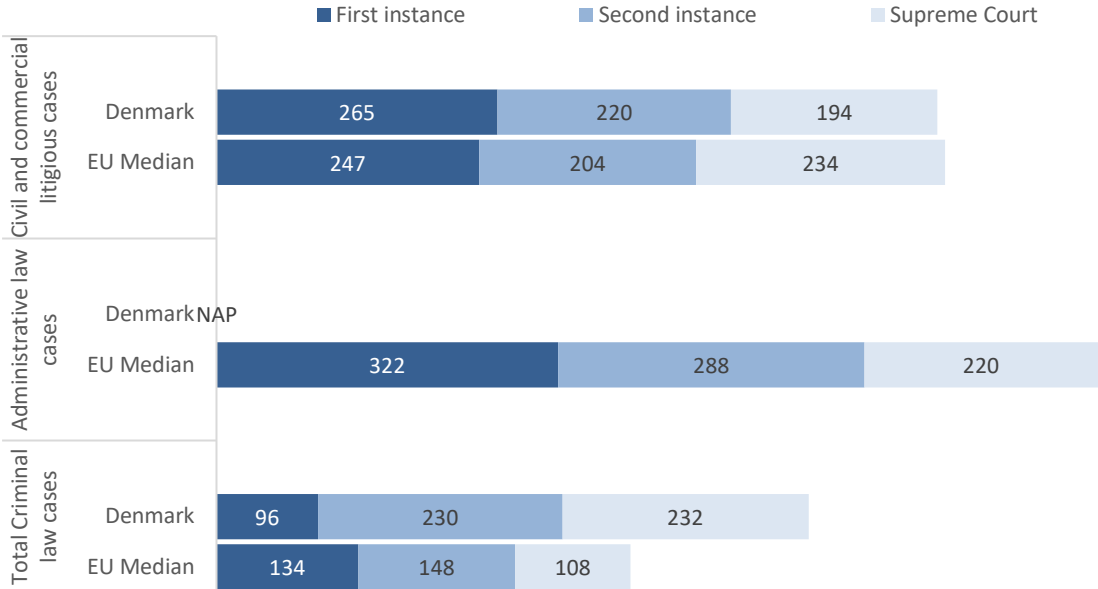

In Denmark, administrative courts do not exist. Instead, administrative cases are initially handled outside the judicial system by court-like bodies, such as appeal boards, committees, or councils. Litigious administrative cases that proceed to court are included in the category of civil and commercial litigious cases.

The higher number of cases in 2023 compared to 2021 is due to lower activity in 2021 caused by COVID-19. Compared to 2022, the January 1, 2023 pending case figures appear higher, mainly due to late registrations and a new, more accurate calculation method. The January 1, 2023 figures align with those recorded on December 31, 2022, in the Danish Courts database.

In 2023, criminal law cases at the first instance in Denmark had the shortest processing time, averaging 96 days, closely aligning with the EU trend for the reference year (134 days). In contrast, civil and commercial litigious cases at the first instance recorded the longest processing time in Denmark, averaging 265 days, which is slightly above the EU median for such cases (247 days).

Regarding the Clearance Rate indicator at the first instance level, it remains below the 100% threshold for both criminal law cases and civil and commercial litigious cases.

At the second instance level, the Clearance Rate also falls short of 100% - 93,8% for criminal law cases and 91,3% for civil and commercial litigious cases.

