Relevant qualifications summary¹	<p>I possess a Doctor of Philosophy in Law, with a dissertation that concentrated on the intricacies of human trafficking legislation, paying particular attention to the non-punishment principle. Since completing it, I have built substantial experience in the anti-trafficking field, most recently working in the space of developing AI for combating human trafficking. My knowledge of AI for facilitating and combatting exploitation is regularly sought after by governments, police and NGOs.</p> <p>My work has also included evaluating ASEAN countries THB legislation for the IOM, analysing the UK's NRM for the European Commission, and managing over nine human trafficking focused projects, involving collaboration with police, NGOs, governments, and victims. In my research I have conducted over 250 interviews, 130 with victims, and have experience in using qualitative methods such as running round tables, interviews and focus groups.</p> <p>I have worked for four years at safe houses for male and female victims.</p>
