MEETING REPORT

Secretariat Memorandum prepared by the Directorate of Democratic Participation Culture, Nature and Heritage Department

1. Opening of the meeting by the Chair

The meeting was opened by the Chair, Ms Giuliana De Francesco (Italy), who welcomed participants to the 9th plenary session of the CDCPP (see Appendix I).

The Committee thanked the Chair for her opening statement and the Director of Democratic Participation, Mr Matjaž Gruden, for his welcoming words, stressing the timely and ambitious agenda of the CDCPP. He noted the impetus given to cultural work in times of crisis and the importance of the Committee's specific contribution to the Council of Europe's work on Freedom of Expression, Artificial Intelligence and the relevance of the Committee's work for the UN's Agenda 2030 and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

2. Adoption of the agenda

The Committee adopted the agenda, as it appears in Appendix II.

3. Thematic session (Parts 1, 2 and 3)

- welcomed the organisation of the three thematic sessions ("The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic", "AI and culture, creativity and cultural heritage" and "Climate change and sustainable development") organised on the occasion of the November plenary session, and engaged in questions and debates including on how Council of Europe activities and tools can help to address the challenges examined;
- **thanked** Mr Kern for his presentation on the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the Cultural and Creative Sector (CCS) (thematic session 1);
- **thanked** Mr Meneceur for his presentation of the CoE's work on Al, Mr Stocker for his presentation on "Al and culture, creativity and cultural heritage" and Ms Traviglia for her presentation on Al use in cultural heritage and archaeology (thematic session 2);
- **thanked** Mr Potts for this presentation on "Climate change and sustainable development", as well as the Secretariat for presentations of ongoing Council of Europe work on sustainable development and climate change (thematic session 3);
- welcomed statements on culture as a first necessity investment because of its multidimensional impact in addressing global crises and the need to upgrade and mainstream it into debates on priority action in Europe;
- **regretted** that analyses of the impact of measures by governments taken to address the pandemic were still scarce;
- **suggested** follow-up activities of transversal interest to the Committee and directly useful for policy makers, thus adding value to the CDCPP's work, including
 - the preparation of a CoE CM/Recommendation to member States on the essential role and impact of culture, creativity and creative industries, cultural heritage and landscape in addressing global crises (democracy, economic, health, climate, social) with *either* special consideration of the impact of AI in these areas and, conversely, the impact human beings through culture and creativity can have on AI developments, *or* the preparation of a CM/Recommendation to member States on AI and culture, arts, science and creativity and implications for the sectors covered by the CDCPP, with a clear message that only humans can and must take responsibility for technology and that arts and culture can serve as a method here rather than a sector;
 - the promotion of training for public officials in policy sectors other than culture on the economic and social value of CCS and how to make the most of local resources, as well as;
 - a dedicated CoE CM/Recommendation on the importance of cultural heritage education as part of education for democratic citizenship and human rights in the digital era;
 - the holding of a working session in 2021 on the exchange of best practices relating to Al in archaeology, considering the Council of Europe Convention for the Protection of the Archaeological Heritage of Europe (revised, Valletta, 1992);

- recognised the contribution of CoE tools and strategies to address the climate emergency and working towards the SDG goals, as a means of necessary transformative change, and specifically the Faro Convention and European Landscape Convention, as well as Strategy 21, the HEREIN participative survey on Heritage and Climate actions, the European Heritage Days and the Enlarged Partial Agreement on Cultural Routes and suggested their full use for climate action;
- **welcomed** the progress made with the compilation of the *CDCPP reader on Culture in times of COVID-19*, as presented by the Secretariat and **invited** delegates who have not yet done so, to provide short contributions to it.

4. Fields of activities of the CDCPP

4.1 Contribution to the 70th anniversary of the European Convention on Human Rights

The Committee:

- **launched** the Manifesto on the Freedom of Expression of Arts and Culture and in the Digital Era and the concept of a digital #exhibition "Free to Create Create to be Free" by the Council of Europe, as contributions to the 70th anniversary of the European Convention on Human Rights and **thanked** the Chair of the CDCPP for her launch speech;
- strongly **encouraged** member States and other stakeholders to support and widely disseminate the Manifesto and contribute actively to the implementation of the digital #exhibition by providing, in digital format, works of art from member States that promote the freedom of expression and by providing voluntary contributions for the realisation of the project;
- **thanked** the German Authorities for the announcement of a voluntary contribution of €10 000 towards the realisation of the digital #exhibition "Free to Create Create to be Free";
- noted the reservation of the Russian Federation as regards the Manifesto text, given that their suggested amendment could not be included in the text that had been finalised following two rounds of written consultations with all delegations, up to 2 October.

