▶ **Intergovernmental Expert Group on Cybercrime (meetings 2011 - 2021)**

**UN General Assembly ▶ Third Committee ▶ UNGA Resolution 74/247 (December 2019)**

▶ **New treaty process to commence in 2020 (organizational meeting end-August 2020)**

**UN General Assembly ▶ First Committee ▶ UN Group of Governmental Experts (GGE) on Advancing responsible State behaviour in cyberspace in the context of international security (since 2004)**

**UN General Assembly ▶ First Committee ▶ Open-Ended Working Group on Developments in the Field of ICTs in the Context of International Security (OEWG) (established in 2018)**

**Meanwhile: The Budapest Convention on Cybercrime 2001 keeps expanding...**
