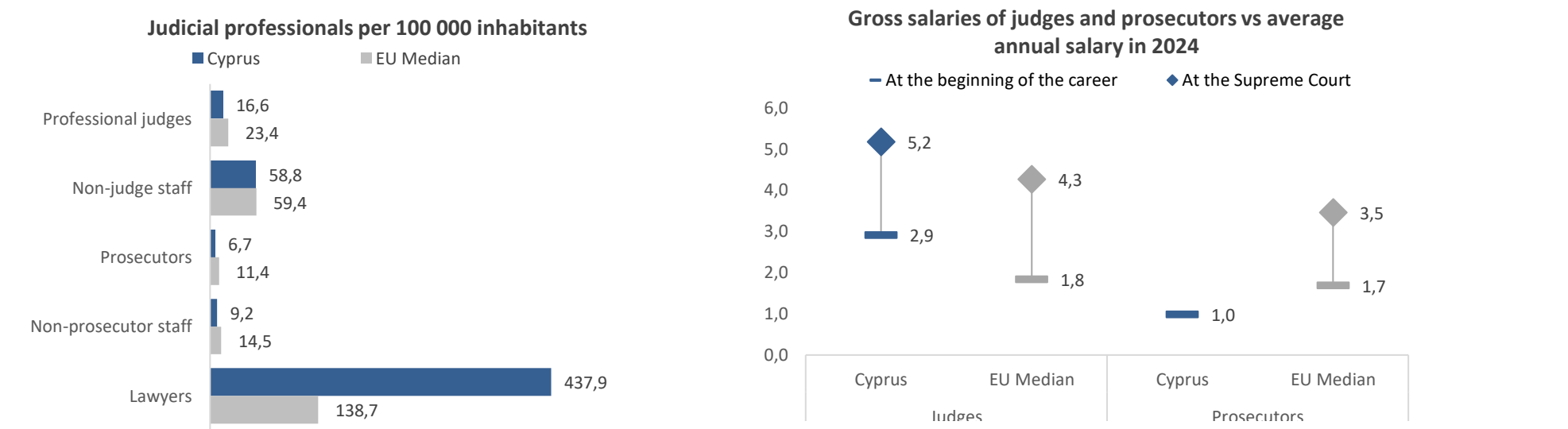

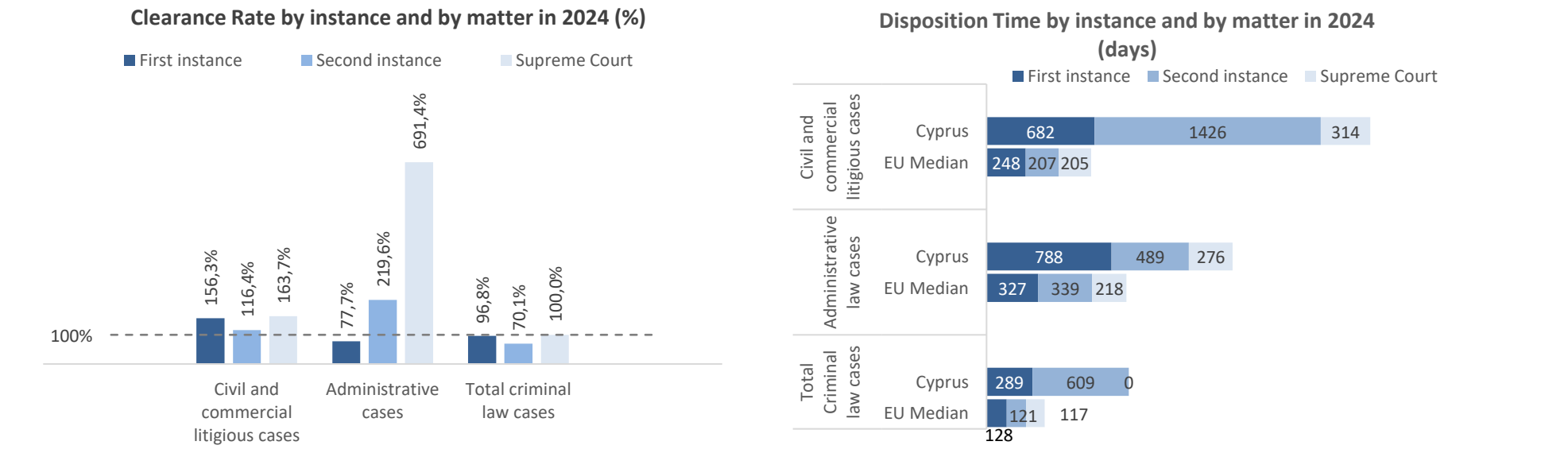

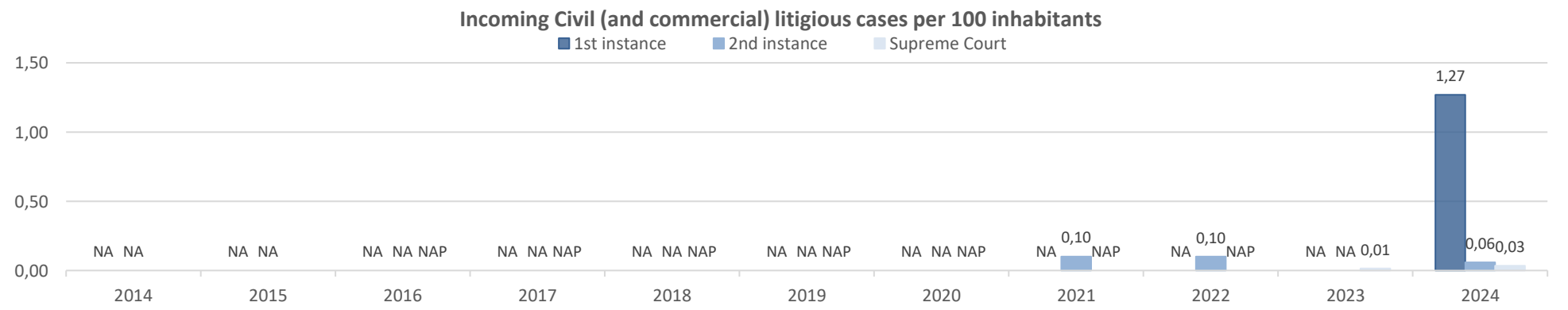

1. Judicial organisation in Cyprus (2024 data)

In 2024, In Cyprus there are 33 courts in total considered as legal entities, among which 13 are of general jurisdiction, while 20 are specilaised courts.

It is worth mentioning that in 2023 there was a core jurisdictional reform in Cyprus resulting in the establishment of a three-tier court system. Until 2023, there were only two instances in Cyprus. As of 1st of July 2023 a Supreme Constitutional Court and an Appeal Court were set up.

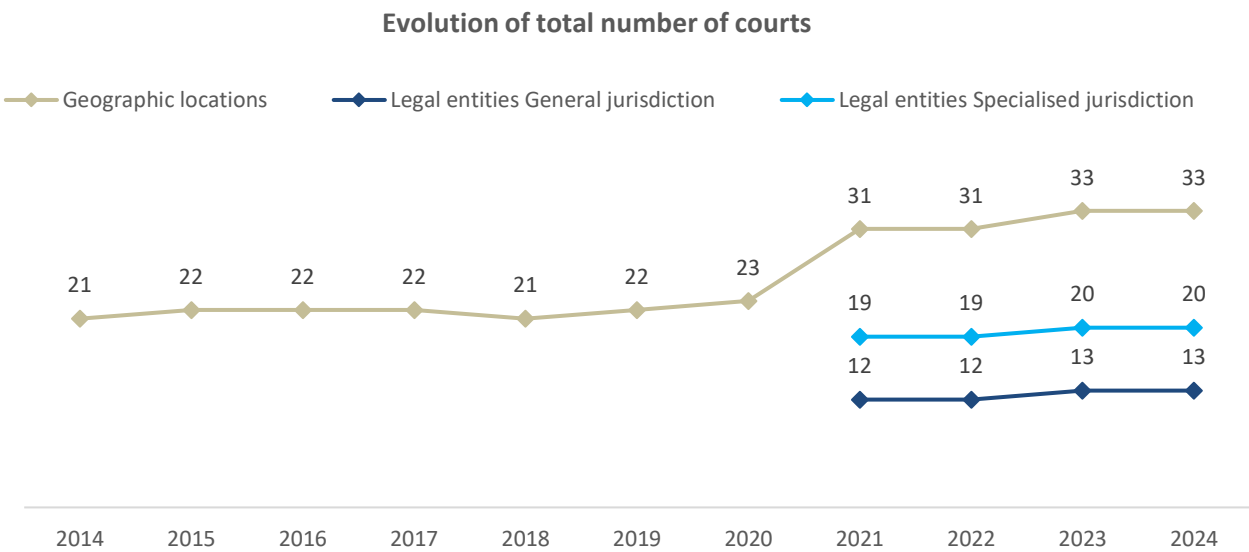
Accordingly, courts of general jurisdiction are organised in the following way: 13 courts act at first instance, the newly established Appeal court has competence to hear civil, criminal and revisional (administrative law) appeals, while the Supreme Court decides, at third and last instance on civil or criminal cases on points of law.

Concerning the 20 specialised courts, 19 are competent at first instance and one intervenes at a higher instance, namely the Supreme Constitutional Court. The latter has jurisdiction for the review of constitutionality of laws, but it also acts as a supreme administrative court.

In terms of geographic locations, in 2024 there are 33 courts in Cyprus, among which 30 act at first instance.

