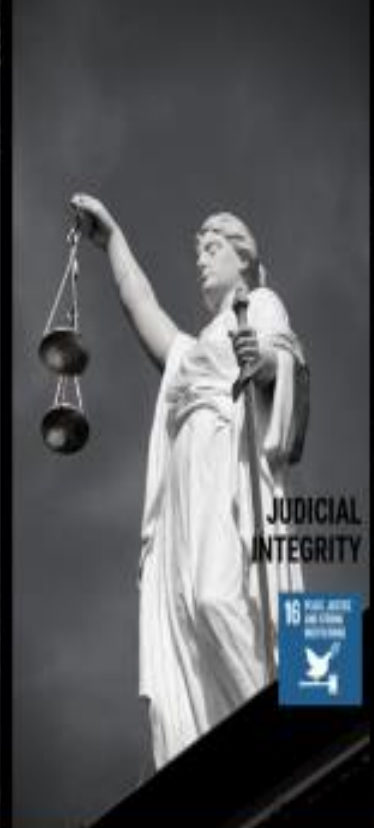


Lawrence Cohen and Mark Felson's (1979) routine activity theory (RAT)

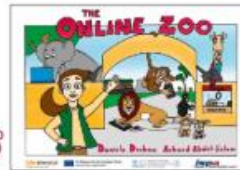

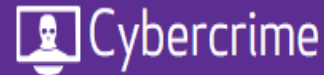