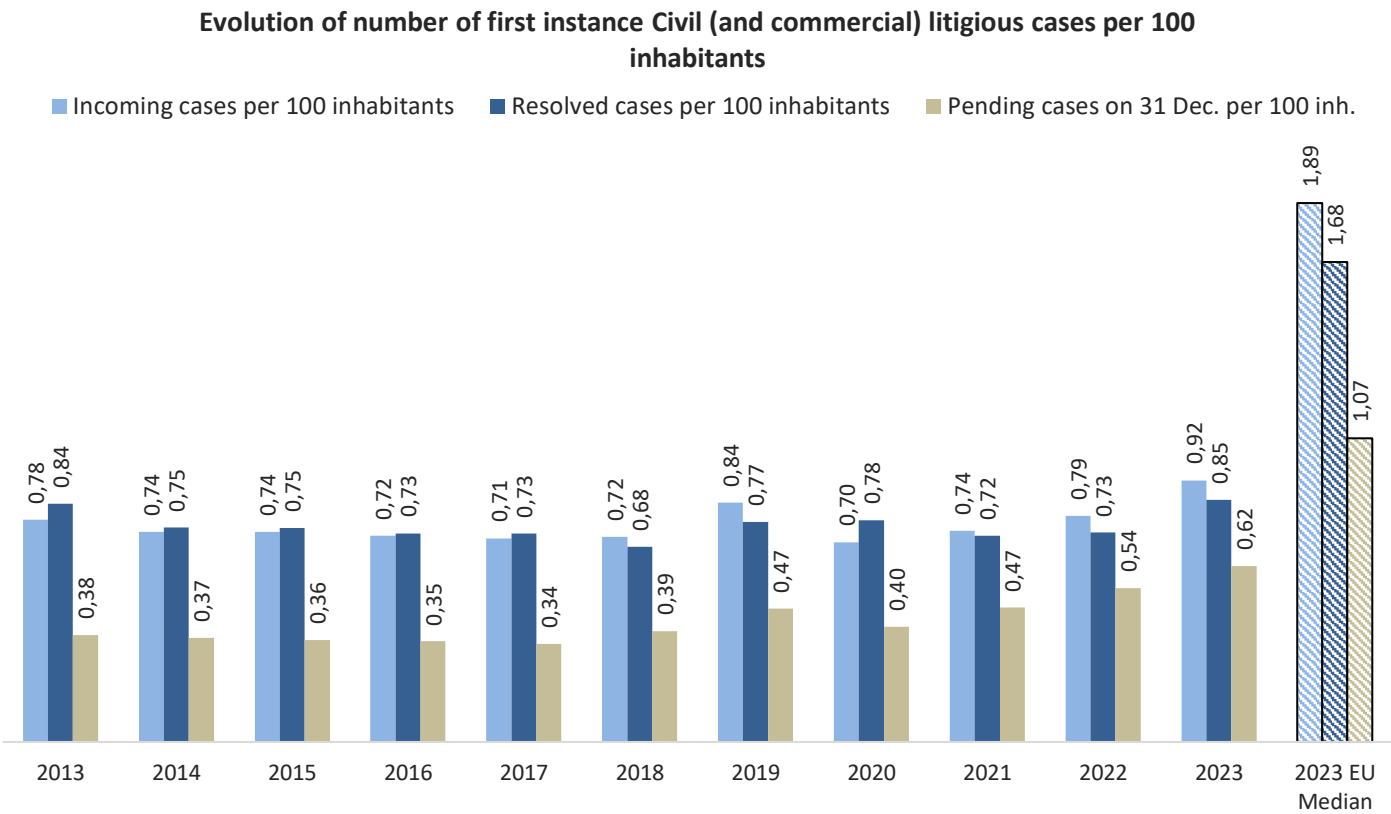
At the third instance level, the Clearance Rate exceeds 100% only for civil litigious cases. For criminal law cases, however, it remains below the threshold at 92,5%, indicating potential challenges in processing this category of cases.

Denmark attributes the overall decrease in the number of criminal cases at the second instance in 2023 primarily to a notable increase in case processing times at the second instance courts. This stands in contrast to the first instance and highest instance courts, where processing times have also risen, though to a much lesser extent.

