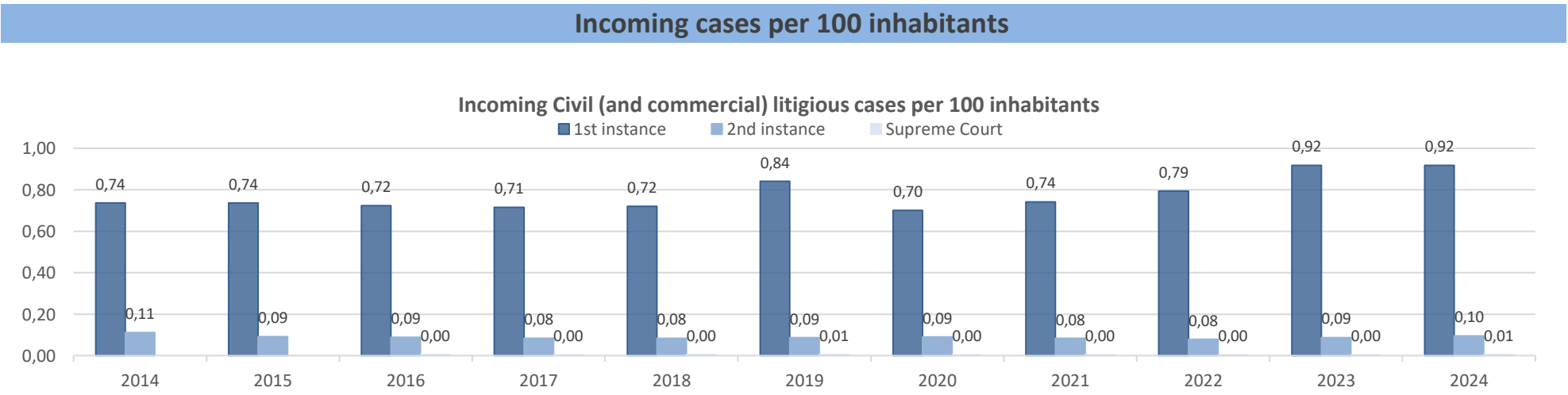
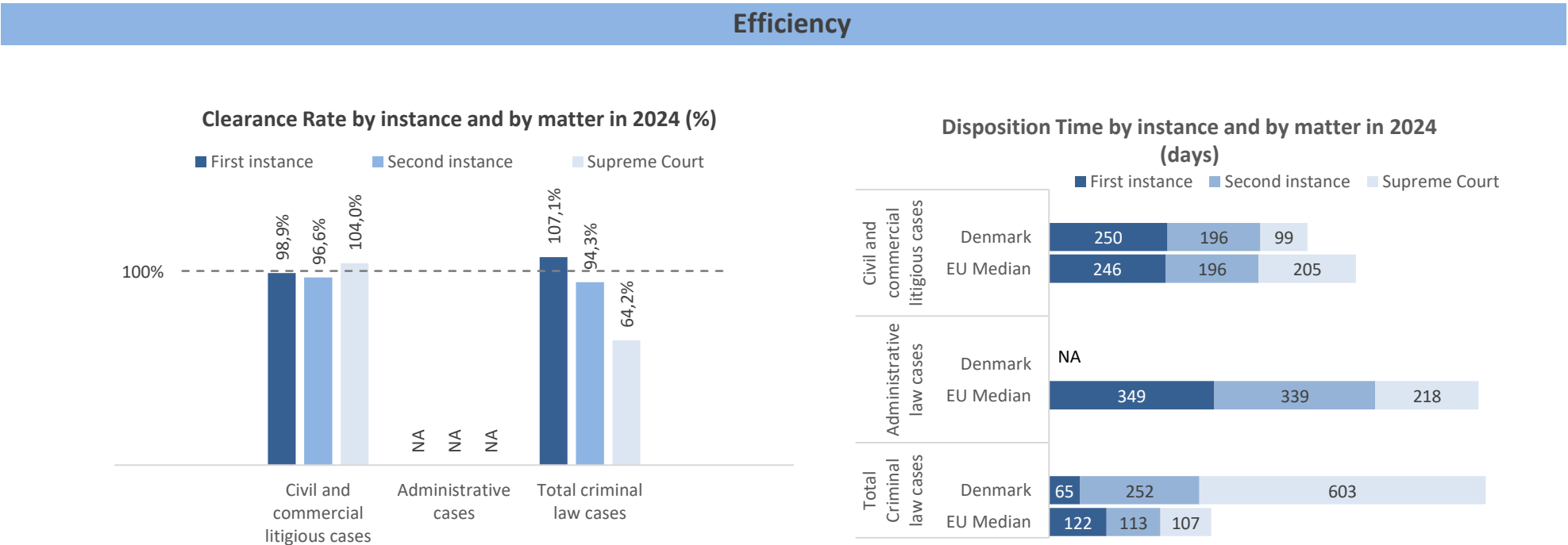
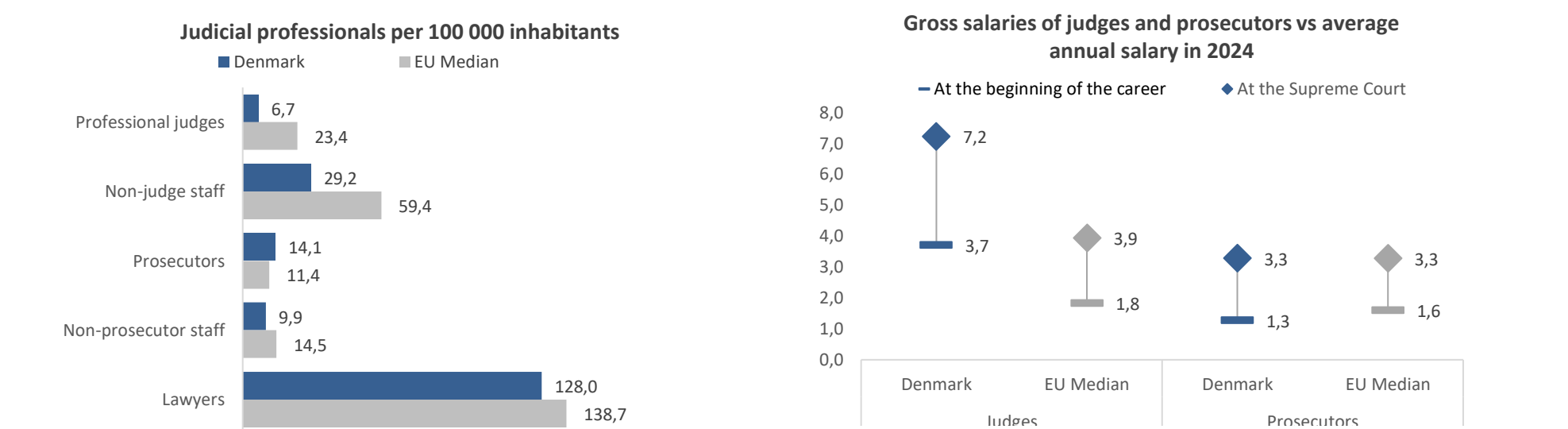

1. Judicial organisation in Denmark (2024 data)

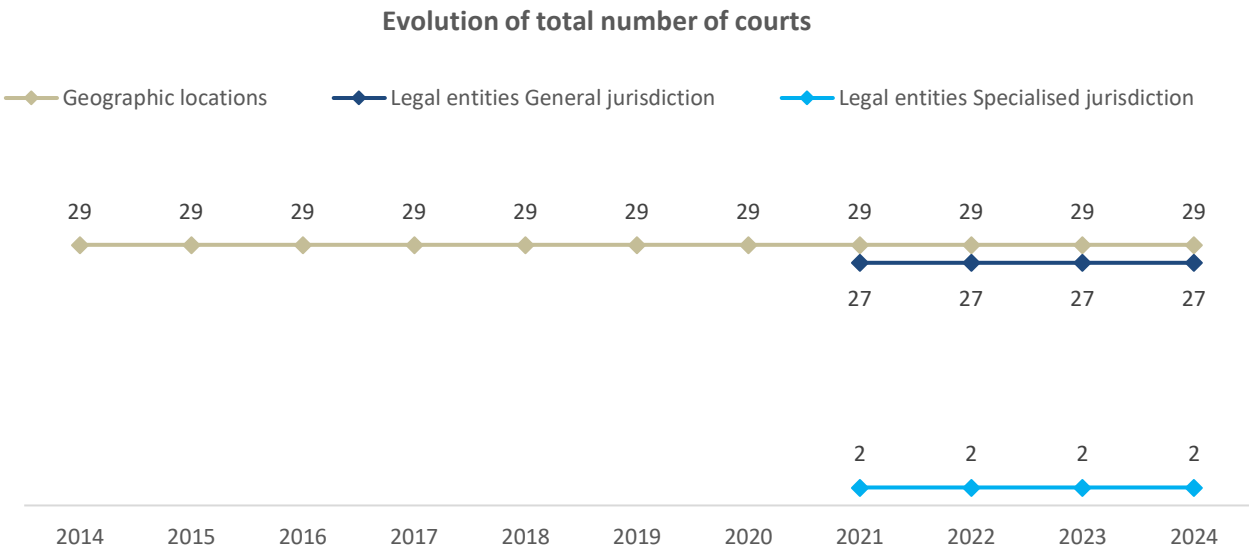
According to the 2024 data, the Danish court system is composed of 29 legal entities, among which 27 are of general jurisdiction, while two have specialised competence. More precisely, the 27 courts of general jurisdiction encompass 24 District Courts intervening at first instance, two High Courts dealing with appeals, and the Supreme Court.

