The present policy advice document was prepared by the Directorate of Democratic Institutions, Directorate General of Democracy and Political Affairs in co-operation with the Working Group of Experts of the CoE Programme to Strengthen Local Democracy in Ukraine, and Prof Gérard Marcou, University Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne, Director of GRALE, France.

Introduction

The creation of modern, democratic and efficient local self-government (LSG) system requires a constant political will and a strategic vision. The Council of Europe's Recommendation (2004) 12 and the 2009 Explanatory Note on how to prepare national work programmes for major LSG reforms would be useful to consider when designing the National Strategy.

The present document is a policy advice prepared as a result of the National Expert Round Table (27 April 2010, Kyiv) on the basis of methodological recommendations of the Council of Europe. It also takes into account the ordinances of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine of 23 September 2009 No. 1134-p, of 29 July 2009 No. 900, of 2 December 2009 No. № 1456-p, the Law of Ukraine "On the State Programme for Reform and Development of the Housing and the Municipal Economy for 2009-2014", and the Presidential Programme of Economic Reforms for 2010-2014, "Prosperous society, competitive economy, efficient state."

The Strategy defines main directions of the LSG and decentralisation reform for the years of 2010 - 2013. Its aim is to define the medium-term vision of the reform to ensure establishment of effective local governance system meeting requirements of the European Charter of Local Self-government. The policy directions defined by the document cover the following areas:

- Institutional Reform of local self-governance;
- Administrative-territorial reform;
- Decentralisation and delegation of powers;
- Fiscal decentralisation;
- State supervision over the work of local self-governing entities;
- Municipal public service reform;
- Incorporation of LSG reform into a larger public administration reform;
- Local infrastructure and communal services;
- Inter-municipal and trans-border cooperation;
- Citizen participation, raising awareness and support for LSG.

It should be noted that in the framework of the CoE-Ukraine Action Plan, and in particular, of the CoE Programme to Strengthen Local Democracy in Ukraine (2010-2012), the CoE assistance, policy advice, and legal expertise is available on every piece of legislation that needs to be drafted or revised.

NATIONAL STRATEGY (ROADMAP) OF DECENTRALISATION AND LOCAL SELF- GOVERNMENT REFORM IN UKRAINE

PRIORITY 1

Strengthen local and regional democracy

Lead authorities: Ministry of Regional Development and Construction of Ukraine, Council of Regions under the President of Ukraine, State Foundation for Local Self-Government in Ukraine

Priority 2

Provide resources adequate to the level of responsibilities performed by local authorities at every level (hromada, rayon, oblast) Lead authorities: Ministry of Finance of Ukraine, Ministry of Regional Development and Construction of Ukraine, Committee on Economic reforms under the President of Ukraine.

PRIORITY 3

Upgrade (improve) territorial organisation of Ukraine on the basis of three tiers of local government Lead authorities: Ministry of Regional Development and Construction of Ukraine, Council of Regions under the President of Ukraine

PRIORITY 4

Improve the capacity of the local government institutions and administration

Lead authorities: Ministry of Regional Development and Construction of Ukraine, Ministry of Housing and Municipal Economy of Ukraine, State Foundation for Local Self-Government in Ukraine
