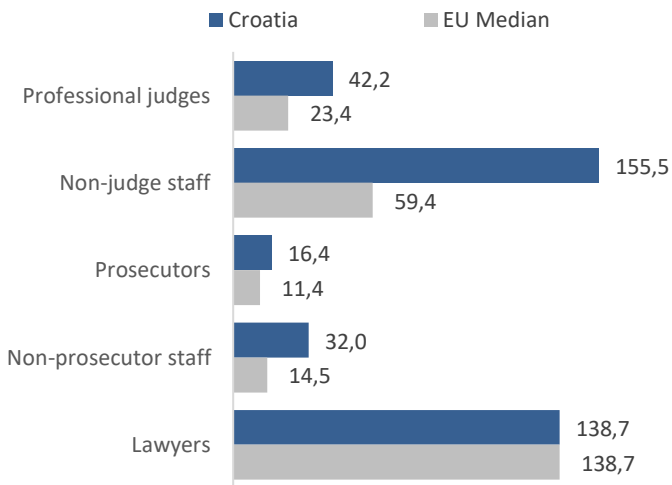

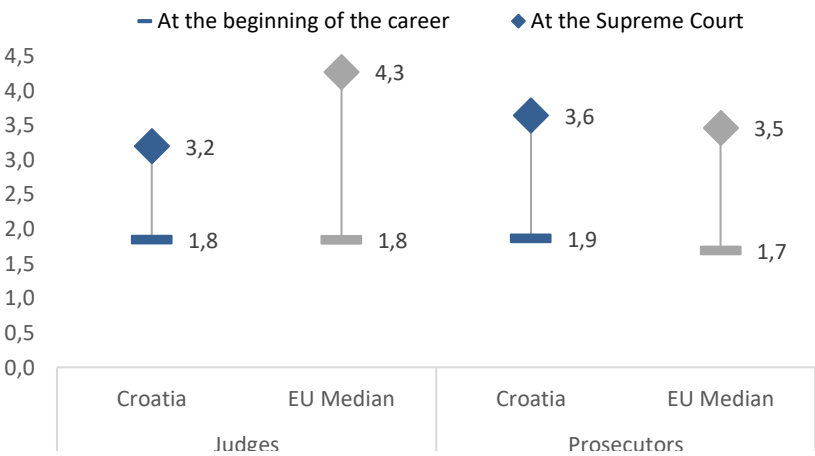

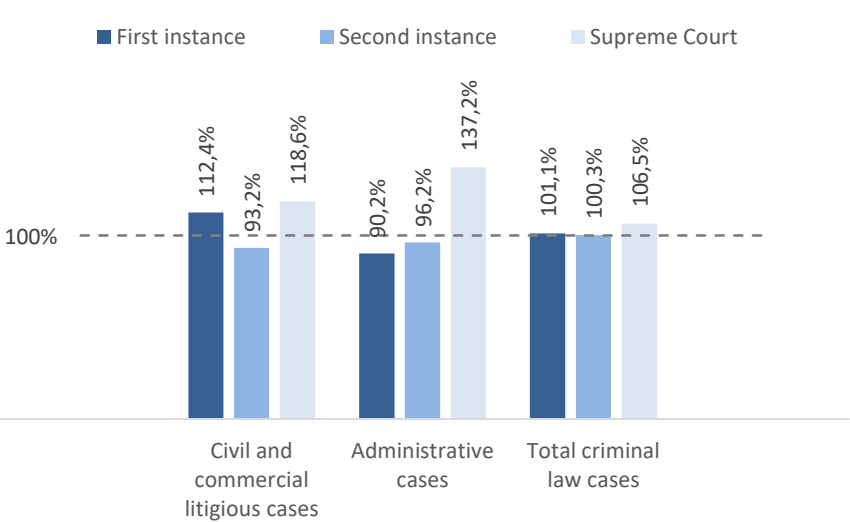


Gross salaries of judges and prosecutors vs average annual salary in 2024

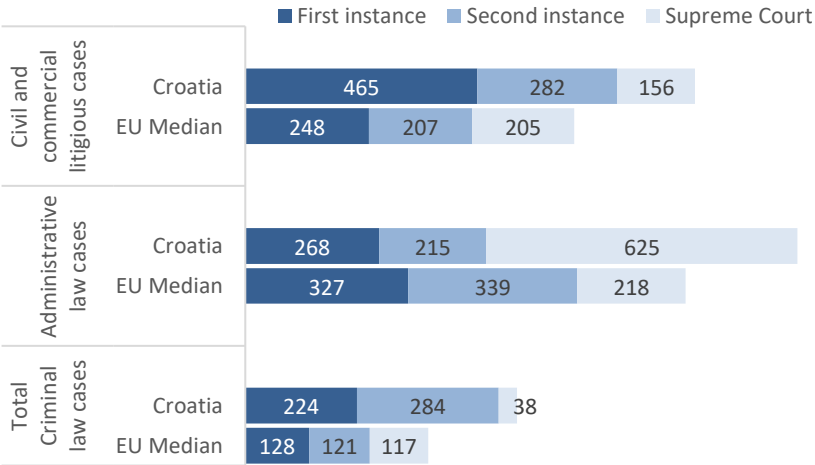

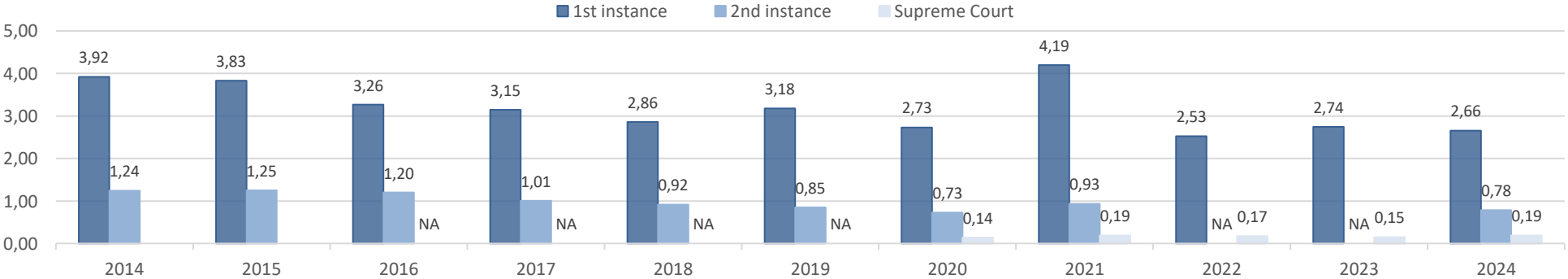


Disposition Time by instance and by matter in 2024 (days)

1. Judicial organisation in Croatia (2024 data)

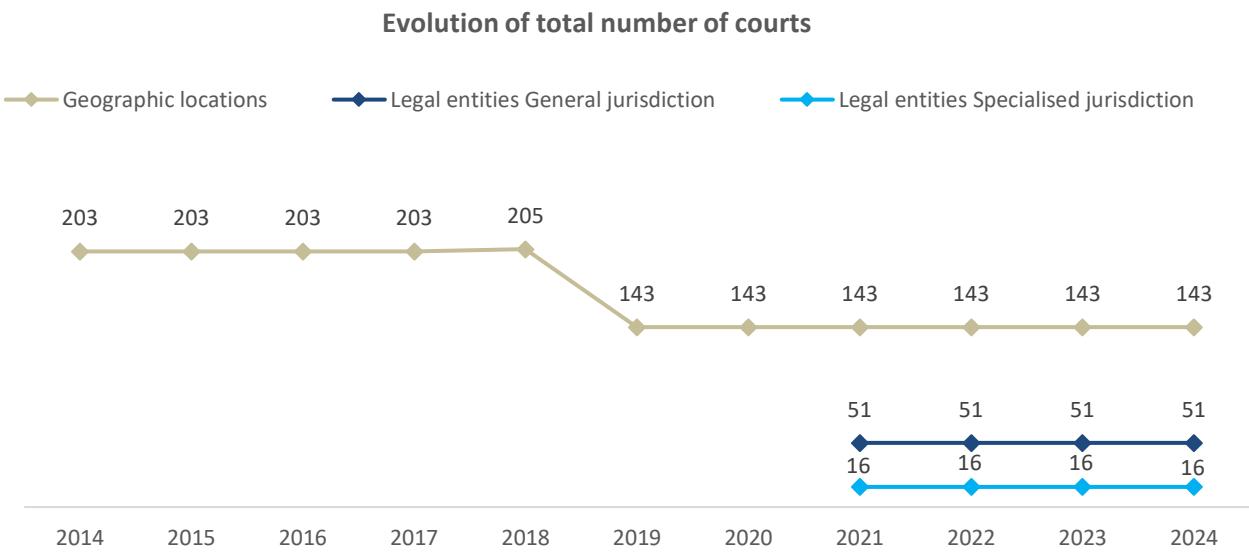
The judicial map comprises a total of 67 courts as legal entities, distributed across 143 geographic locations. These include both general jurisdiction and specialised courts.

There are 51 courts of general jurisdiction, categorised into 33 first-instance courts, 17 second-instance courts, and 1 highest-instance court.

Specialised courts account for 16 legal entities, consisting of 14 first-instance courts and 2 higher-instance courts. Among these are 9 commercial courts (including 1 higher instance), 1 labour court, and 4 administrative courts (including 1 higher instance).