The Land Registration Court and the Maritime and Commercial Court are considered as first-instance specialised courts.

In terms of geographic locations, there are 29 courts among which there are 26 courts of first instance, which include the 24 District Courts as well as the Land Registration Court and the Maritime and Commercial Court.

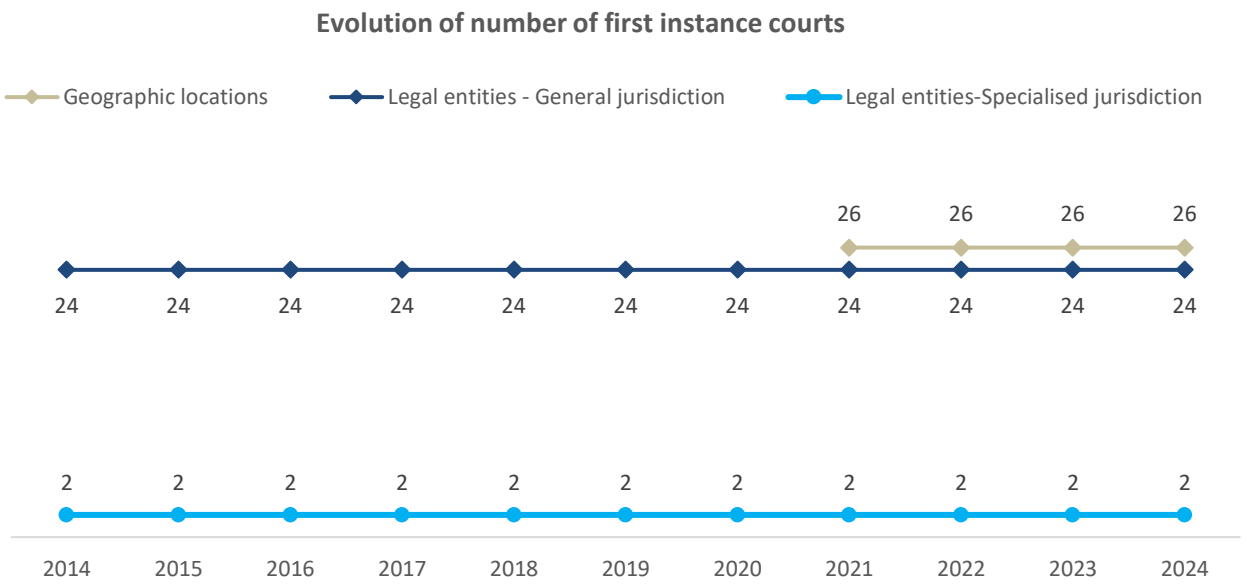

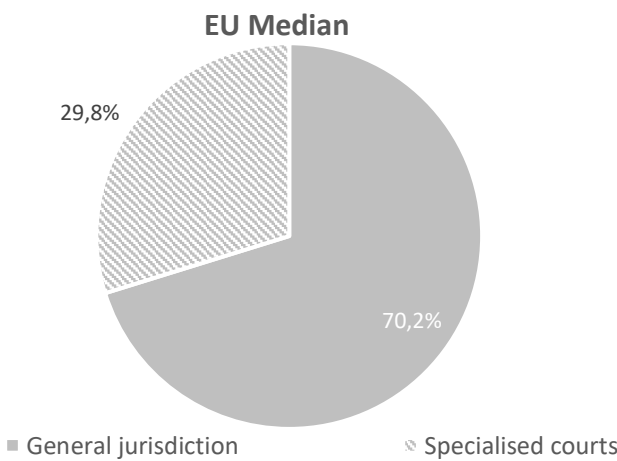
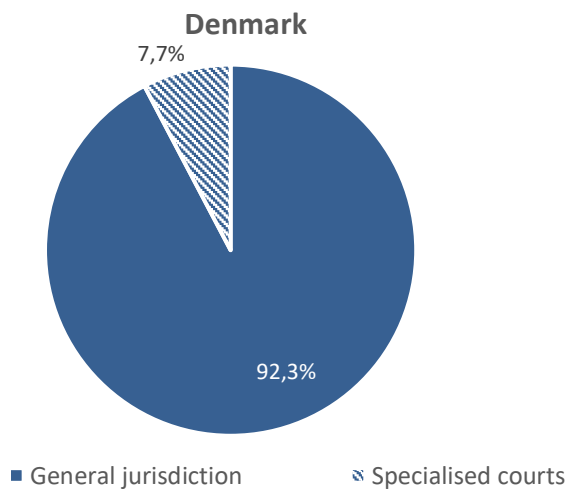

In Denmark, there are only two specialised courts acting as legal entities at first instance. The Maritime and Commercial Court handles commercial cases and, to a significant extent, insolvency cases, such as bankruptcies, though not exclusively. The Land Registration Court, on the other hand, was established in 2009.

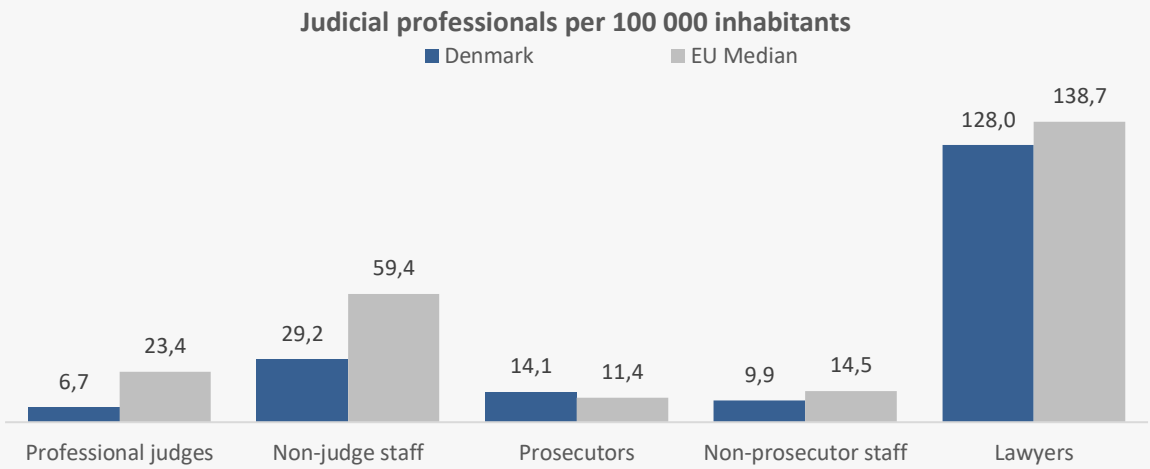
Juvenile courts do not exist as separate entities. Instead, cases involving juveniles fall under the jurisdiction of the District Courts, where a Juvenile Board ensures special care for such matters. Similarly, family courts are not independent legal entities but operate as sections within the District Courts. There is also one military court, but it does not fall under the authority of the Danish Courts Administration.