4.2

Progress report on the Association of the Compendium of Cultural Policies and Trends - Interim Report, 19 October 2020

The Committee:

- welcomed the developments regarding the Association of the Compendium of Cultural Policies and Trends, and specifically the Covid-19 section featuring country reports on measures taken by Governments and other stakeholders in the cultural sector (<u>https://www.culturalpolicies.net/covid-19/</u>) and the section about online cultural initiatives (<u>https://www.culturalpolicies.net/covid-19/online-initiatives/</u>) in different sectors;
- thanked the Compendium service provider, Ms Janina Pigaht, for her intervention;
- **encouraged** member States and interested cultural policy research institutions to become Stakeholder members of the Compendium Association.

Cultural Policy Peer Reviews – North Macedonia

- noted the forthcoming online cultural policy peer review of North Macedonia, in the framework
 of the Council of Europe's programme of policy reviews and legal assistance to member States
 in the fields of culture and heritage;
- **invited notification** to the Committee and Secretariat of any interest in undertaking similar reviews in individual countries.

4.3 Cultural Heritage

Council of Europe Convention on Offences relating to Cultural Property (Nicosia Convention)

The Committee:

- encouraged member States to sign and ratify the Nicosia Convention;
- **decided** to work towards wide distribution of the promotional film on the Nicosia Convention geared at a broad public, including policy makers and civil society;
- **invited** member States to promote the Nicosia Convention as an open instrument at relevant European and international events.

Recommendation CM/Rec(2020)7 of the Committee of Ministers to member States on promoting the continuous prevention of risks in the day-to-day management of cultural heritage: cooperation with States, specialists and citizens

The Committee:

- welcomed the launch of Recommendation CM/Rec(2020)7 of the Committee of Ministers to member States on promoting the continuous prevention of risks in the day-to-day management of cultural heritage: co-operation with States, specialists and citizens;
- **expressed its will to engage** with the practical implementation of the recommendations made in the text;
- **expressed its readiness to help ensure** wide dissemination of the text at national level with all groups involved in the continuous prevention of risks in the management of cultural heritage.

European Heritage Days

The Committee:

- **welcomed** the progress made in the implementation of the 2020 European Heritage Days Programme;
- **congratulated** the network of EHD National Coordinators for the successful organisation of tens of thousands of European Heritage Days events, under the difficult circumstances of 2020;
- **encouraged** member States to participate in the 2021 European Heritage Days pan-continental theme of "Inclusive Heritage".

Strategy 21

The Committee:

- **welcomed** the progress made on the follow-up to Strategy 21 and invited member States to promote it at national level, provide/collect good practices/initiatives and help their promotion at national level, and report on the implementation of the Strategy;
- expressed its interest in the full use of Strategy 21 in working towards the SDG Goals;
- **expressed its interest in translating** the promotional material into national languages and disseminating it at regional and local levels, thus widening the ST21 network;
- expressed its interest in contributing to the organisation of promotional events at national level.

The Faro Convention on the Value of Cultural Heritage for Society

- welcomed the progress made on the implementation of the Faro Convention Action Plan and the Joint Project with the EU "The Faro Way", including the production of innovative digital promotional tools and exchanged and advised on the activities foreseen in 2020 and beyond;
- encouraged member States that have not yet done so, to sign and ratify the Faro Convention;
- supported the Faro inspired initiatives at local, regional and national levels and expressed its interest in engaging with the organisation of promotional events at local, regional and national levels;
- **expressed its interest in translating** the promotional material (namely the new Faro Brochure) into national languages.

Herein Network

The Committee:

- welcomed the progress made in the implementation of HEREIN activities and initiatives;
- **acknowledged** the contribution of the HEREIN Network to the ongoing work on cultural heritage and sustainable development;
- **expressed its interest in engaging** with the HEREIN information system and consolidating the project, including through voluntary contributions;
- **thanked** the French Authorities for the voluntary contribution to the HEREIN system, as well as the HEREIN AISBL for their steady support of HEREIN works, namely with the recent publication of the HEREIN survey on protection signage.

4.4 European Landscape Convention

National policies and international co-operation for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention

The Committee:

- **invited** States, which so wish, to consider the possibility to sign or ratify the <u>European</u> <u>Landscape Convention;</u>
- took note of the preparation of the 11th Council of Europe Conference on the implementation of the European Landscape Convention, which will be held under the auspices of the Hungarian Chairmanship of the Committee of Ministers, at the Palais de l'Europe, Strasbourg, <u>26-27 May</u> <u>2021</u>.