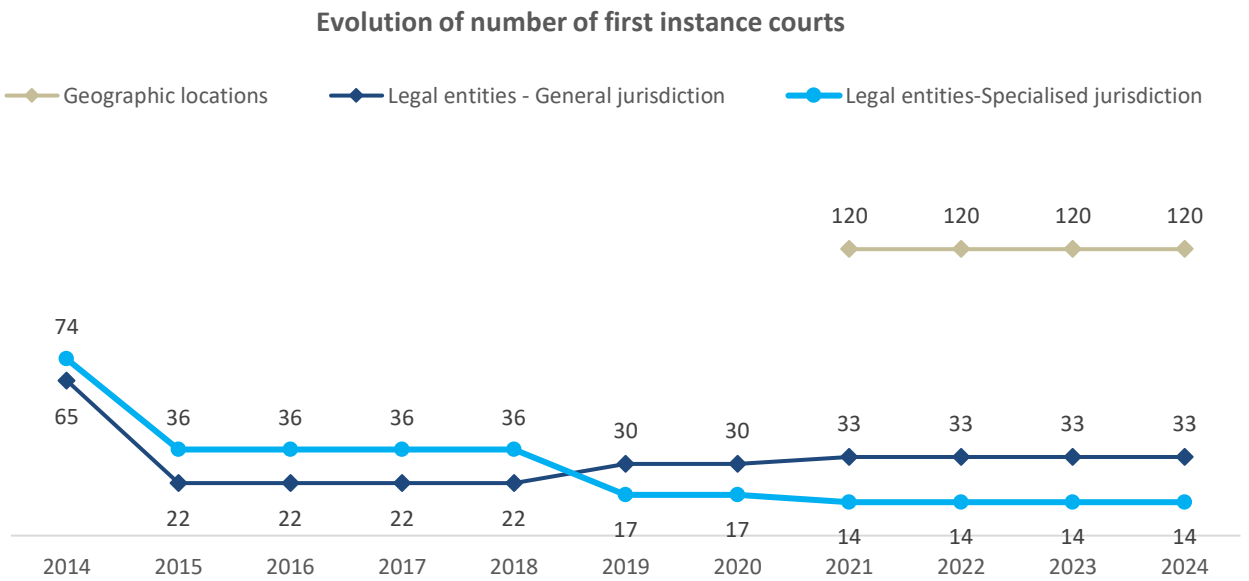


The reform of the judicial map implemented in 2015 reduced the number of Misdemeanour Courts from 63 to 22. Consequently, under the Act on Territorial Jurisdiction and Seats of Courts (Official Gazette, No. 128/14), there are currently 22 functioning Misdemeanour Courts.

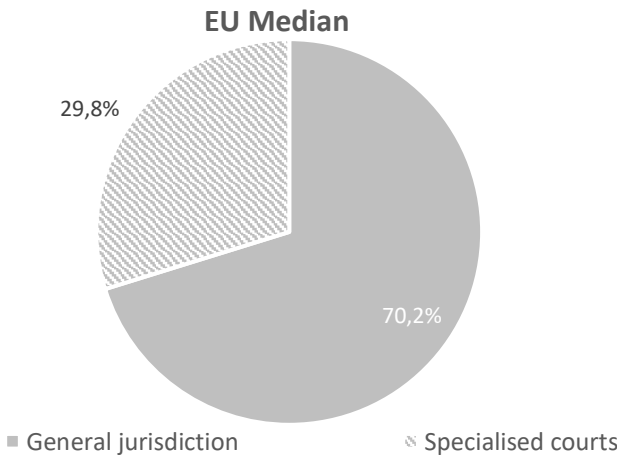
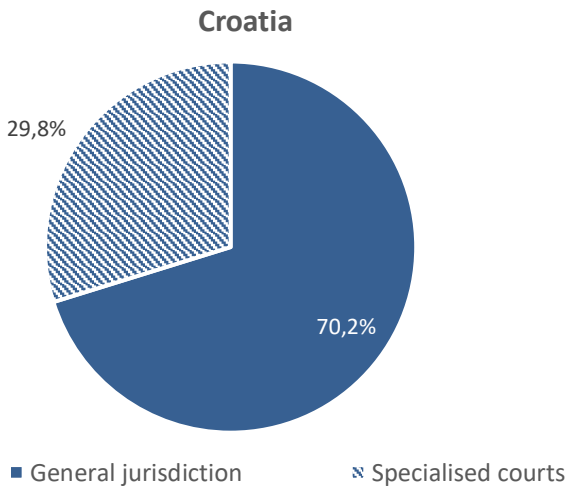
On January 1, 2019, the new Courts Areas and Seats Act came into effect. The most significant organisational measure introduced by this Act was the merging of Misdemeanour Courts into Municipal Courts. Additionally, several Municipal Courts that had been closed after 2015 were reopened. As a result, there are now fewer first-instance specialised courts than in 2018, but more general jurisdiction courts.