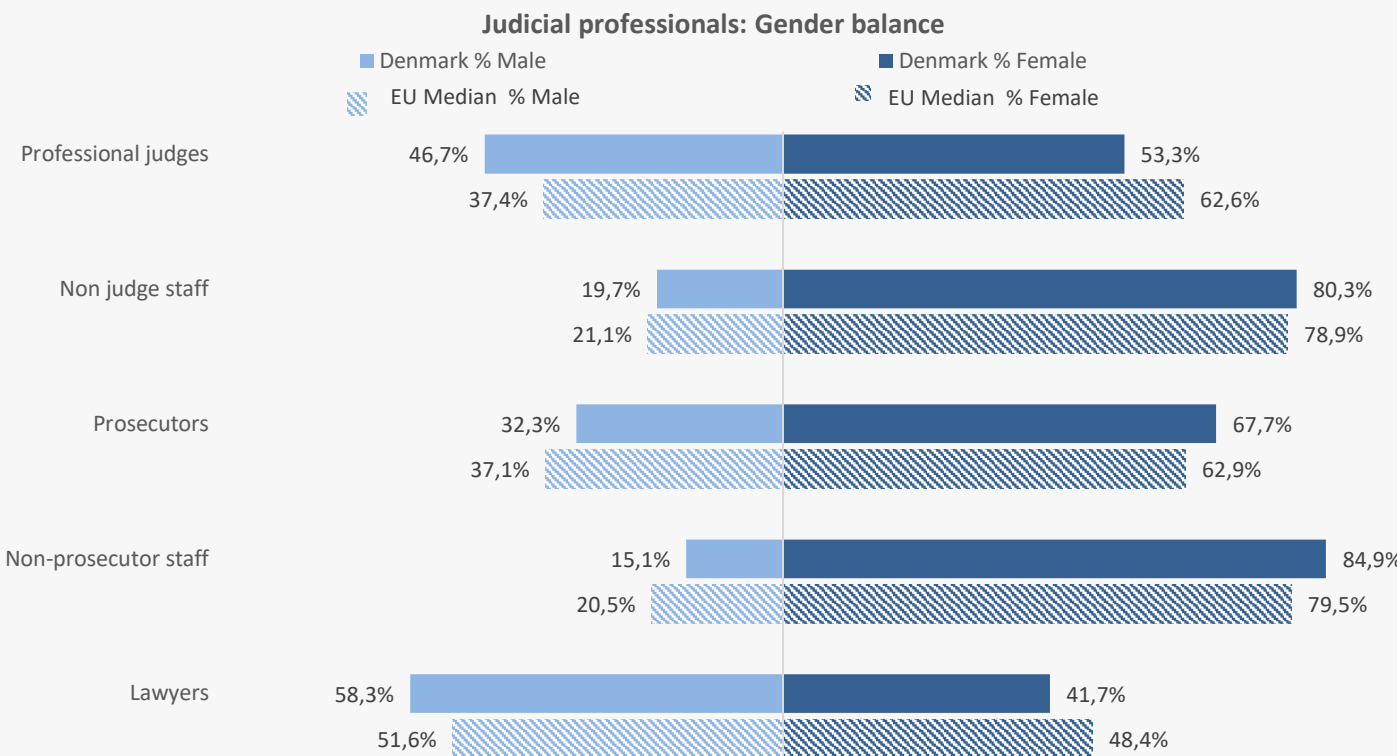

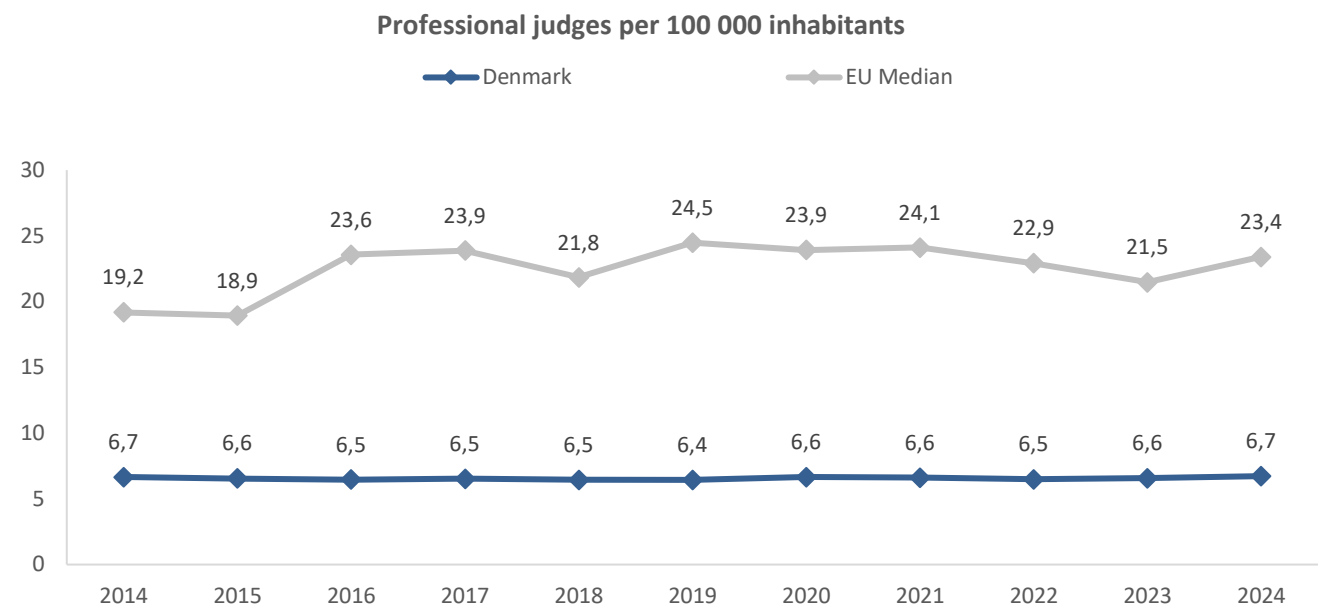

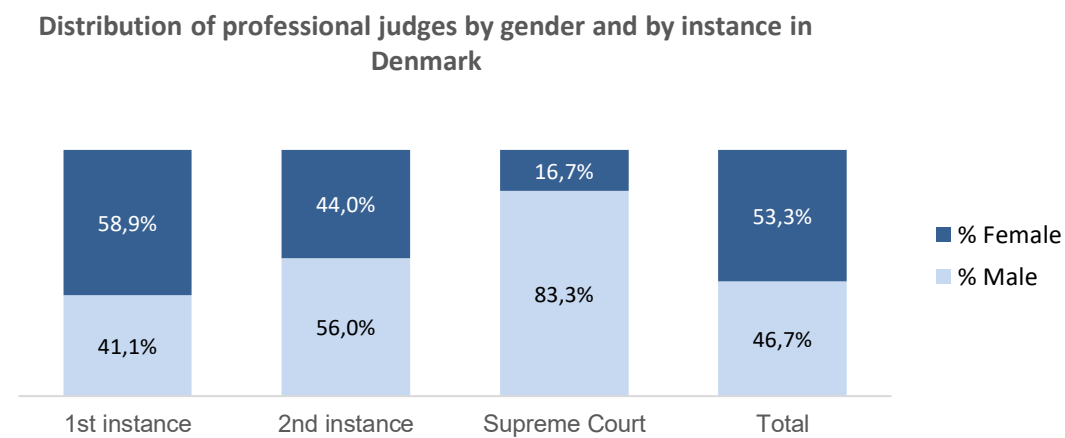
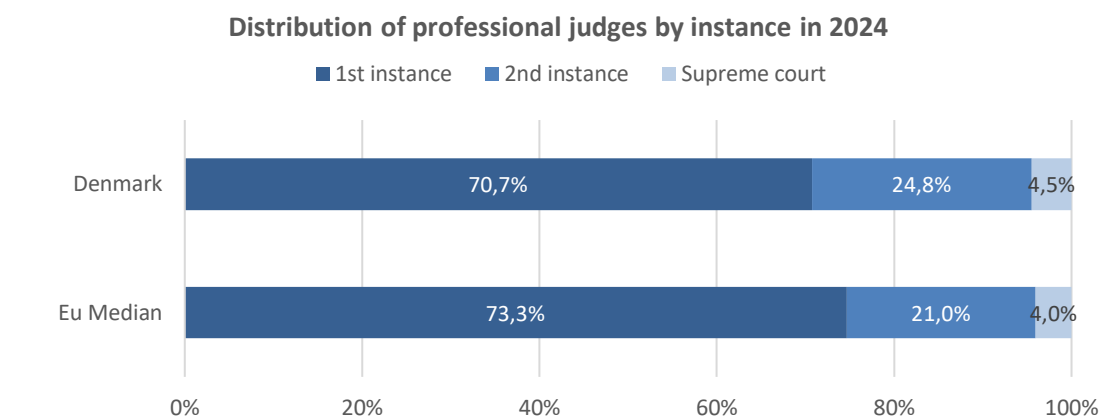


According to the 2024 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Denmark is 403, which is 3,6% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Denmark, there are 6,7 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants).

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 215, which represents 53,3% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 285 are sitting in the first instance courts (of whom 168 are female); 100 are sitting in the second instance courts (of whom 44 are female) and 18 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of whom 3 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, a similar trend is observed in Denmark. However, the predominance of first-instance judges is less pronounced, while the number of judges at the second and third instances is relatively higher.

As regards the distribution male/Female, it has to be specified that the number of female judges exceeds that of male judges only at the first-instance level.

