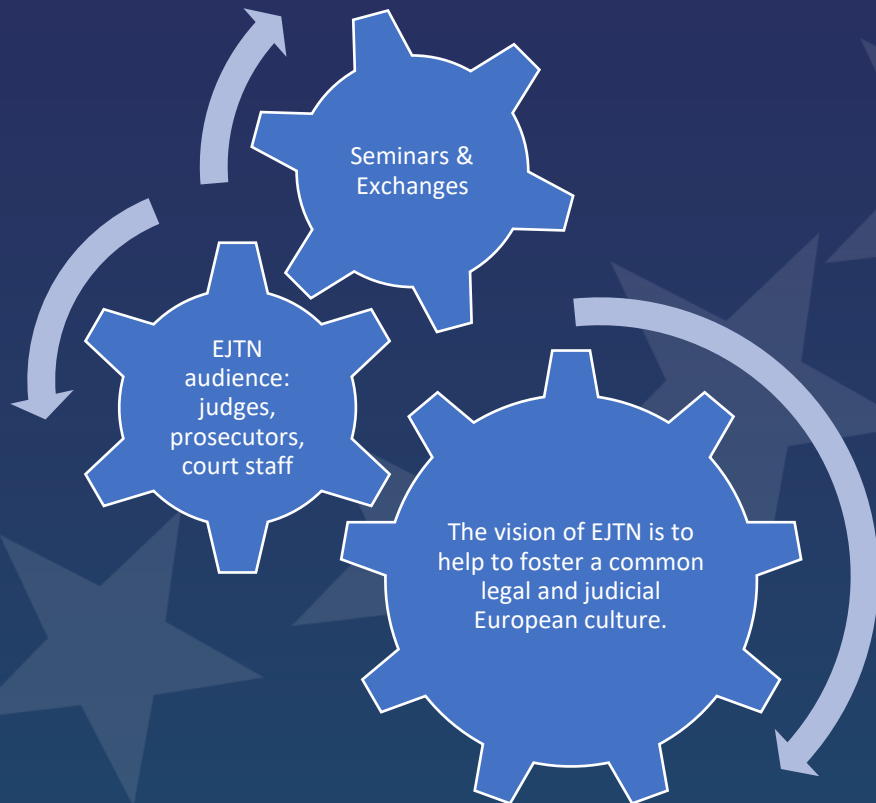

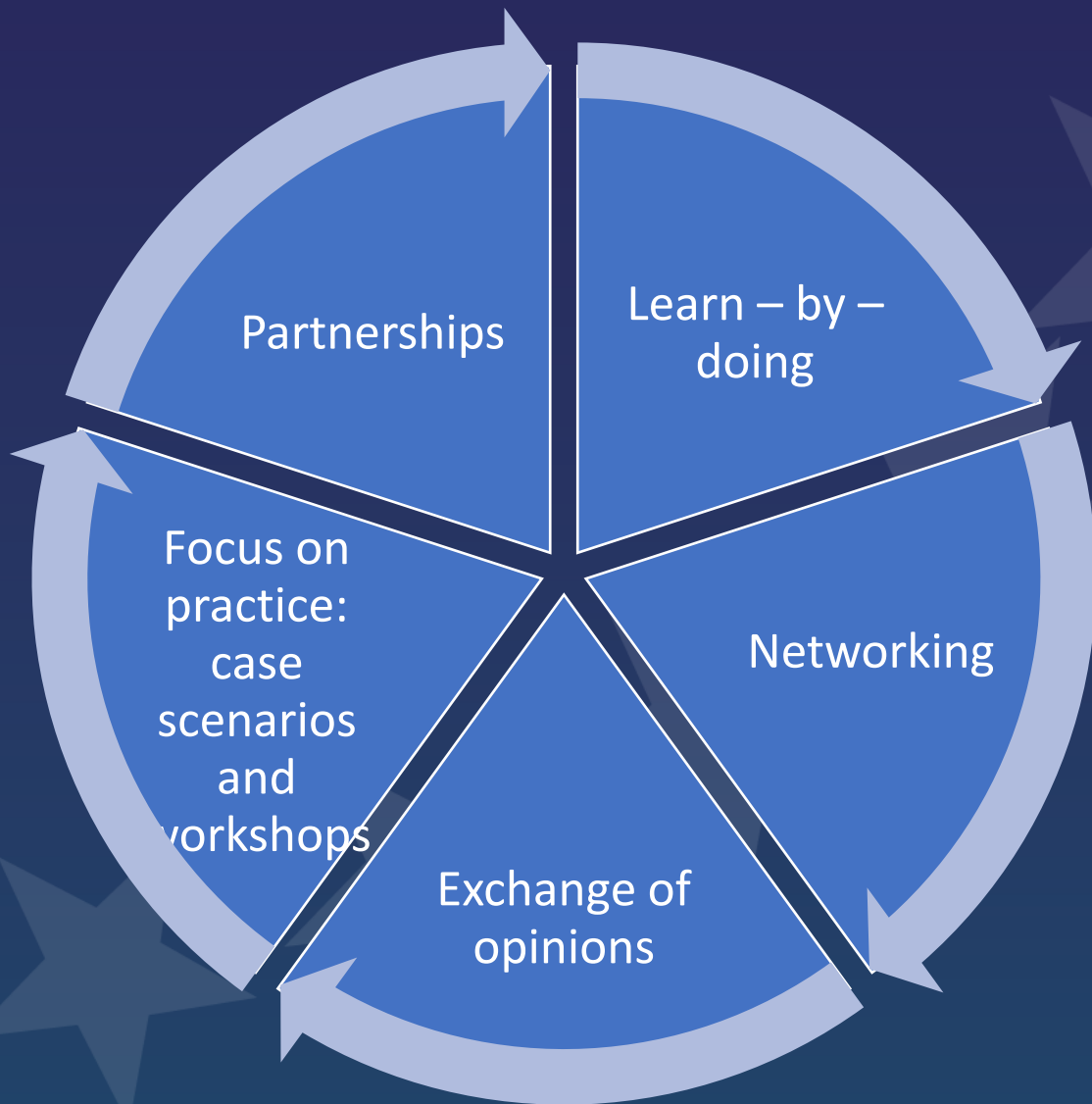

Cooperation with Administrative law Sub-Working Group

- Since 2017: Data Protection Seminar (expert participation)

Cooperation with Human Rights and Fundamental Sub-Working Group

- EJTN-ECtHR Judicial Training - Human Rights for EU Judicial Trainers (2017-2019)
- Human Rights and Access to Justice in the EU (2017 - 2023)

EJTN experts part of expert groups to develop HELP training courses materials (tutors)

- 2015, HELP course on fight against racism, xenophobia
- 2018, HELP course on procedural safeguards and Victims' Rights

Study Visits

- Presentation of HELP Programme during the study-visits to the ECtHR (5 times/year for aprox 40 pax)
