SPACE I 2024: Key facts and figures

Background

- The Council of Europe Annual Penal Statistics (SPACE) are compiled every year by the University of Lausanne on behalf of the 46 member states of the Council of Europe-
- The latest SPACE I report depicts the situation of European prisons on 31st January 2024
 - How many prisoners?
 - How many places available in prison?
 - Characteristics of the prisoners : pre-trial vs. sentenced, females, foreigners, length of their sentences, type of offence, etc.
- SPACE I also provides data on the flow of prisoners (entries and releases) and the costs of imprisonment during the whole year 2023





Participation

- Fifty-one (51) prison administrations in the 46 Council of Europe member states answered the SPACE I 2024 questionnaire, which corresponds to a participation rate of 100%.
- This is the first time in the SPACE statistics history.

Map 1. Prison population rates (inmates per 100,000 inhabitants) on 31st January 2024








Figure 1. Prison population rates (inmates per 100,000 inhabitants) on 31st January 2024 (n=51 PA)








Figure 2. Trends in the prison population rates, from 2005 to 2024 (n=48 PA)








Figure 2.1 Trends in the prison population rates by prison administration, from 2005 to 2024








Figure 3: Percentage change in prison population rates (2024 compared to 2023) (n=48 PA)









Figure 4: Evolution of the European average and median rates of admissions and releases per 100,000 inhabitants (2010-2023) (n=34 PA)




















Figure 5. Percentage of female inmates in the prison population on 31st January 2024 (N=48 PA)









Figure 6. Average age of inmates on 31st January 2024 (N=39 PA)







Figures 7 Proportion of age categories on 31st January 2024 (n=39 PA)








Figure 8. Prison density (number of inmates per 100 detention places) on 31st January 2024 (n=50 PA)










Figure 9. Breakdown of sentenced prisoners by principal offence on 31st January 2024, in percentages (n=47 PA)








Figure 10. Percentage of sentenced prisoners serving sentences for drug offences on 31st January 2024 (n=46 PA)








Figure 11. Breakdown of sentenced prisoners by sentence length on 31st January 2024, in percentages (n=47 PA)








Figure 12. Percentage of inmates not serving a final sentence in the prison population on 31^{st} January 2024 (n=47 PA)









Figure 13. Percentage of foreign inmates in the prison population on 31st January 2024 (n=48 PA)

Figure 14. Average length of imprisonment in 2023, based on the stock and flow of inmates (n=49 PA)








Figure 16. Ratio of inmates per one prison staff member on 31st January 2024 (n=49 PA)










Figure 18. Rate of releases from penal institutions, per 100,000 inhabitants, during 2023 (n=48 PA)



Costs of imprisonment in 2020

- ✓ The costs are calculated on the basis of real **expenditures** and not on the foreseen budgets
- ✓ Around 25 billion Euros (46 prison administrations)
- ✓ Daily cost of an inmate = € 81 (44 prison administrations)
- ✓ Huge variations across countries
