





1. Judicial organisation in France (2023 data)

The French judicial system is characterised by the coexistence of two distinct orders - "ordre judiciaire" and "ordre administratif", each of which is organised into three court instances. In the sense of the CEPEJ terminology, administrative courts are considered as specialised courts.


In 2023 in France, there are 206 courts (legal entities) of general jurisdiction. Among them, the 164 "tribunaux judiciaires" and the 4 First instance courts (TPI) have competence at first instance, while the 37 Courts of appeal are the second instance courts of general jurisdiction. The Cassation Court is the highest instance court of general jurisdiction and its equivalent in administrative matters is the Council of State (Conseil d'Etat).

France is characterised by a very high number of specialised courts, most of which act at first instance, while at a higher instance there are only administrative courts (9 Appelate administrative courts and the Council of State).

In terms of geographic locations, there are 842 courts among which 789 are of first instance. When a court of first instance and a court of appeal are located on the same site, they have been counted separately.



In France in 2023, at first instance there are 152 commercial courts; 216 labor courts (211 "conseils de prud'hommes" and 5 labor courts); 38 administrative courts; 155 juvenile courts and 282 other specialised courts (272 parity courts for rural leases (tribunaux paritaires des baux ruraux (TPBR)), the Court for navigation on the Rhine; the Court for navigation on the Moselle; 6 Maritime courts; the National court of asylum and the "Commission du contentieux du stationnement payant").

In matters of enforcement of sentences, the enforcement judge (JAP) is a court of first instance for the enforcement of sentences, being at the same time a decision-making, monitoring and follow-up body. The Court for the Enforcement of Sentences (TAP) is a court of first instance, composed of three JAPs of the judicial courts (most complex and sensitive cases). In each court of appeal, a TAP is established. The exact number of enforcement of criminal sanctions courts is not available and for that reason teh total number of specialised first instance court cannot be calculated for 2023.

In matters of terrorism, a derogatory jurisdiction is provided for under ordinary law (articles 706-22-1 and D 49-75 to D49-81-5 of the CPP). The Paris enforcement courts specialized in terrorist matters (JAPAT, the TAPAT and the enforcement chamber) have exclusive jurisdiction to monitor persons convicted by specialized terrorism trial courts; shared jurisdiction with ordinary law enforcement courts to monitor persons convicted of acts of terrorism and other offenses falling within the scope of Article 706-16 of the CPP by ordinary law courts.

Concerning military jurisdictions, in peacetime courts of general jurisdiction are competent, while in times of war, the territorial courts of the armed forces are competent as exceptional jurisdictions.


Higher instance specialised courts exist only in administrative matters - the 9 Administrative courts of appeal and the Council of State.






According to 2023 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in France is 7 573, which is -1,5% less than in previous cycle.


More precisely, in France, there are 11,1 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 21,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants)

It should be mentioned that the data submitted for administrative judges are lower than those submitted for the previous cycle because they take into account the actual rate of assignment to the Litigation Division of the Council of State and not the number of individuals. Indeed, a member of the Council of State may be assigned simultaneously to the Litigation Division - and thus perform the duties of a judge - and to the Administrative division. For information, the number of staff without taking into account the rate of assignment is as follows: Total: 155 (Men: 92; Women: 63).

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 5 288, which represents 69,8% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 5 386 are sitting in the first instance courts (of which 3 885 are female); 1 835 are sitting in the second instance courts (of which 1 216 are female) and 352 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of which 187 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, a similar trend is observed in France. First instance judges are predominant but slightly less than in the EU, while second and third instance judges are sligthly above the respective EU medians.

As regards the distribution male/female, it has to be specified that female judges constitute the majority at all three instances.

When analysing data on professional judges, it is worth having in mind that in France, besides the 7 573 professional judges, there are 22 938 non-professional judges intervening in different matters such as commercial, insolvency, labour and social law. Within this figure are counted also assessors at the juvenile courts, courts for rural leases and maritime courts. Moreover, in labour, commercial and insolvency matters, non-professional judges are siiting alone, not in a mixed bench with a professional judge.



Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in France




In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 112, which represents 45,3% of the total number of court presidents.

