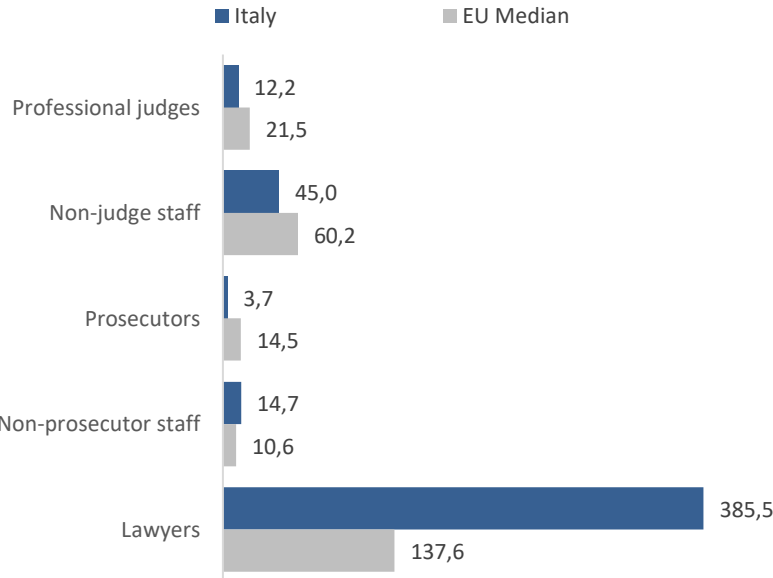

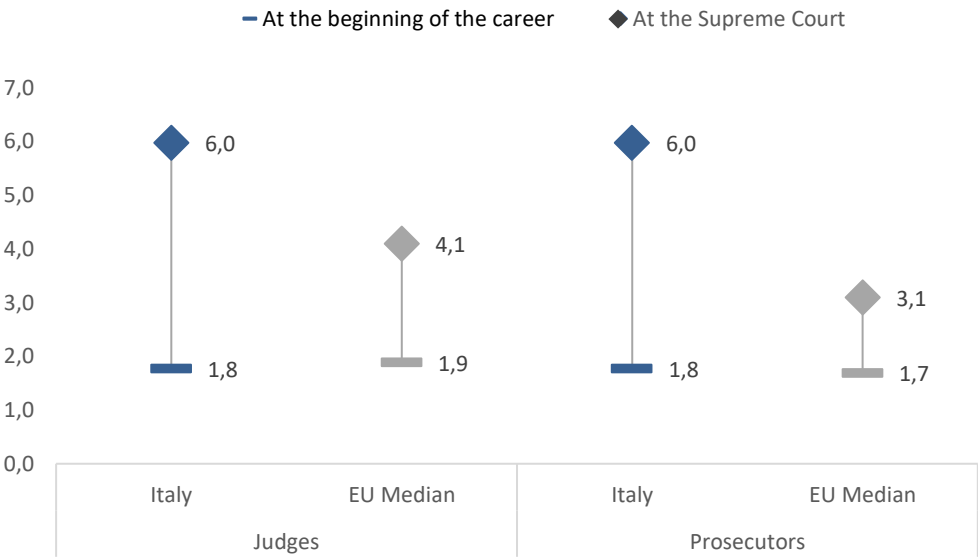

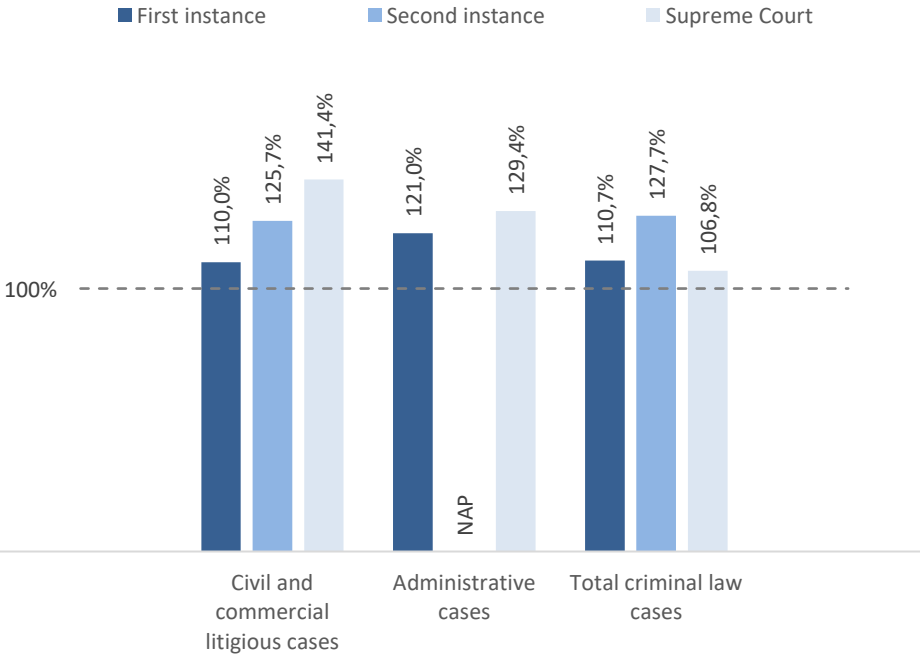


Gross salaries of judges and prosecutors vs average annual salary in 2023

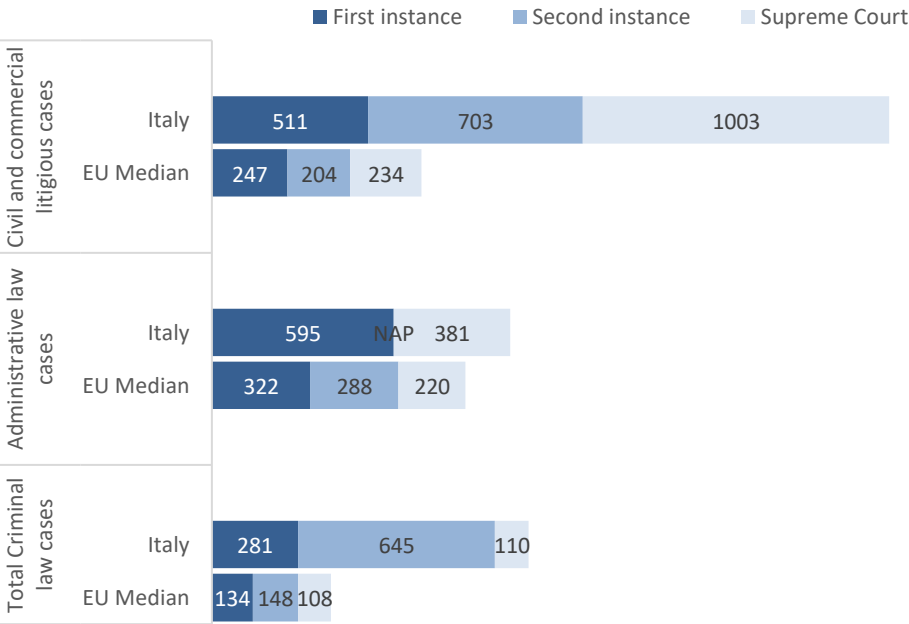

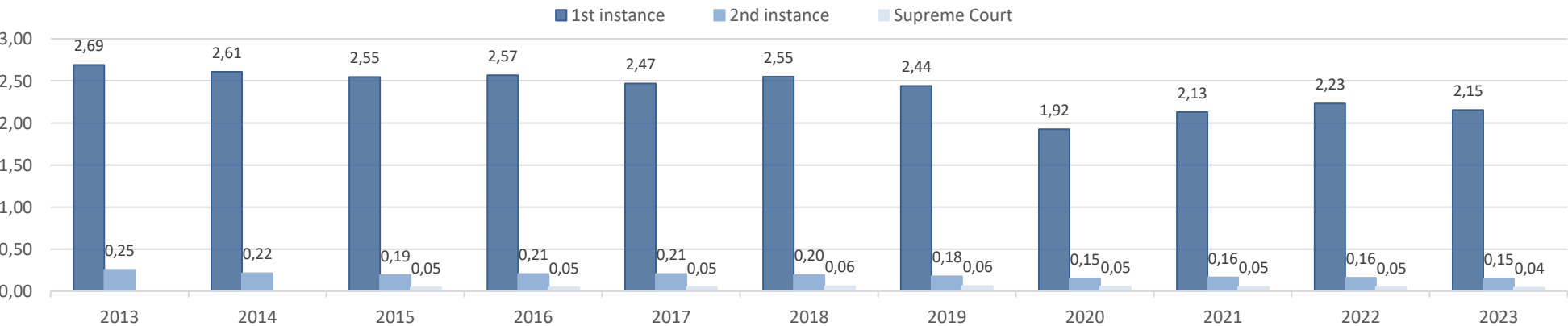


DispositionTime by instance and by matter in 2023 (days)