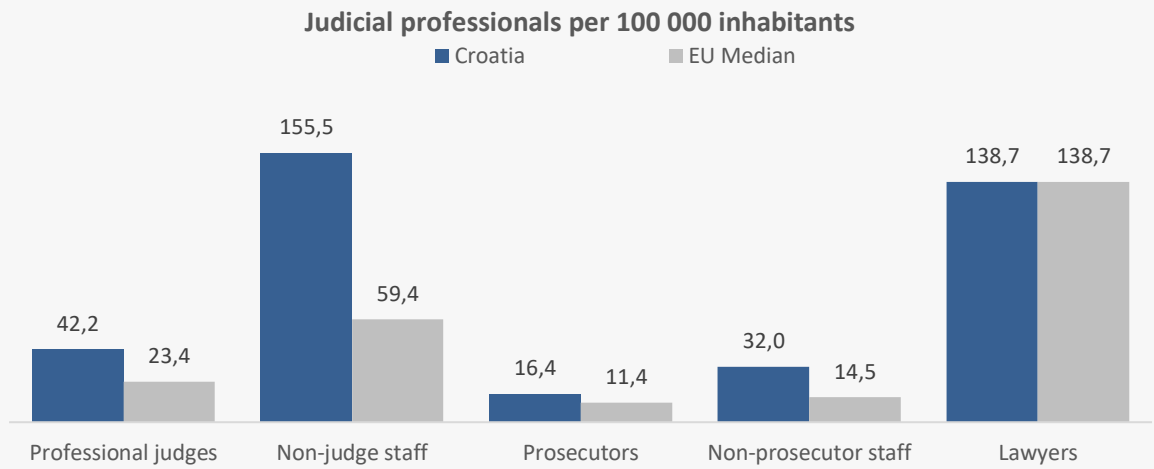

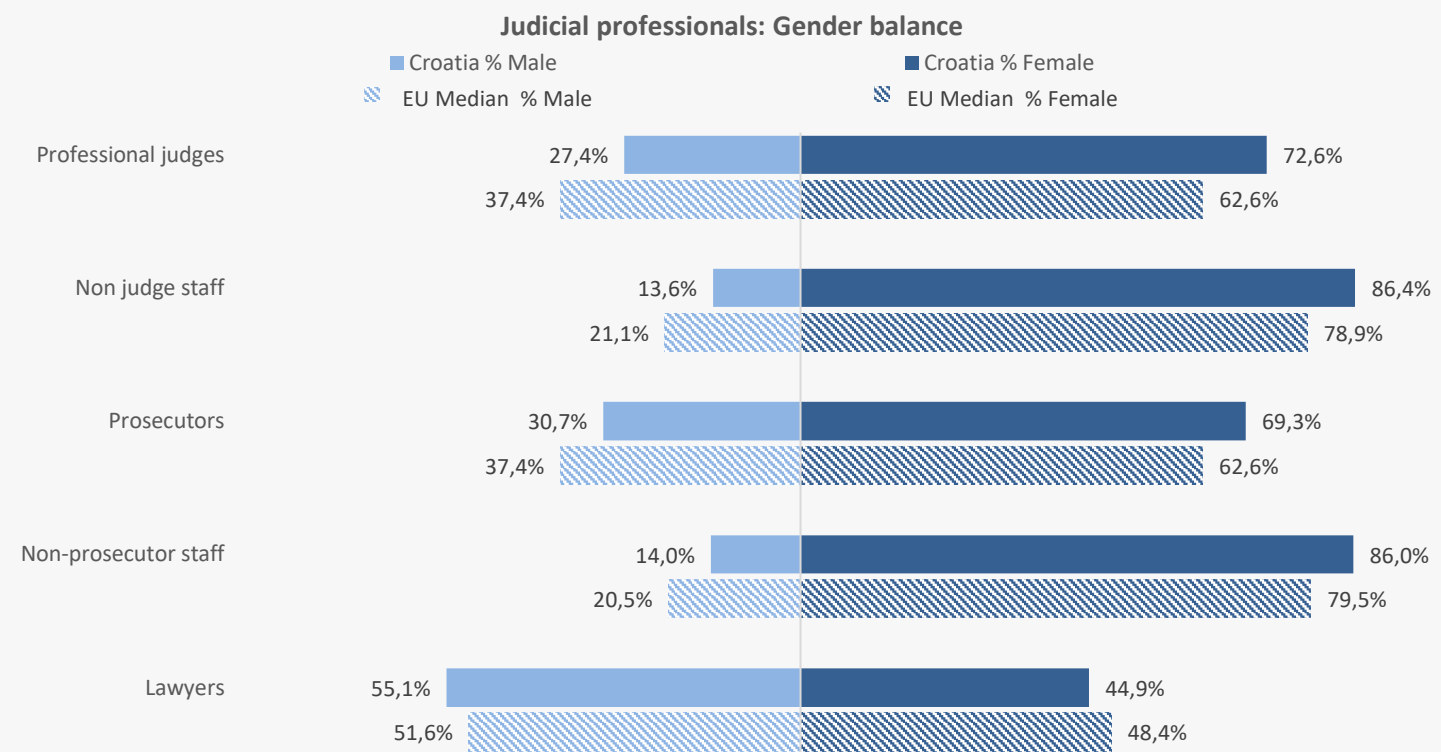

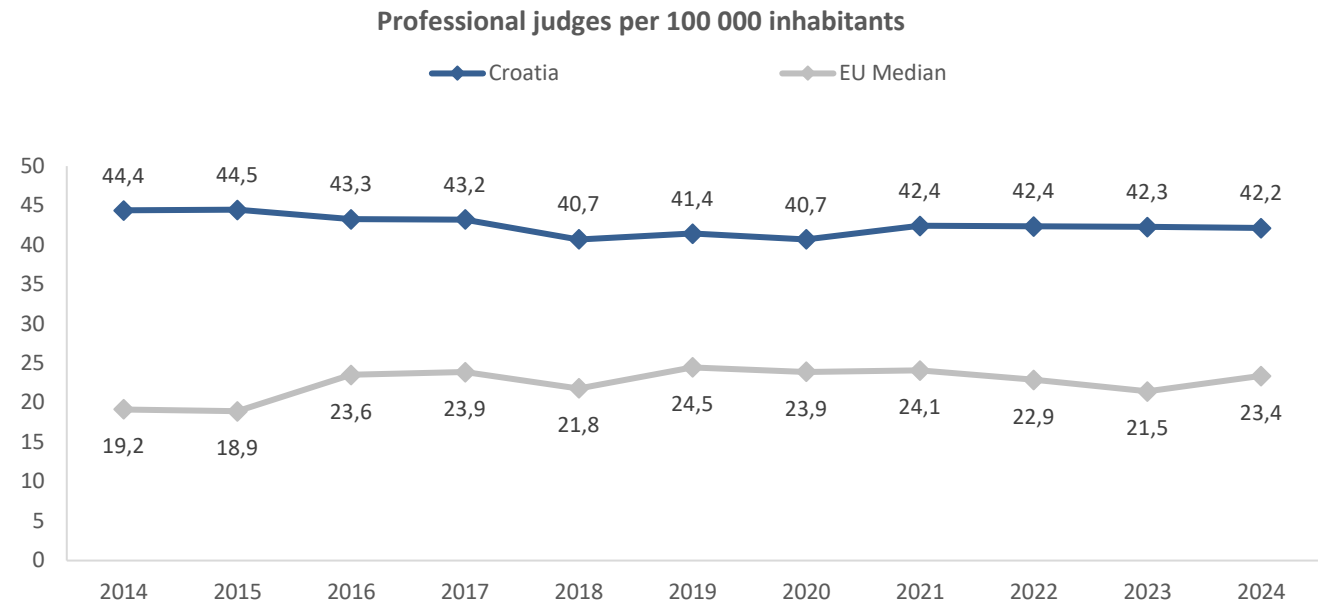

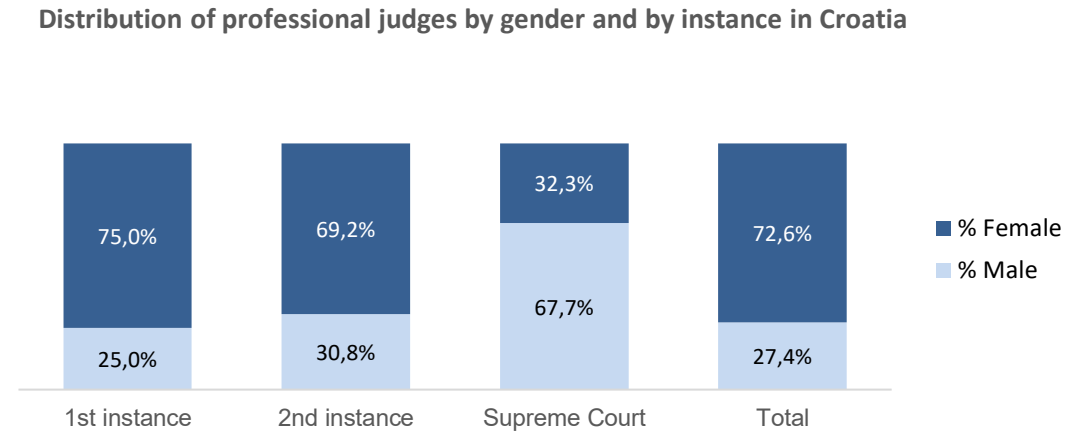
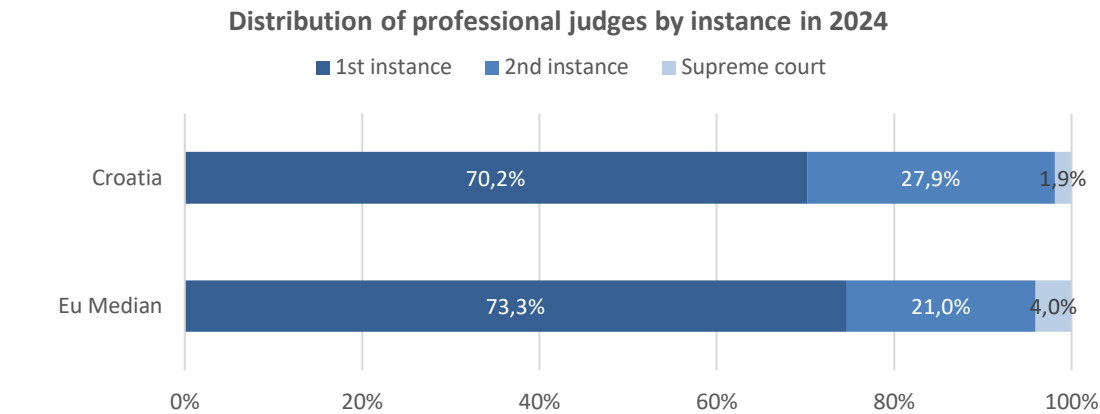


According to 2024 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Croatia is 1 630, which is 0,1% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Croatia, there are 42,2 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants)
In the total number of judges, only data on actually working judges is presented (the total does not include judges on unpaid leave; judges on maternity leave; judges suspended after disciplinary procedure; judges transferred to other State body- for example to Ministry of Justice or Judicial Academy).

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 1 183, which represents 72,6% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 1 144 are sitting in the first instance courts (of whom 858 are female); 455 are sitting in the second instance courts (of whom 315 are female) and 31 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of whom 10 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, the professional judges in Croatia are distributed among instances in a similar way. The number of judges at first instance is predominant, while judges at second and third instance are less numerous.
As regards the distribution male/Female, it has to be specified that female professional judges are significantly more numerous than male at all instances, except at Supreme Court level, where their representation is at 32,3%.

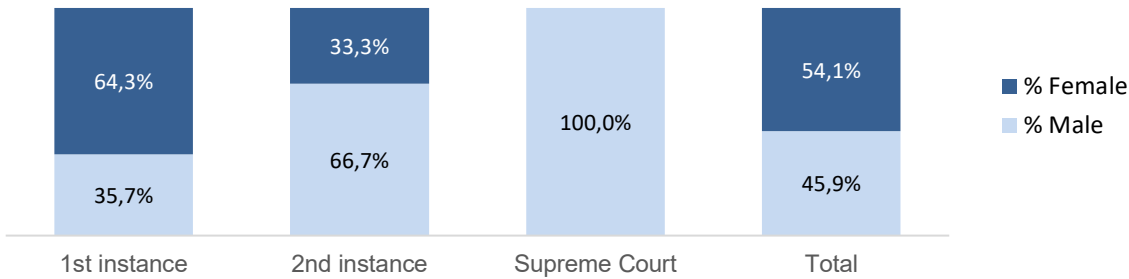

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Croatia



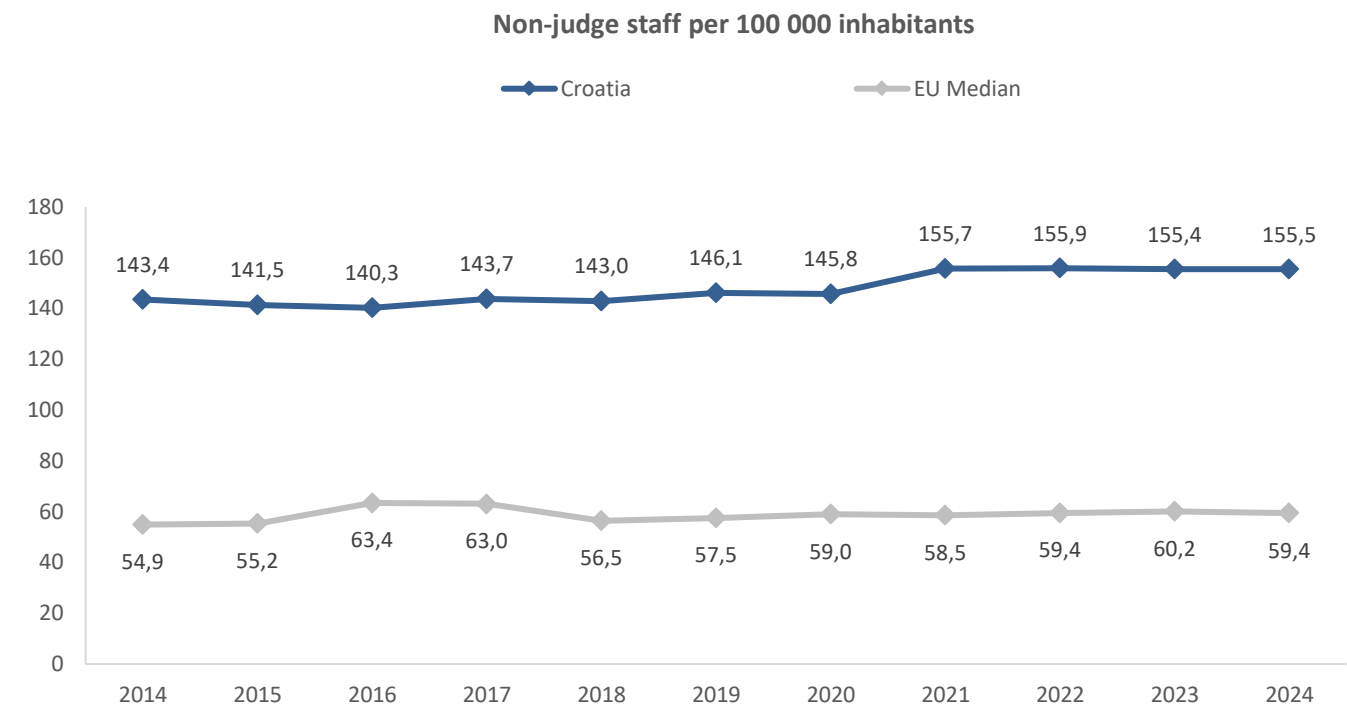
In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 33, which represents 54,1% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 42 are sitting in first instance courts (of whom 27 are female); 18 are sitting in second instance courts (of whom 6 are female) and 1 male sitting at the Supreme Court.