In 2023, France has 25 947 non-judge staff (of which 20 785 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 2,2%.

In 2023, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 37,3 in 2022 to 37,9 in 2023).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 11,3 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2022 to 11,1 in 2023.

In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:

- 19 730 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of which 16 762 are Female);
- $_{\circ}$ 4 116 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of which 2 985 are Female);
- 908 technical staff (of which 125 are Female);
- $_{\circ}$ 1 193 other (of which 913 are Female);

"Other non-judge staff" include legal assistants and specialist assistants who do not work for the public prosecutor's office.

The category "2. Non-judge (judicial) staff whose task is to assist the judges" includes also A, B and C category contract staff recruited under the local justice support plan implemented from the second half of 2020. These contract staff are recruited for 3 years.

The total number of non-judge staff working in the courts increased by 564 actual staff between 2022 and 2023. For example, the number of "2. Non-judge (judicial) staff whose task is to assist the judges" decreased by 451 mainly because of the fall in the number of local justice contract staff in all categories (-268 actual staff numbers) and administrative assistants (-192 actual staff numbers), a number of whose posts have nevertheless been converted into administrative secretary posts. The "3. Staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the management of the courts" increased by 710, reflecting the continued strengthening of regional administrative services, which has been underway for several years (+233 actual staffing levels), which has led to the creation of contract B local IT technicians (contract B TIP, +126 actual staffing levels), administrative secretaries (+42 actual staffing levels) and psychologists (+18 actual staffing levels).

Similarly, the number of non-judge administrative staff in the courts has increased significantly (in particular +156 administrative secretarial posts). Finally, the legal assistants and specialist assistants making up the other non-judge staff category increased by 301. As at 31/12/2023, 1 580 category A and B staff (including 1 291 women) were undergoing initial training at the National School for Court Registrars, most of them on practical training in the courts. These staff will join the courts in 2024 or 2025, which will significantly increase the number of staff working in the courts and regional administrative departments.

With regard to the administrative courts, the technical staff listed correspond to the staff employed and paid by the administrative court and not the people working under service contracts for which data are not available.

Professional judges and non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio






Evolution of the ratio between professional judges and non-judge staff



In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 1 305, which represents 54,5% of the total number of prosecutors.

The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 1 892 in first instance (of which 1 049 are female); 444 are in second instance (of which 230 are female) and 58 in final instance (of which 26 are female).

As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of public prosecutors, it should be noticed that starting from 2023, data on first instance public prosecutors include also the 430 "délégués du procureur" (72 women and 358 men) who carry out functions comparable to those of public prosecutors....



Distribution of Heads of prosecution services by gender and by instance in France




In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution services (all instances) is 68, which represents 34,0% of the total number of Heads of prosecution services.




The increase in the numbers between 2022 and 2023 occurs in the context of the strengthening of the justice budget, in particular by providing for the creation of a large number of posts for legal assistants (300 in 2023), these criteria have made it possible to consolidate the assignment of legal assistants to the Public Prosecutor's Office on a long-term basis.

In accordance with the note from the Directorate of Judicial Services dated 30 January 2023 on the distribution and recruitment of legal assistant staff for the year 2023, the following were taken into account: the support for the activity of the public prosecutors' offices, the ratio of the number of legal assistant staff jobs per localised prosecutor's position so that it is between 1 for 6 and 1 for 7 for all metropolitan jurisdictions, the specificities of overseas jurisdictions and jurisdictions hosting specialized interregional jurisdictions (JIRS) or national centers. In addition, the distribution of the posts of legal assistant officers was linked to an action plan to reduce stocks and improve the quality of processing of proceedings. Similarly, the need to support the public prosecutors' offices, particularly within the JIRS or national centres, in the characterisation and processing of complex offences has led to the assignment of specialised assistants within these courts.

Public prosecutors and non-prosecutor staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio





In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 144 856€.

According to 2023 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in France is 54 495€, which is around the EU median of 58 128€. (-6% below)

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 1,3 times higher. (the EU median is 1,9)

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 58 623€ to 266 974€. France's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is 4% above the EU median of 118 595€

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 101 592€.