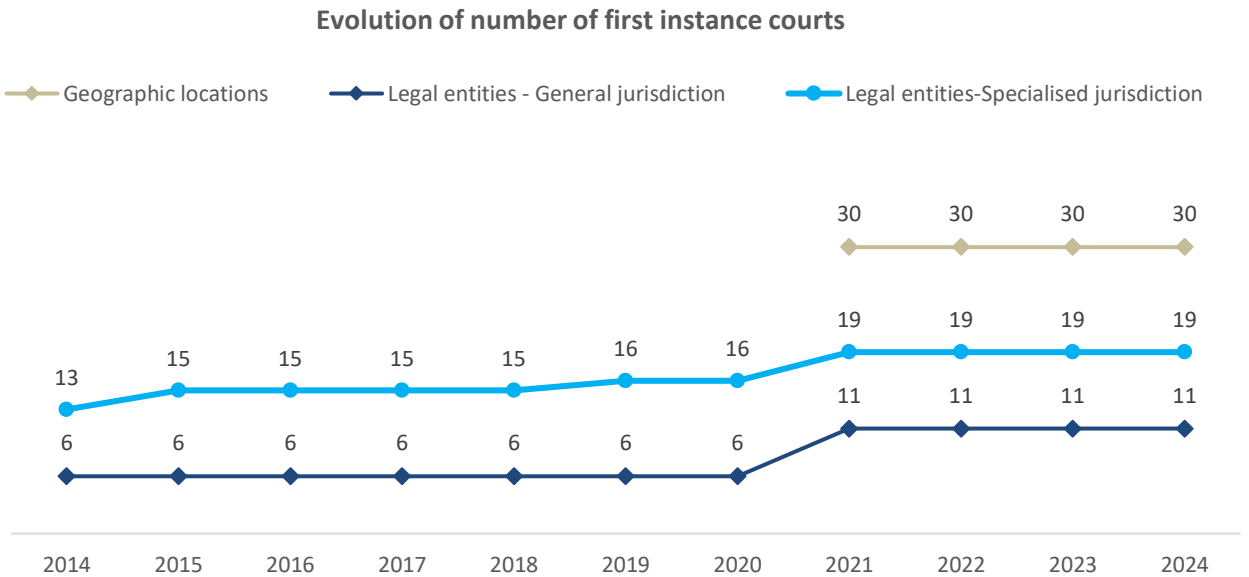

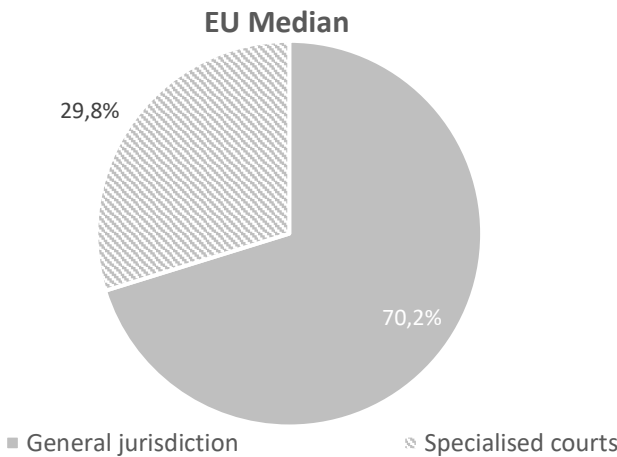
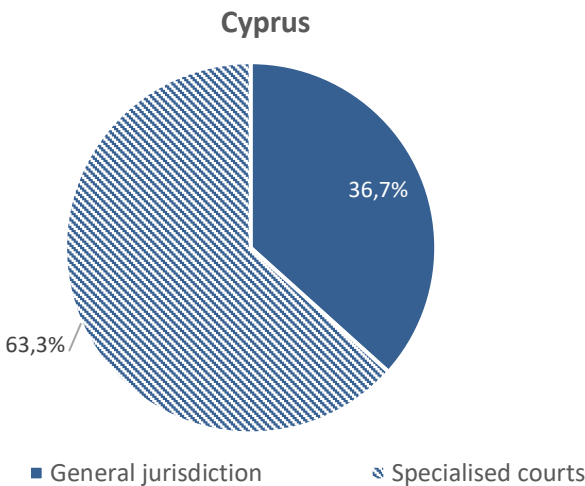
In 2023, Cyprus adopted a three-tier court system, following the establishment of an Appeal court and the Supreme Constitutional Court. The Supreme Court acts as the third and final instance in criminal and civil cases.

Distribution of first instance general jurisdiction and specialised courts



The distribution between first instance general jurisdiction courts and first instance specialised courts in Cyprus is 36,7% - 63,3%. Compared with the distribution tendency in EU (70,2% - 29,8%) one can notice that specialised courts are predominant in Cyprus, in contrast with the situation in the EU.

In 2024, there are 19 specialised courts of first instance in Cyprus among which 4 have competence in labour law, 4 intervene in family law, 3 are rent and tenancies courts, 1 is specialised in administrative law, 1 deals with military matters, 5 are Juvenile courts and the Administrative court for international protection is categorised as "other specialised court".

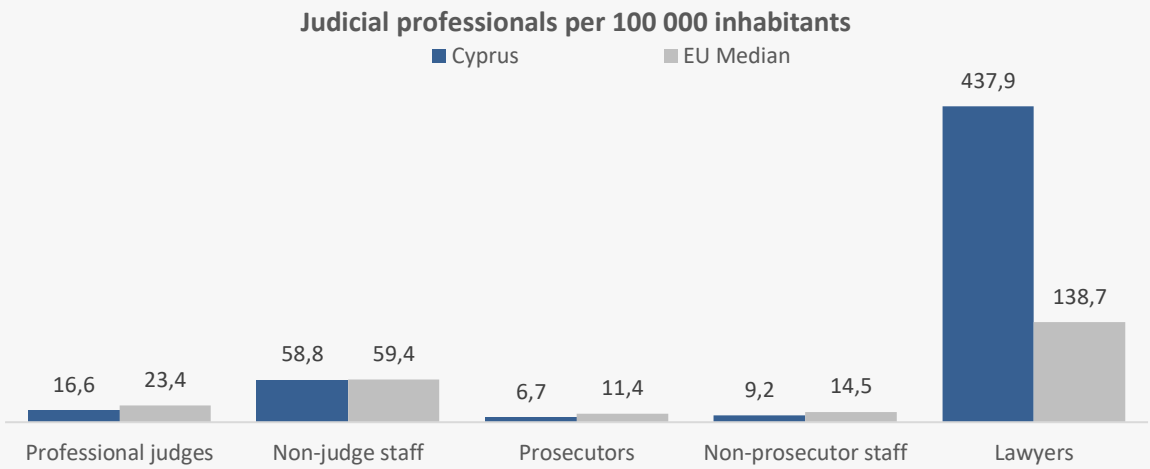
As already mentioned above, the Supreme Constitutional Court was established in July 2023. It has jurisdiction for review of constitutionality of laws, but it also acts as the Supreme Administrative Court. Accordingly, it is considered as a specialised court acting at a higher instance.

