II. Professional experience

Currently teaching a course on Human Rights Law in particular on the case law of the European Court of Human Rights at the Faculty of Law, University of Zagreb, Croatia.

2013 - Member of the Council of Europe Advisory Panel of Experts on Candidates for election as Judge to the European Court of Human Rights; its Vice Chairperson (2013 - 2017) and Chairperson since 1 June 2017.

2014 - 2017 - Chairperson of the Commission for the Control of INTERPOL's Files (CCF).

2013 - 2014 - Acting as expert for the Council of Europe HELP (Human Rights Education for Legal Professionals) programme in Serbia. Its aim is to continue to integrate European Convention on Human Rights standards, as interpreted by European Court of Human Rights case law, fully into the national curricula of training institutions for the professional training of judges and prosecutors in all Council of Europe member states.

1 November 1998 - 31 December 2012 - Judge at the European Court of Human Rights, elected in respect of Croatia; sitting as Section Vice-President since 5 February 2009 and Section President since February 2011.

Prior to joining the European Court of Human Rights, Ms Vajić was Professor of Public International Law at the Faculty of Law, University of Zagreb, Croatia. She studied law in Zagreb and obtained an LLM and JSD in International Law. Ms Vajić also attended the Diploma Program at the Graduate Institute of International Studies (*Institut universitaire de Hautes Etudes Internationales* - IUHEI), in Geneva, Switzerland.

Ms Vajić published numerous articles and studies in different fields of International Law and Human Rights Law, participated in domestic and international conferences as speaker or commentator and was Guest Professor at several domestic and foreign universities.