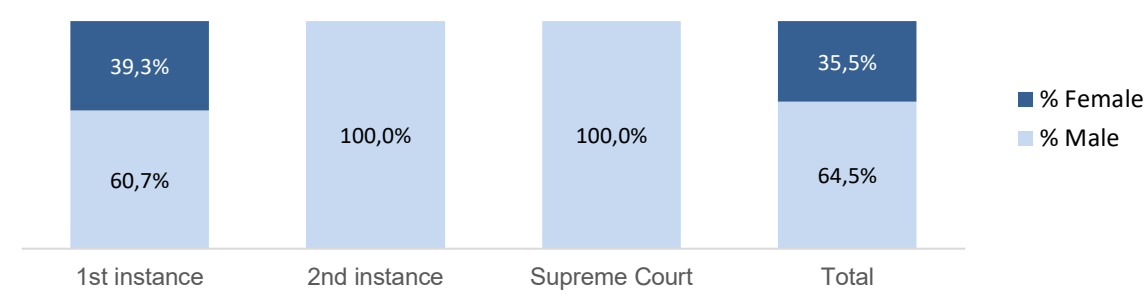

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Denmark

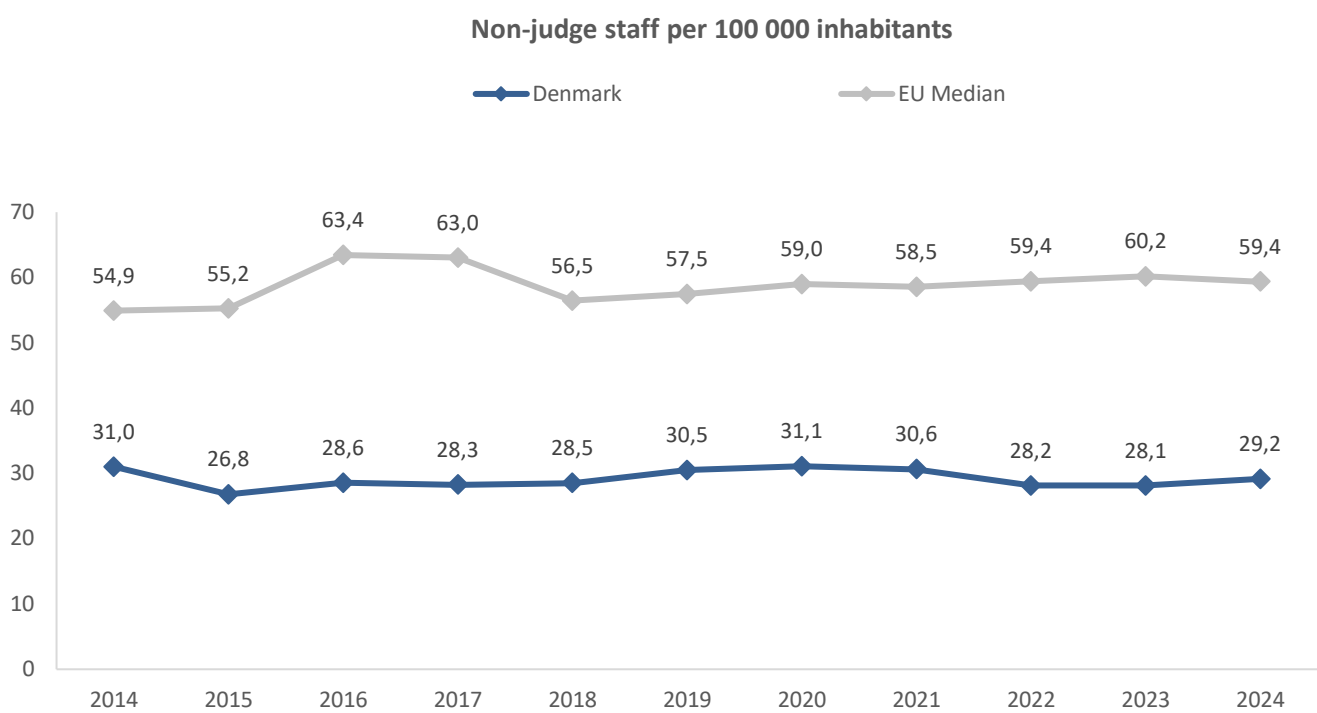


In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 11, which represents 35,5% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 28 are sitting in first instance courts (of whom 11 are female); 2 are sitting in second instance courts (of whom none are female) and 1 male is sitting in the Supreme Court.

In 2024, Denmark has 1 748 non-judge staff (of whom 1 403 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 4,8%.

In 2024, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 28,1 in 2023 to 29,2 in 2024).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 6,6 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2023 to 6,7 in 2024.

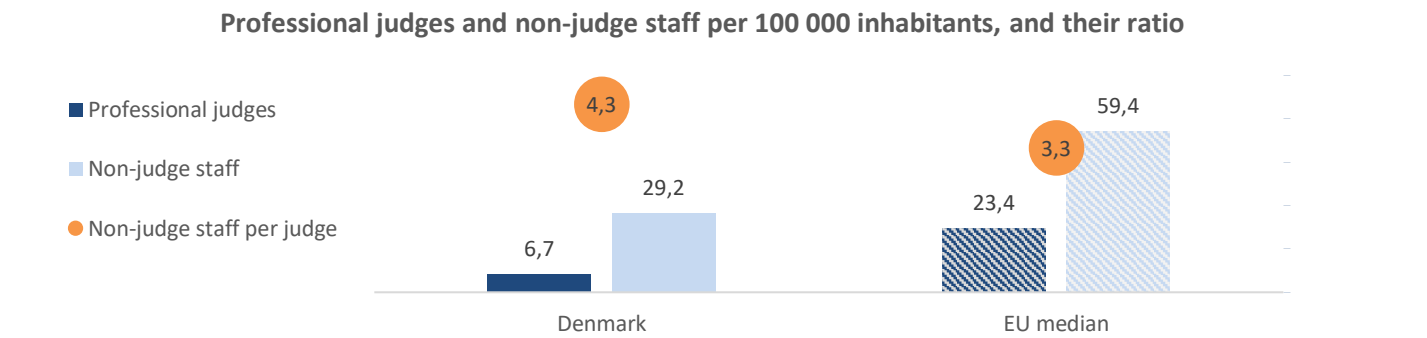
In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:

- 324 Rechtspfleger (or similar bodies) with judicial or quasi-judicial tasks having autonomous competence and whose decisions could be subject to appeal (among which 203 are Female);
- 1 242 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of whom 1 120 are Female);
- 29 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of whom 16 are Female);
- 109 technical staff (of whom 70 are Female);
- 44 other non-judge staff (of whom 34 are Female).

This year Denmark redistributed the non-judge staff between the categories "non-judge staff assisting the judge" and "non-judge staff in charge of administrative tasks". The change was applied to the previous cycles accordingly.

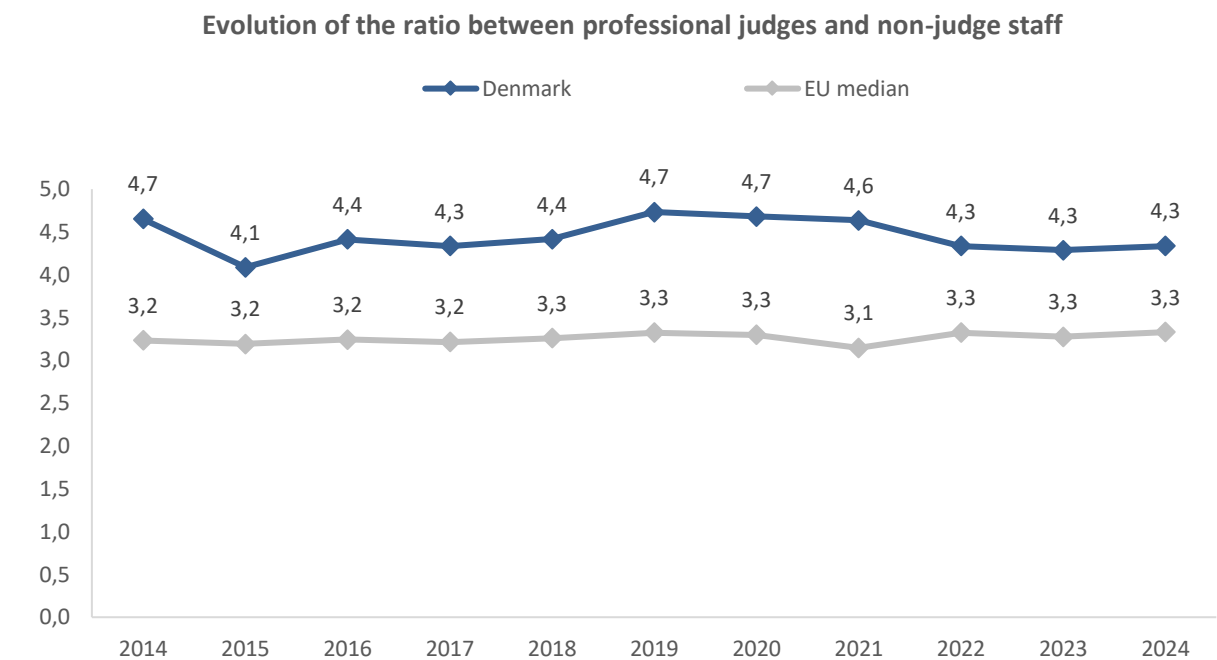


In Denmark, there are 6,7 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 4,3 non-judge staff per judge.

There has been a small increase compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 4,3 non-judge staff per judge.

Evolution of the ratio between professional judges and non-judge staff

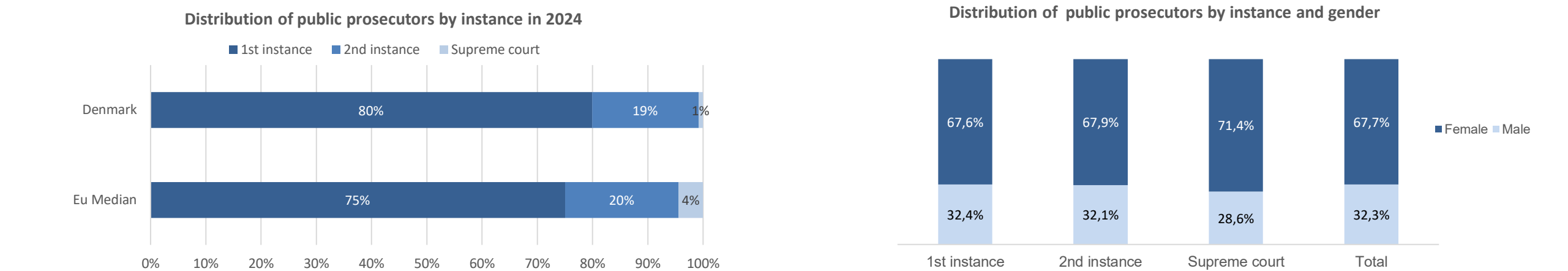

In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 570, which represents 67,7% of the total number of prosecutors.

The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 673 in first instance (of whom 455 are female); 162 are in second instance (of whom 110 are female) and 7 in final instance (of whom 5 are female).

