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




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« It's all happening »



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Typical concerns



- Politics in school: Allowed? How?
- Parents' reactions
- Limited time
- Respect differences
- Dealing with emotions
- Awareness, factual knowledge
- Competencies
- Misconceptions





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Role of schools

- It is about children
- Quality education is not just teaching the curriculum
- Risks of creating taboos and spread of fake news
- Teachers' opinion matters
- School models the wider community
- Best chance to address children
- Varies based on age groups: from providing emotional safety to sharing information
- Teaching solidarity and representing values





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Remember

- Difficult is OK. ۲
- Turns into an opportunity.
- Worst scenario: do nothing.
- You teach with your personality.

Bear in mind

Why is it difficult for you? What would you need to be more comfortable and confident? How can it affect children? Why did they behave like this? What do I want to teach them at this moment? How can I teach it best?





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Opportunities and approaches to engage

- Ask and listen
- Inform
- Think about nonverbal techniques (music, play, art, body, etc.)
- Promote volunteering and child participation
- Promote peer support
- Talk about how it affects the school directly
- Stop bullying
- Discuss prejudices
- Discuss mental health
- Support media literacy and help recognizing fake news
- Role of religion and other supportive communities or tools
- Rituals
- Every member of the school community is competent, not just teachers
