Spanish regulation on Landscape - I

- The Spanish Constitution (1978) refers to it from different approaches

Cultural policy:

• Law 16/1985, of 25 June on Spanish historical heritage: provides specifically for historic sites and historic gardens

Urban policy:

• Royal decree 7/2015, of 30 October, (Unifying Law on floor and urban rehabilitation); provides for environment, natural landscape, urban landscape and cultural heritage
