


Gross salaries of judges and prosecutors vs average annual salary in 2022





1. Judicial organisation in Denmark (2022 data)


According to 2022 data, the Danish court system is composed of 29 legal entities among which 27 are of general jurisdiction, while two have specialised competence. More precisely, the 27 courts of general jurisdiction encompass 24 District courts intervening at first instance, two High courts dealing with appeals and the Supreme Court.

The Land Registration court and the Maritime and Commercial Court are considered as first instance specialized courts.

In terms of geographic locations, there are 26 courts of first instance and 29 courts in total.








In Denmark, there are only two specialised courts as legal entities which act at first instance. On the one hand, the Maritime and Commercial Court deals with commercial but also, to a greater extent, but not exclusively, with insolvency cases (bankruptcies etc.). On the other hand, the Land Registration Court has been established in 2009.


Juvenile courts do not exist as such. Cases concerning juveniles are within the competence of the District courts where a Juvenile Board ensures special care. It is noteworthy that Family courts are not separate legal entities, but sections of District courts. There is one military court but it is not part of the Danish Courts Administration.









According to 2022 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Denmark is 385, which is -0,8% less than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Denmark, there are 6,5 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is significantly below the EU median of 22,9 judges per 100 000 inhabitants).

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 204, which represents 53,0% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 257 are sitting in the first instance courts (of which 149 are female); 110 are sitting in the second instance courts (of which 51 are female) and 18 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of which 4 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, a similar trend is observed in Denmark. However, the predominance of first instance judges is less pronounced, while second and third instance judges are more numerous.

As regards the distribution Male/Female, it has to be specified that the number of female judges is higher than the number of male judges only at first instance.

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Denmark




In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 10, which represents 31,3% of the total number of court presidents.

In 2022, Denmark has 1 779 non-judge staff (the number of Female non-judge staff is not available). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals a decrease of -1,1%.

In 2022, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has decreased (from 30,6 in 2021 to 30,0 in 2022).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 6,6 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2021 to 6,5 in 2022.

Professional judges and non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio




In Denmark, there are 6,5 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is significantly below the EU median of 22,9 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 4,6 non-judge staff per judge.

There is no difference compared with the previous cycle when this ratio was also at 4,6 non-judge staff per judge.








In this cycle, the total number of female prosecutors (all instances) is 536, which represents 67,0% of the total number of prosecutors.

The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 662 in first instance (of which 446 are female); 131 are in second instance (of which 85 are female) and 7 in final instance (of which 5 are female).

According to comments provided by Denmark, as regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of public prosecutors, it should be mentioned that the number is the actual number of employees in fulltime equivalent as of December 2022. Full-time equivalents are allocated on the 1st of the month, and it is therefore not possible do draw a precise number for 31 December. The number is therefore drawn for 1 December 2022 and scaled up to a full year.



Distribution of Heads of prosecution services by gender and by instance in Denmark




In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution (all instances) is 9, which represents 47,4% of the total number of Heads of prosecution.

The total number of Heads of prosecution is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 15 at first instance level (of which 8 are female); 3 at second instance level (of which 1 are female) and 1 at the highest instance level (none of which is female).

In Denmark, the staff attached to the public prosecution service (non-public prosecutors) are shared between the police and the prosecution offices (first instance level).

The decrease in the number of non-prosecutor staff is due to the fact that, among other things, that police personnel employed by the prosecution were also included before, and due to an organizational change in the public prosecution services.




In 2022, there are 7 290 lawyers, which is 3,2% more than in 2021.

There are 2 880 female lawyers which is 40% of the total.

Denmark has 123,0 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is below the EU median of 132,1 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 26 931€ to a maximum of 140 244€.

According to 2022 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Denmark is 140 244€, which is more than double the EU median of 54 224€. Denmark is the country with the maximum absolute gross salary in the EU.

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 3,2 times higher (the EU median is 1,9).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 53 144€ to 261 648€. Denmark is the country with the maximum absolute gross salary for judges at the highest level.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 609€ to a maximum of 96 084€.

In 2022, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Denmark of 49 137€ is around the EU median of 48 728€ (1% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,1 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 44 880€ and the maximum is 194 005€. Denmark's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is 45% above the EU median of 87 247€.

