Ministry of Construction and Physical Planning

The Ministry of Construction and Physical Planning performs administrative and other tasks related to construction, physical planning and housing, and participates in the development and implementation of programmes from European Union funds and other forms of international assistance in these fields.

The Ministry also performs administrative and other tasks related to: physical planning in the Republic of Croatia and coordination of regional physical development; planning, use and protection of space; international cooperation in physical planning; physical planning inspectional tasks; spatial information system; monitoring of the status of space and implementation of physical planning documents of the Republic of Croatia; location permits; cooperation in development of physical planning documents of counties, cities and municipalities in order to ensure requirements for management, protection and administration of space, and coordination of activities of state administration bodies participating in the development, adoption and implementation of physical planning documents; ensuring requirements for development and improvement of operation of legal and natural persons in the field of physical planning; settlement planning and regulation of building land use.

The Ministry performs administrative and other tasks related to the effects of economic policy instruments and measures on the development of design services in construction and on construction services; operation of legal and natural persons in the field of construction, the Croatian Chamber of Architects and Engineers in Construction and other engineers involved in construction; monitoring and analysing the quality of construction and design services in construction; housing, housing policy; apartment and settlement construction; implementation of special housing programmes of the Government of the Republic of Croatia; policy, monitoring and improvement of the status in utility management, international cooperation in construction and housing.

The Ministry performs tasks related to the participation of the Republic of Croatia in the work of bodies of the European Union in the fields of the Ministry's responsibility.

Physical planning provides the conditions for use (governance), protection and management of the space of the Republic

of Croatia (hereinafter: the State), as a particularly valuable and limited national asset, and also creates the prerequisites for social and economic development, environment and nature protection, building excellence and rational use of natural and cultural goods.

Spatial plans at the state level are the State plan for spatial development, spatial plan of a national park, spatial plan of a nature park, and other spatial plans of areas with special features the adoption of which is prescribed pursuant to the State plan for spatial development and urban development plan of a detached building area outside the settlement for economic and/or public purposes of state significance (hereinafter: the urban development plan of state significance).

Ministry of Culture

Ministry of Culture performs administrative and other tasks in the area of culture including in relation to the cultural heritage: research, study, monitoring, record-keeping, documenting and promoting cultural heritage; a central IT and documentary service; establishing the characteristics of protected cultural heritage; the prescription of measures to establish programmes of general application in culture in the Republic of Croatia; care, alignment and supervision of financial programmes for the protection of cultural heritage; establishing and supervising institutions which implement activities to protect cultural heritage; the assessment of working conditions for the activities of legal and physical persons in restoration, conservation and other cultural heritage activities; ensuring the prerequisites for the education and further training of expert workers in the field of protecting cultural heritage; confirming conditions for the use and purpose of cultural goods, and managing cultural goods in accordance with regulations; confirming special conditions for buildings for the protection of items of cultural heritage; and implementing inspectional tasks for the protection of cultural heritage. The Directorate for the Protection of Cultural Heritage has twenty conservation departments, which are responsible in their particular territory. Care for the overall cultural heritage - immovable, movable and intangible contribute to the landscape management.

Ministry of Environment and Energy (MEE)

The focus of the work carried out by the Ministry of Environment and Energy is to create conditions for sustainable development – development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs.

The scope of work of the Ministry includes task related to protection and conservation of the environment and nature in line with the sustainable development policy of the Republic of Croatia, as well as tasks related to water management and administrative and other tasks from the field of energy.

MEE is implementing landscape policy through environmental legislation and procedures: Strategic Environmental Assessment and Environmental Impact Assessment.

Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) and Environmental Impact Assessments (EIA) are a procedures prescribed by the Environmental Protection Act, Regulation on the strategic environmental assessment of strategy, plan and programme and the Regulation on environmental impact assessment. The Impact Assessment Study is developed for the SEA and EIA procedures. In this Study the impact of the strategy, plans, programmes and projects on the landscape is assessed.

Nature Protection legislation and procedures regulates the system of protection and preservation of nature and its parts and other related issues. Nature Protection Act defines nature as overall biodiversity, landscape diversity and geodiversity.

The Nature Protection Act includes the protection of landscapes, which combines the planning and implementation of measures to prevent unwanted changes, disturbance or destruction of significant and distinctive features of landscapes, by integrating nature protection requirements into the procedures of drafting physical planning documents and natural resource management plans and by prescribing protected area management plans.