In 2023, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in France of 54 495€ is slightly above the EU median of 49 953€. (9% above)

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,3 times higher. (the EU median is 1,7)

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 456€ and the maximum is 199 670€. France's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is 32% above the EU median of 93 759€

It has to be pointed out that the salary scale for judges at the beginning of their career has been upgraded.

The sub-directorate for legal affairs of the Ministry of Justice, in conjunction with the State judicial agent, monitors liability actions relating to the defective functioning of the public service of Justice (essentially based on Article L. 141-1 of the Code of Judicial Organisation, with regard to users of this service). The State judicial agent directly follows up actions for compensation for pre-trial detention undergone in the context of criminal proceedings that have ended with a decision to dismiss, discharge or acquit (Articles 149 et seq. of the Code of Criminal Procedure).

- 1) Regarding liability actions relating to the defective functioning of the public service of Justice: The vast majority of them are based on Article L. 141-1 of the Code of Judicial Organisation. According to this article, the State is obliged to allow a compensation for damage caused by the defective functioning of the Justice service. Except in the case of special provisions, this liability is incurred only in the event of serious fault or a denial of justice. This regime of liability concerns only the user of the public service of Justice, the third party to the legal proceedings being able to engage only the liability without fault of the State for breach of equality before public charges.
- 2) With regard to actions based on Article 149 et seq. of the Code of Criminal Procedure: article 149 of the Code of Criminal Procedure gives the right, under certain conditions, to full compensation for the damage suffered as a result of detention in proceedings that have been dismissed, acquitted or discharged. Any person who has been held in pre-trial detention during proceedings which have ended in a decision to dismiss, discharge or acquit that has become final, shall be entitled, subject to the exceptions precisely defined by Article 149 of the CCP, at his or her request, to full compensation for the moral and material damage caused by this detention. The compensation awarded is payable by the State. It is the First president of the court of appeal within whose jurisdiction the decision to dismiss, discharge or acquit, resulting in the detainee's innocence, has been taken, who decides, after a public and contradictory procedure, by a reasoned decision that can be appealed to the national commission for compensation for detention placed at the Court of Cassation (CNRD).

The figures given in the "excessive length of proceedings" category correspond to liability actions relating to the defective operation of the public justice service (article L. 141-1 of the Code of Judicial Organisation); the figures given in the "wrongful arrest/detention" category correspond to legal actions initiated on the basis of article 149 et seq. of the Code of Criminal Procedure; the figures given in the "Other" category correspond to legal proceedings relating to 'seals' and 'police property damage' (door breakage).







In 2023, the longest total length of proceedings (all instances combined) in France is registered in civil matters, while in the EU administrative proceedings proved to be the longest. As to criminal matters, it is not possible to measure their length at first instance because of the lack of available data on pending criminal cases.

In 2023, the lowest Disposition Time in France was registered with regard to third instance criminal cases, while the highest one was calculated for third instance civil cases.


One can see that in civil and criminal matters the Disposition Time values are above the respective EU medians at all three instances. Conversely, in administrative matters, the Disposition Time is below the respective EU medians at second and third instance, while at first instance the value of France constitutes the EU median.

Third instance courts managed to exceed the 100% threshold in terms of Clearance Rate in all three matters which is not the case for first instance courts. As to second instance courts, only in criminal matters their Clearance Rate is below 100%.















In 2023, there are 2 980 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 4,4 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation of the number of mediators between 2022 and 2023 is about 4,4%.

The figure 2 980 includes 2 627 individuals and 353 legal entities.

Mediators in civil, commercial and social matters are entered on the list of mediators provided for by the law of 8 February 1995, drawn up for the information of judges.

The list includes a special section for family mediators and a special section for online services providing mediation services. It is drawn up every three years and may be amended at any time if necessary. It is made available to the public on the website of the Court of Appeal or, failing that, the Ministry of Justice.

A natural person may only be entered on the list if s/he meets the following conditions: 1) has not been convicted of a criminal offence, been disqualified or withdrawn from practicing mediation; 2) has not been the perpetrator of an offence contrary to honour, probity or morality that has resulted in a disciplinary or administrative sanction involving removal from office, striking off the roll, dismissal, withdrawal of approval or authorisation; 3) has training or experience that attests to her/his suitability to practise mediation.