The presented data exclude individuals who are not actively engaged in full-time employment, including those who are absent without pay; not actively seeking employment; removed from employment records; seconded or dispatched to the Ministry of Justice, the Judicial Academy, the State Judicial Council, foreign missions, or other state bodies or organizations outside the state service; on maternity, paternity, parental, or adoption leave; employed on a part-time basis or working reduced hours due to childcare responsibilities or increased childcare costs; caring for a child with developmental difficulties while on leave or working reduced hours; or whose employment status is suspended until the child reaches three years of age.

In 2024, Croatia has 6 011 non-judge staff (of whom 5 191 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 0,4%.

In 2024, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 155,4 in 2023 to 155,5 in 2024).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 42,3 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2023 to 42,2 in 2024.

In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:

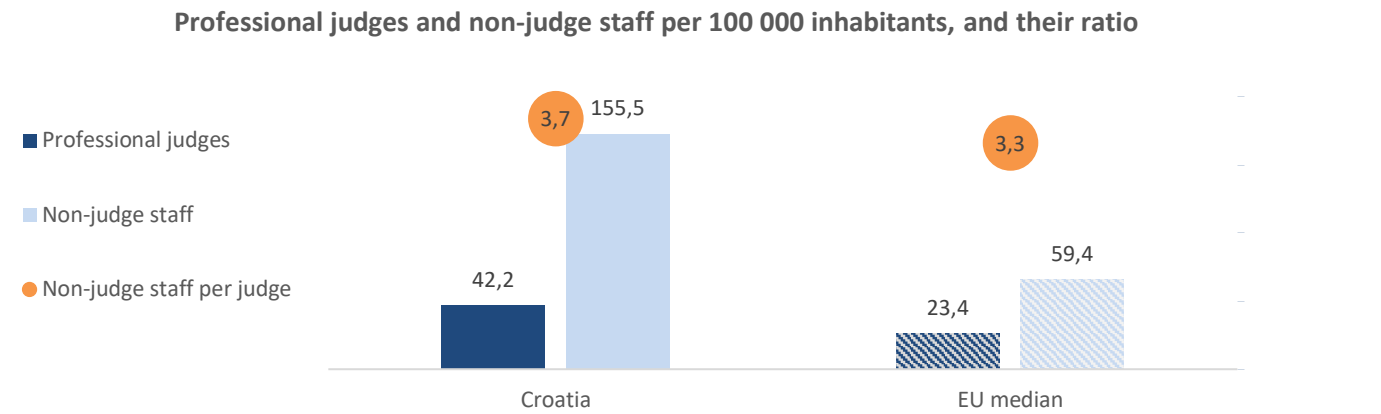
- 542 Rechtspfleger (or similar bodies) with judicial or quasi-judicial tasks having autonomous competence and whose decisions could be subject to appeal (among whom 460 are Female);
- 4 199 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of whom 3 843 are Female);
- 607 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of whom 474 are Female);
- 664 technical staff (of whom 414 are Female);

The total number of non-judicial staff is a result of a deduction and subsumes only actually working staff. Thus, the total does not include staff on unpaid leave; staff on maternity leave; staff suspended after disciplinary procedures; staff transferred to other State bodies (for example the Ministry of Justice or Judicial Academy). Besides, two non-judicial officials working half-time (for the reason of care for a child with special needs) are counted as 1 non-judicial official. s; staff transferred to other State bodies (for example the Ministry of Justice or Judicial Academy). Besides, two non-judicial officials working half-time (for the reason of care for a child with special needs) are counted as 1 non-judicial official.

The fluctuation and variations in the number of Rechtspflegers in the Republic of Croatia can be attributed to their employment structure. Rechtspflegers initially serve a two-year term, which may then be extended for an additional five years. Following this period, they are either granted a permanent position or their employment concludes.

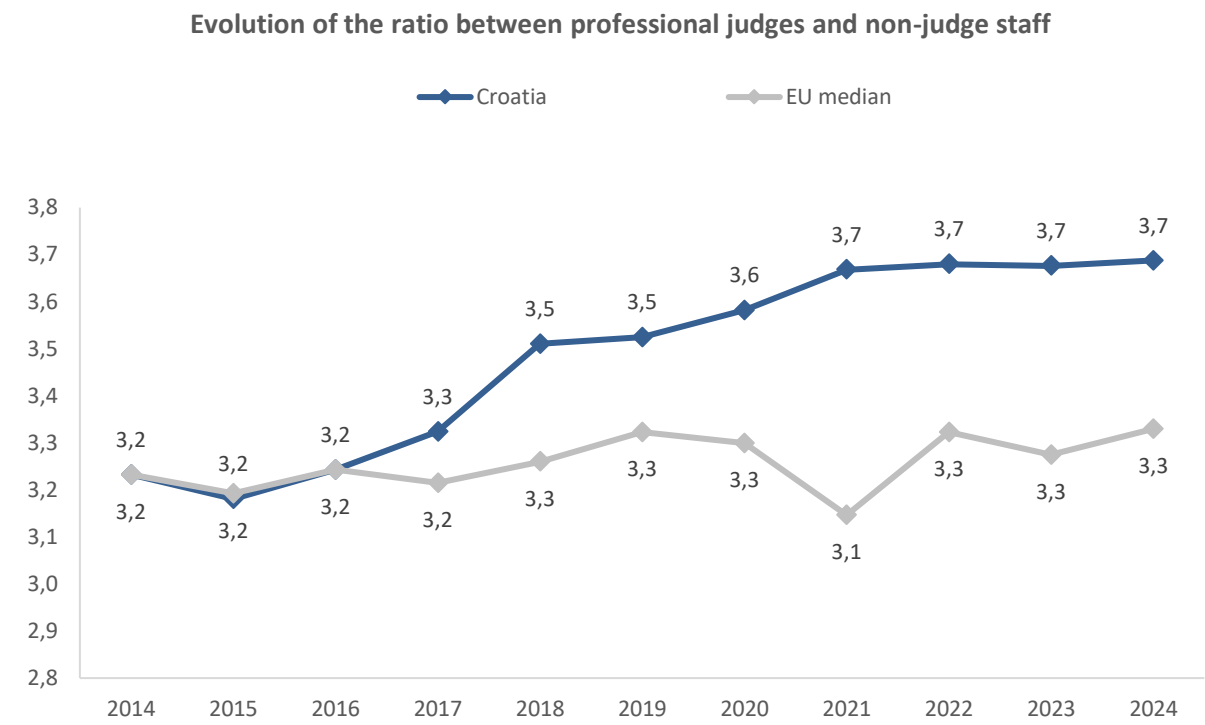

In Croatia, there are 42,2 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 3,7 non-judge staff per judge. There is no significant difference compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 3,7 non-judge staff per judge.

Evolution of the ratio between professional judges and non-judge staff

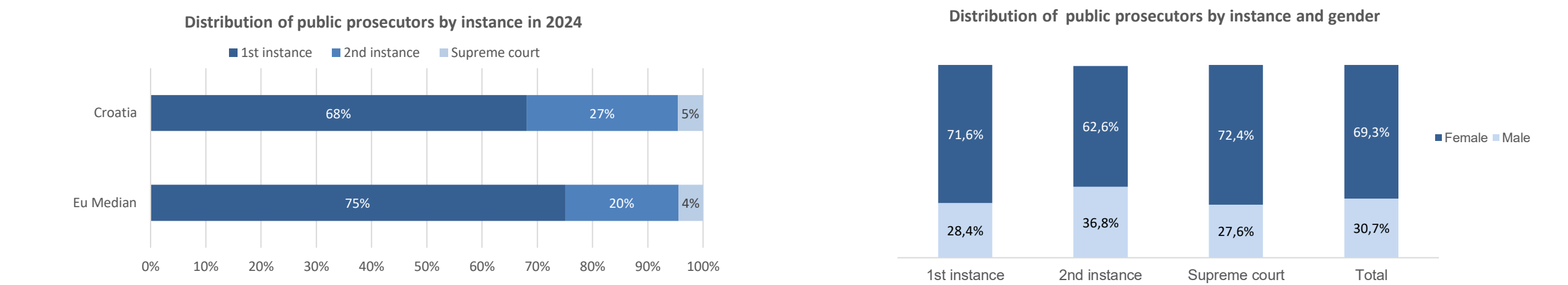

In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 440, which represents 69,3% of the total number of prosecutors.