Council of Europe Meetings of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention

The Committee:

- took note of the publication of the proceedings of the <u>21st Council of Europe Meeting of the</u> <u>Workshops</u> for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention on "Landscape and education", Tropea, Italy, 3-4 October 2018, and <u>22nd Council of Europe Meeting of the</u> <u>Workshops</u> for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention on "<u>Water,</u> <u>landscape and citizenship in the face of global change</u>", Seville, Spain, 14-16 March 2019;
- took note with interest of the adoption of the Lausanne Declaration on "Landscape integration in sectoral policies", symbolically adopted on 20 October 2020 by the representatives of the States Parties to the European Landscape Convention invited to participate in the <u>23rd Council</u> of Europe Meeting of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention on *"Landscape integration in sectoral policies"*, Lausanne, Switzerland, following a written consultation procedure (Appendix III to this Report);
- **took note** of the preparation of the 25th Council of Europe Meeting of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention *"Landscape Strategies, Action plans and Policy documents for landscape quality"*, Mallorca, Spain, 6-8 October 2021.

Council of Europe National Symposiums on the implementation of the European Landscape Convention

The Committee:

 took note of the publication of the <u>National Days</u> on the implementation of the European Landscape Convention in France: "<u>Landscapes from here and elsewhere: cross-views on some</u> <u>landscape approaches at different scales, on both sides of the border</u>", Council of Europe, Strasbourg and Northern Vosges, 26-27 November 2019, organised by the Council of Europe and the Ministry of Ecological and Solidary Transition of France;

- **took note** of the preparation of the National Symposium on the implementation of the European Landscape Convention in Greece, Larissa, Greece, organised by the Council of Europe and the Ministry of the Environment and Energy of Greece, 2021;
- **took note** of the preparation of the National/Regional Symposium on the implementation of the European Landscape Convention in Budapest, Hungary, organised by the Council of Europe and the Ministry of Agriculture of Hungary, 20 October 2021.

International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe

The Committee:

- took note of the celebration of the <u>Fourth International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe</u> on 20 October 2020. The "Message from Lausanne", on the theme of the 23rd Council of Europe Meeting of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention on "Landscape integration in sectoral policies" (initially planned in Lausanne, Switzerland, 19-20 October 2020), the actors of the territory to "integrate landscape into … regional and town planning policies and in … cultural, environmental, agricultural, social and economic policies, as well as in any other policies with possible direct or indirect impact on landscape" (Article 5 d. of the European Landscape Convention);
- took note of the preparation of the Fifth International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe will be celebrated on 20 October 2021. The "Message from Mallorca", on the theme of the 25th Council of Europe Meeting of Workshops for the implementation of the European Convention on the landscape on "Landscape Strategies, Action plans and Policy documents for landscape quality" (Mallorca, Spain, 6-8 October 2021), will invite the actors of the territory to "establish and implement landscape policies aimed at landscape protection, management and planning." (Article 5 b. of the European Landscape Convention).

Information System of the European Landscape Convention: National (and Regional) Landscape Policies

The Committee:

- welcomed the major advances made by the States Parties to the European Landscape Convention, in favour of the implementation of landscape policies at regional, local and local level;
- took note of the National and Regional Reports, appearing in the <u>Information System of the European Landscape Convention</u>, on the website of the <u>European Landscape Convention</u> presented by: Andorra; Belgium (Brussels Capital, Wallonia); Bosnia and Herzegovina (Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina); Croatia; Estonia; Finland; France; Georgia; Greece; Hungary; Lithuania; Luxembourg; Montenegro; Norway; Poland; Portugal; Romania; Serbia; Slovenia; Spain (and one Region); Sweden; Turkey;
- invited the National Representatives of the States Parties to the European Landscape Convention to complete, or update, the Council of Europe Information System on the European Landscape Convention by 15 December 2020, in accordance with Recommendation <u>CM/Rec(2013)4</u> of the Committee of Ministers to Member States;
- invited the Representatives of States who so wish to translate the <u>Glossary of the Information</u> <u>System of the Council of Europe Landscape Convention</u> (Council of Europe, <u>European Spatial</u> <u>Planning and Landscape</u>, 2018, No. 106) into languages of their choice.

