→ art. 14 of the Budapest Convention, scope of procedural provisions

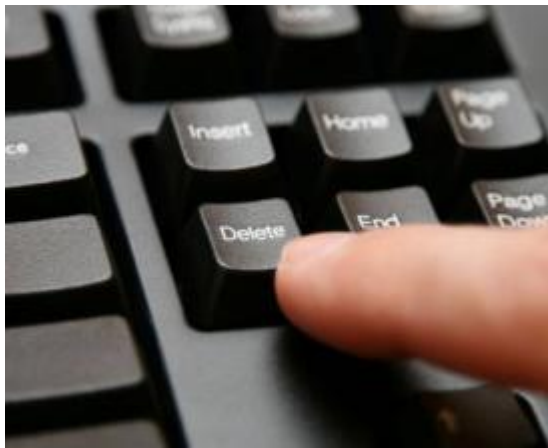


**Specially relevant in the Covid-19 crisis due to lockdowns**

**\* Available tools for cooperation:**

**For preservation of e-evidence: art. 29 and 30 Budapest Convention**

**art. 35 Budapest Convention: 24/7 Network → more efficiency if the central authority is the Prosecutor’s Office**

**Direct and VOLUNTARY cooperation with some ISP (ex: Facebook, Instagram, Google, Microsoft, Uber, and others) → each ISP has its own requirements to disclose information.**

**\*Chilean experience.**

**Second additional protocol: regulation of the direct cooperation with ISP**

**disclosure of content in emergency cases**

**expedited MLA for the disclosure of e-evidence (content)**