According to the comments provided by Denmark, the employment of a new public prosecutor is covered by the collective agreement. In addition to the amount stated above, the public prosecutor in the beginning of his/her career is paid an annual supplement of 17.174 kr./€ 2.304, covering the prosecutor's participation in The Local Prosecution Service's shift schedule (b-vagt). The public prosecutor is payed a basic salary, which is decided centrally in the collective agreement, based on years of working experience, qualifications, work assignments and responsibility in the specific position. In addition to the basic salary, the public prosecutor can be paid a locally negotiated supplement. The supplements depend on the qualifications and specific responsibilities in the position as a prosecutor. Public prosecutor are entitled to an annual salary negotiation.

Still according to the comments, the Prosecution Service's Remuneration Policy states a maximum annual salary for the public prosecutors. The maximum annual salary for any Senior Prosecutor/Special Prosecutor, including the prosecutors at The Supreme Court Unit with the Director of Public Prosecutions is 714.000 DKKR/€ 95.829. The maximum annual salary for any Deputy State Prosecutor within the Danish Prosecution Service, including the Deputy State Prosecutor at The Supreme Court Unit with the Director of Public Prosecutions, is 942.000 DKKR/€ 126.430. The amounts are stated without pension as well as without remuneration for participation in shift schedules etc. Civil servants receive 16,8 % of the total salary as a pension contribution, and employees under the collective agreement receive 17,1 %. However, the pension contribution for the availability supplement (rådighedstillæg) is 12,5 %.


The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.



It is important to be noted that, administrative courts do not exist in Denmark and administrative cases are usually dealt outside courts by court-like bodies, like appeal boards, committees, or councils. In Danish courts however, administrative cases do not constitute a specific case category. The number of "administrative law cases", which are litigious, is encompassed in the number of "civil and commercial litigious cases" and they represent 5.5% of incoming cases.

In 2022, criminal law cases appear to be the fastest in Denmark, which is similar to the trend observed in the EU for the reference year. At the same time, third instance civil and commercial litigious cases are the longest in Denmark, and somewhat above the EU median for this type of cases.

At first instance, the Clearance Rate indicator is somewhat below the 100% threshold for civil litigious cases and close to 100% for criminal law cases. The Disposition Time is below the EU median for criminal law cases, but not for civil litigious cases.

At second instance, courts seem to efficiently deal with civil litigious cases as the Clearance rate is above 100%, but seem to face certain challenges in processing criminal law cases, as the Clearance Rate is below the 100% threshold (87,6%). The Disposition Time is below the EU median only for civil litigious cases.


For the third instance, the Clearance Rate indicator is above the 100% threshold for civil litigious cases, but below the 100% threshold for criminal law cases (79,4%), which might imply certain challenges in processing this type of cases. At the same time, the Disposition Time is above the EU median for both types of cases.

In 2022, according to the information provided by Denmark, there was still an aftermath of the unusual situation of the Covid-19 related to the periods with closing down the courts. It has created more pending cases as the prosecution continued to forward new cases to the courts, that could not deal with them. Land registration is the major source of incoming cases with very large figures as it fluctuates a lot depending on interest rates, loan rescheduling etc.



With a Clearance Rate calculated at 92,6% in 2022, Denmark seems to face some difficulties in dealing with its first instance Civil (and commercial) litigious cases.

Between 2021 and 2022, the Clearance Rate has decreased by -5,0 points.


As mentioned above, in Denmark, administrative cases do not constitute a specific case category and are encompassed in the number of "civil and commercial litigious cases".

Administrative courts do not exist in Denmark, therefore administrative cases are initially dealt outside courts by court-like bodies, like appeal boards, committees, or councils. There exist however civil cases related to administrative topics that are encompassed in the number of "civil and commercial litigious cases" and their number is estimated to 2600 in 2022. This is 5,5% of the total number of incoming civil and commercial litigious cases in Denmark.





It has to be highlighted that the number of processed cases includes both cases dismissed by the police and cases dismissed by the public prosecutor. All prosecutors are subject to a recruitment procedure conducted by the Director of Public Prosecutions' Office on behalf of the Ministry of Justice. A prosecutor can serve within the Local Prosecution Service based in one of the 15 the police districts or within the Central Prosecution Service with one of the Regional State Prosecutors' offices or with the Director of Public Prosecutions' Office.

According to the comments provided by Denmark, it is not possible to present the data in the format of the table above (3.1.1. + 3.1.2. + 3.1.4.), as the legal basis in Denmark (sections 721 and 749 of the Administration of Justice Act) is not divided in such subcategories.