The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 433 in first instance (of whom 310 are female); 174 are in second instance (of whom 109 are female) and 29 in final instance (of whom 21 are female).

As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of public prosecutors, it should be noted that the provided data encompasses all officials in the public prosecutors' offices, including heads of the public prosecutors' offices (the Public Prosecutor of the Republic of Croatia, county and municipal public prosecutors, the head of the Bureau for Combating Corruption and Organised Crime) and all public prosecutors deputies.

As regards the distribution of the number of prosecutors among the different judicial instances, the number of prosecutors at the first instance level includes all municipal public prosecutors, their deputies, as well as the head of the Bureau for Combating Corruption and Organised Crime and deputies.

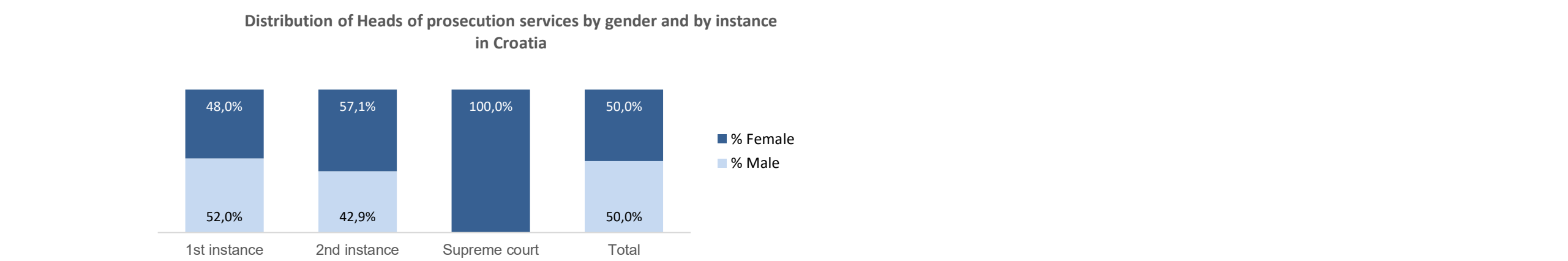
The number of prosecutors at the second instance (court of appeal) level includes all county public prosecutors and their deputies. The number of prosecutors at the Supreme Court level includes the Public Prosecutor and deputy prosecutors.

As regards the distribution male/Female, it has to be specified that the majority of public prosecutors at all instances are female, with the highest percentage of female public prosecutors at first instance level (71,6%).

In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution (all instances) is 20, which represents 50% of the total number of Heads of prosecution.

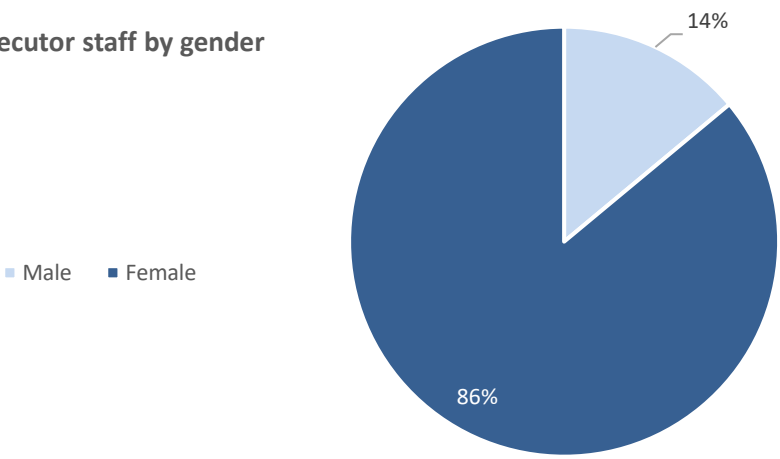
The total number of Heads of prosecution is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 25 at first instance level (of whom 12 are female); 14 at second instance level (of whom 8 are female) and 1 female at the highest instance level.

The organisational structure of the public prosecution services comprises: the State Attorney of the Republic of Croatia, the Office for Combating Corruption and Organised Crime (USKOK), county State attorneys' offices and municipal State attorneys' offices. The number of public prosecutors' offices has been significantly rationalised. The number of Heads of the State attorneys' offices does not correspond to the number of municipal State attorneys' offices, because in some of these offices the Heads of offices were not appointed and, until such appointment is made, their duties are exercised by their deputies. The number of the first instance State attorneys' offices includes the number of the municipal State attorneys and Head of Office for Combating Corruption and Organised Crime (USKOK).

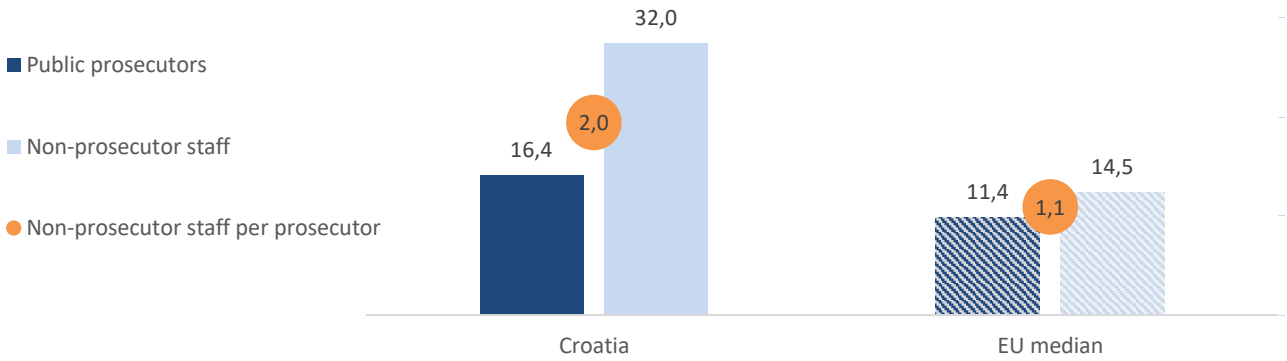

Public prosecutors and non-prosecutor staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio

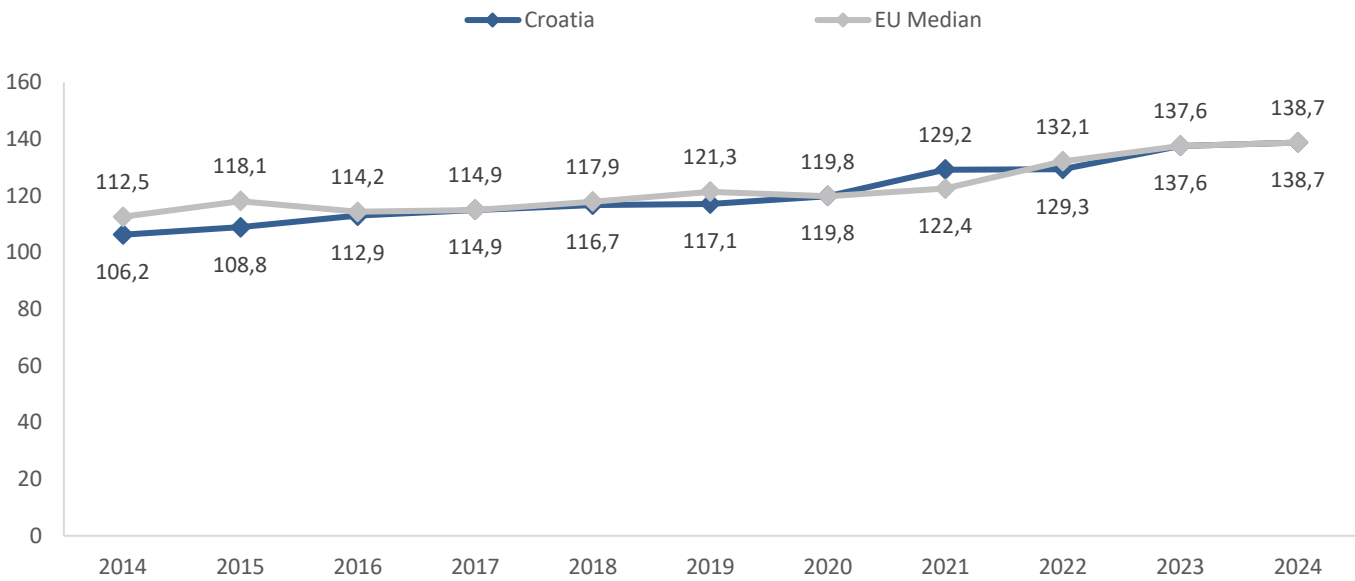

Lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants

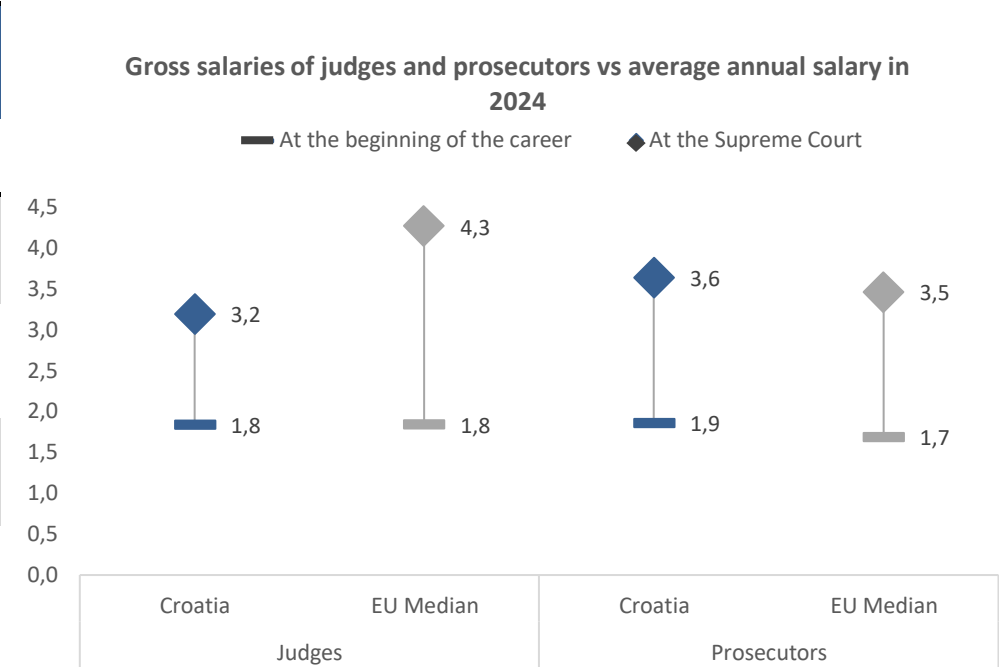


In 2024, there are 5 362 lawyers, which is 1,2% more than in 2023. There are 2 407 female lawyers which is 45% of the total.

