

Youth4Culture Project: Encouraging active youth participation in European cultural heritage promotion

• Partners: Charles V Cultural Route, The Ceramics Route, The Jewish Heritage Route and The Olive Tree Route, all of which are cultural itineraries of the Council of Europe.

The YOUTH4CULTURE project aimed to explore new strategies and working methods to encourage the civic participation of young people in the promotion and valorization of European cultural heritage as a sustainable resource for entrepreneurship and sustainable development.

In this field, the project launched several activities to promote the exchange of good practices, the generation of ideas, the training of skills and working methods of young workers and their professional development to enable them to define new initiatives related to youth participation, the promotion of European cultural heritage and the social inclusion of young people.





Youth4Culture Project: Encouraging active youth participation in European cultural heritage promotion



The project partners have worked on:

- Improving the working methods of youth workers to promote the civic participation of young people and the revaluation of European Cultural Heritage;
- Updating the professional competences of youth workers who support youth entrepreneurship in cultural enterprises;
- Explore best practices to adapt them to different European contexts in relation to civic engagement, cultural promotion and youth;
- Improve the efficiency and impact of European Cultural Routes.

Education as the Key for Youth Development in Tourism

in 2018, youth travel (including travellers between the ages of 15 and 29) represented 23% of international tourist arrivals and generated USD 333 billion in tourism receipts (WYSE).

Tourism is a major global employer: **prior to the pandemic, an estimated 1 in 10 jobs** worldwide was directly or indirectly related to tourism.

If offered an opportunity, adequate education, and support, youth may feel empowered to actively engage in the decision-making processes and participate in shaping the future of tourism.





ABOUT GYTS



EUROPEAN HERITAGE VOLUNTEERS



TRAINING COURSES AND VOLUNTEERING PROJECTS



European Heritage Training Courses and European Heritage Volunteers Projects are formats of non-formal heritage education and voluntary engagement for cultural heritage. They allow emerging heritage professionals from around the world to engage in the rescue, conservation, restoration, or revitalisation of significant heritage sites at international, national, or regional levels while simultaneously expanding their theoretical knowledge and practical skills.

What We Do:

- **Practical Conservation:** Participants engage in activities such as documentation, conservation, restoration, and maintenance of heritage sites, using traditional techniques and materials.
- **Educational Component:** The courses and projects offer in-depth theoretical knowledge, including lectures and site visits, covering the historical, cultural, and technical aspects of heritage conservation.
- **Cultural Exchange:** The interdisciplinary and international nature of the training courses and volunteering projects fosters dialogue and exchange between participants from diverse countries and cultural backgrounds.
- Community Involvement: Local communities benefit from the revitalisation
 of their heritage and gain the opportunity to engage in cultural exchange,
 strengthening their connection to their own cultural identity while building
 relationships with international participants

THE IMPACTS AND BENEFITS OF THE PROGRAMME



European Heritage Training Courses and European Heritage Volunteers Projects aim to bridge theory and practice in heritage conservation. They provide participants with hands-on experience while contributing to the conservation and revitalisation of cultural heritage sites across Europe. Each course and project is tailored to the specific needs of the heritage site, ensuring a balance between practical work and educational content.

Impact for Participants:

- Acquiring hands-on skills in heritage conservation techniques.
- Gaining practical experience to complement academic education.
- Building professional networks with heritage experts and peers across Europe.
- Developing intercultural understanding through collaboration with international participants.

Benefits for Sites and Communities:

- Immediate conservation and maintenance support for heritage sites.
- Increased visibility and awareness of the cultural significance of local heritage.
- Empowerment of all generations in local communities through engagement with the planning and implementation of the course or project.
- Strengthened cultural identity and heritage appreciation, fostering long-term sustainability of the engagement for cultural heritage.

CONNECTIONS CREATED BY THE PROGRAMME



- The programme bridges theoretical knowledge of emerging heritage professionals in academic settings with hands-on experiences and the practical application of traditional skills at particular heritage sites.
- It facilitates a two-way exchange between future heritage practitioners from predominantly urban environments and engagement at heritage sites in rural areas, along with local communities and traditional craftsmen, benefiting both sides and broadening perspectives.
- The programme contributes to the transfer of knowledge across generations, enabling young professionals to appreciate and valorise craftspeople, traditional crafts and their practical experiences.
- The programme fosters collaboration among various stakeholders at heritage sites, bringing together in a common effort national, regional and local authorities with heritage practitioners, community leaders and heritage activists.
- With its international scope, the programme promotes a diverse dialogue on heritage conservation, creating a platform for cross-cultural and transboundary exchange of heritage-related knowledge, skills, and traditional techniques.