Information Platform of the European Landscape Convention

The Committee:

 took note with interest of the establishment of the <u>Information Platform of the European</u> <u>Landscape Convention</u>, intended to present: the main themes of the Convention; the synthesis reports on national and regional policies for the implementation of the Convention; the work carried out for its implementation.

Sessions of the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe

6th Session of the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe (2018-2019)

The Committee:

- **took note** of the preparation of the 24th Council of Europe Meeting of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention "Council of Europe Landscape Award Forum of National Selections 6th Session 2018-2019", Geneva, Switzerland, 11-12 June 2021, organised by the Council of Europe, in co-operation with the Swiss Federal Office for the Environment (FOEN), in the framework of the Work Programme of the European Landscape Convention;
- took note of the Celebration of the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe, which will be
 organised on this occasion, considering the <u>Decisions</u> of the Committee of Ministers adopted
 on 16 October 2019, on the Award, Special Mentions and Recognitions, in accordance with
 Resolution CM/Res(2008)3 on the rules governing the Landscape Award of the Council of
 Europe

7th Session of the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe (2020-2021)

The Committee:

took note of the invitation addressed to the Parties to the Convention (e-mail of 8 October 2019 addressed to the Permanent Representations with a copy to the Members of the CDCPP and National Representatives for the implementation of the Convention; reminder sent on 21 April 2020) to submit, by 30 January 2021, applications to the Secretariat of the Council of Europe, according to Resolution CM/Res(2008)3 on the rules governing the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe.

Landscape Award Alliance of the Council of Europe

The Committee:

 took note of the following activities carried out on the Council of Europe Landscape Award Alliance, for the 6th Session of the Landscape Award 2008-2019: <u>Online presentation</u>; <u>Exhibition</u>; Publication <u>"Landscape Award Alliance of the Council of Europe"</u>, volume 2, 2018-2019, Council of Europe, Territory and Landscape Series", <u>Territory and Landscape Series</u>, 2020, No. 120.

Thematic Reports and draft recommendations of the Committee of Ministers on natural, rural, urban and peri-urban areas, considered outstanding as well as every-day or degraded landscapes (inland water and marine areas are taken into consideration)

The Committee:

- **noted** further work with a view to preparing draft recommendations for the attention of the CDCPP and the Committee of Ministers.

The Committee:

 took note of the preparation of the reports on the themes mentioned in the Work Programme, with a view to presenting them at the 11th Council of Europe Conference on the Landscape Convention (Strasbourg, 26-27 May 2021).

Promoting synergies on the themes of sustainable development (environment, society, economy and culture), democracy, human rights and rule of law

The Committee:

supported the work to promote synergies on the themes of sustainable development (environment, society, economy and culture), democracy, human rights and the rule of law, in the framework of the Work Programme of the European Landscape Convention.

Contribution to the global debates on sustainable development (United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development) and habitat

The Committee:

- took note of the continuation of the work to contribute to the global debates on sustainable development (United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development) and habitat, in the framework of the Work Programme of the European Landscape Convention;
- **took note** of the contribution of the Council of Europe Landscape Convention to the United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, with regard in particular to the implementation of the Goals 3 (Good health and well-being), 11 (Sustainable cities and communities) and 15 (Life on land).

5. Information concerning other Council of Europe activities in the fields of culture, heritage and landscape

The Committee **welcomed**:

- and expressed its interest in the works of the PACE and possible future co-operation on the Manifesto on the Freedom of Expression of Arts and Culture in the Digital Era and the Digital #exhibition "Free to Create Create to be Free".

6. Co-operation with the European Union and other international bodies and with civil society and professional associations

The Committee:

- thanked the representative of the European Commission for her statement and welcomed the fruitful co-operation with the European Union and the success of Joint Programmes and Projects in the cultural heritage sector, including the EHDs, Routes4you, The Faro Way. The Committee expressed its interest in intensifying co-operation, also in view of new activities of shared interest by the EU and the CoE;
- **welcomed** the co-operation with civil society and professional associations in the sectors covered by the CDCPP and the tangible contribution to select projects.

7. Working methods of the CDCPP and future work in 2021

- **took note** of the information provided on ongoing activities related to the Committee's working methods and **supported** the Secretariat in dealing with reporting requirements;
- **welcomed** the information provided by the Chair on her recent reply to the survey by the Secretary General of the Council of Europe to Chairs of the Steering Committees;
- **noted** the current revision of Resolution CM/Res(2011)24 on intergovernmental committees and subordinate bodies, their terms of reference and working methods;
- **expressed** its satisfaction with the thematic sessions held at the November plenary session and **suggested** holding similar thematic sessions at future Committee meetings.