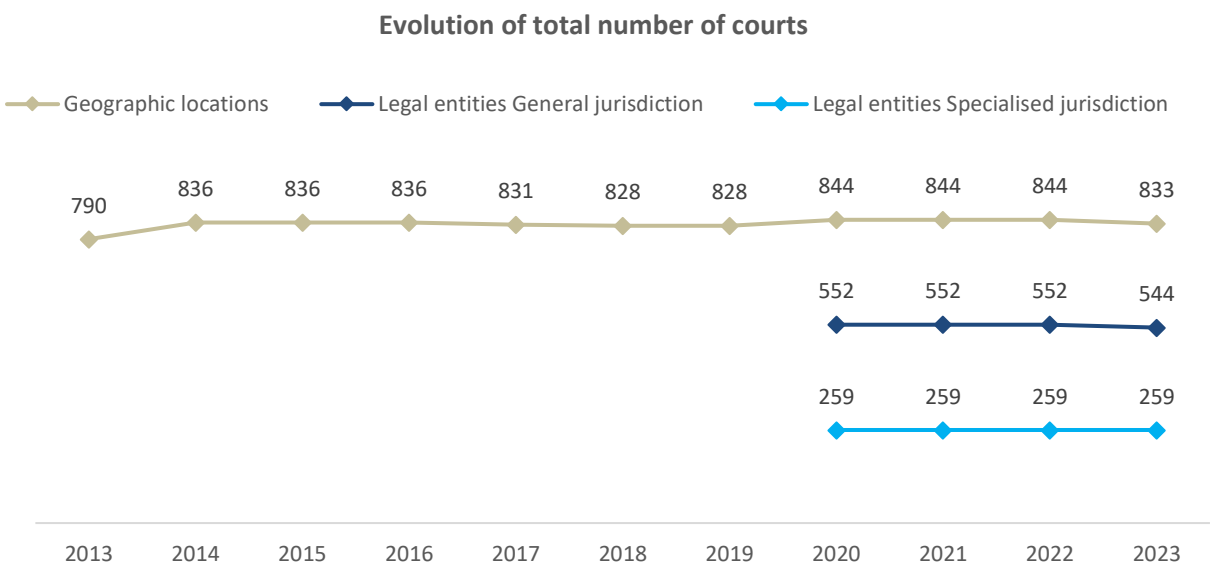

In 2023, in Italy there are 544 first instance courts of general jurisdiction, 26 second instance courts of general jurisdiction, 1 Supreme Court (highest instance) of general jurisdiction and 259 specialised courts (236 in first instance and 23 in second instance). There are 833 geographic locations.

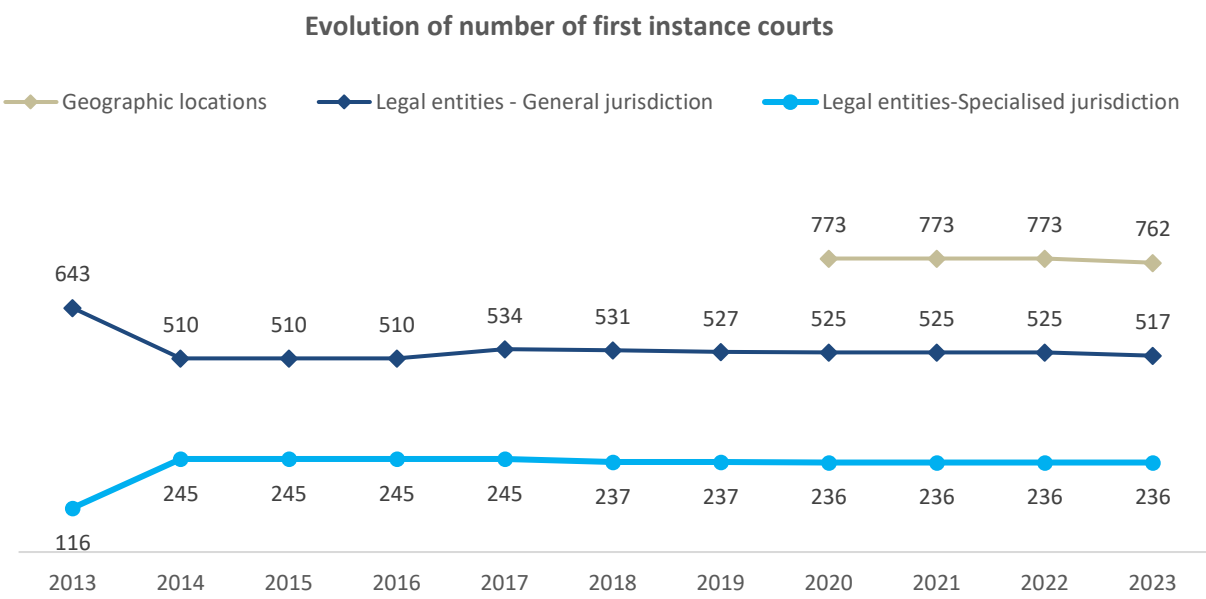

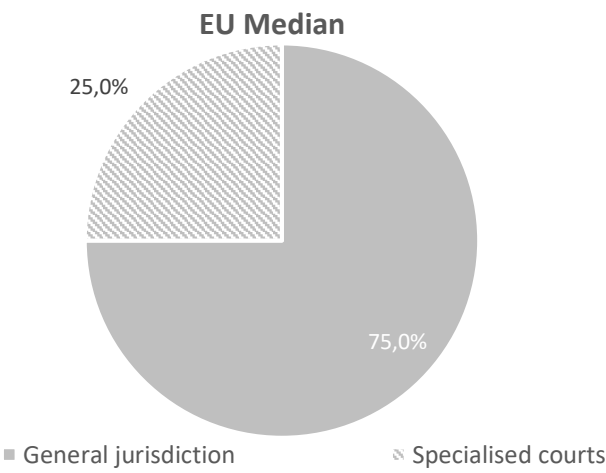
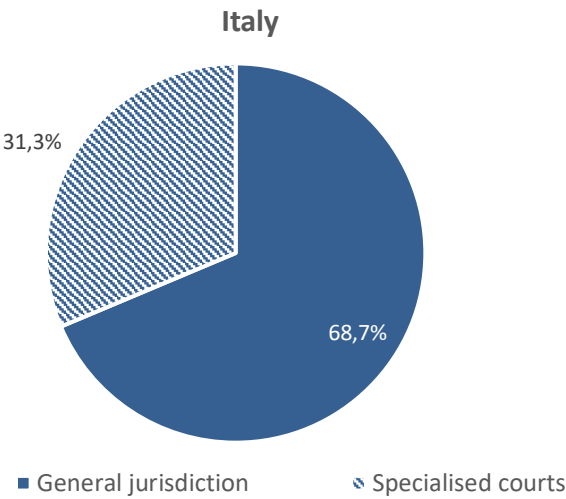

The distribution between first instance general jurisdiction courts and first instance specialised courts in Italy is 68,7% - 31,3% (distribution tendency in EU: 75,0% - 25,0%).

Since 2014, Italy has had 22 Brand Commercial Courts (Tribunali delle Imprese), which are distinct legal entities rather than internal court divisions established for organisational purposes, such as labour or family matters.

Notably, in Italy, some specialised first-instance courts are not administered or financed by the Ministry of Justice. These include regional audit commissions, local tax commissions and military courts. As a result, these courts are not considered in responses regarding court budgets, cases, judges, or non-judge staff. Regional audit commissions are not even counted in the number of courts. Conversely, regional administrative courts (first-instance administrative courts) and the supreme administrative court, although they are also not administered or financed by the Ministry of Justice, are included in the counts. Since 2014, they have been considered in the totals for the number of courts and cases. Additionally, starting from 2018, they have been included in the counts for the number of judges, non-judge staff and in the courts budget. Furthermore, specific matters, such as labour, family, and other specialised areas, are handled by dedicated divisions within the same court. In addition, there are 26 divisions, known as Direzioni Distrettuali Antimafia (DDA), that specifically address mafia and organised crime cases.

Appeals from some specialised courts, such as commercial and juvenile courts, are heard by general jurisdiction appeal courts. Specific subject matters, such as labour, insolvency, family, counter-terrorism, and the fight against organised crime, are addressed by dedicated divisions within general jurisdiction courts. The option "Other specialised courts" refers to tax courts.