Croatia has 138,7 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is around the EU median of 138,7 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 153 676€.

According to 2024 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Croatia is 40 271€, which is rather below the EU median of 61 347€ (-34% below).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 1,8 times higher (the EU median is 1,8).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary of a judge is from 54 719€ to 298 911€. Croatia's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is -43% below the EU median of 121 591€.

For public prosecutors, the range of the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 106 135€.

In 2024, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Croatia of 40 668€ is rather below the EU median of 52 969€ (-23% below).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary of a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,9 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 013€ and the maximum is 254 088€. Croatia's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is -16% below the EU median of 94 385€.

The term "wrongful arrest/detention" refers to compensation for an erroneous arrest and conviction. The Ministry, which also oversees peaceful resolution processes, reviews requests for compensation in cases of unwarranted arrest and conviction.

If the applicant rejects the Ministry's compensation offer, they have the option to file a complaint with the appropriate court. As a fair monetary settlement, the Ministry provides affected individuals with a compensation amount of HRK 280.00 (€37.16) per day of deprivation of liberty.

The amounts paid in 2024 relate to payments made pursuant to decisions adopted in amicable settlement proceedings, as well as to court judgments delivered in 2024 concerning cases initiated in previous years.

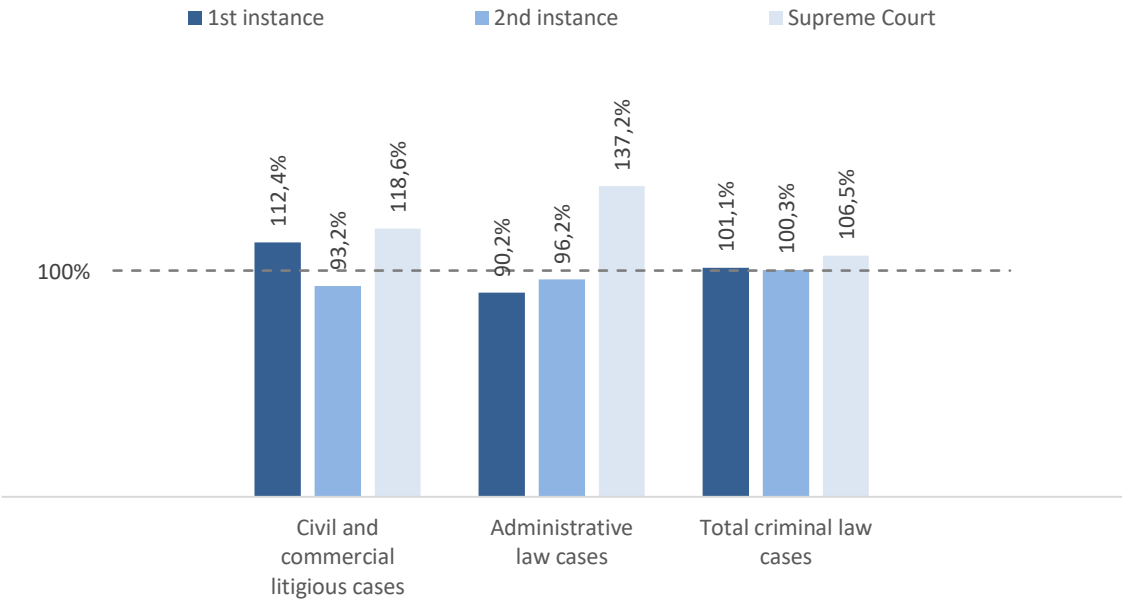

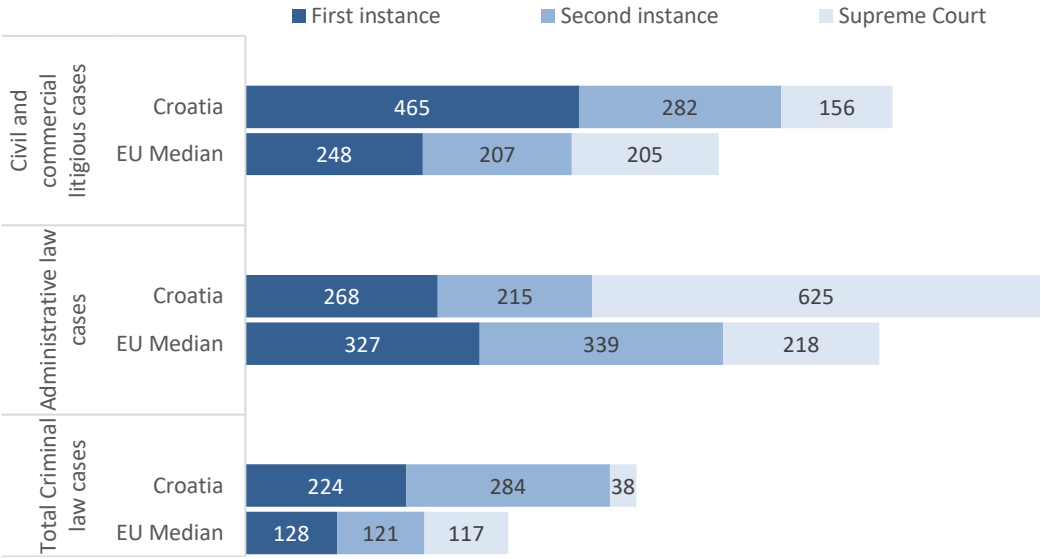

Disposition Time by instance and by matter in 2024 (days)



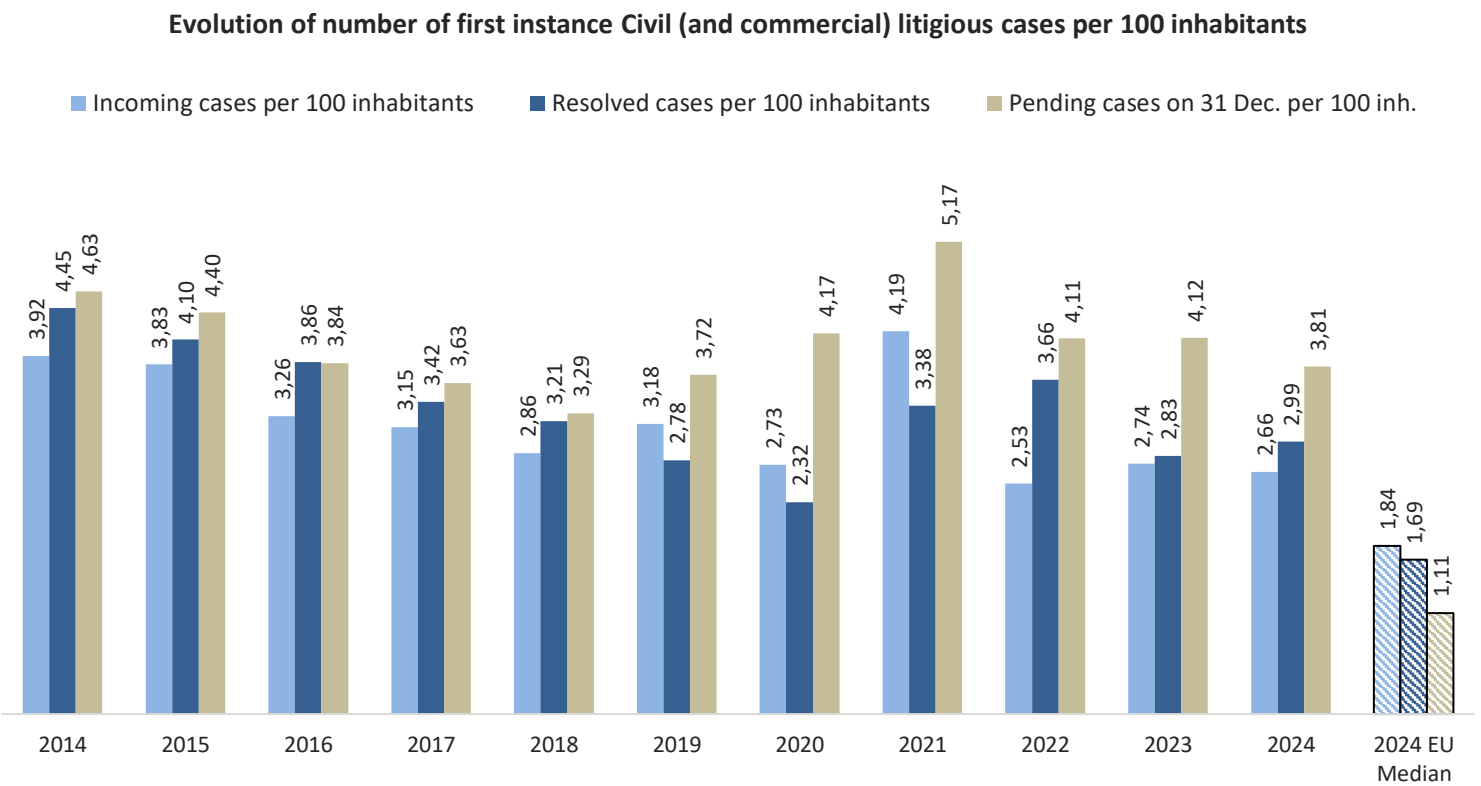
The 2024 case flow data shows that Croatian courts generally meet or exceed a 100% clearance rate across most case types and court instances, indicating an overall capacity to resolve at least as many cases as are received, except when it comes to second instance civil and commercial litigious cases and first instance administrative cases. Clearance rates are particularly high in civil and commercial litigious cases at first instance and at the Supreme Court level, in administrative cases at Supreme Court level and in criminal cases at Supreme Court level. The Supreme Court's positive trend continues in 2024 as the number of unresolved cases has decreased regarding all three legal matters. The incoming caseload in 2024 is higher than in 2023, when it was affected by the strike. Thus, in terms of incoming cases, the Supreme Court returned to the average levels observed over the past three years.