8. Dates of the next meetings

The Committee:

- **decided** to hold its next meeting in June or November 2021, pending circumstances as physical or online meetings, with the possibility of holding a 1-day online meeting in June, followed by a face-to-face meeting in November.

9. Any other business

There was no other business.

10. Partial close of the meeting

The Chair **thanked** all participants for their contributions to an inspiring and fruitful plenary meeting. She offered a farewell speech underlining the importance of the work achieved and planned by the CDCPP and of the excellent cooperation with the Secretariat. She then **closed** the session for all those participants not eligible to take part in the election process.

LAUSANNE DECLARATION

"Landscape integration in sectoral policies"

Symbolically adopted on 20 October 2020,

date of the Celebration of the 20th anniversary of the European Landscape Convention and the <u>4th International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe</u>,

by the representatives of the States Parties to the European Landscape Convention invited to participate in the 23rd Council of Europe Meeting of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention on "The integration of the landscape into sectoral policies", Lausanne, Switzerland, 19-20 October 2020, following a written consultation procedure.

Due to the pandemic and health regulations at this time, the meeting could not be held as planned and the contributions prepared for the Meeting will be the subject of a <u>thematic publication by the Council of Europe</u>.

Considering that the aim of the Council of Europe is to achieve greater unity between its members for the purpose of safeguarding and realising the ideals and principles which are their common heritage;

Having regard to:

 - the European Landscape Convention, adopted by the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe on 19 July 2000 and opened to Member States for signature in Florence on 20 October 2000 [ETS No. 176];

 the Recommendation of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe of 6 February 2008 on the guidelines for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention, and in particular its Appendix 2 – Suggested text for the practical implementation of the European Landscape Convention at national level [CM/Rec(2008)3];

 the Recommendation of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe of 27 September 2017 on the contribution of the European Landscape Convention to the exercise of human rights and democracy with a view to sustainable development [CM/Rec(2017)7];

- the Recommendation of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe of 14 November 2018 on the creation of public funds for landscape [CM/Rec(2018)9];

 the Recommendation of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe of 16 October 2019 on Landscape integration in policies relating to rural territories in agricultural and forestry, energy and demographic transition [CM/Rec(2019)7]; - the Recommendation of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe of 16 October 2019 on Landscape and democracy: public participation [CM/Rec(2019)8];

Reaffirming that the landscape:

 has an important public interest role in the cultural, ecological, environmental and social fields, and constitutes a resource favourable to economic activity whose protection, management and planning can contribute to job creation;

- is an important part of the quality of life for people everywhere: both in urban areas and in the countryside, in degraded areas and in areas of high quality, in areas recognised as being of outstanding beauty and in everyday areas;

- contributes to the formation of local cultures and that it is a basic component of the natural and cultural heritage, contributing to human well-being;

- is a key element of individual and social well-being and that its protection, management and planning entail rights and responsibilities for everyone;

Considering:

- the powerful symbolic significance of the landscape, which feeds on the sources of the social imagination;

- its structural role as a lever for sustainable development based on a harmonious balance between the environmental, social, cultural, and economic dimensions;

- the importance of the landscape with regard to the challenges of health, food and energy, as well as addressing the challenges resulting from climate change, the disappearance of living species, pollution of the water and air, degradation of agricultural and forest soils, and artificialisation of land;

Noting that the pandemic period has only reinforced this social demand for landscape;

The participants urge the Parties to the European Landscape Convention, and other States which so wish:

- 1. To systematically integrate the landscape dimension into policies which may have a direct or indirect impact on the quality of the landscape, in accordance with the provisions of the Convention;
- 2. To ensure thus that the policies of spatial and town planning, policies concerning infrastructure, water management, energy, the economy and employment, as well as environmental, agricultural, social, health, cultural and tourism policies, take into consideration the values and functions of the landscape;
- 3. To consider that integration concerns both the administrative bodies and departments on the same level (horizontal integration) and those belonging to different levels (vertical integration), in accordance with the provisions of the Recommendation <u>No R (2008) 3</u>.

The participants express the wish that, on the occasion of the <u>4th International Landscape Day of the</u> <u>Council of Europe</u>, the Lausanne Declaration on *"The integration of landscape in sectoral policies"* be brought to the attention of the stakeholders of the landscape, as a contribution to the implementation of the United Nations General Assembly's 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