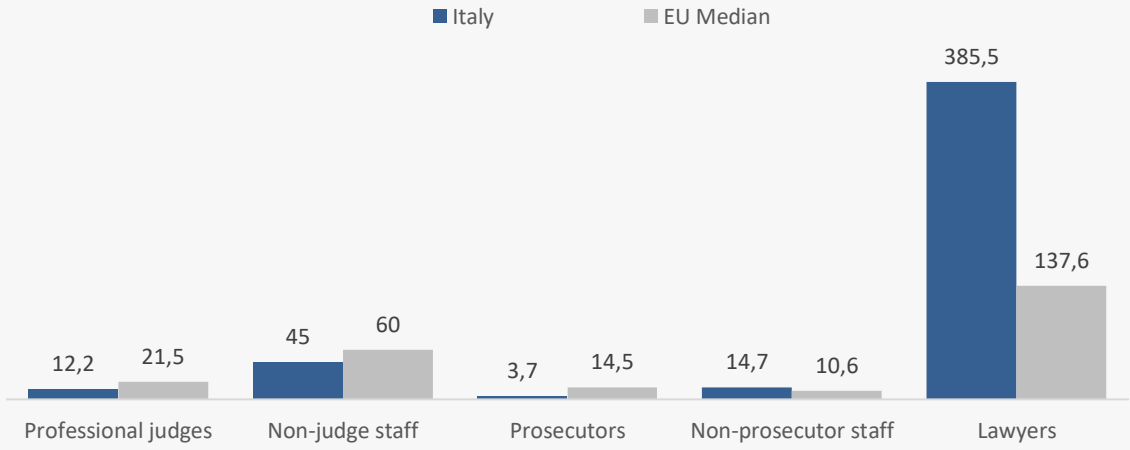

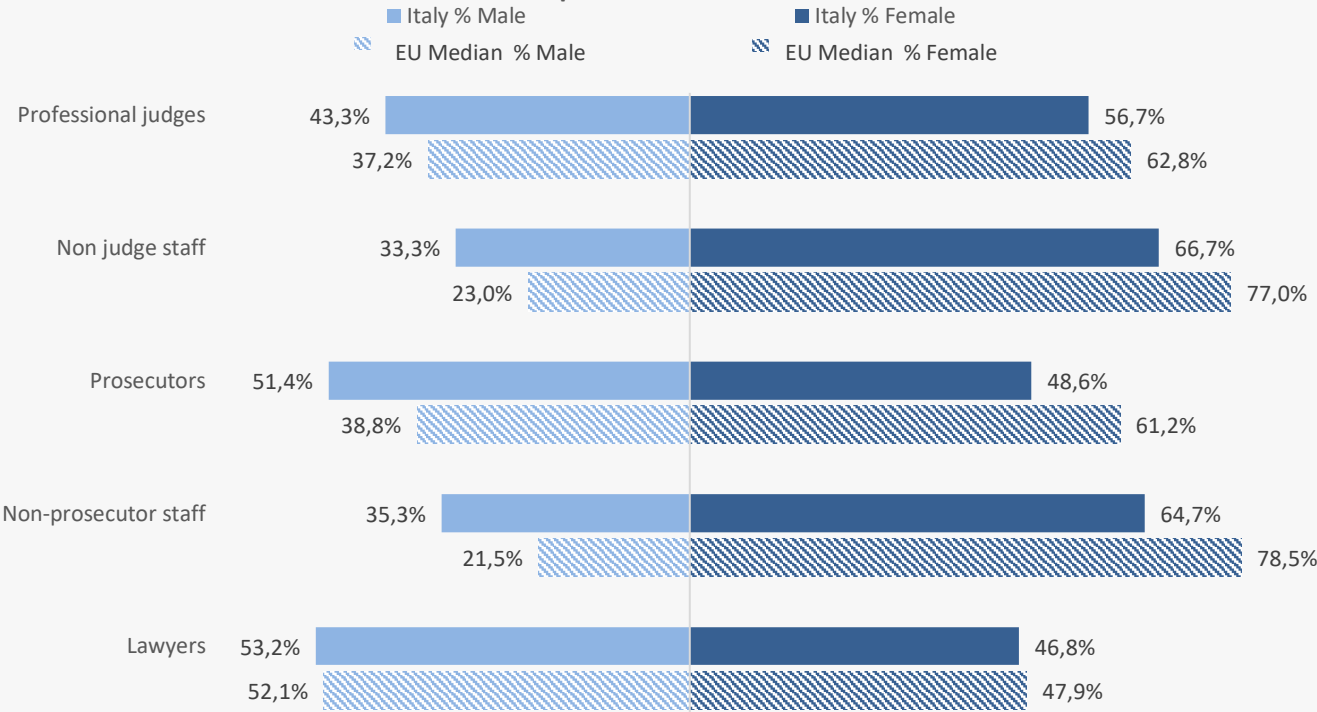
Judicial professionals per 100 000 inhabitants