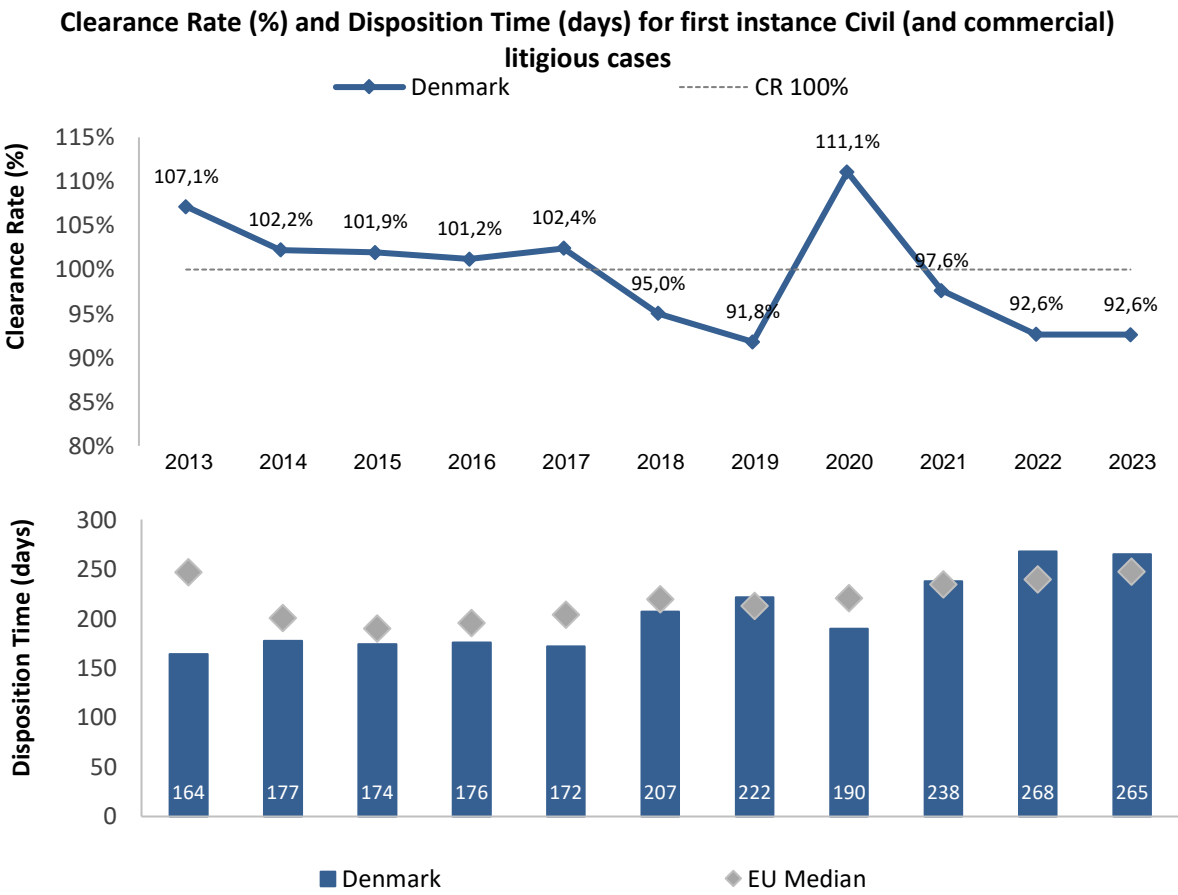

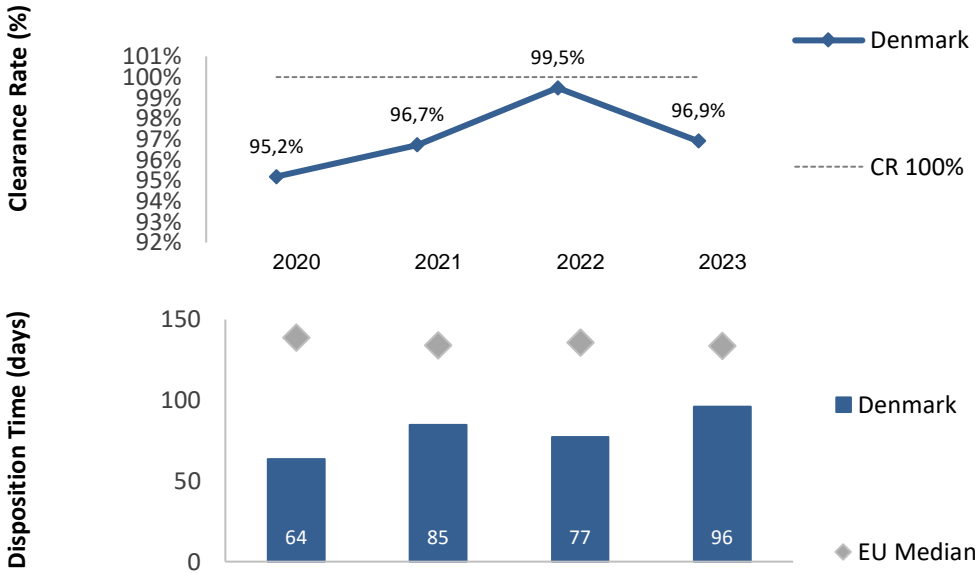

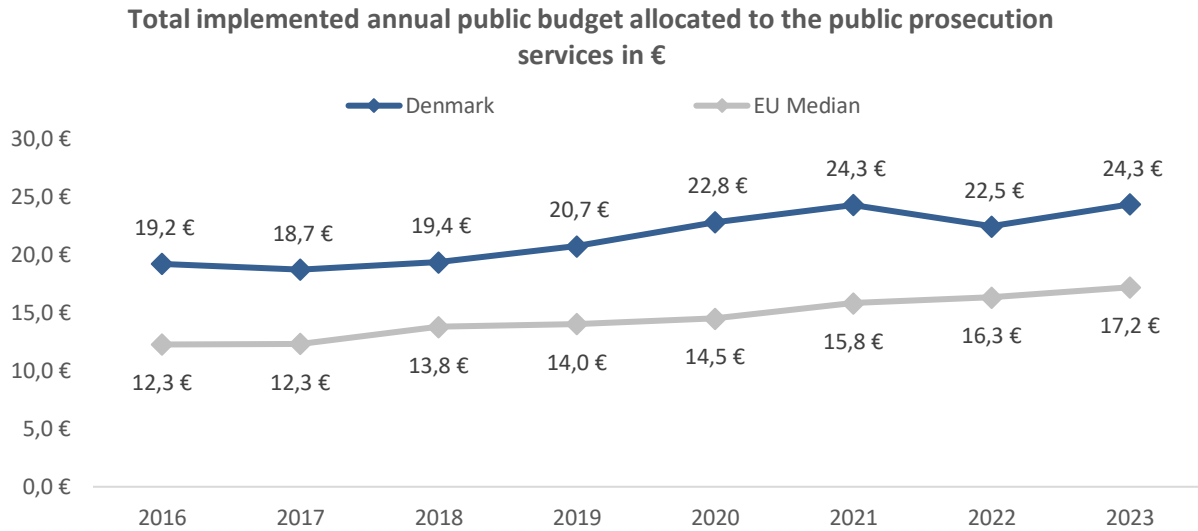

Data on the budget allocated to the training of public prosecution services is not available.

The implemented budget reflects actual expenditures observed during the reference year. In 2023, there was a notable strengthening of criminal case processing compared to 2021, driven by efforts to reduce case backlogs and processing times. This initiative resulted in increased resource consumption for case processing and prosecution activities.

The difference between the implemented budget and the formally approved budget by Parliament arises because the implemented budget corresponds to the actual expenditures incurred during the reference year.