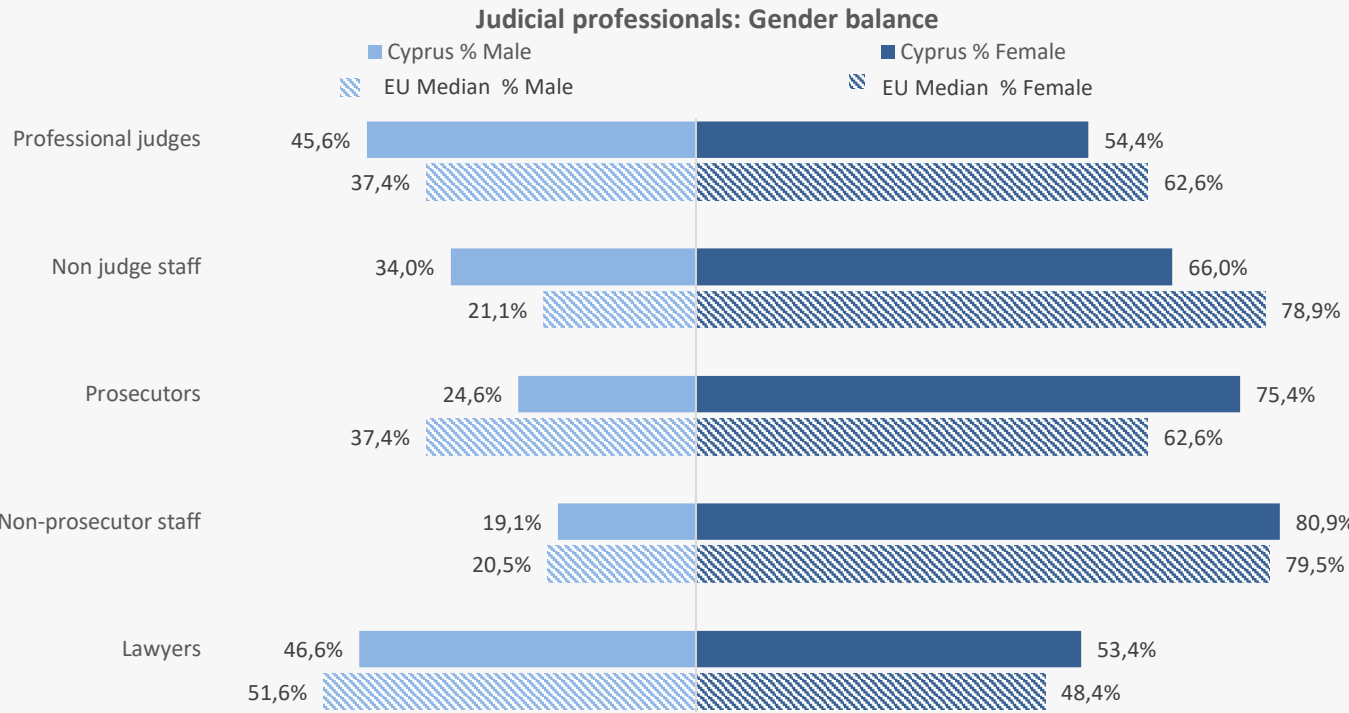

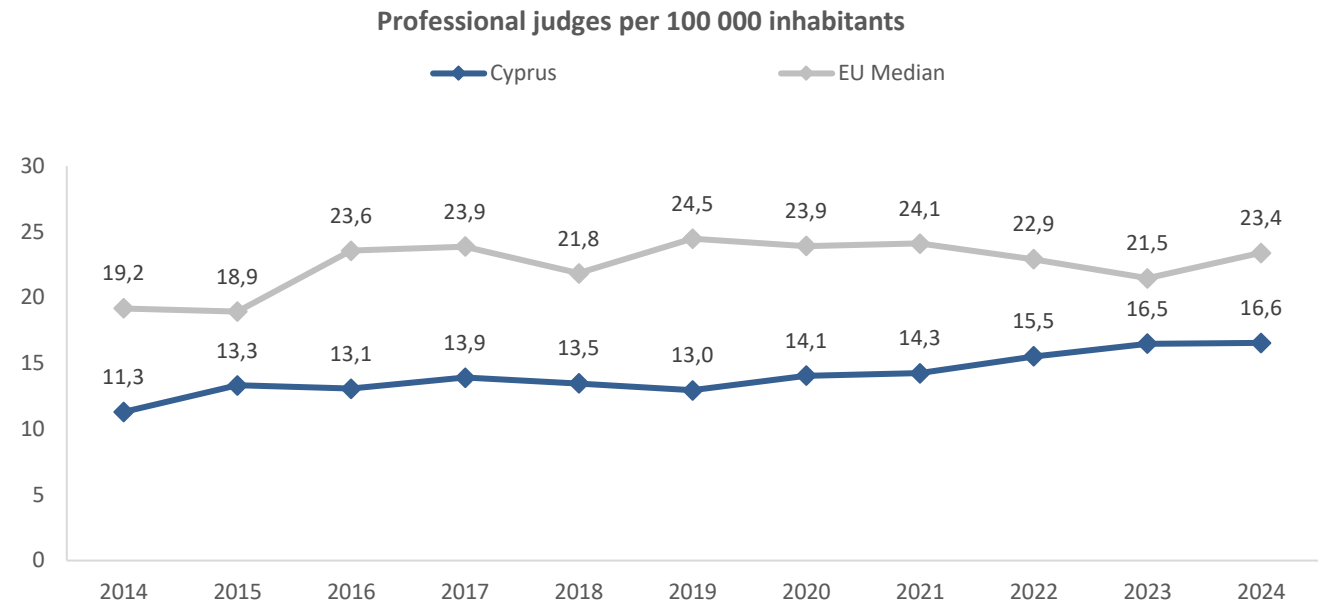

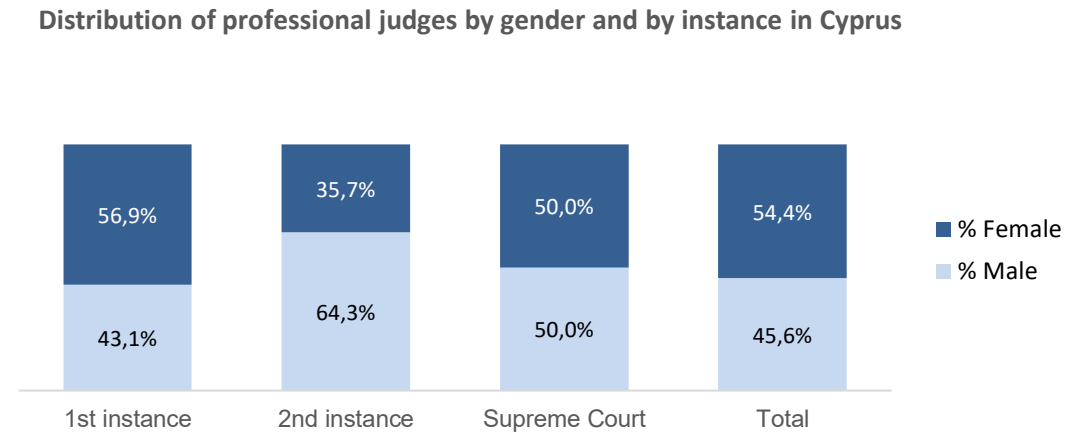
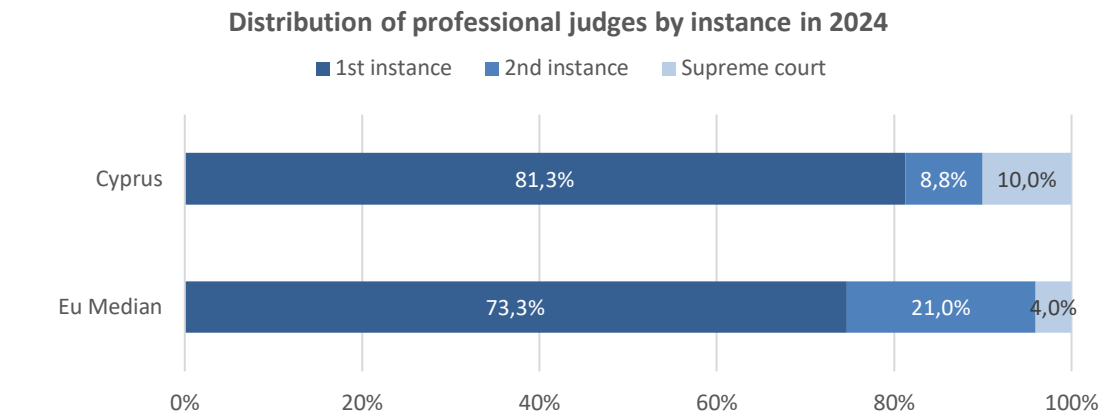


According to the 2024 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Cyprus is 160, which is 3,9% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Cyprus, there are 16,6 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants).

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 87, which represents 54,4% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 130 are sitting in the first instance courts (of whom 74 are female); 14 are sitting in the second instance courts (of whom 5 are female) and 16 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of whom 8 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, in Cyprus first instance judges prove to be more predominant than in the EU. Conversely, there are half as many second instance judges as in the EU, while the percentage of Supreme Court judges is higher in Cyprus than in the EU.

As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of judges, the latter has been affected by the 2023 reform, namely the introduction of a three-tier court system. Judges are distributed among the different instances in the following way: at first instance are considered judges of the 11 first instance courts of general jurisdiction as well as those of the 19 specialised first instance courts; as second instance judges are counted those of the newly established Appeal court; data on last instance judges include the Supreme Court Judges (7) and the Supreme Constitutional Court Judges (9).

As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of judges, it should be noted that Supreme Court judges include the Judges of the Supreme court (7 Judges; 3 female and 4 male) and of the Supreme Constitutional Court (9 judges; 5 Female 4 male).

The number of judges of the Court of appeal is 16. In 2024 two positions remained vacant following retirement.

As regards the distribution of the number of judges among the different judicial instances, Cyprus presents some peculiarities which should be mentioned. Namely, at second instance, Cyprus has much less judges compared to the EU median, while there are more judges at the highest instance (10% compared to 4% on an EU level).

As regards the distribution male/female, it has to be specified that female judges are under represented at second instance, while there is parity of judges at Supreme Court level.

In Cyprus, the distribution of judges by category is possible at first and second instance. At the Supreme Court, judges are competent for both civil and criminal cases.

District judges deal with both criminal and civil cases. However, they are assigned either civil or criminal jurisdiction for a specified period of time.

The Appeal court is divided into chambers each dealing with specific matters.

The Supreme court deals with Civil and Criminal cases. The Supreme Constitutional Court deals with constitutional cases and administrative cases at a last instance.

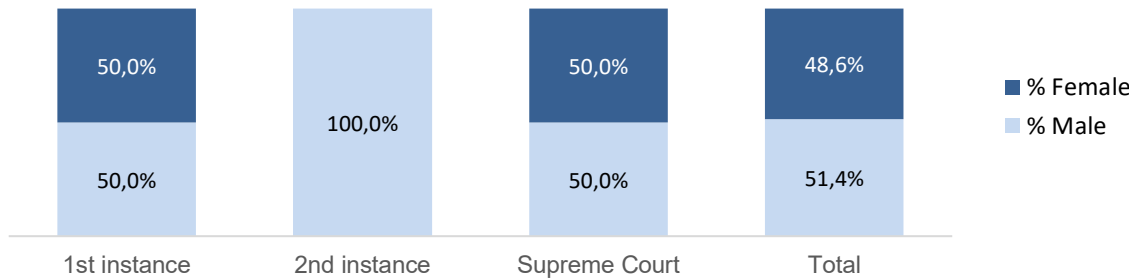
The category "Other" refers to the military court.

In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 18, which represents 48,6% of the total number of court presidents.