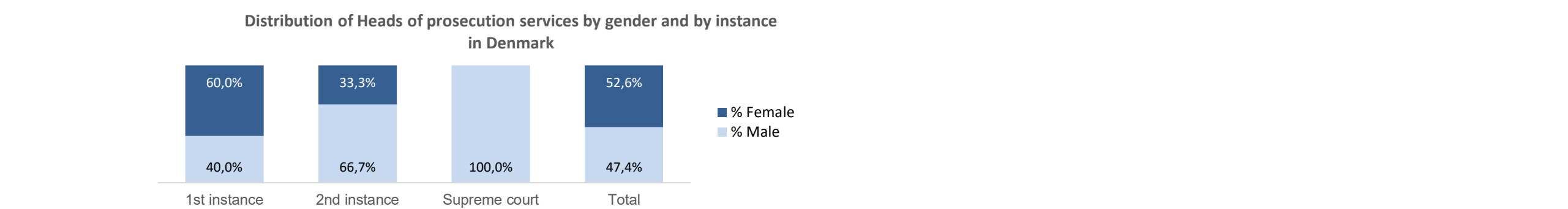
As regards the distribution male/female, it has to be specified that female prosecutors are the majority at all instances (more than 67% at all three instances).

The data on the number of employees in The Danish Prosecution Service and how they are distributed, is registered through a database, Polpai, containing all employees in the Danish Police and The Danish Prosecution Service.

In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution (all instances) is 10, which represents 52,6% of the total number of Heads of prosecution.

The total number of Heads of prosecution is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 15 at first instance level (of whom 9 are female); 3 at second instance level (of whom 1 is female) and 1 at the highest instance level (of whom none are female).

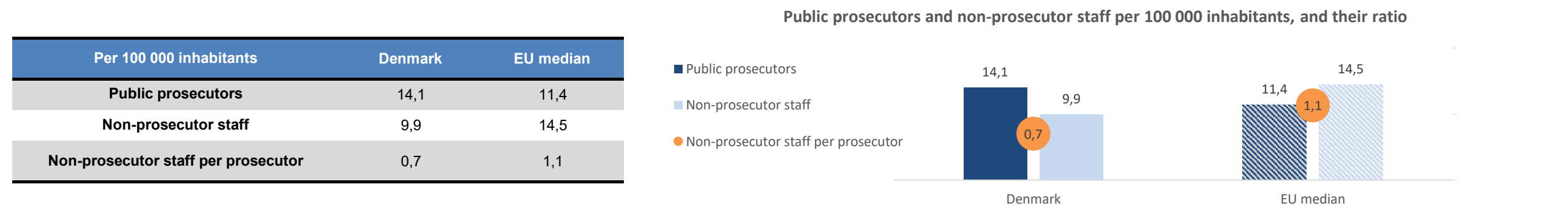
The head of the prosecution offices at the first instance level is the director of the prosecution service in each of the 15 police districts across Denmark, Greenland, and the Faroe Islands. At the second instance level, which includes the Court of Appeal, the heads of prosecution are the leaders of the three state prosecutors' offices: Copenhagen, Viborg, and the State Prosecutor for Special Crime. At the Supreme Court level, the head of the prosecution office is the Director of Public Prosecutions (Rigsadvokaten).

In Denmark, the staff attached to the public prosecution service (non-public prosecutors) are shared between the police and the prosecution offices (first instance level).

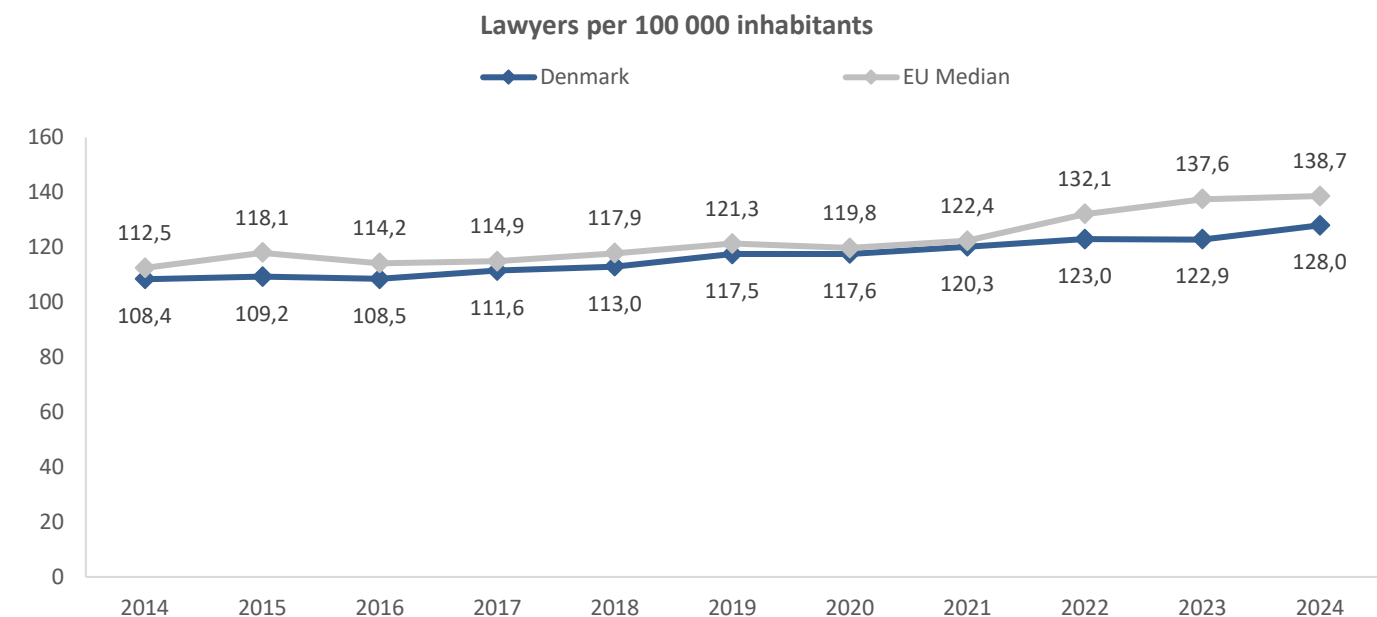
Ratio between non-prosecutor staff and public prosecutors

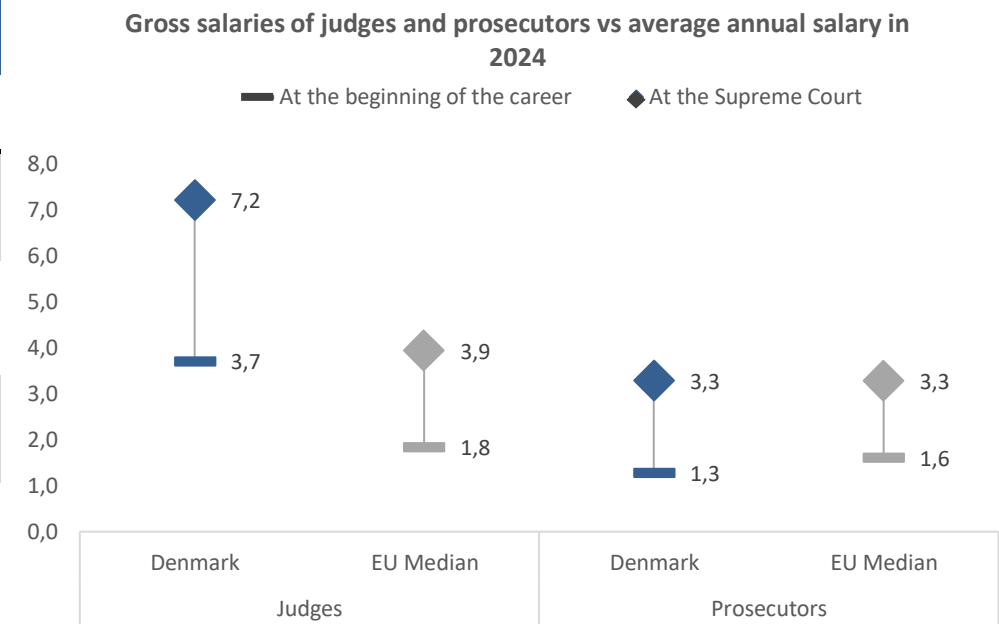
In 2024, there are 7 671 lawyers, which is 5,2% more than in 2023.
There are 3 199 female lawyers which is 42% of the total.

Denmark has 128,0 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is around the EU median of 138,7 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

It should be noted that there is a small discrepancy between the stated total number of lawyers and the number of male and female lawyers, respectively. This is because it is possible to refrain from specifying gender.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 153 676€. According to 2024 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Denmark is 153 676€, which is more than double the EU median of 59 141€. Denmark is the country with maximum absolute gross salary in the EU.

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 3,7 times higher (the EU median is 1,8).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary of a judge is from 54 719€ to 298 911€. Denmark is the country with maximum absolute gross salary of 298 911€ for judges at the highest level.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 106 135€.

In 2024, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Denmark of 52 969€ is around the EU median of 52 922€.

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,3 times higher. (the EU median is 1,6).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 013€ and the maximum is 254 088€. Denmark's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is 44% above the EU median of 94 385€.