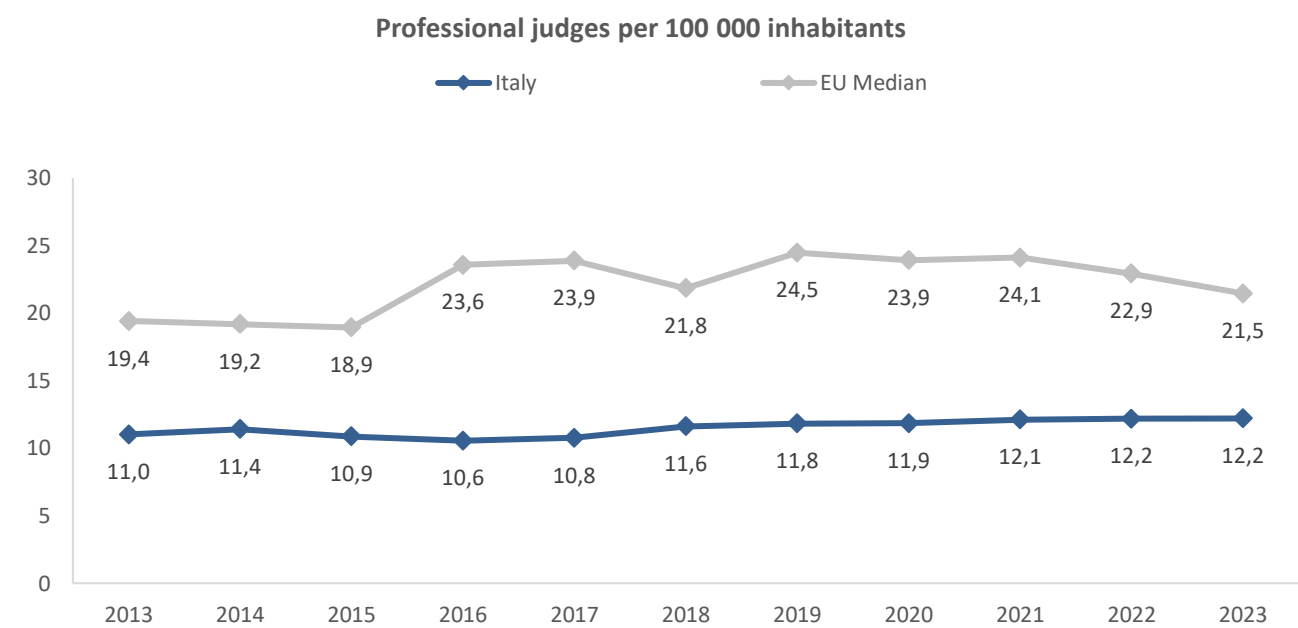

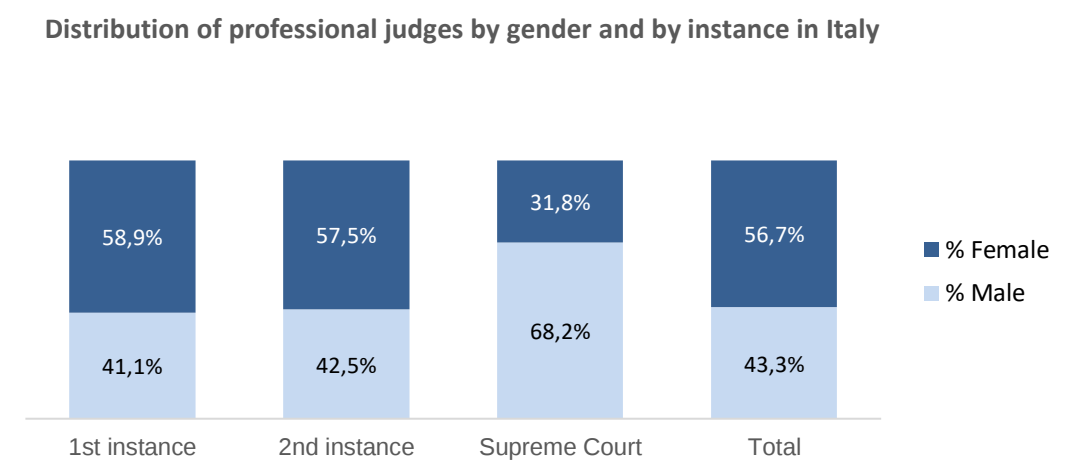
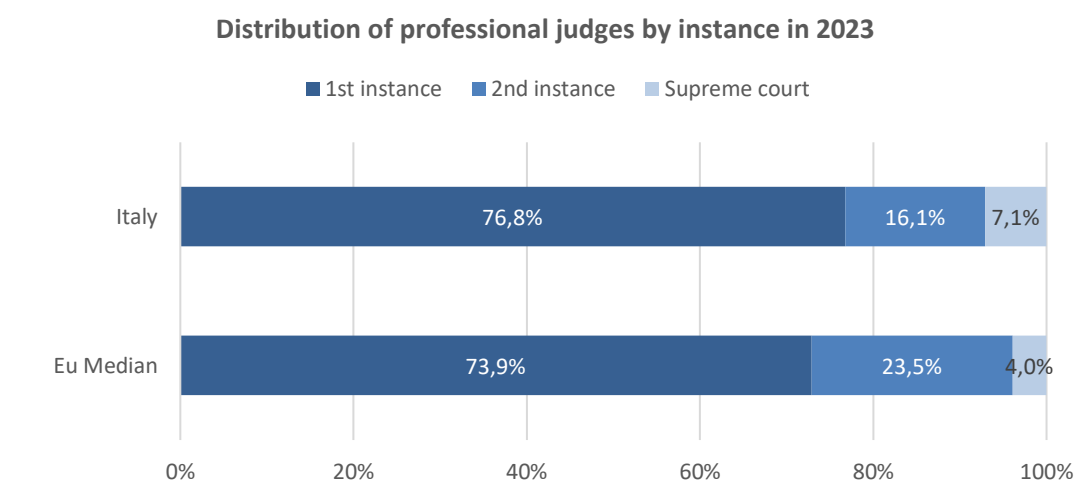
According to the 2023 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Italy is 7 198, which is 0,4% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Italy, there are 12,2 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 21,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants)

Judges serving in specialised first-instance courts, such as regional audit commissions, local tax commissions, and military courts, which operate independently and are financially autonomous from the Ministry of Justice, are not included in this count.

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 4 084, which represents 56,7% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 5 528 are sitting in the first instance courts (of which 3 254 are female); 1 161 are sitting in the second instance courts (of which 668 are female) and 509 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of which 162 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, Italy has relatively less judges in the second instance (16,5% vs 23,2%). This is probalby due to the fact that there are no administrative courts and judges of second instance.

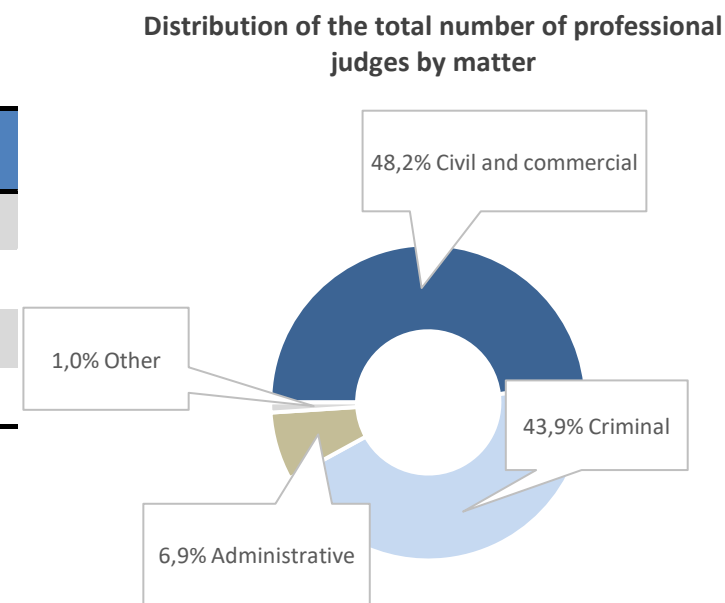
As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of judges, it should be noticed that the judges belonging to the specialised first instance courts that are not administered and financed by the Ministry of Justice (regional audit commissions, local tax commissions and military courts) are not counted under this question.

As regards the distribution of the number of judges among the different judicial instances, as already mentionned, in Italy there is not a second instance for administrative cases, therefore, there are no second instance administrative judges.

As regards the distribution male/female, the percentage of females is higher in the first two instances and lower at the supreme court.

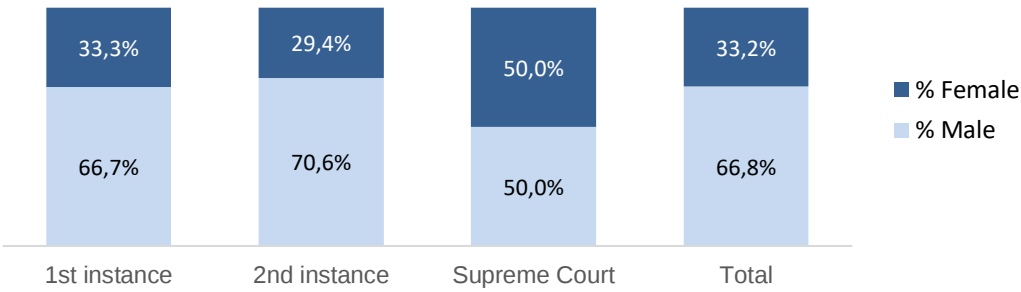

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Italy



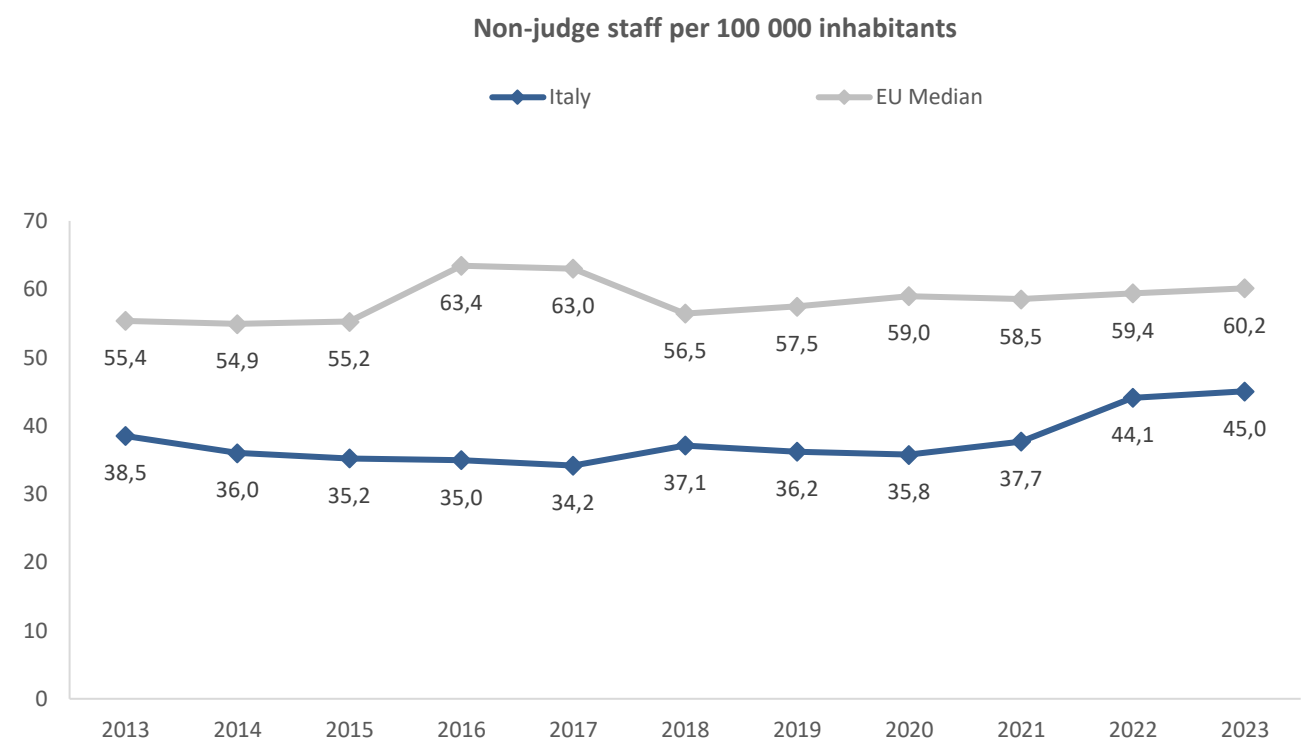
In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 64, which represents 33,2% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 174 are sitting in first instance courts (of which 58 are female); 17 are sitting in second instance courts (of which 5 are female) and 2 are sitting in Supreme Court (of which 1 are female).

In 2023 the number of court presidents decreased because some court presidents have retired and no new presidents have been formally appointed yet.

In 2023, Italy has 26 573 non-judge staff (of which 17 732 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 2,4%.

In 2023, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 44,1 in 2022 to 45,0 in 2023).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 12,2 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2022 to 12,2 in 2023.