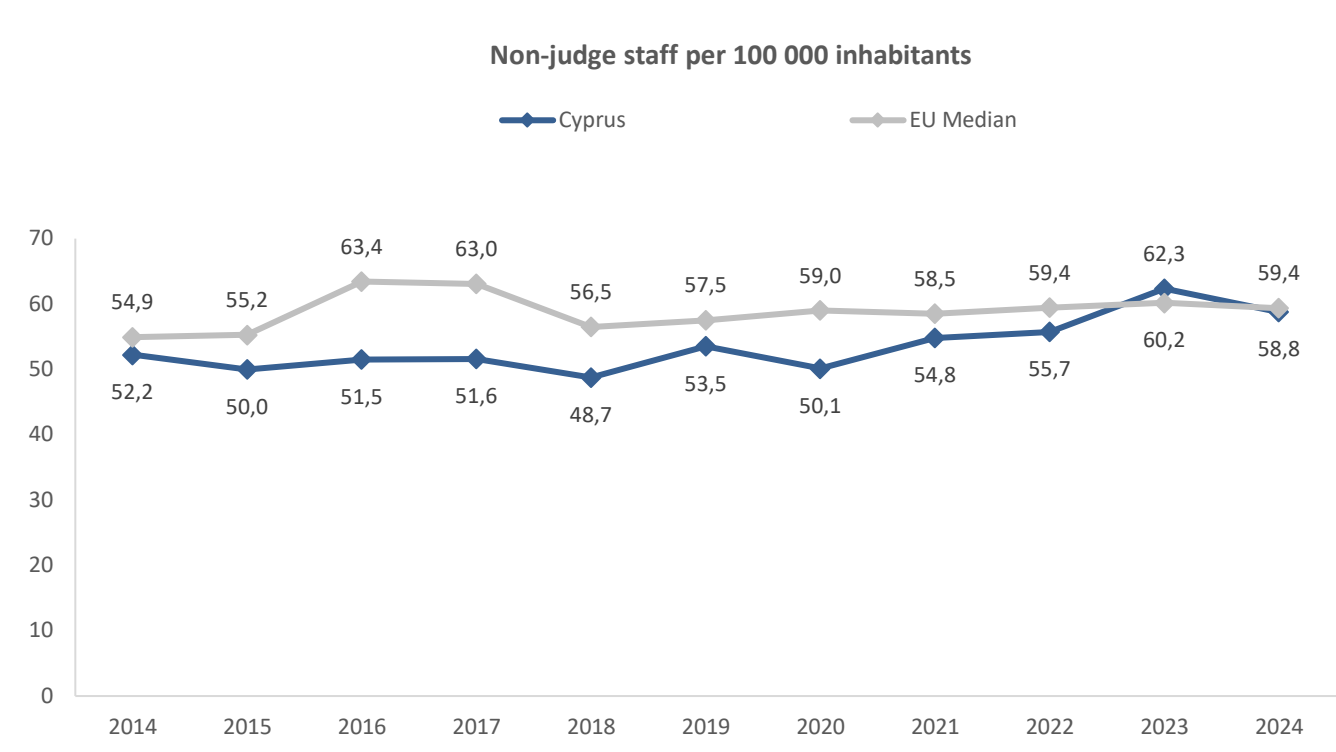
The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 34 are sitting in first instance courts (of whom 17 are female); one male sitting in second instance courts and two are sitting in the Supreme Court (of whom one is female).

District courts can have more than one court president.

It is worth recalling that following the 2023 reform, there are two presidents at the Supreme Court level - the one of the Supreme Court and the one of the Supreme Constitutional Court.

In 2024, Cyprus has 568 non-judge staff (of whom 375 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals a decrease of -2,4%.

In 2024, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has decreased (from 62,3 in 2023 to 58,8 in 2024).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 16,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2023 to 16,6 in 2024.

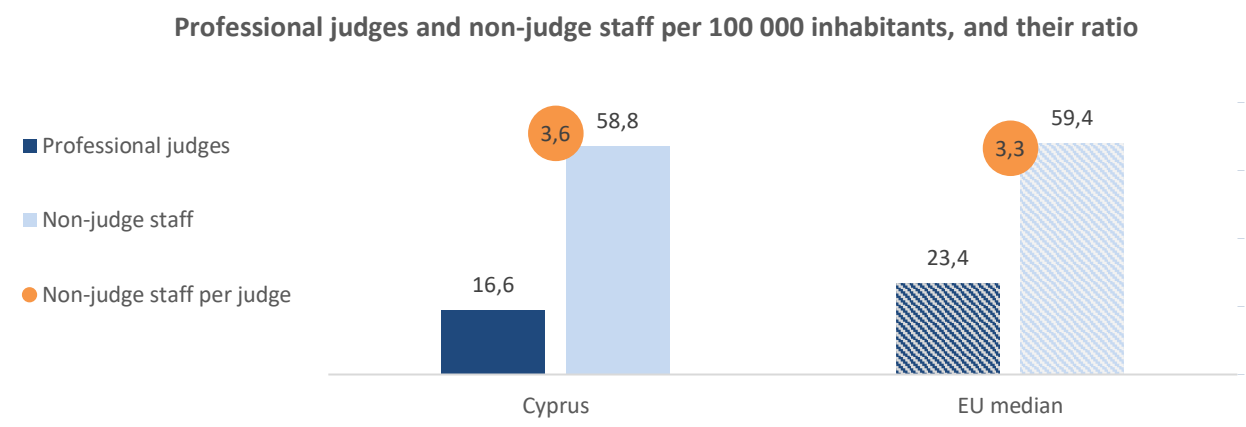
In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:

- 192 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of whom 178 are Female);
- 156 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of whom 132 are Female);
- 176 technical staff (of whom 47 are Female);
- 44 other (of whom 18 are Female);

The total number of non-judge staff includes clerical staff and also court bailiffs.

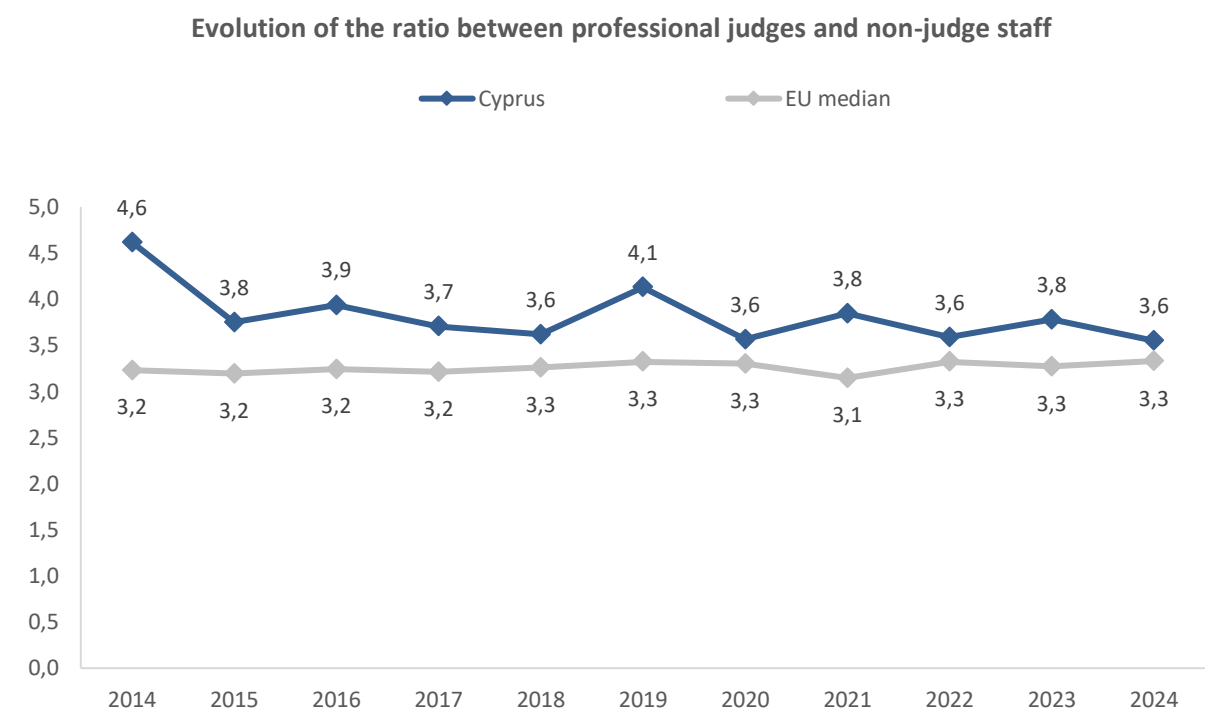


In Cyprus, there are 16,6 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 3,6 non-judge staff per judge.

There is no significant difference compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 3,8 non-judge staff per judge.

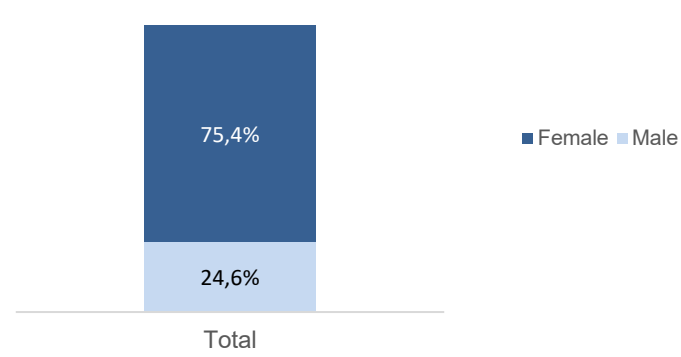

In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 49, which represents 75,4% of the total number of prosecutors. Prosecutors can intervene at all instances.

When presenting the data on public prosecutors, it's important to note that the Criminal Section of the Legal Service of the Republic is staffed by both counsels and public prosecutors. Both groups handle criminal cases before the courts, but only the number of public prosecutors is included in the table.