The Danish authorities are unable to provide information on the net salary as the Danish tax system is progressive. This means the tax rate is based on income, and municipal taxes vary depending on the municipality. The employment terms for a new public prosecutor are governed by a collective agreement. In addition to the stated salary, a newly appointed public prosecutor receives an annual supplement of 17,388 DKK (approximately 2,330 EUR). This supplement compensates for the prosecutor's participation in the Local Prosecution Service's shift schedule (b-vagt).

The public prosecutor's base salary is determined centrally through the collective agreement and is based on factors such as years of experience, qualifications, job responsibilities, and the specific position. Beyond the base salary, additional locally negotiated supplements may apply, depending on the prosecutor's qualifications and specific responsibilities. Public prosecutors are also entitled to annual salary negotiations.

In Denmark, a deputy prosecutor is placed under the collective agreement for academics, in a seniority-based salary system with an availability allowance. Upon completion of the mandatory basic training of the Prosecution Service, the prosecutor receives an additional allowance. Furthermore, prosecutors in rotation receive a supplement during and after their rotation period.

Subsequently, it is possible through annual salary negotiations to obtain further salary increases, either in the form of qualification allowances or by advancement to a higher job category such as special consultant or senior consultant.

For managerial positions, candidates are placed in a new salary framework specifically determined at state level for managerial staff.

The numbers are based on data from Platina, the case management system of The Danish Prosecution System. Data has been created outside the standard model; specifically developed models are tested but carry higher risk of unidentified errors. Thus, table is associated with considerable uncertainty.

The number of cases with a request for compensation equals the distinct case reference numbers of relevant cases within the Regional State Prosecutors or the State Prosecutor for Special Crimes. The number of cases where compensation has been granted equals the distinct case reference numbers within the Regional State Prosecutors, the State Prosecutor for Special Crimes, or the Director of Public Prosecutions.

The total sum of compensations is calculated as the sum of amounts in cases where requests were fully or partially granted by the Regional State Prosecutors, the State Prosecutor for Special Crimes, or the Director of Public Prosecutions. Cases where a court ordered compensation are not included, as they are not registered in Platina.

In Platina, compensation amounts are registered in a text-field where users may enter non-numeric characters. This creates a risk that some amounts cannot be converted into numerical values and are excluded. Users may also assign keywords (e.g., “arrests,” “pre-trial detentions,” “preliminary charges”) to cases. Since a case may contain multiple keywords but only one compensation amount, it is impossible to determine which interventions the compensation covers or how it is distributed. Keyword-based classification therefore carries significant uncertainty and provides an inaccurate representation of how requests and amounts are distributed across ‘Wrongful arrest/detention’ and ‘Wrongful conviction’.

4. Performance of courts in Denmark (2024 data)

• Efficiency indicators

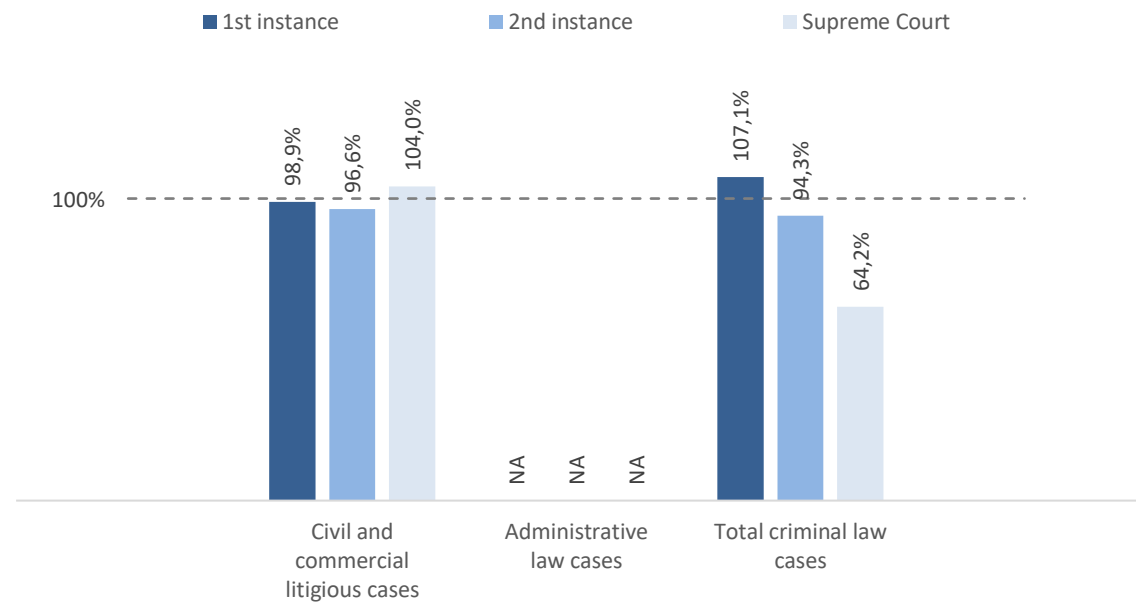

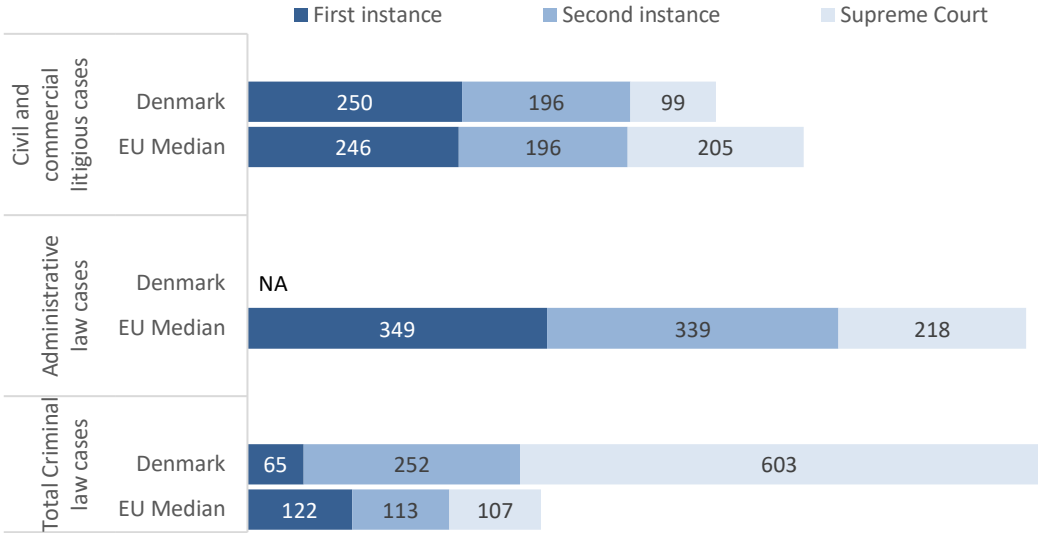

In Denmark, administrative courts do not exist. Instead, administrative cases are initially handled outside the judicial system by court-like bodies, such as appeal boards, committees, or councils. Litigious administrative cases that proceed to court are included in the category of civil and commercial litigious cases.

In 2024, criminal law cases at the first instance in Denmark had the shortest processing time, averaging 65 days, closely aligning with the EU trend for the reference year (122 days). In contrast, civil and commercial litigious cases at the first instance recorded longer processing time in Denmark, averaging 250 days, which is slightly above the EU median for such cases (246 days).

Regarding the Clearance Rate indicator at the first instance level, it remains below the 100% threshold for civil and commercial litigious cases and it is above 100% for criminal law cases.

