Georgia

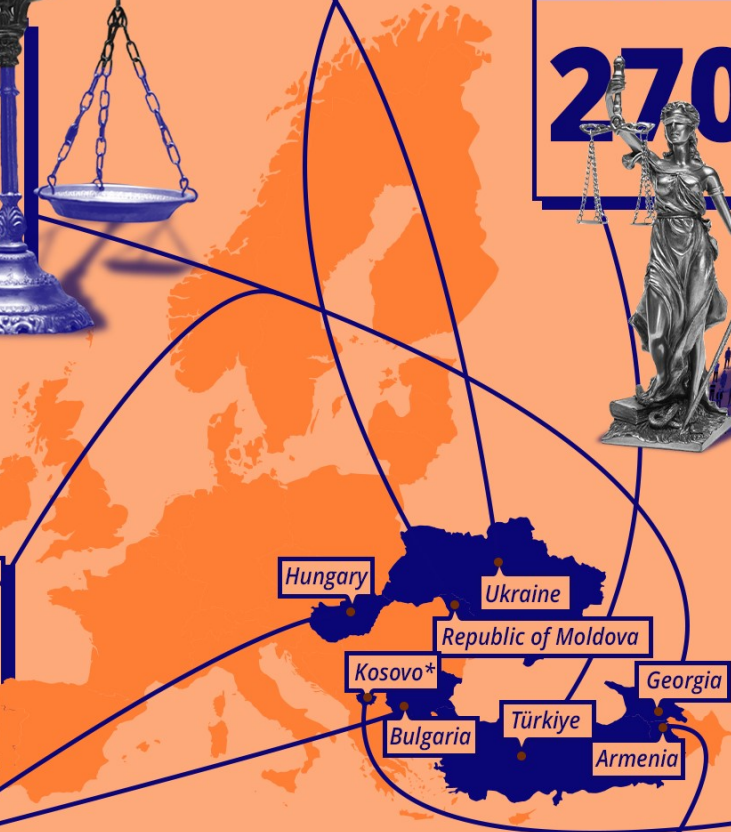
+68% in prosecutions of sexual violence cases in 2021-2022