In terms of gender distribution, female public prosecutors make up a significant majority of all prosecutors in Cyprus.

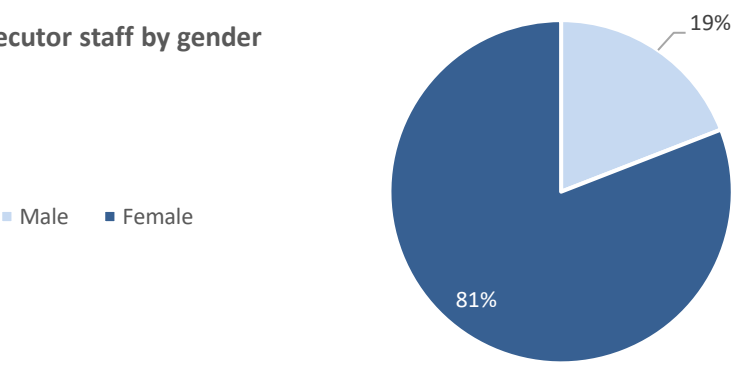
Distribution of Heads of prosecution services by gender and by instance in Cyprus

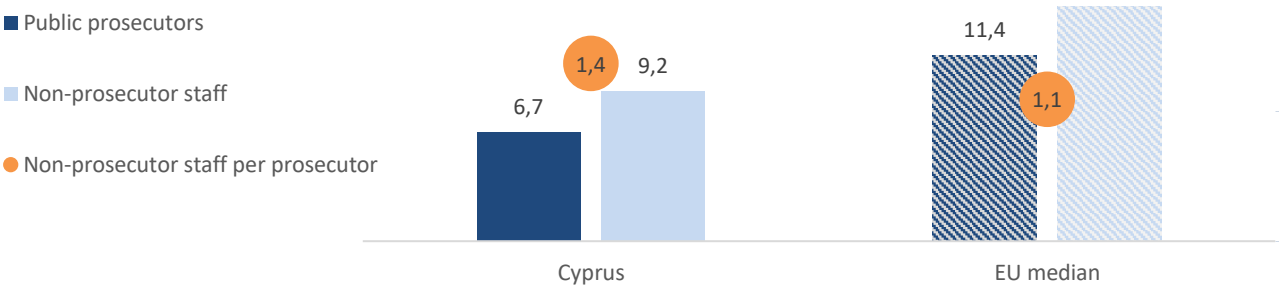

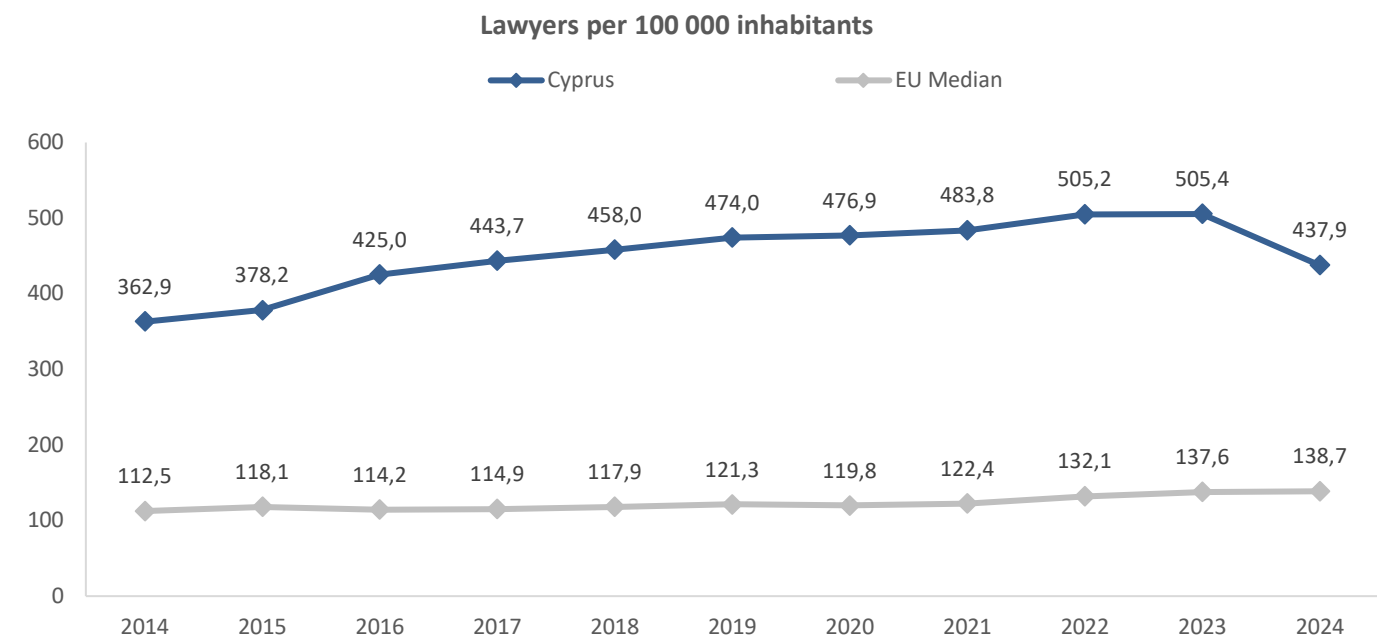
Public prosecutors and non-prosecutor staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio

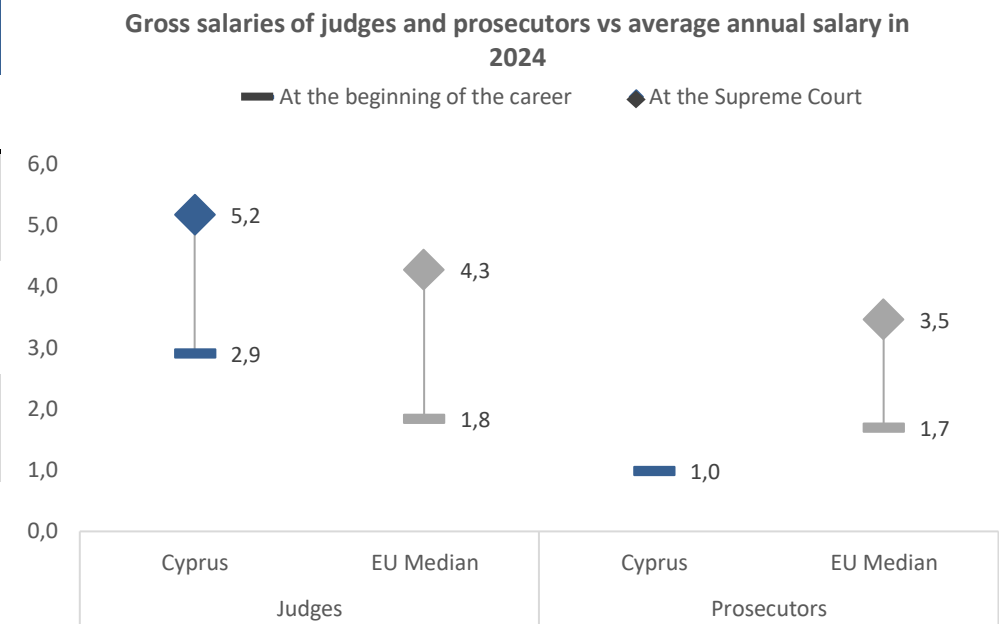
In 2024, there are 4 232 lawyers, which is -10,3% less than in 2023.

There are 2 258 female lawyers which is 53% of the total.

Cyprus has 437,9 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is quite above the EU median of 138,7 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 153 676€.

According to 2024 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Cyprus is 86 815€, which is quite above the EU median of 61 347€ (42% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 2,9 times higher (the EU median is 1,8).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary of a judge is from 54 719€ to 298 911€. Cyprus's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is 27% above the EU median of 121 591€

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 106 135€.

In 2024, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Cyprus of 29 506€ is rather below the EU median of 52 969€ (-44% below).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career is 1 time higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 013€ and the maximum is 254 088€. The EU median is 94 385€.

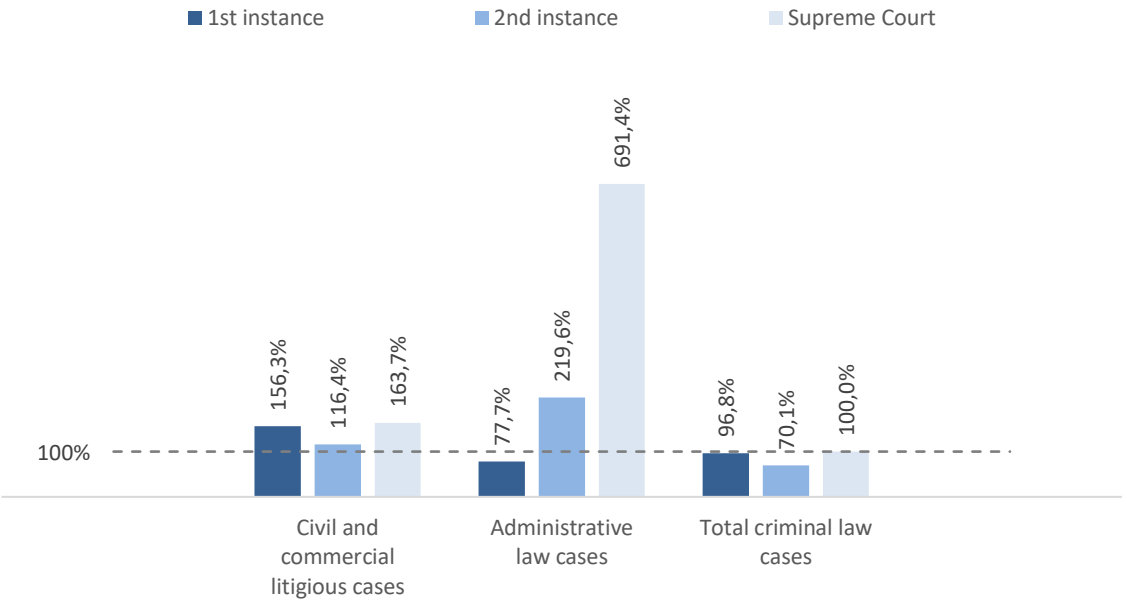
The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.