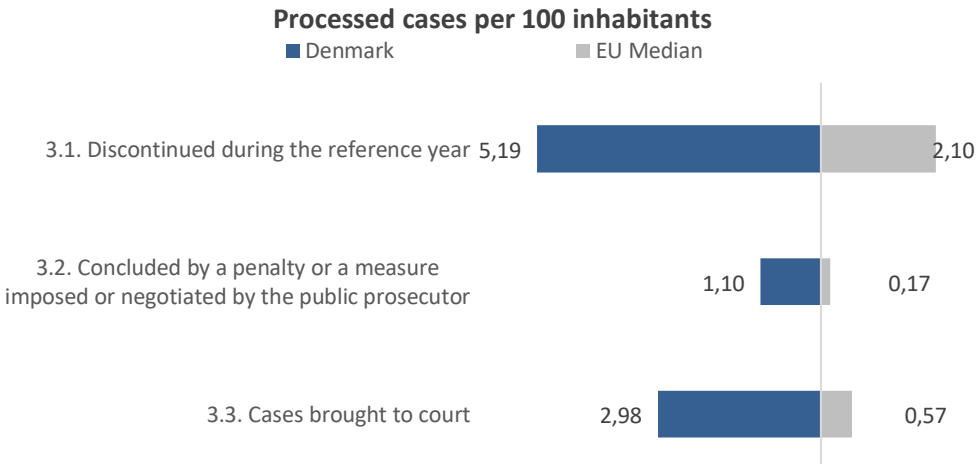
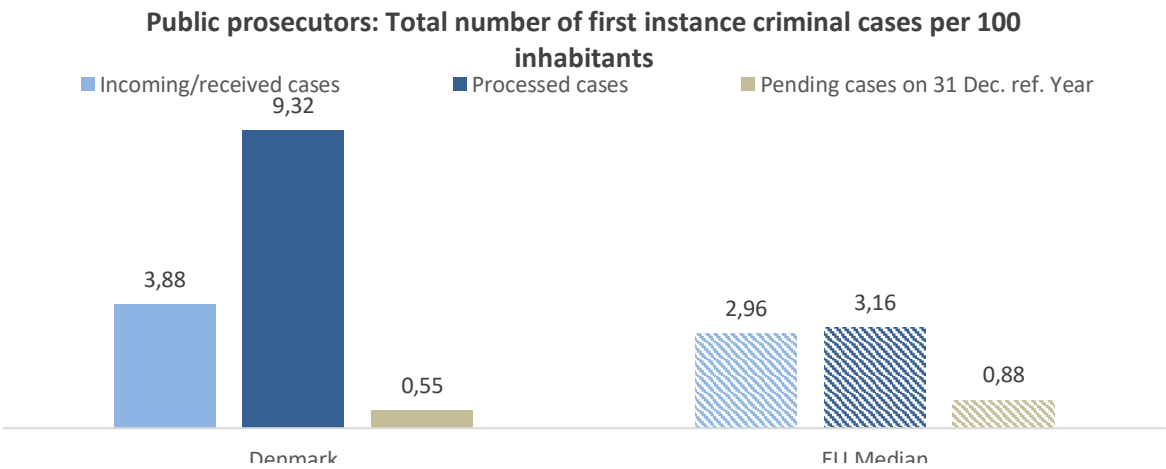

Prosecutors are recruited through a formal procedure conducted by the Director of Public Prosecutions' Office on behalf of the Ministry of Justice. A prosecutor may serve in the Local Prosecution Service within one of the 15 police districts, or in the Central Prosecution Service, which includes Regional State Prosecutors' offices and the Director of Public Prosecutions' Office.