The disposition time indicates that case resolution times in Croatia are longer than the EU median in several areas, especially at first-instance courts for civil and commercial cases and at the Supreme Court for administrative cases. During 2023, the courts were unable to process the incoming administrative caseload in its entirety, leading to an increase in the number of pending cases at the end of 2023 and continuing into 2024. This trend has persisted throughout 2024. In criminal matters, disposition times are comparatively shorter at the Supreme Court but longer at first and second instances compared with the EU median.

With regard to land registry cases — which account for nearly half of the total inflow of court cases in the Republic of Croatia — it is particularly important to emphasize the scope and volume of these data. The data are obtained exclusively through the Joint Information System of Land Registers and Cadastre (ZIS). The reliability and consistency of data concerning the work of 109 land registry departments largely depend on the timeliness and completeness of updates within the system itself. It is therefore likely that horizontal inconsistencies primarily arise for this reason.

Discrepancies in comparison with data from the previous year can be further explained by the extraordinary circumstances that affected court operations during 2023. Owing to the strike of court clerks and judges, there was a temporary suspension in the receipt and processing of cases, which resulted in a decline in activity. In 2024, following the resumption of regular operations, an increase was recorded both in the number of incoming and resolved cases, which is also reflected in the overall indicators. This increase should therefore not be interpreted solely as a result of structural changes in court operations, but also as compensation for the reduced level of activity in the previous period.

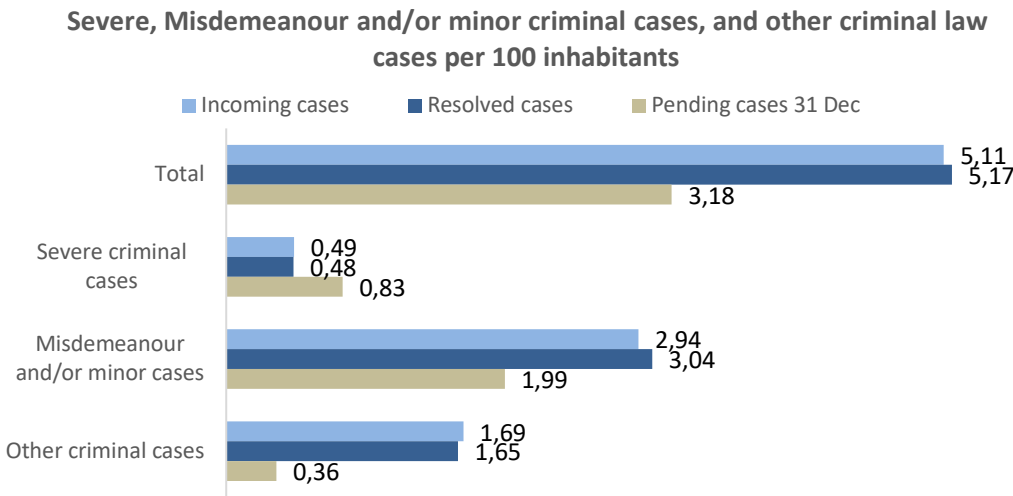
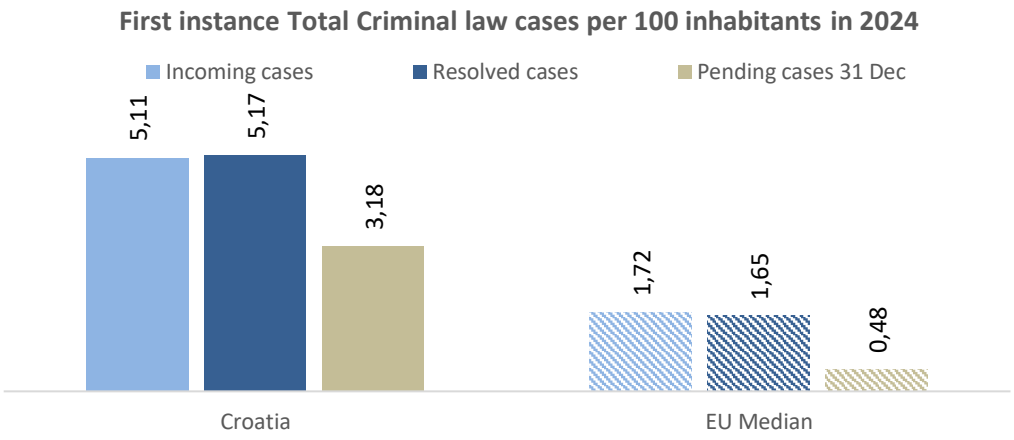

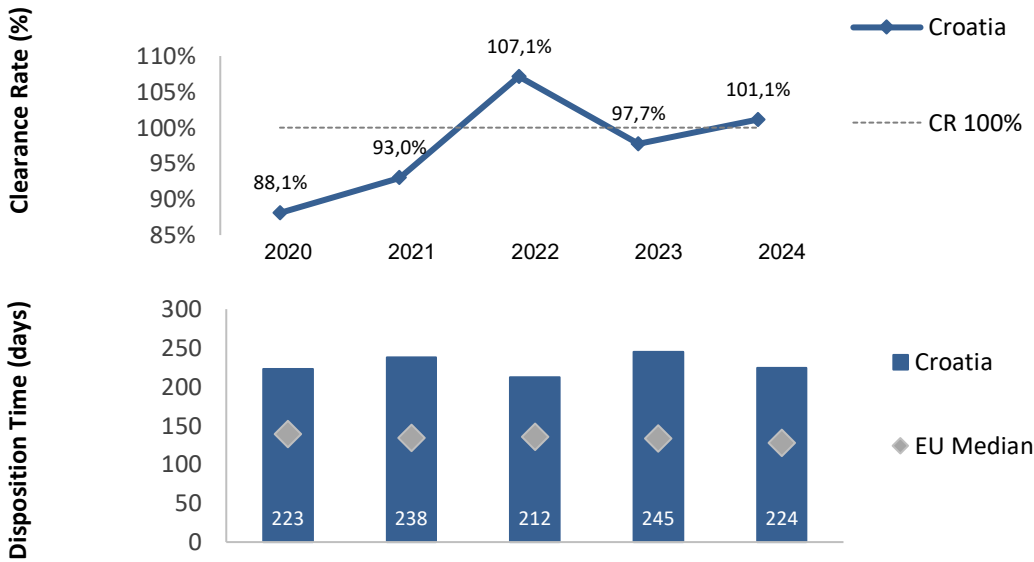
As a consequence of the strike of court clerks and judges in 2023, there was a disruption in the receipt and resolution of cases, which resulted in a temporary decline in activity. In 2024, with the resumption of regular operations, an increase was recorded both in the number of incoming and resolved cases, which is also reflected in the overall indicators. This increase therefore does not indicate structural changes in court operations, but rather compensation for the reduced level of activity in the previous period.

Due to the structure of the Croatian legal system, the distinction between severe criminal cases and misdemeanours or minor criminal cases is based on court jurisdiction rather than a substantive classification of offences. Croatian law clearly differentiates between criminal offences and misdemeanours, with misdemeanours defined as less serious unlawful behaviours that do not warrant criminal liability. However, the Criminal Code does not formally classify criminal offences by severity. Consequently, for the purposes of this categorisation, severe criminal cases are those under the jurisdiction of second-instance county courts, while misdemeanours and/or minor criminal cases fall within the jurisdiction of second-instance misdemeanour courts and the High Misdemeanour Court.

