

PRESENTATION TO THE OING CONFERENCE
AXIS 1 OF THE "SPORT AND HUMAN RIGHTS" COMMITTEE'S MANDATE

Axis 1: fight against all forms of hate speech and rejection (racism, homophobia, intersectionality of discrimination) and against all attacks on the ethical practice of sport (doping, violence, corruption).

Education and training will be the priority levers used in the two areas described above.

Several foundations will help us move in the right direction:

- The Sport Division, with its European Sport Charter, and the EPAS.
- Of course, the Committee will pay particular attention to cross-disciplinary work with other committees, and will promote this collaboration.
- The legacy of the Olympic Games 2024 in Paris, with the Olympic movement in support. A major political and media window will be opened. The Committee must have a watchful eye on all this.

OBJECTIVES :

1. To propose and create useful resources for training and raising awareness of hate speech from an early age (theoretical part).

Important: resources already identified or produced by the Council of Europe need to be better disseminated, according to needs or differences. A major challenge lies in training and identifying what already exists, before duplicating efforts.

- a. Publication of a guide entitled "Tous supporters, supporters de tous" ("All supporters, supporters of all").
- b. Create a handbook of best practices and disseminate existing ones.
- c. Design and identify innovative educational tools for training and raising awareness around the practice of sport.

2. Give a voice to the people concerned to establish a diagnosis of needs, and draw out the best learning outcomes (practical part).

- d. Identification and networking of competent players
- e. Organize innovative training/debate days to gather opinions and proposals from the public concerned.
- f. Support and organization of local projects to promote the Council of Europe's approach and bodies at grassroots level.
 - i. European Day of Sport and Disability
 - ii. Round tables
 - iii. Debate workshop
 - iv. European Anti-SGBV Week or Day

3. Contribute to a recognized, harmonized and stricter application of the rules in force concerning discrimination and doping, as well as the democratization of reporting tools and platforms (legislative part).

With the help of the Council of Europe's legal tools and bodies, draw up a diagnosis of current sports federation regulations, proposing an overhaul where necessary. A section **on financing** large-scale awareness-raising/training campaigns could be an interesting avenue to explore.