Protection of landscape diversity is also regulated through issuing nature protection requirements in the procedure of building permits issuance, approvals for activities in the protected area and through carrying appropriate assessment of the impact of the project, strategy, plans and programmes on the ecological network (Natura 2000) in line with provisions of the Nature Protection Act.

Responsible Regional Administrative Departments are issuing nature protection requirements, approvals and carrying appropriate assessment of the impact of the project, strategy, plans and programmes on the ecological network (Natura 2000) in line with provisions of the Nature Protection Act.

They are usually responsible for physical planning as well. They prepare all the important studies including landscape studies as optional. As the City of Zagreb has both administrative roles as a big City and a county in the same time, here they develop Spatial plan of the City of Zagreb and urban development plan of a detached building area outside the settlement for economic and/or public purposes of county significance (hereinafter: the urban development plan of county significance).

Spatial plans for Counties, are being developed by county authorities responsible for spatial planning together with County Institutes for Physical planning, and adopted by County Assembly.

Integrated Approach to Landscape Protection, Planning and Management

Preservation of landscape values, their renewal and affirmation are the basics of attractiveness of some area for visitors, development or investments, but also for preserving the existing population and demographic renewal, especially in rural areas.

In landscape management, it should be kept in mind that landscape is not a frozen image – the unchanging sum of all physical natural and anthropogenic attributes of space, but a dynamic process where changes are possible, but with the preservation and affirmation of identity and the directing of development according to the desired model.

From the perspective of spatial planners, we recognize areas for action and priority future activities: improvement of regulation and refinement/ clarification of competences, more effective cross-sectoral co-operation, development of landscape bases and atlases of landscapes at national and lower levels, as well as strengthening of general awareness of the importance of landscapes, in particular by including landscape themes in education and

training programmes.

Implementation of the Landscape Basis for the Spatial Plan of Dubrovnik-Neretva County

As part of the elaboration of the Landscape Basis of Dubrovnik-Neretva County, identification and evaluation of the landscape was carried out using new methodologies adjusted for the regional level in accordance with the European Landscape Convention (Integrated Approach). The analyses were made in GIS. The typological classification of landscapes has been carried out and the guidelines for landscape planning and management have been given. For the identified landscape types, visual, ecological and overall landscape sensitivity was assessed as well as the pressures and their value and vulnerability were analysed.

Especially recognized are areas of cultural landscape on the regional level, and for the most prominent ones protection based on the Act on the Protection and Preservation of Cultural Goods has been proposed.

By provisions of the Plan, the development of additional conservation and landscape studies is prescribed, with a more detailed characterization of particularly valuable areas and historical ambience urban and rural parts in the authentic environment as the basis for planning.

Landscape Policy in Environmental and Nature Protection and Its Implementation on the Case Study of the Mura - Drava - Danube Biosphere Cross-Border Reserve

Under its jurisdiction, the Ministry of Environmental Protection and Energy also covers the implementation of regulations on nature and environmental protection issues. Within the context of these regulations, nature is taken to mean overall biodiversity, landscape diversity, and geo-diversity, and is in the interest of the Republic of Croatia.

A worthy example characterised by a high level of biodiversity and landscape diversity is the area along the rivers Mura, Drava, and Danube. Some significant landscape features of this area are its preserved natural shores, small settlements that live in harmony with nature, and humid habitats such as flood forests, wet lawns, dead-end backwaters, abandoned basins and meanders, among others.

For the purpose of protecting the value of that river system, the Republic of Croatia declared the Mura-Drava Regional Park, which was followed by the proclamation of the cross-border Mura-Drava-Danube biosphere reserve between Croatia and Hungary, and the proclamation of the Natura 2000 ecological network.

Landscape Basis as a Multisectoral Tool for Landscape Protection, Planning and Management

Recent experiences of the Department of Ornamental Plants, Landscape Architecture and Garden Art in developing landscape bases in the Republic of Croatia will be presented. They refer to the landscape bases of the Krka National Park, the Dubrovnik Neretva County, the Island of Cres, the Stari Grad Plain of Hvar. The emphasis will be on the variety of possibilities of landscape bases implementation in different sectoral tools (spatial plans, conservation bases, development strategies, protected area management plans) and, in general, in tourism promotion and local community education. Attention will also be drawn to the necessity of adjusting the methodology to different purposes, goals and scales. The related issues will be also pointed out: the lack of a legal basis for the implementation of the landscape bases and on the absence of GIS databases.