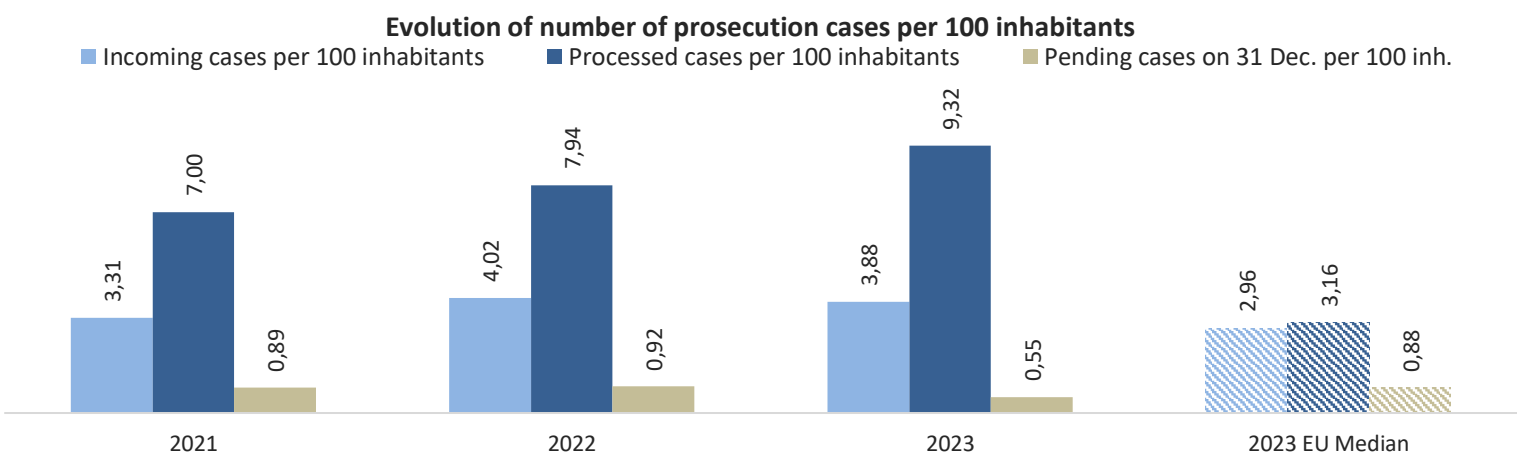
According to Danish authorities, the discrepancy between closed/finished cases and incoming cases arises because processed cases involve work carried out by both the police and the prosecution service, depending on the case. Distinguishing between cases finalized by the police versus the prosecution service is not always possible, as cases are often archived in police departments, regardless of who handled the final processing. For statistical purposes, one case represents one crime per person involved. For example, if two crimes are committed by three individuals, this results in six counts (cases). Additionally, reports of crime can increase in counts as they progress through the chain of criminal proceedings. The department that last worked on the case is considered its "owner."

It is not possible to extract data on discontinued cases in the format requested (Q 3.1.1, 3.1.2, and 3.1.4), as Danish law (sections 721 and 749 of the Administration of Justice Act) does not categorize such cases into these specific subsectors. Between 2021 and 2023, there has been an intensified effort to reduce the number of pending cases, which partly explains the increase in processed cases during this period.

