

Octavi Quintana is a physician by training, specialist in Critical Care and MPH. After 10 years working as an attending physician he started on management positions in the health care system in Spain including director of the Malaga Regional hospital and deputy director general of the SNS (National Health Service). He started working in the CoE in 1986 as delegate of Spain in the CAHBI which later became the CDBI. He served as chair for a couple of years during the drafting of the European Convention on Bioethics. He left the CoE in 2000. In 1996 he was appointed as member of the European Group of Ethics advising the President of the EC where he served until 2001 when he was the vice chair. In 1993 he started working on Humanitarian Aid with an NGO mainly in the Great Lakes Crisis in 1994-7, in Bosnia in 1996-8, and in Kosovo in 1999. On 2002 while he was the director for International Affairs of the Ministry of Health in Spain he was appointed as director for Health Research at the European Commission where he has been since as director of Energy Research and director of the European Research Area. Since last month he is the Director of a R&I program with Mediterranean countries called PRIMA.
