EXTRACT FROM THE MEETING'S ABRIDGED REPORT

Decisions

The Joint Council on Youth:

(...)

- in relation to the feasibility study for a recommendation on peace education in non-formal education and youth work:
 - took note of the feasibility study carried out by Dr Phil Gittins and endorsed its conclusions;
 - thanked the members of the Advisory Council and other experts for their support and contributions to the study;
 - decided to establish a working group to draft a Committee of Ministers recommendation addressed to governments of member states on peace education in non-formal education and youth work; agreed the group should consist of up to three members of the European Steering Committee for Youth (Jan Vanhee, Marialuisa Silvestrini), three members of the Advisory Council on Youth (Anja Jokić, Margo Vorykhava and Riikka Pasanen), one expert to be appointed by the European Youth Forum and one to be appointed by ERYICA;
 - agreed that the working group should carry out its work within the parameters outlined in the Feasibility Study with any adjustments deemed necessary by the group, notably to reflect the approaches and role of the youth sector in human rights education and peacebuilding and to take into account developments in the field;
 - agreed with the proposed calendar for drafting the recommendation, and to examine the text and its appendices, with a view to its possible adoption, at its 53rd meeting (November 2025);