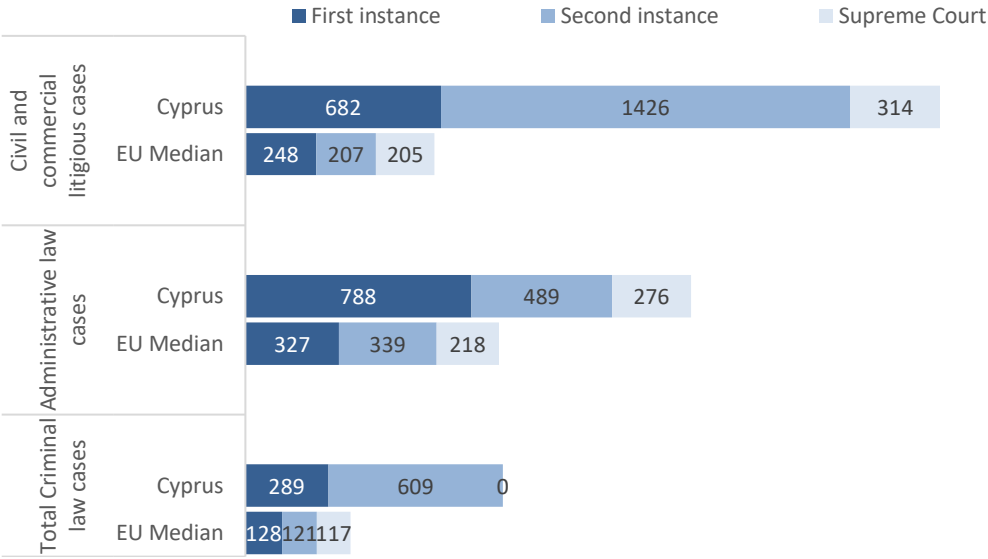

At the outset, it is worth recalling that in 2023 Cyprus adopted a three-tier court system with the establishment of the Appeal court, the Supreme Court and the Supreme Constitutional Court. Following the reform, appeals filed after 2018 were transferred to the new Appeal Court, while civil and criminal appeals filed before 2018 remained at the Supreme Court. The Supreme Constitutional Court is the third instance in administrative matters.

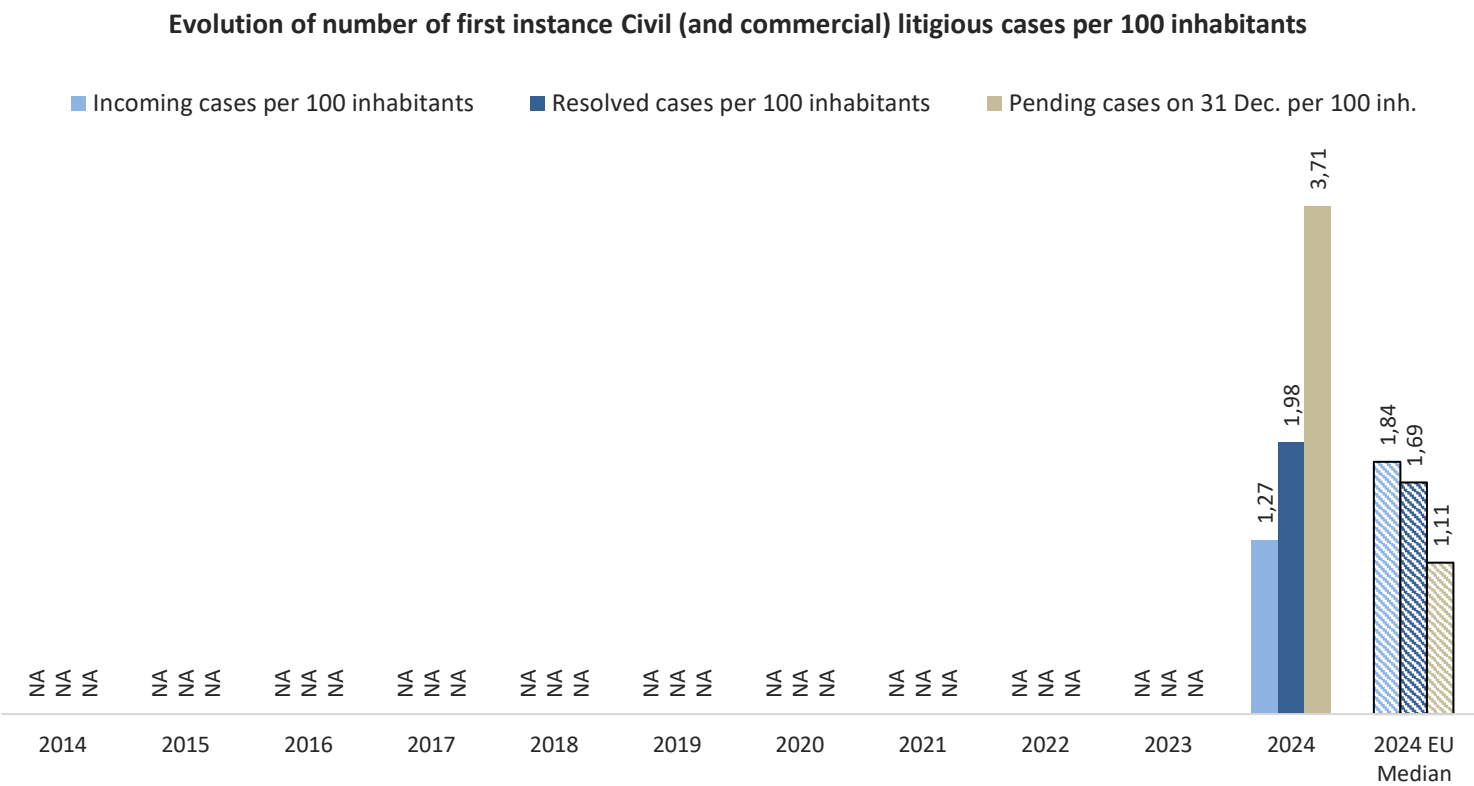
Clearance rates in civil and commercial cases exceed 100% at all instances, while administrative law cases show exceptionally high clearance rate particularly at Supreme Court level. As the Supreme Court was re-established, more cases were tried at third instance. Criminal cases were also largely kept under control, with clearance rates close to or reaching full clearance at first and last instance. Second instance criminal cases however, show a much lower Clearance Rate. This should be interpreted by taking into account that the reference date for the previous cycle was 1st of July 2023 when the Court of Appeal was established, which explains the variatons not necessarily reflecting a real surge in caseload or efficiency.

Despite this positive Clearance Rate, case disposition time remains very long, especially at the second-instance level for civil and commercial and criminal cases. Civil and commercial cases experience particularly significant delays, with second-instance proceedings lasting on average over three years. Administrative cases also show prolonged disposition times across all instances. In 2024 there is a decrease in the resolved administrative cases as the courts have to go into the subject matter of the case. Since 2023 the profile and nationality of filed cases have shifted significantly. The Court's backlog has transitioned from being primarily composed of applicants from South and Southeast Asia, to a predominance of cases from Sub-Saharan Africa. Previously decision making was comparatively faster, as many of the appeals from Asian applicants involved largely unfounded or purely financial claims. The newer composition however, tends to have more complex and substantive cases, as is evident by the increased rate in positive decisions, requiring a deeper examination. While this has led to longer processing times, the overall backlog has remained relatively stable, after an initial increase, owing to a concurrent reduction in the overall numbers of appeals filed.

