Please summarise how the new committee contribute to and advance the priorities and influence of CINGO and Civil Society within the Council of Europe (CoE)? (no more than 200 words) The rights, needs and contributions to society of children and adolescents – particularly those who are most marginalised by poverty, discrimination and other structural disadvantage - need to thread through all the work of CINGO. Access to services, opportunities and civil society participation should be for all ages. Our youngest community members most often have the least power and access to being heard within political and civil society structures. We need to be their advocates. The proposed CINGO committee builds on the first three years of a children's rights mandate, extends the ambition of that committee, focuses more on cross-committee and cross-thematic working (for instance, children in relation to migration; technology/AI; sport; environment; gender; social cohesion) and consolidates the progress made in influencing CoE bodies.

The Council of Europe strategy for children and young people's rights (through CDENF, CJ/ENF, the Lanzarote Committee and a new Consultation Group on the Children of Ukraine) has wide ambitions that can only be realised with strong, multi-nation contribution from civil society. CINGO needs to complement the work of individual NGO Experts within these Committees with collective

contribution via this participant CINGO committee.

Finally, having a children and adolescent rights committee is a strong signal within CoE and externally that CINGO is oriented towards creating a better, more just and inclusively democratic Europe for the next generation as well as for this.

#### Cross cutting themes/ways of working

Throughout this workplan, the CINGO committee on the rights of the child will adopt principles and ways of working that include:

- Seeking the direct involvement or input of children, young people and/or young adults with recent relevant experiences within our work wherever this is possible and relevant (e.g. through choice of contributors to events or presentations, voice of young people in consultations)
- Focusing on the specific contribution of civil society and its importance in partnership or liaison with statutory and political bodies
- Ensuring the work of the committee focuses on influence, relevant challenge and impact within the Council of Europe (CoE) (particularly but limited to CDENF), but also proposes action where CoE political and formal bodies' priorities have gaps or insufficiency.
- Ensuring the rights, freedoms and voices of children and young people are promoted through liaison with other CINGO committees and relevant other parts of CoE, working in a transversal and collaborative manner.
- Focusing on tangible actions that can make a real difference to children and young people.
