



LEGAL CERTAINTY AND TRUST IN AI: THE ROLE OF PARLIAMENTARIANS IN AI GOVERNANCE

Rapid advancements in artificial intelligence (AI) may provide significant opportunities and challenges for humanity, with impacts, including on human rights, experienced differently between nations. However, a potential impact of AI is currently outpacing efforts by parliamentarians and the policy community to better understand and regulate a fast-changing and growing technological sector with a multitude of global implications.

This high-level session will highlight the need for increased international multi-stakeholder cooperation, collaboration, and exchange of information and experiences to ensure a united worldwide effort to maximize the benefits of AI, while mitigating risks to humanity, including through initiatives designed to reduce disparities in technological development between nations.

The event will explore the critical role of legal frameworks in fostering trustworthy AI governance, with a particular focus on the Council of Europe's **Framework Convention on AI, Human Rights, Democracy, and the Rule of Law** and the Risk and Impact Assessment of AI systems from the point of view of human rights, democracy and the rule of law (**HUDERIA Guidance**) adopted by the CAI in November 2024.