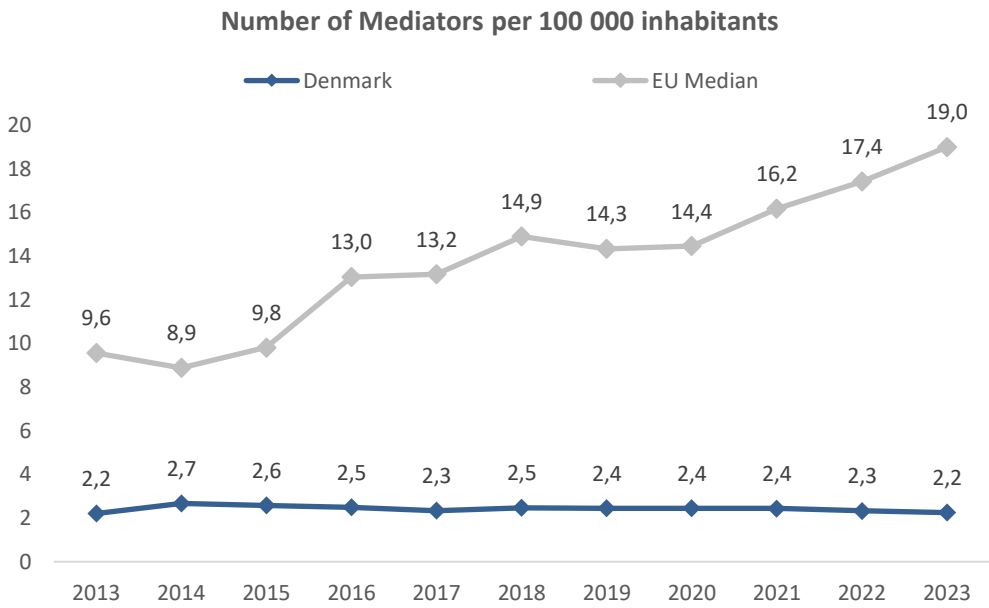

In 2023, there are 133 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 2,2 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation of the number of mediators between 2022 and 2023 is about -3,6%.

To qualify as a court-appointed mediator, a candidate must be a practicing lawyer or judge, have completed a relevant training program in mediation, and be deemed suitable for the role through a comprehensive assessment.

Although court-appointed mediators may also work as lawyers or judges, they act solely as mediators during the mediation process. According to Section 273, Subsection 1, Numbers 1 and 2 of the Administration of Justice Act, judges appointed as mediators are selected by the relevant court president, while lawyers are appointed by the Danish Court Administration after consultation with the two High Courts, the district courts, and the Danish Bar and Law Society.

It is the responsibility of each court president and the Danish Court Administration to assess candidates individually to ensure they possess the necessary qualifications and competencies.

Court-appointed mediators are also required to continuously maintain and develop their skills through ongoing professional education and training to support their mediation expertise.

In 2023, there are 41 notaries which represents 0,7 notaries per 100 000 inhabitants.

The function of a notary is an integral part of the district courts. All 24 district courts have one or more notaries who can verify signatures on important documents or certify that a copy is identical to the original. Notaries can confirm the identity of individuals signing wills or other documents and ensure that the signer understands the implications of creating such a document. They can also witness and confirm that a specific person has signed a particular document.

The exact number of notaries is uncertain, as the Danish Court Administration does not have precise data on the total number of notaries employed by the courts or their gender distribution. However, based on accounting figures and average annual costs, it is estimated that in 2023 there were approximately 41 full-time equivalent notary positions in the district courts.

Writing assistance tools: The system has a function that replaces a physical signature through an approval flow, but it is not a digital signature.

Recording of Court Hearings: In civil cases, recording is available in 287 courtrooms across 26 courts but is used only sporadically and requires explicit consent from the parties involved.

For administrative cases, recording is not practically relevant, though the same 287 courtrooms in 26 courts are equipped for it.

In criminal cases, recording is primarily used. While it is available in 287 courtrooms across 26 courts, the usage rate varies from court to court and judge to judge. Each judge decides on a case-by-case basis whether to use this functionality for a specific hearing. Recording is officially authorized under Danish legislation.

Playback of recordings during court proceedings is available for jurors. Automatic transcription of recordings is planned for the future once the quality becomes reliable. Currently, transcription is handled manually by court clerks on an ad hoc basis.

According to Danish authorities, they collect data on specific aspects such as satisfaction of court staff and the appeal ratio. However, this data is not used to monitor the courts. Instead, they share it with the courts for their guidance or with the Ministry of Justice. Neither them nor the Ministry of Justice have the mandate to regulate or monitor the courts based on this data. The shift in approach compared to previous years is not due to a lack of monitoring but rather a change in how the term "monitor" has been interpreted. While they do collect this data, they do not have the authority to enforce any actions upon the courts.