In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:

- 17 636 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of which 12 617 are Female);
- 4 945 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of which 3 473 are Female);
- 2 112 technical staff (of which 954 are Female);
- 1 880 other (of which 688 are Female);

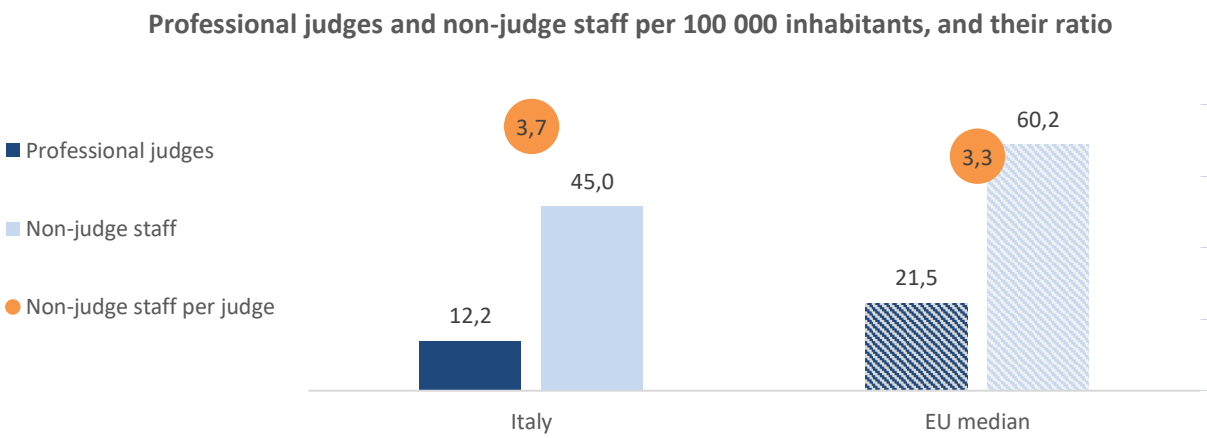
The category “other non-judge staff” encompasses assistants, receptionists, porters and other judicial staff. As a general remark, it should be stressed that the high percentage of “other non-judge staff” in Italy is due to a very strict interpretation of the definition of the main categories. The specialised first instance courts that are not administered and financed by the Ministry of Justice (regional audit commissions, local tax commissions and military courts) are not taken into consideration in this counting.

In 2022, as part of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR), the Ministry of Justice undertook an extraordinary recruitment process to strengthen the so-called "Trial Office." This organisational initiative involved the creation or enhancement of support teams for judges, employing staff on fixed-term contracts with the aim of reducing case backlogs and shortening disposition times.

This measure also improved the quality of justice by assisting judges in their routine activities, such as conducting legal research, drafting and organising documents, and preparing case studies. By delegating these tasks, judges were able to focus on more complex and substantive judicial matters.

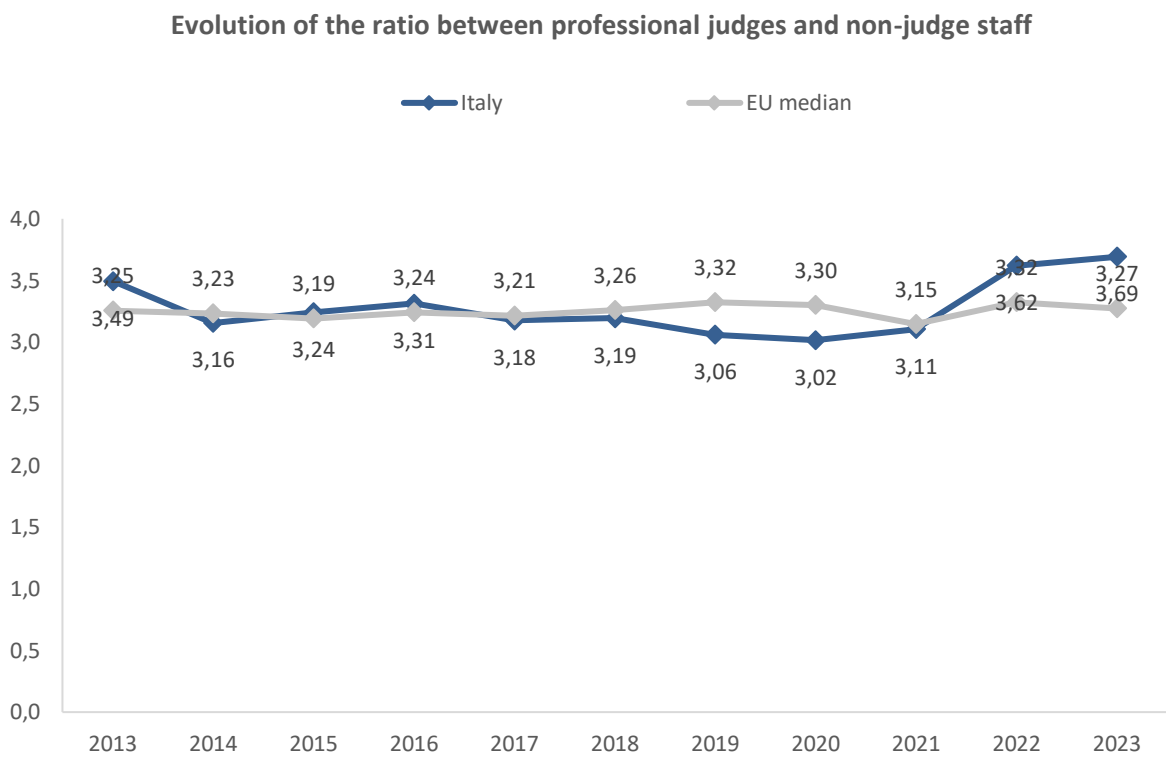


In Italy, there are 12,2 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 21,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 3,7 non-judge staff per judge.

There has been a small increase compared with the previous cycle when this ratio was at 3,6 non-judge staff per judge.

Evolution of the ratio between professional judges and non-judge staff

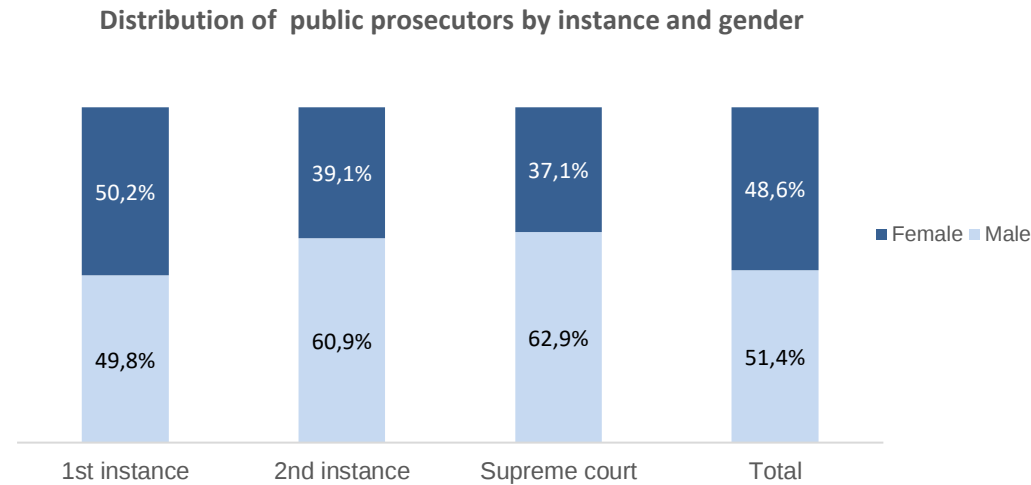
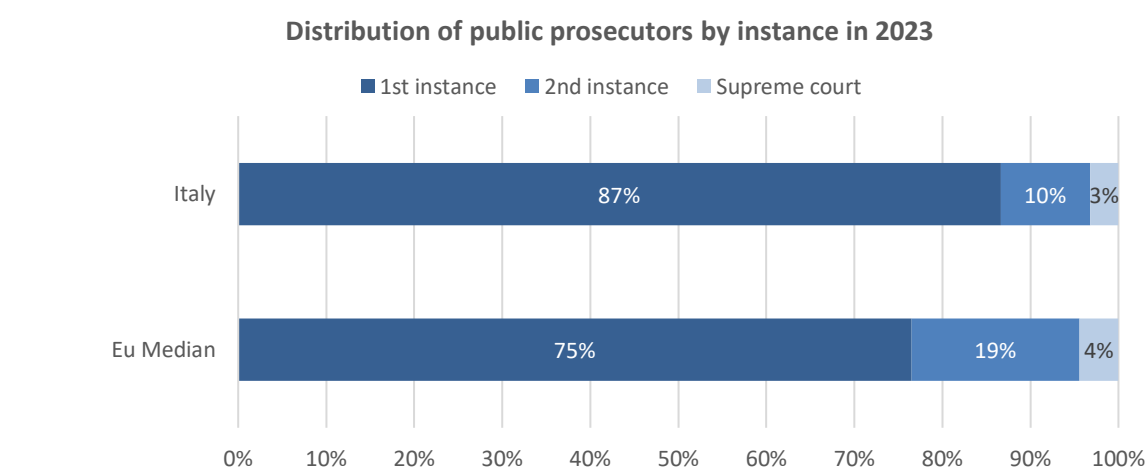

In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 1 054, which represents 48,6% of the total number of prosecutors.