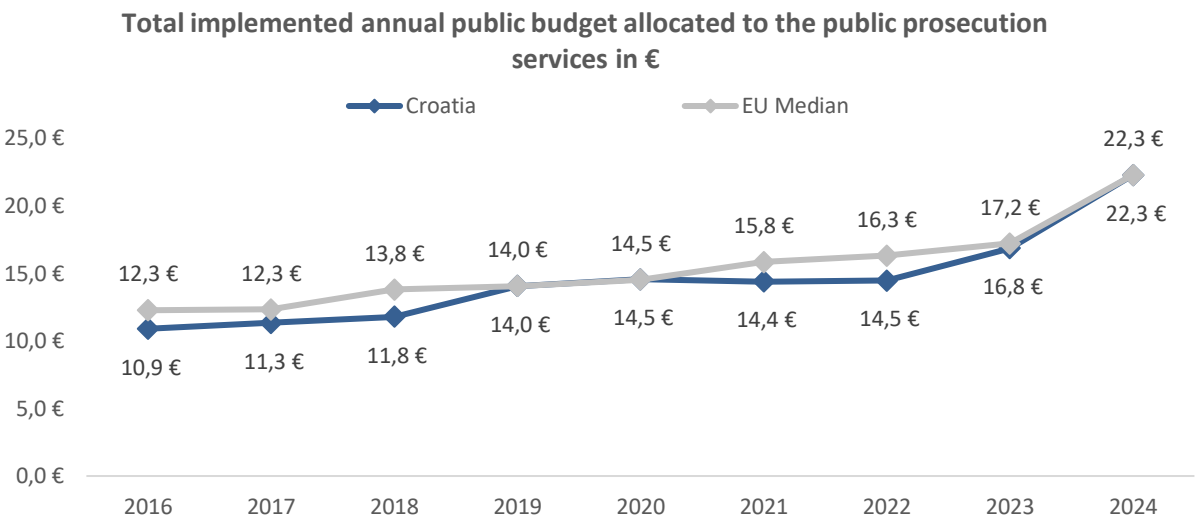

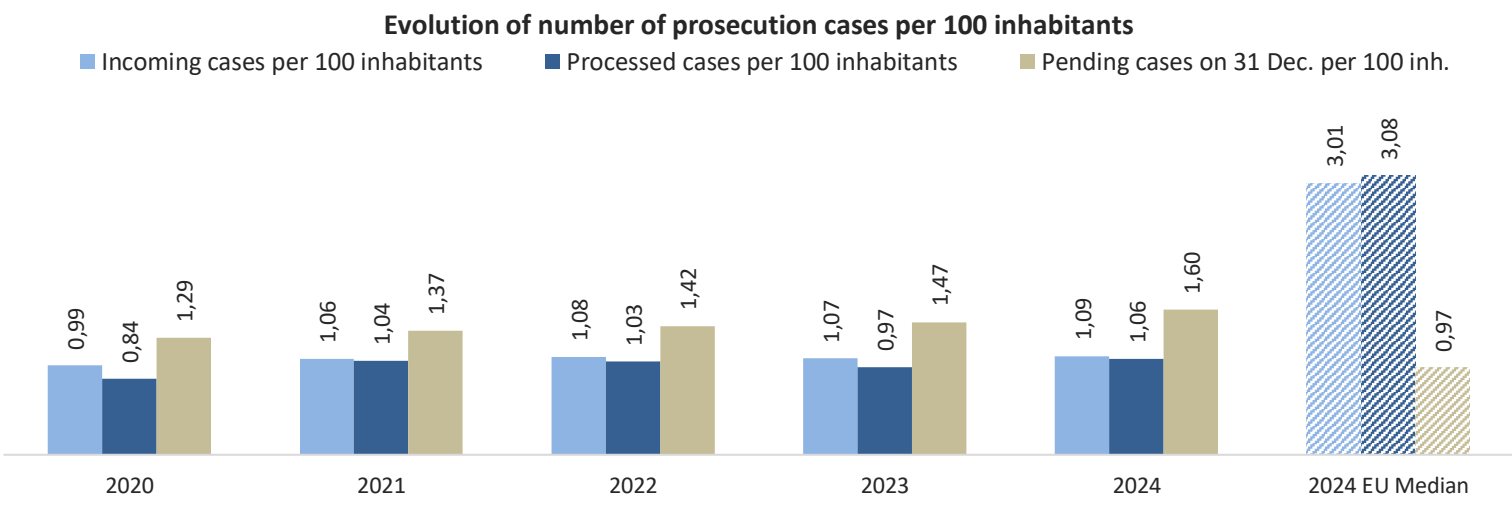
The discrepancies largely result from misalignment between the questionnaire requirements and the statistical reporting framework of the State Attorney's Office, resulting in several NA and NAP entries. In line with the questionnaire instructions, standard consistency requirements do not apply in such cases.

The increase in pending cases is partly attributable to staffing shortages, including vacant positions for deputy prosecutors and legal advisors, which have increased workloads and the number of hearings and court sessions.

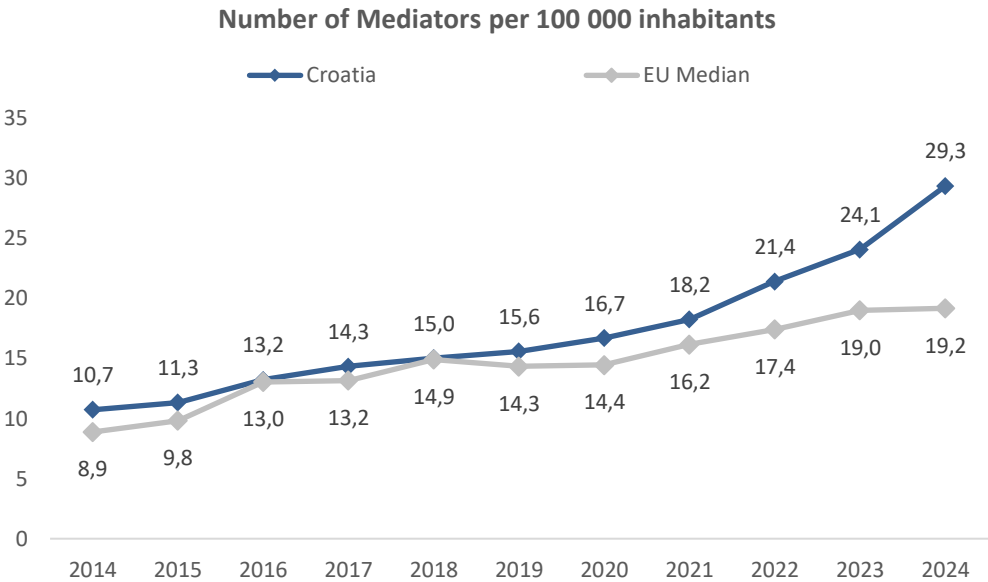

In 2024, there are 1 134 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 29,3 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation of the number of mediators between 2023 and 2024 is about 22,3%.

The increase in the number of mediators results from a combination of educational, regulatory, and project-based measures. During the reporting period, several projects were implemented to enhance the education and qualifications of mediation professionals, including basic mediator training, which significantly expanded the pool of individuals eligible for entry into the Register of Mediators.

This growth was further supported by the adoption of the new Act on the Peaceful Resolution of Disputes and the Ordinance on the Register of Mediators, which enabled the registration of mediators already listed in the previous register as well as previously certified but unregistered mediators. Additionally, the new legislative framework has stimulated increased public interest in mediation and demand for training. Given the broader application of mediation envisaged by the new legislation, further growth in the number of registered mediators is expected.

Comments on recording of court hearings

The implementation of the Audio Recording and Transcription System for court hearings is currently underway. The contract with the Contractor was signed on March 28, 2025. The deadline for the completion of the procurement is 18 months from the date of contract signing.

Work is being carried out on establishing a central software solution for the integration of all courts into a unified system for monitoring and managing a shared repository of all recordings, as well as a central software solution for the automated transcription of recordings stored in the central shared repository. After completion implementation will proceed in individual courtrooms (a total of 1,317 courtrooms).

8. Systems for measuring and evaluating the performance of courts and public prosecution services in Croatia (2024 data)

In Croatia, quality standards are determined for the judicial system at national level (e.g. quality systems for the judiciary and/or judicial quality policies). Specialised personnel within the courts and the public prosecution services is entrusted with implementation of these national level quality standards.

According to the Courts Act (Official Gazette, No. 28/13, 33/15, 82/15, 67/18, 126/19, 130/20, 21/22, 60/22), the president of the court evaluates judges annually based on Framework Criteria. These criteria assess the number of judgments delivered compared to the expected number, performance in various case types, adherence to deadlines for judgment delivery and drafting, judgment quality based on remedies in legal actions, and other judicial activities. The Framework Criteria, proposed by the General Assembly of the Supreme Court and adopted by the Minister of Justice, set the annual decision quota for each judge.

Under the State Attorney Office Act (Official Gazette, No. 67/18, 21/22), the performance of State Attorneys and Deputy State Attorneys is evaluated every three years based on: case resolution results (assessed using the Framework Criteria for the Work of Deputy State Attorneys and the average results of county or municipal state attorney offices over the preceding three years); quality of decisions (including the justified use of legal remedies; observing deadlines during procedures; other activities, experience, and adherence to the Code of Ethics for State Attorneys and Deputy State Attorneys. The Framework Criteria are adopted by the Minister responsible for judicial affairs, with prior input from the Chief State Attorney of the Republic of Croatia.

According to the Courts Act (Official Gazette No. 28/13, 33/15, 82/15, 67/18, 126/19, 130/20, 21/22, 60/22), the president of the court where a judge performs, issues a decision each calendar year assessing whether the judge has fulfilled their duties based on the prescribed criteria. If it is determined that the judge, without justified reason, did not meet the required number of decisions or performed duties improperly, disciplinary proceedings must be initiated in accordance with the State Judicial Council Act.

Disciplinary action against a court president is initiated by the president of the higher court. Sanctions for disciplinary offences may include a rebuke, salary reduction (up to one third for up to 12 months), or dismissal.

If justified reasons exist for underperformance, they must be explained and the decision forwarded to the higher court. Judges may object to such a decision within three days; the court president must respond within eight days. If the objection is rejected, the judge may appeal to the higher court, whose decision is final and not subject to further legal remedies.

According to the State Attorney Council Act (Official Gazette No. 67/18, 126/19, 80/22) if the number of resolved cases and actions taken in a one-year period is, without justifiable reason, less than 80% of the average of the state attorney's office in which he holds office, the Deputy State Attorney is disciplinary liable for disciplinary offence of irregular performance of duty.
