"Is the current health crisis, with its heavy toll in human lives and the transformation of society, likely to destroy civil liberties? What actions for INGOs?"

## Introduction

The potential **weakening of civil liberties** as a result of the current health crisis leads to rich discussions during the webinar organised in June by the Education and Culture Committee.

This theme was widely supported by nearly 100 INGOs who wanted the <u>October 2020 session</u> to focus on it. The Secretary General of the Council of Europe had alerted the 47 member states to the risks to human rights, democracy and the rule of law, in April: "The virus is destroying many lives and much more of what is very dear to us. We should not let it destroy our core values and free societies."

Civil society wishes to pay particular attention to the preservation of rights and freedoms in the context of the health crisis.
