CHILDREN IN SITUATIONS OF VULNERABILITY: EVALUATIONS, PROBLEMS AND PROPOSED SOLUTIONS

Piatra Neamț, Romania, 23 May 2024

CONCEPT

Recent global developments have exacerbated the vulnerable situation of marginalised communities both at European and international levels. Challenges linked to war, the consequences of Covid-19 pandemic, the effect of labour migration on children, poverty and discrimination accentuate the situation and require for complex issues to be addressed on systemic levels.

The Council of Europe Strategy for the Rights of the Child (2022-2027), the EU Strategy on the Rights of the Child, as well as the National Strategy for the Protection and Promotion of Children's Rights "Protected Children, Safe Romania" 2023-2027 (HG 969/ 2023) are the three benchmarks in approaching the theme of this event.

With particular focus on marginalised and vulnerable communities such as the Roma, the <u>Strategic Action</u> <u>Plan of the Council of Europe for Roma and Traveller Inclusion 2020-2025</u> addresses the disadvantaged situation of Roma by focusing on three main priority areas: promoting and protecting the human rights of Roma and Travellers, combating antigypsyism and discrimination, and fostering inclusion in society.

To address the issue of violence against children, in 2023, the Council of Europe adopted a **Recommendation** on strengthening reporting systems on violence against children <u>CM/Rec(2023)8</u>. It includes guidance for member States in developing, strengthening and monitoring effective national systems for professionals and volunteers for reporting all forms of violence against children, as essential elements of national strategies address these issues alongside integrated and multidisciplinary child protection systems. Moreover, the recently adopted **Recommendation CM/Rec(2024)1 of the Committee of Ministers to** *member States on equality of Roma and Traveller women and girls* mentions the fact that the vulnerability of Roma women and girls puts them at greater risk of other forms of violence, including human trafficking and domestic, sexual and other forms of violence and that Member States should work on their prevention while establishing victim protection services and designing, funding and implementing, with the involvement of women and girls, public awareness campaigns and relevant training programmes.

Inadequate housing and conditions in which children live, do homework or play, as well as the lack of resources for proper nutrition are aspects of poverty that need to be addressed at local and national level. Education, access to social assistance or health services are essential for overcoming situations of vulnerability. In addition, there is a need to address new issues arising from substance abuse, human trafficking or cyberbullying that require adequate knowledge, skills and resources. With the raise of labour migration, the children left behind by parents going abroad for work are particularly at risk of being affected by these phenomena, in the context of poor / inadequate support structures and protection services. In this regard, the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe (PACE) has recognized in its **Recommendation 2196 (2021) on Impact of labour**











migration on "left-behind" children that the impact of labour migration is often underestimated, and that left-behind children are a particularly vulnerable group that is largely invisible and not given sufficient attention.

The event "Children in situations of vulnerability: evaluations, problems and proposed solutions" is the framework within which the authorities and relevant institutions / organisations from the national level in Romania can present the current situation and expertise from the field, based on direct evaluations, identified problems and solutions. The multiple facets of children's vulnerabilities make it necessary to collaborate and share knowledge, approaches and identify the most appropriate measures while bringing forward proposals to improve existing policies and practices in the field.

CONTEXT

The ROMACT Programme aimed at strengthening political will and understanding of Roma inclusion at local and regional level was developed based on existing European and national policy frameworks for Roma inclusion. It has been implemented by the Council of Europe and the European Commission since 2013.

The Programme acknowledges that local and national measures are crucial for bringing improvements in Roma communities in key areas such as education, social assistance, housing, employment, and health.

ROMACT methodology emphasizes the involvement of individuals from marginalised communities in developing solutions and projects that target them and aligns with European social inclusion policies supporting also the implementation of the National Roma Integration Strategy at local level.