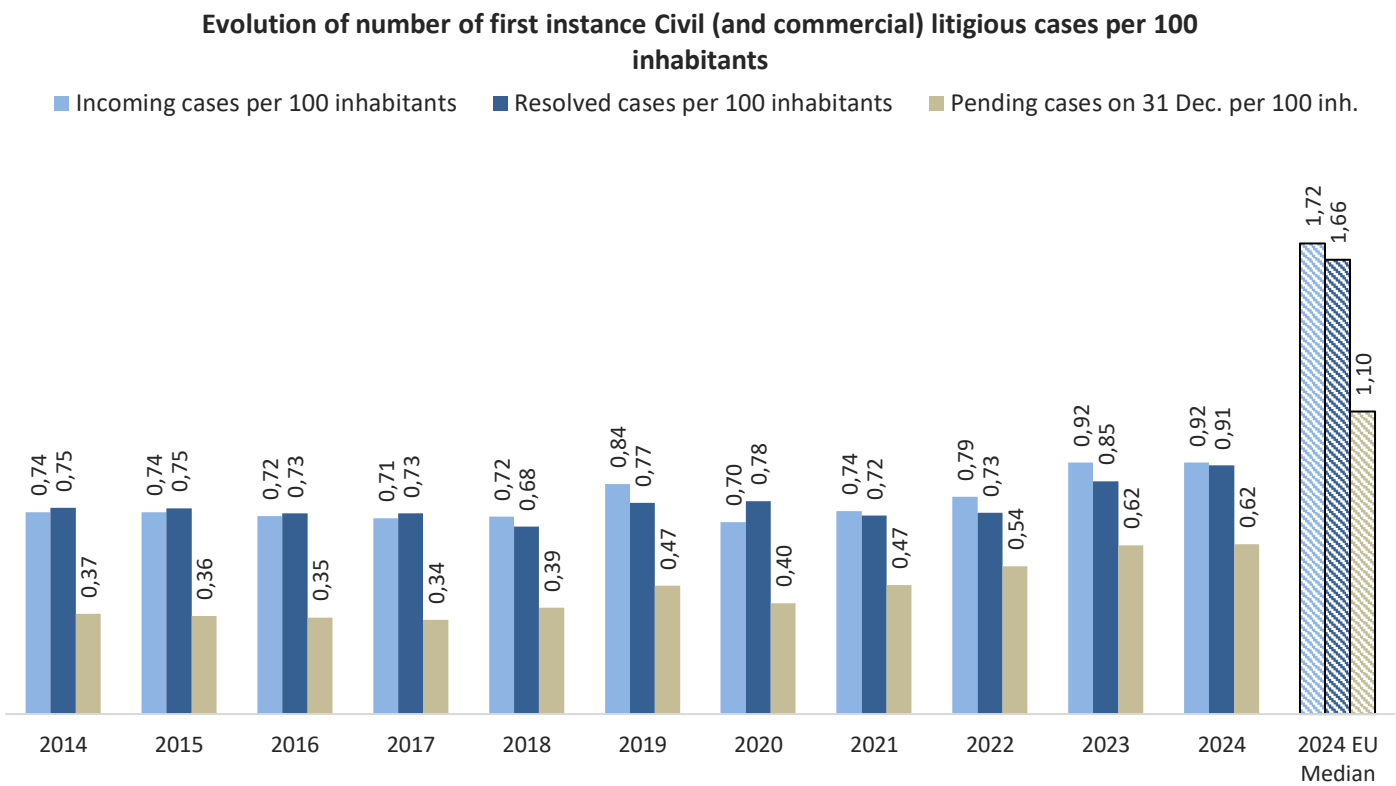
At the second instance level, the Clearance Rate is of 94,3% for criminal law cases and 96,6% for civil and commercial litigious cases.

At the third instance level, the Clearance Rate exceeds 100% only for civil litigious cases. For criminal law cases, however, it remains below the threshold at 62,2%, indicating potential challenges in processing this category of cases.

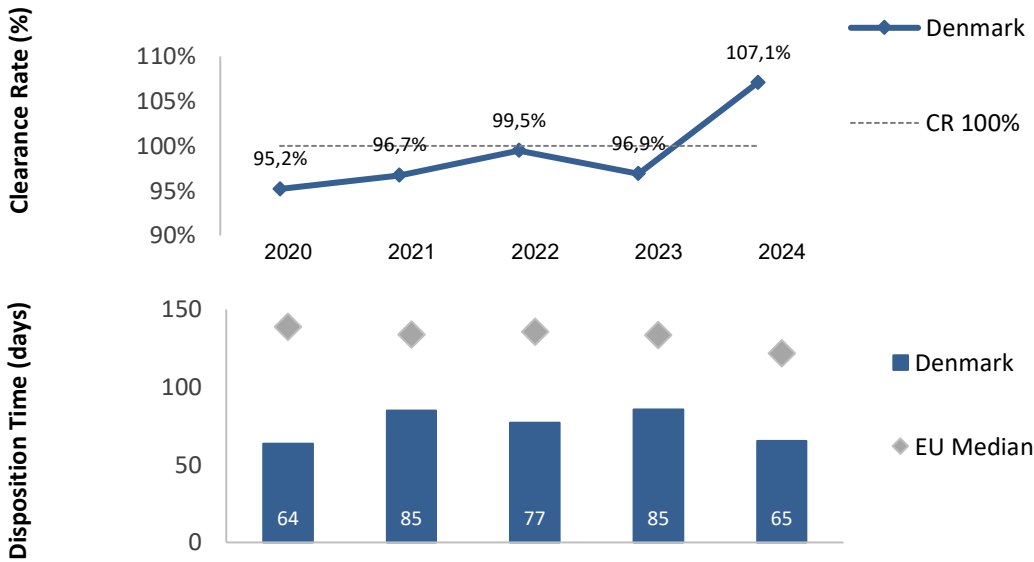

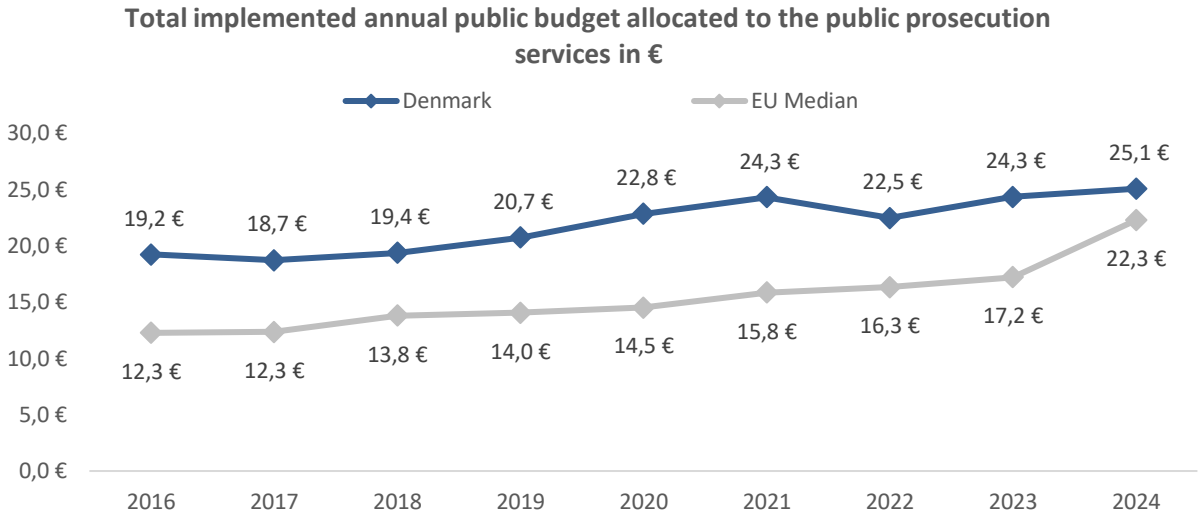

The implemented budget corresponds to the observed expenditures during the reference year. There has moreover been a strengthening of criminal case processing in recent years, especially compared to 2021 with a wish to reduce case processing times and case backlogs in criminal case processing, which has led to an increase in re-source consumption on case processing and prosecution activities

In 2024, there was a balance between budget and consumption. Compared to 2023, consumption has increased by approximately 5 percent. This can primarily be attributed to a continued strong focus on strengthening criminal case processing with a view to reducing case processing times and case backlogs in criminal case processing.

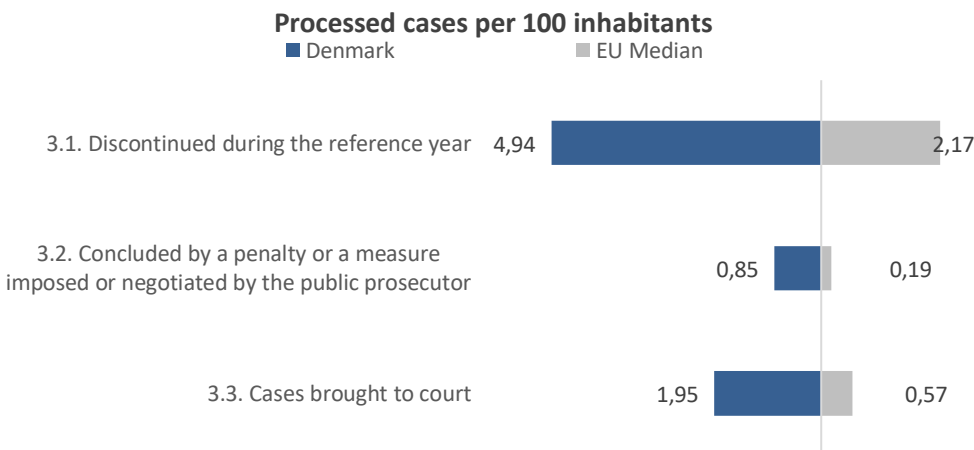
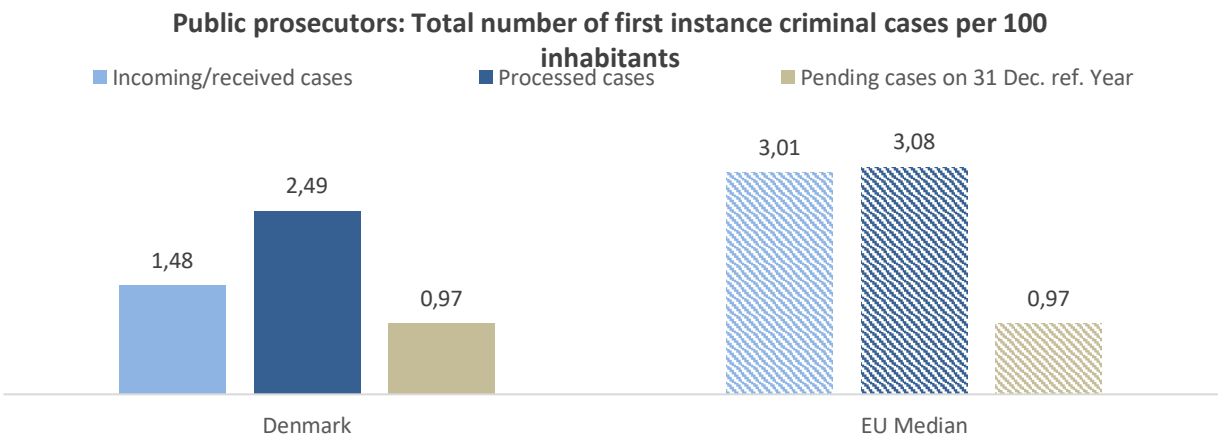
The reason for the discrepancy in closed/finished cases relative to incoming cases is that processed cases include cases that the prosecution service has responsibility for, but that both the police and prosecution service conducts work on – depending on the case. We cannot always distinguish closed/finished cases between the police and prosecution service as they are often archived in police departments regardless of who processed the case.