A legal entity carrying out the activity of mediator may only be entered on the list if it meets the following conditions: 1) its directors meet the conditions listed above; 2) its articles of association provide that it may carry out mediation; 3) Each natural person who carries out mediation must meet the above conditions.

The Court of Appeal councillor responsible for monitoring the activities of judicial conciliators and mediators and coordinating their work within the jurisdiction of the Court of Appeal, examines the application and checks that the applicant meets the required conditions. The general assembly of judges of the court of appeal draws up the list of mediators in civil, commercial and social matters.

The decision to refuse registration or to strike off the list may only be appealed to the Court of Cassation.

8. Systems for measuring and evaluating the performance of courts and public prosecution services in France (2023 data)

In France, quality standards are determined for the judicial system at national level (e.g. quality systems for the judiciary and/or judicial quality policies). However, there is no specialised personnel within the courts or the public prosecution services entrusted with implementation of these national level quality standards.

Quality standards developed for public administration are used in the judicial system. The charter of the administrations thus sets the rules for the reception of litigants in all courts and can lead to certification. There are also local initiatives aimed at setting up a "quality system" based on certification by an external body, which consists in establishing procedures describing the reception process, the organisation of work and the management of a case.

As regards administrative justice: the rate of annulment and reversal of court decisions must be kept below 15% and the stock of cases older than two years must be kept below 7.5% of the total stock.

Following an experimental phase, the direct style of drafting of decisions in litigious matters rendered within the administrative court has been generalized, as of January 1, 2019. With this in mind, a vade-mecum on the drafting of decisions of the administrative court had been drawn up by a working group and distributed.

The framework letters sent to each court by the General Secretariat of the Council of State recall the general objectives set out in the documents accompanying the Finance Act in terms of speed and quality: target average delivery time, proportion of cases of more than 24 months (must not exceed 8.5% of the overall backlog of all courts and 4.5% of the overall backlog for administrative courts of appeal) and rate of annulment-reversal of judgments of the tribunals by the courts or judgments of the courts by the judge of cassation not exceeding 15%.

Strictly speaking, there are no specialised staff responsible for the implementation of these quality standards, but a monitoring responsibility for the presidents of chambers and heads of courts.

No quantitative target per judge is defined at national level. For administrative courts, the General Secretariat of the Council of State, in consultation with the head of court, sets an overall target for each court. Heads of court may set quantitative performance targets per judge: number of cases per year, priority given to the oldest cases. For administrative courts, there are individual quantitative targets which is not the case for civil and criminal courts, where the indicators relate to functions (courts of general jurisdiction, investigation judges, juvenile courts, public prosecutors) and registry staff. Thus, a set of objectives and indicators are set out, at national level, in the annual documents presented to Parliament (Annual Performance Project and Annual Performance Report), including a certain number of indicators measuring the "performance" of civil servants and judges, with an average level of performance to be achieved (targets). These ratios are very general.

The individual part of the administrative judges' function allowance (there is also a functional part that depends on the responsibilities, the level of experience and the constraints relating to the functions performed), which takes into account the results obtained and the way of serving, may be adjusted if the objectives, qualitative and in particular quantitative, are not met.

The assessment of public prosecutors foreseen by article 12-1 of the Statutory Order 58-1270 of 22 December 1958 is aimed at determining the prosecutor's professional value. It must reflect their professional legal and technical skills, their level of commitment and assess their ability to perform a given function as well as identifying their training needs as part of a career path. The assessment is drawn up by the Prosecutor General of the Court of Appeal or the prosecutor at the High Court of Appeal in the case of public prosecutors within their scope. The assessment is seen as an opportunity for discussion between the prosecutor and his or her superior and should enable the prosecutor to highlight the skills he or she has applied, his or her strengths and areas for improvement. It helps to better situate the prosecutor's work within the organisation and operation of the department, but also to clarify the tasks associated with his or her duties by highlighting his or her professional potential. The assessment is therefore an opportunity for public prosecutors to take stock of their work, consider changes in their professional practice and assess themselves at regular intervals in relation to their career plans. For the assessor, the aim is to identify the potential of each individual in order to contribute to the efficient management of human resources.