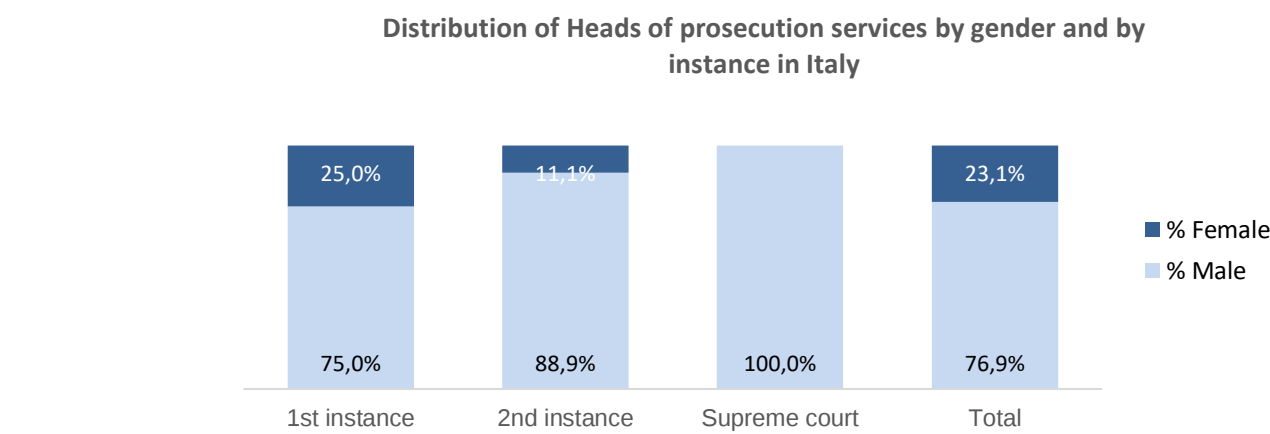
The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 1 878 in first instance (of which 942 are female); 220 are in second instance (of which 86 are female) and 70 in final instance (of which 26 are female).

As regards the distribution male/female, male prosecutors are more than 50% in all instances. Additionally, their representation tends to increase as the instance level progresses.

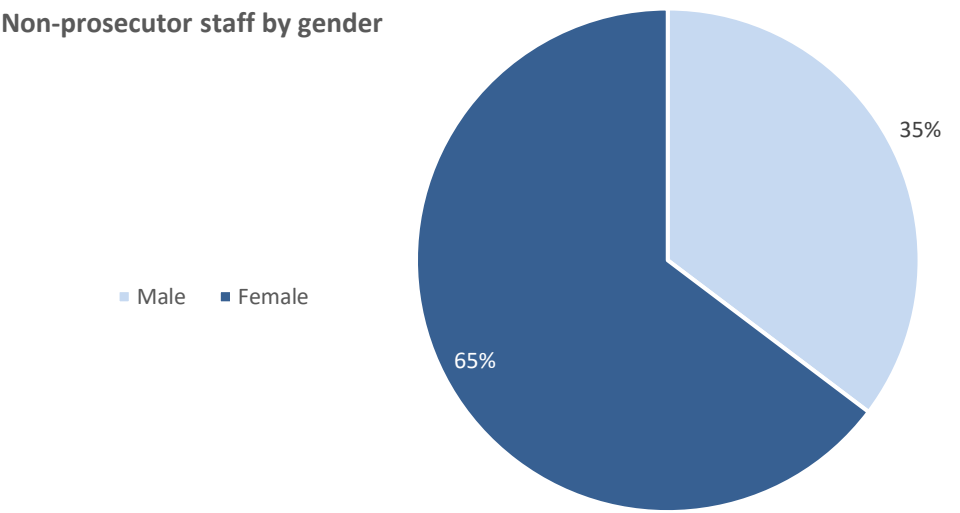
In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution (all instances) is 34, which represents 23,1% of the total number of Heads of prosecution.

The total number of Heads of prosecution is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 128 at first instance level (of which 32 are female); 18 at second instance level (of which 2 are female) and 1 at the highest instance level (of which 0 are female).

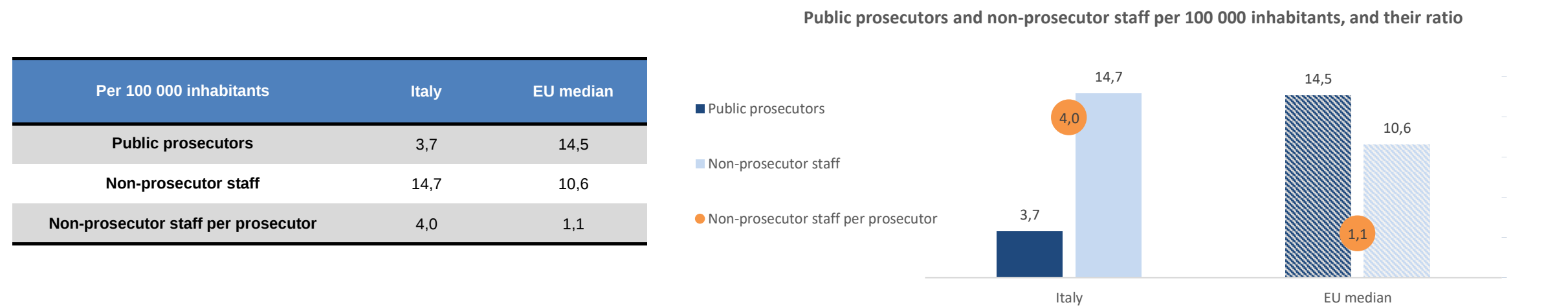

Non-prosecutor staff by gender

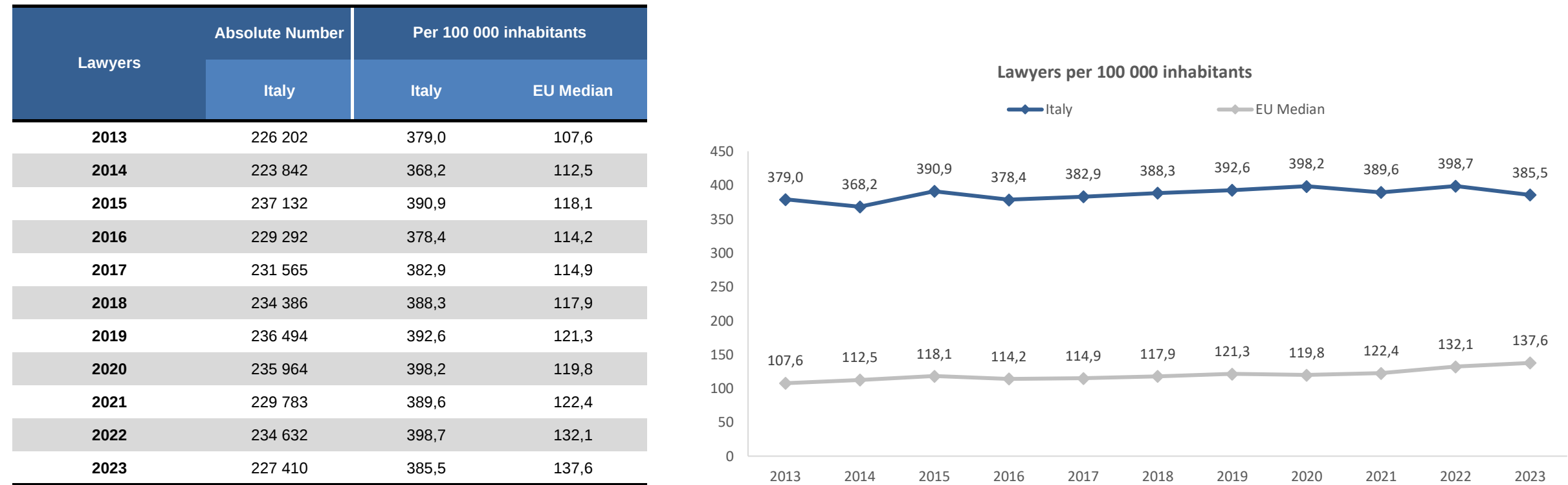


Ratio between non-prosecutor staff and public prosecutors



In 2023, in Italy, the ratio between non-prosecutor staff and prosecutors of 4,0 was significantly above the EU median of 1,1.

