Strong and dynamic regional identities are a crucial element both for a region's development and vitality, and for the development of European integration as a whole. Regions with special status exist in several member states of the Council of Europe. Such regions have specific, guaranteed powers (e.g. legislative, administrative, financial) that are more extensive than those held by other regions. They are established with a view to responding to the particular needs of certain territories whether because of their history, geographical position, or culture or linguistic characteristics. or make stronger the territorial integrity of a state by making room for legitimate aspirations in favour of different degrees of autonomy (e.g. preservation of regional identity or economic and administrative advantages) while cementing the principle of national unity within the state.

Experience shows that only dialogue and negotiation, with a shared desire to make progress, can resolve crises between nation states and regions. Granting special status can also allow for smooth integration or reintegration of a region or a territory into the national constitutional framework, sometimes after a major conflict.

Special status autonomy is developed against the background of and taking into consideration three main principles: subsidiarity, territorial cohesion and solidarity.

The Congress adopted a report "Regions and territories with special status in Europe" in 2013, and the Congress Chamber of Regions held a debate on this subject on 16 October 2024.

Following this, a new report will take into account the important developments that have taken place since 2013 and will enlarge the knowledge base concerning the specificities of such regions.