One case accounts for one crime for each person involved in the crime. If two crimes were committed by three people, there would be six counts of crimes (=cases). Reports of crime might also grow in number of counts as it progresses through the chain of criminal proceedings. The 'owner' of the case is the department that last worked on it.

The term "Reasons of opportunity" entails cases discontinued according to section 721, subsection 1, no. 3-4 of The Danish Administration of Justice Act, which is applied in cases where it is asessed that legal costs and processing time are disproportionate in relation to the significance of the case and its potential sentence.

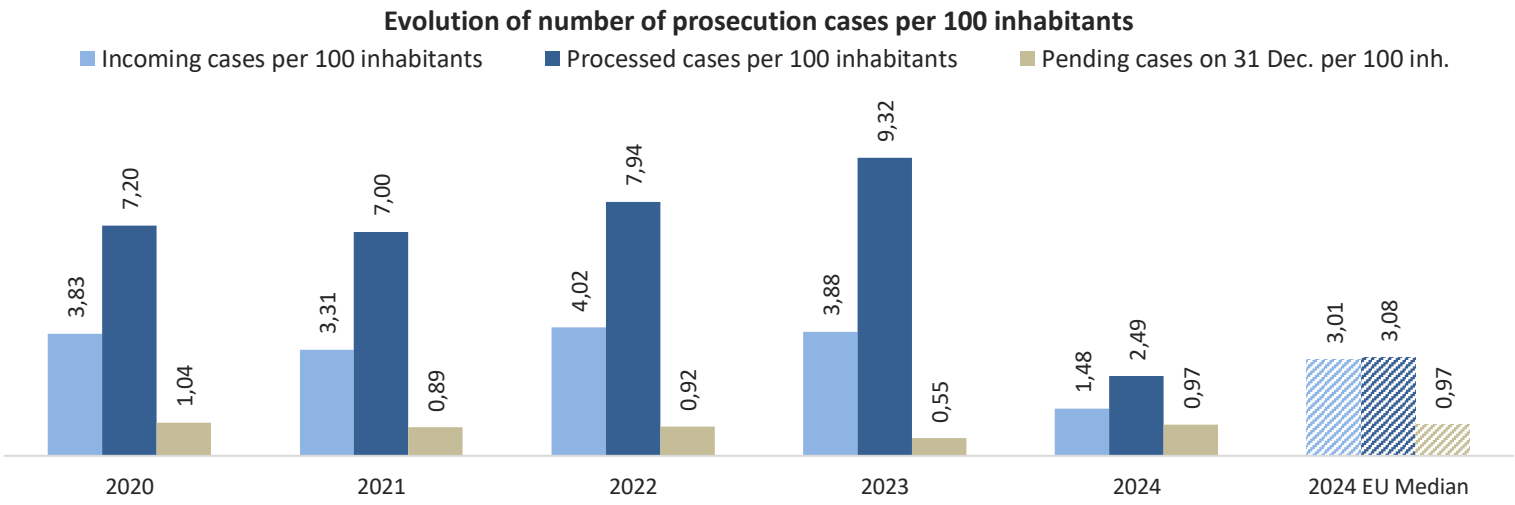
It is correct that there has been an increase of approximately 83% when comparing 2024 to 2023. However, it is important to emphasize that these number cover individual offences rather than court cases they fall under. When comparing the number of court cases, where one or more offences have been discontinued due to reason of opportunity, we only see an ~18% increase. The reason behind this being that in 2024 a number of court cases, with a large number of individual offences, were settled with discontinuation. For instance; in 2024 five court cases had over 100 offences discontinued due to reason of opportunity – while another case had over 500 offences.

Throughout 2024, there has been an increased effort in reducing the backlog of pending indictments, by prioritizing the processing of existing cases in court. Due to this prioritization, there has been a ~40% decrease in the number of pending indictments when comparing the beginning and end of 2024. However, this has also meant fewer resources allocated to initiating new prosecutions. The natural consequence being an increase in the number of pending charges

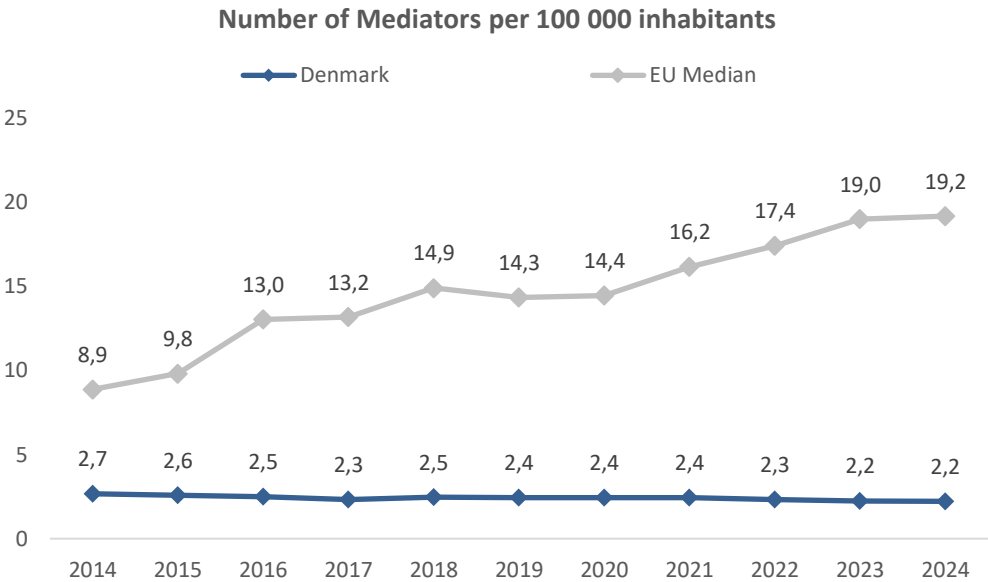

In 2024, there are 133 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 2,2 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation of the number of mediators between 2023 and 2024 is about 0,0%.

To qualify as a court-appointed mediator, a candidate must be a practicing lawyer or judge, have completed a relevant training program in mediation, and be deemed suitable for the role through a comprehensive assessment.

Although court-appointed mediators may also work as lawyers or judges, they act solely as mediators during the mediation process. According to Section 273, Subsection 1, Numbers 1 and 2 of the Administration of Justice Act, judges appointed as mediators are selected by the relevant court president, while lawyers are appointed by the Danish Court Administration after consultation with the two High Courts, the district courts, and the Danish Bar and Law Society.

It is the responsibility of each court president and the Danish Court Administration to assess candidates individually to ensure they possess the necessary qualifications and competencies.

Court-appointed mediators are also required to continuously maintain and develop their skills through ongoing professional education and training to support their mediation expertise.

In 2024, there are 53 notaries which represents 0,9 notaries per 100 000 inhabitants.

The function of a notary is an integral part of the district courts. All 24 district courts have one or more notaries who can verify signatures on important documents or certify that a copy is identical to the original. Notaries can confirm the identity of individuals signing wills or other documents and ensure that the signer understands the implications of creating such a document. They can also witness and confirm that a specific person has signed a particular document.

The number of notaries in Denmark is uncertain. The Danish Court Administration does not have precise information regarding the total number of notaries employed by the Danish Courts or the gender of the notaries. However, it is possible to make an approximate statement of the number of notaries in the courts in 2024 based on of accounting figures and average costs per year. On this basis, it is estimated that in 2024 there have been approx. 53 full-time notary positions in the district courts.

Please note , that ‘notary’ is not an occupation, but a function typically carried out by clerical workers or student assistants at the court. Consequently, at some courts, the function is performed by part-time employees, which means that the number of full-time equivalent positions may not accurately reflect the actual number of individuals serving as notaries

The Criminal and Probate Case Administration Program is aiming to support criminal and probate areas within the Danish courts. Within this program we have introduced the fine case system and the new criminal case system, where the judge approves electronically within the solution instead of signing printed paper.

Recording of court hearings

Civil: Currently 287 courtrooms in 26 courts. Only used sporadically. Requires explicit acceptance from the parties involved.

Administrative: Not relevant in practice. Currently 287 courtrooms in 26 courts.

They share it with the courts for guidance or the Ministry of Justice, but they do not have mandate to regulate the courts based on this data. The Ministry of Justice do not have mandate to monitor and regulate the courts either. They monitor both "satisfaction of the court staff" and "appeal ratio". The reason for the change from previous years is not that it hasn't been monitored, but that there has been a different interpretation of the question previously in regards to the use of "monitor". They do collect the data however they cannot use the data to force action upon the courts.