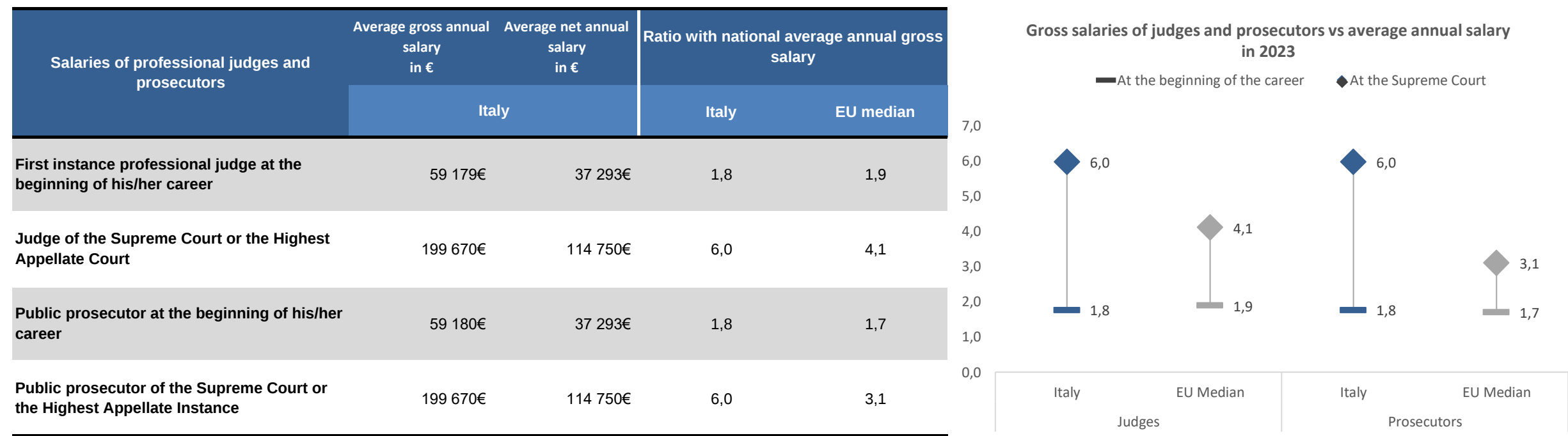

In 2023, there are 227 410 lawyers, which is -3,1% less than in 2022.
There are 106 512 female lawyers which is 47% of the total.

Italy has 385,5 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is above the EU median of 137,6 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

Salaries of professional judges and prosecutors at beginning of a career and at the highest instance



In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 144 856€.

According to 2023 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Italy is 59 179€, which is around the EU median of 58 128€ (2% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 1,8 times higher (the EU median is 1,9).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 58 623€ to 266 974€. Italy's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is 68% above the EU median of 118 595€.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 25 759€ to a maximum of 101 592€.

In 2023, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Italy of 59 180€ is rather above the EU median of 49 953€ (18% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,8 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 456€ and the maximum is 199 670€. Italy is the country with maximum absolute gross salary in the EU.

It is noteworthy that the salaries of judges and public prosecutors do not depend on the position held but rather on the experience (i.e. years of service). This means that the salary of a judge working in the lowest courts can be the same as the salary of a judge working in the Supreme Court of Cassation.

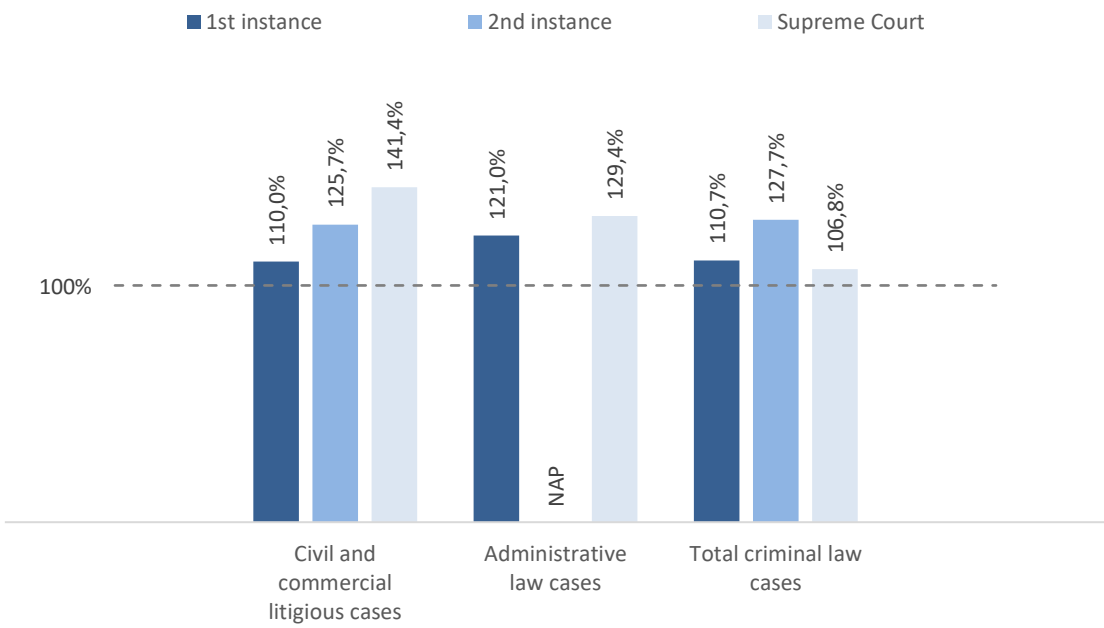
The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.