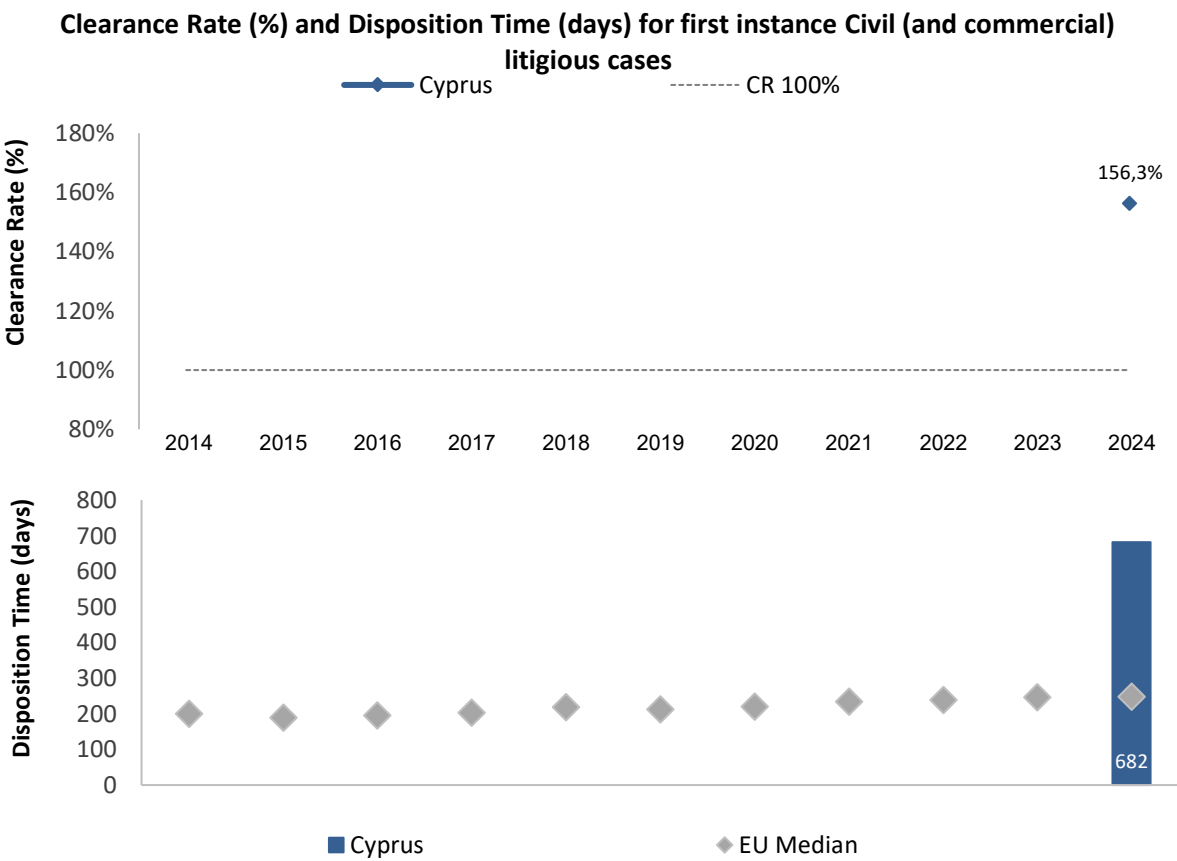

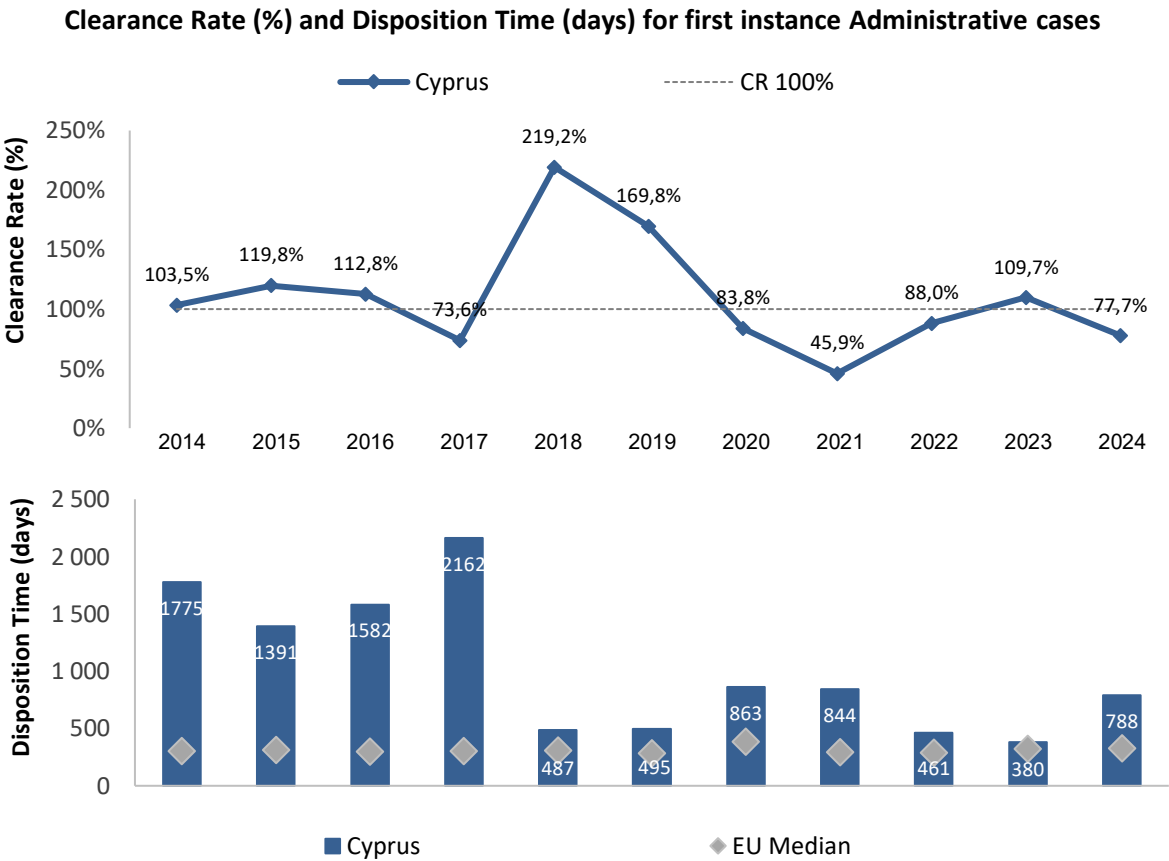

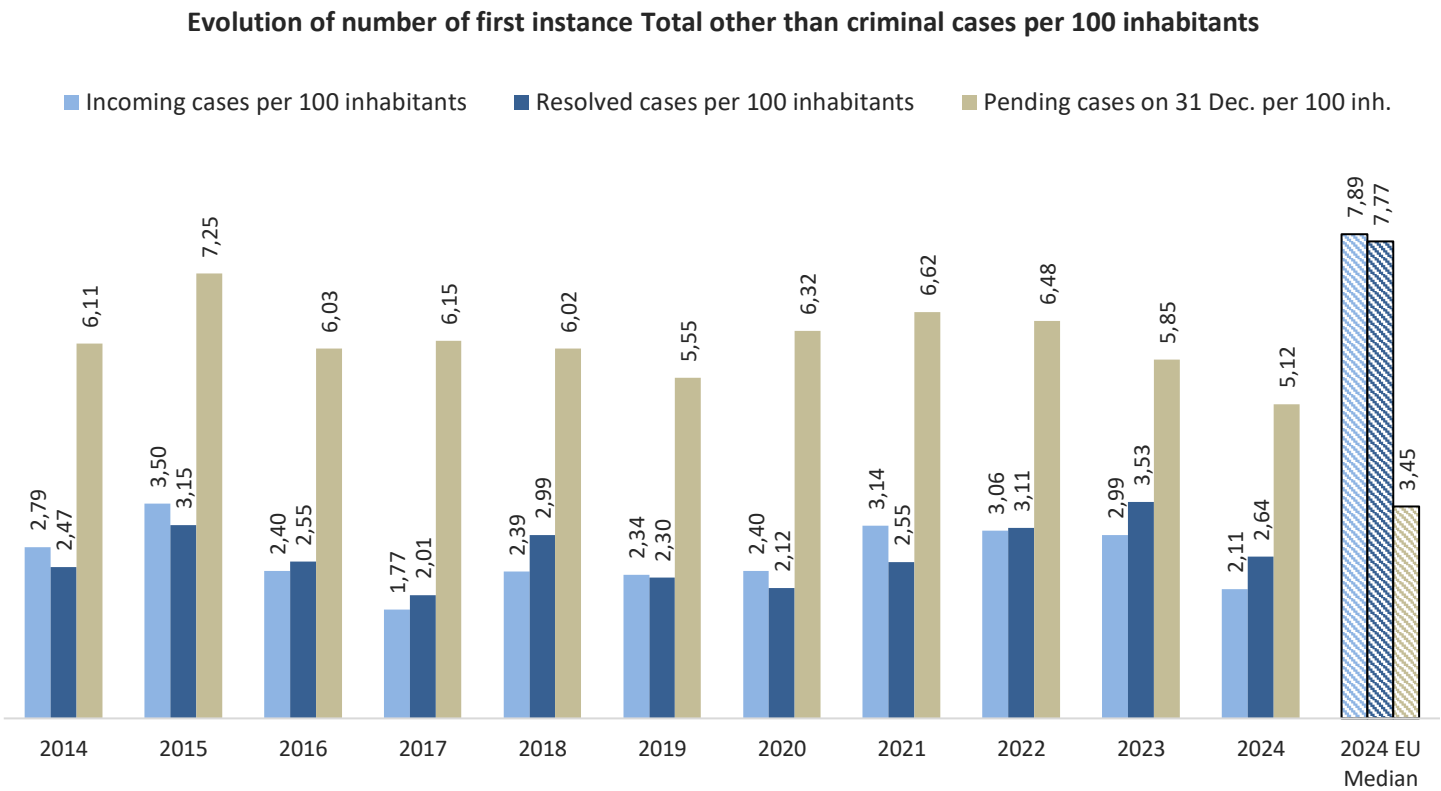

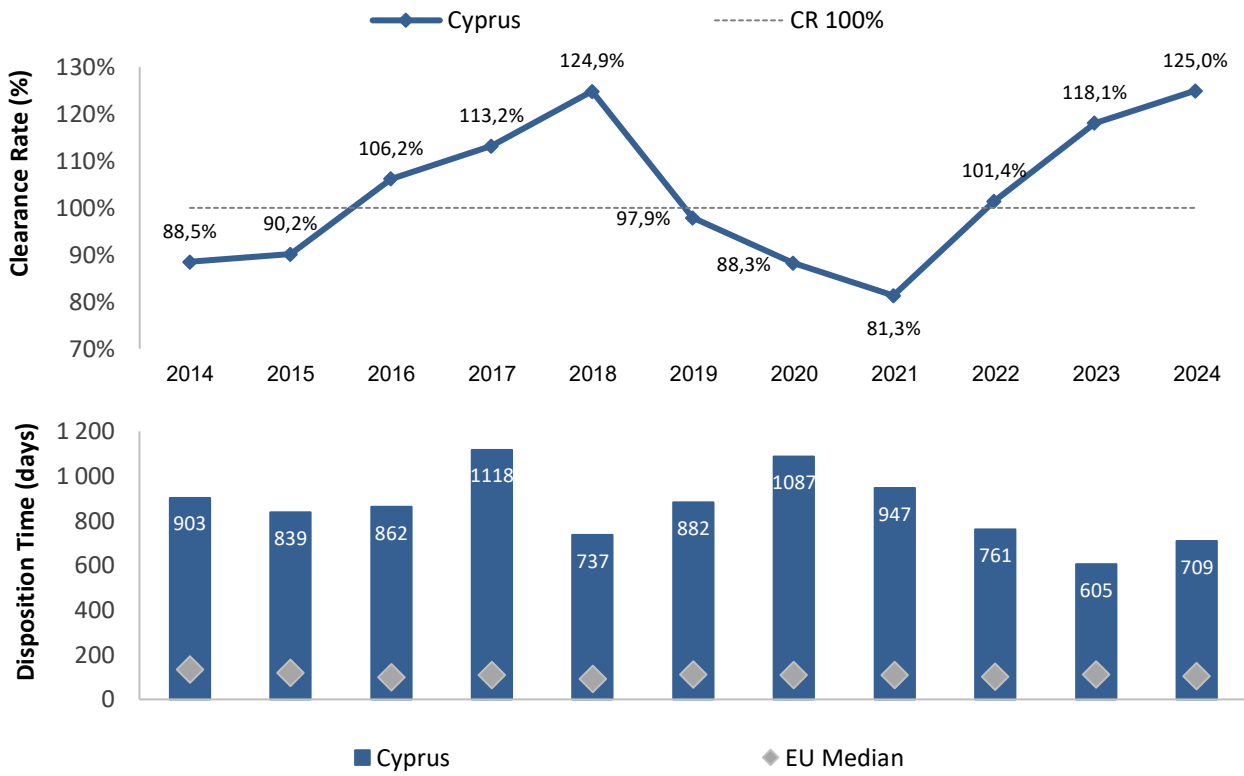

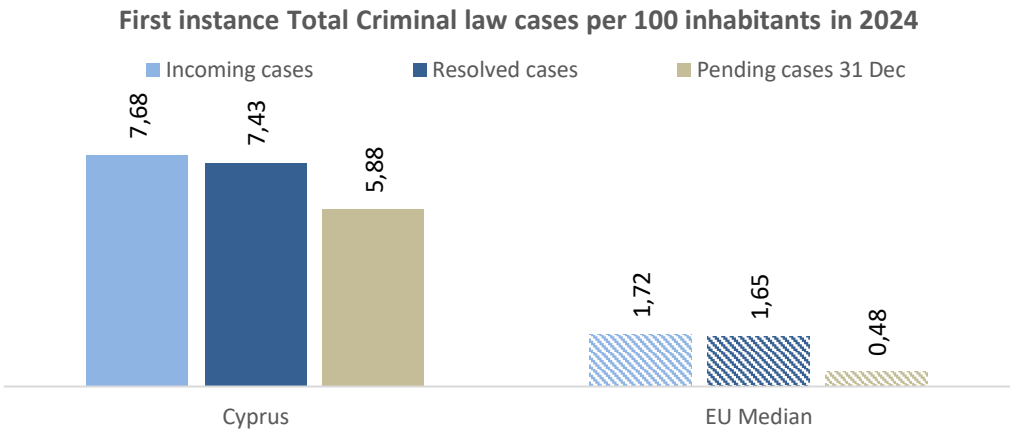

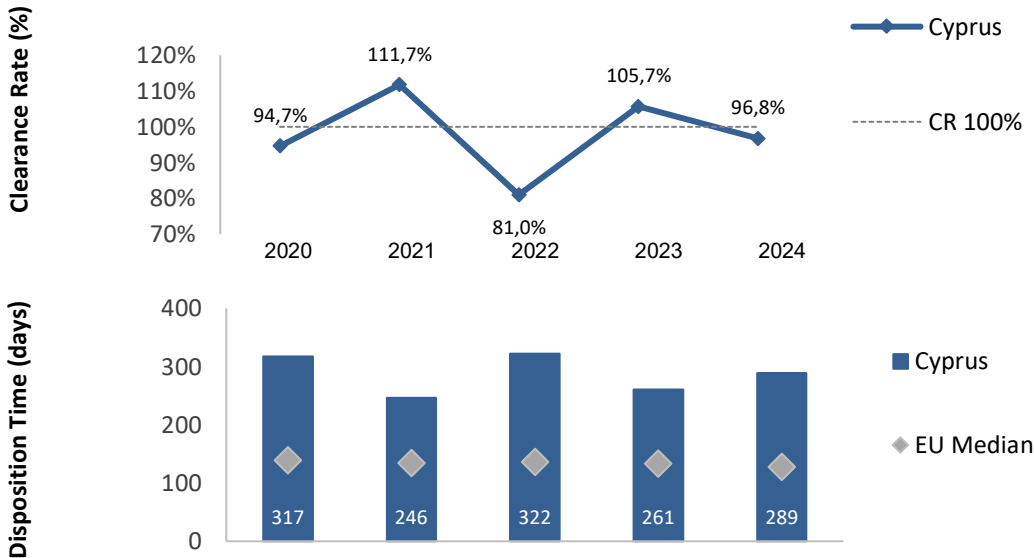

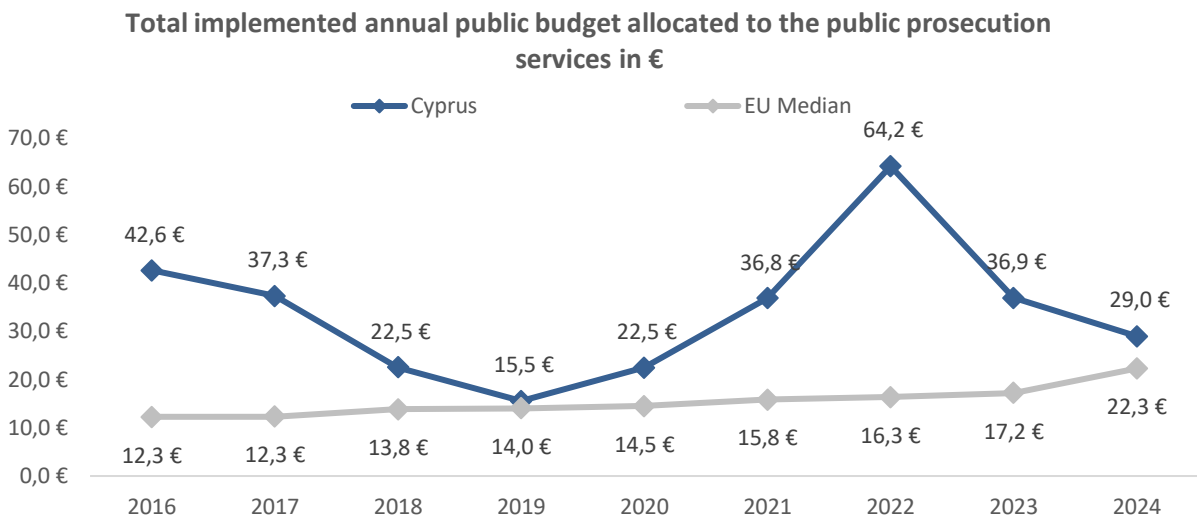

According to the Mediation in Civil Matters Law of 2012 (Law 159(I)/2012), there are two Registers of Mediators which are kept by the Minister of Justice and Public Order: (1) the Register of Mediators where the mediation in question concerns commercial dispute and (2) the Register of Mediators where the mediation in question concerns civil dispute, other than commercial.

A person, in order to be registered in the Register of Mediators in commercial disputes must: (a) (i) be enrolled in the Roll of Advocates and holds an annual license of practicing as an advocate in accordance with the Advocate’s Law, or (ii) be a member of the Cyprus Chamber of Commerce and Industry or the Cyprus Scientific and Technical Chamber, is the holder of a recognized university degree and has attended a special training programme to become a mediator of total forty (40) hours, organized by the Cyprus Chamber of Commerce and Industry, or the Technical Chamber of Cyprus, or has attended an equivalent programme; (b) does not hold any public post, either permanent, or temporary, or by substitution in the public service; (c) has not been convicted of a serious criminal offence or an offence involving dishonesty or moral turpitude; (d) is not under a trusteeship or guardianship and s/he is not deprived of his/her legal capacity; (e) pay a registration fee of €30 in the Minister of Justice and Public Order.

A person, in order to be registered in the Register of Mediators in civil disputes other than commercial must: (a) be enrolled in the Roll of Advocates and holds an annual license of practising as an advocate in accordance with the Advocate’s Law and shall submit to the Minister certification that he has attended a programme of training as a Mediator; (b) does not hold any public post, either permanent, or temporary, or by substitution in the public service; (c) has not been convicted of a serious criminal offence or an offence involving dishonesty or moral turpitude; (d) is not under a trusteeship or guardianship and he is not deprived of his legal capacity; (e) pay a registration fee of €30 in the Minister of Justice and Public Order.

Also, every person who is registered in the Registers of Mediators, must continue her/his training in mediation matters, attending at least twenty-four (24) hours of education every three (3) years from the date of his/her registration, and submit a relevant certification to the Minister.