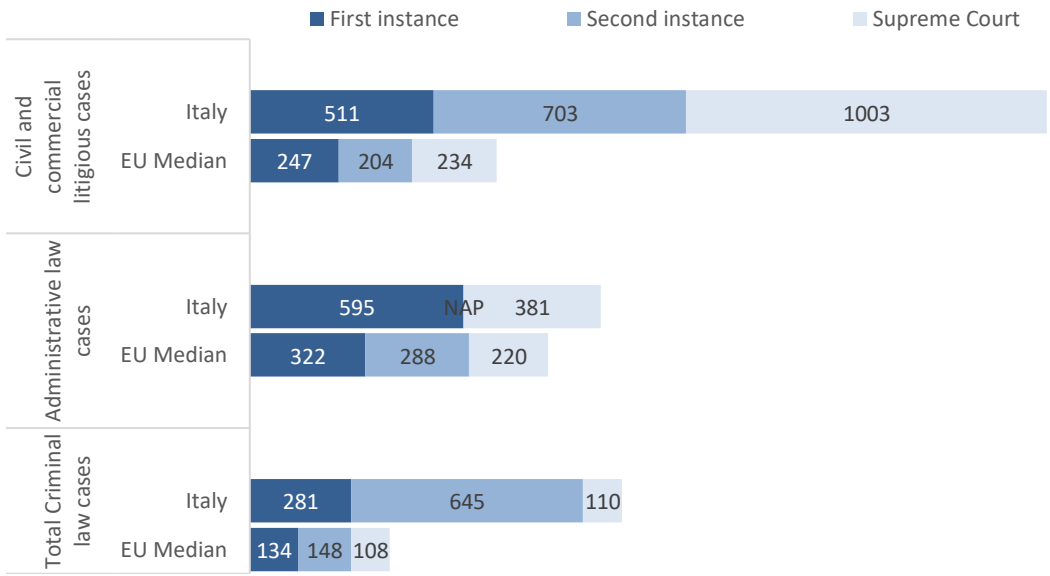

In the framework of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR) Italy has undertaken a series of actions in order to reduce both disposition time and backlogs. The main objective is an overall reduction of 40% in the civil sector and 25% in the criminal sector by June 2026 (all three instances together). More specifically a reduction of the civil backlog by 65% in first instance courts and 55% in appeal courts by the end of 2024; by 90% in first instance courts and appeal courts by June 2026. As far as for the civil cases, such targets relate exclusively to litigious cases. 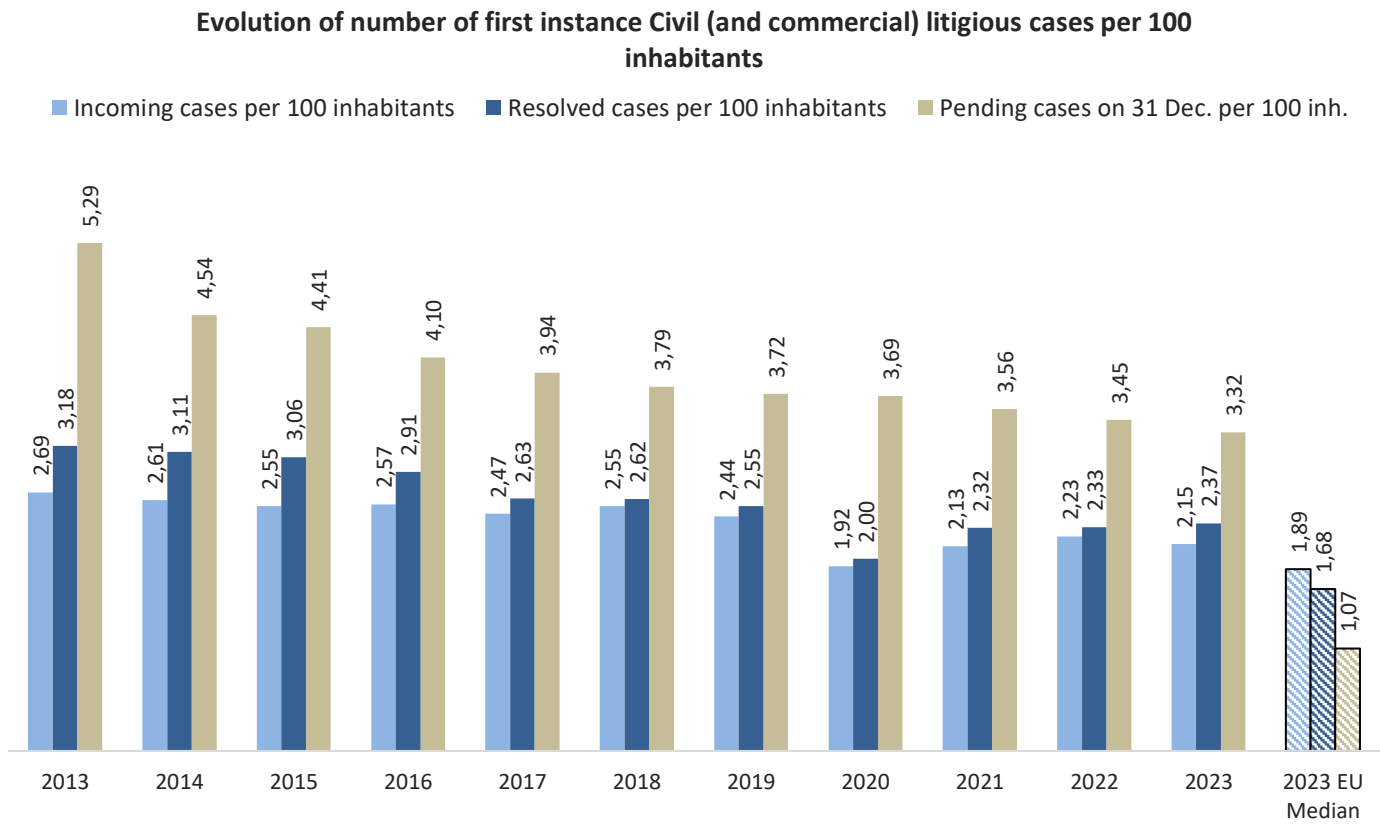
As a result, in 2022 and 2023 the number of resolved cases increased significantly, the clearance rate is well above 100% for all the categories of cases and all instances, and, consequently, the number of pending cases and the disposition time decreased. However, the total length of proceedings is still above the EU median, especially as regards civil and commercial litigious cases and criminal cases in all instances.

With regard to administrative cases (number provided only as of 2014), the appeals are dealt with by the Council of State (Consiglio di Stato) which is a legal-administrative consultative body ensuring the legality of public administration in Italy. The Council has jurisdiction on acts of all administrative authorities, except when these authorities lack discretionary power, in which case the dispute is considered to be one of civil law. Figures referring to the activity of the Council of State are inserted in the frame of question 99 (third instance cases) and not question 97 (second instance cases).

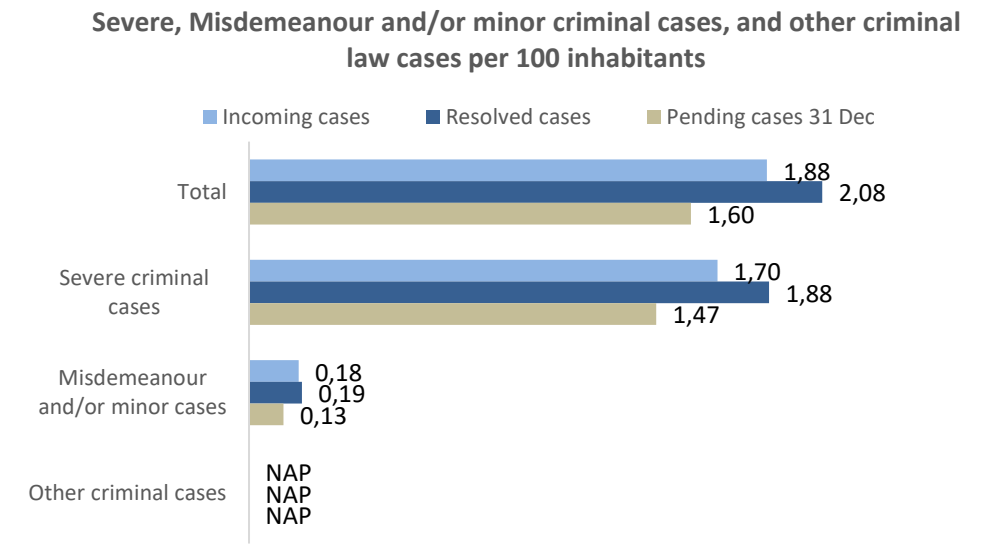

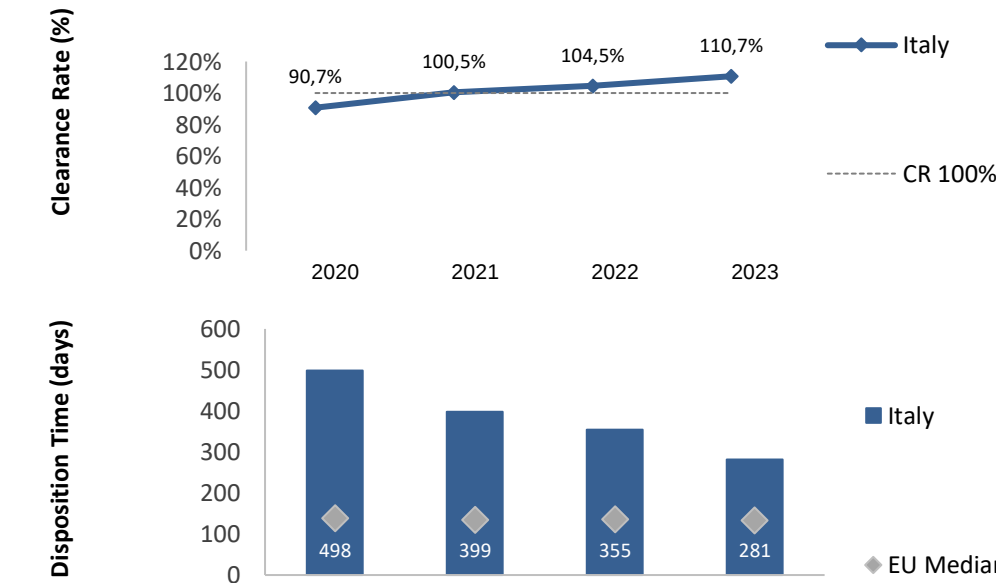

In 2023, there are 23 745 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 40,3 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation of the number of mediators between 2022 and 2023 is about 0,8%.

To become a mediator in Italy, individuals must meet specific requirements:

- Be in possession of a university degree of at least three years or be registered with a professional association.
 - Complete a training course of at least 80 hours, including theoretical and practical components, with a final evaluation. An internship is provided for by participation, with support to the mediator, in no less than ten mediations with adhesion of the invited party.
 - Undergo biennial refresher courses including at least 18 hours of advanced training and an additional 10 hours for "expert" mediators in cross-border, international or consumer relations. Mediators already enrolled will also have to participate in courses that also include face-to-face laboratory activities.
 - Declare their availability to serve as a mediator for a maximum of five mediation organisations.
- These criteria ensure the qualifications and competence of mediators in civil and commercial matters.

In 2023, there are 5 033 notaries, which represents 8,5 notaries per 100 000 inhabitants.

The Notary as existing in Italy belongs to the “Latin (roman) notarial system”. The Latin notary is a public officer and a specialised counselor; his/her expertise must cover estate contracts, loans and mortgages, company law, family law, wills law, the relevant sections of fiscal law. The Latin notary also performs other judicial duties as a judicial auxiliary/assistant. Notaries as public officers are professionals who perform public functions. They are vested by the State with public authority and faith, which allows them to draw authentic deeds (or public deeds). Put differently, a notary can be defined as a public officer to whom the State delegates a specific public power, the power to assert (to affirm) the authenticity of a document. The profession of notary is characterised by the qualities of independence and impartiality.
