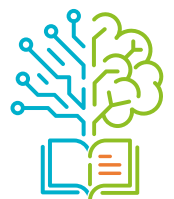

CONCEPT NOTE

Background:

The long-term vision of the Council of Europe's Education Strategy is that all learners will be able to fully exercise their rights as active citizens in democratic societies. Human rights-based digital transformation of education is one of the 3 priority pillars of the strategy.

Digital transformation of education has changed the landscape dramatically in recent years having contributed to enhancing teaching and learning processes, widening access to educational resources, promoting digital literacy, and fostering innovative approaches that improve educational outcomes and equip learners for the digital age.

The Council of Europe has launched the European Year of Digital Citizenship Education 2025 (European Year 2025) to give a new impetus to the development and promotion of digital citizenship education in all member states.

The European Year 2025 stands as a unique opportunity to enhance the visibility and impact of digital citizenship education (DCE) and reaffirm its value. This designated year shall provide a strategic platform for key stakeholders from the public, private and civil sectors to work together, set common goals and share sense-making practices. It will provide a concise yet impactful space for measuring achievements and collectively defining a road map for the future of digital citizenship education. Through streamlined efforts, this initiative is expected to propel DCE forward, ensuring its resilience and effectiveness in the ever-evolving digital landscape.

Objective of the Forum:

The digital environment and technologies provide unprecedented means and opportunities for people to express themselves in different ways, to discover, learn and create, to communicate and socialise, and to actively participate in their communities. But they also bring new challenges.

Amidst the challenges exacerbated by the Covid-19 pandemic and the advent of disruptive technologies like ChatGPT, the challenging issues that digital citizenship education seeks to address such as disinformation, cyberbullying, online hate speech and the misuse of personal data have become more prominent. This underlines the urgent need for increased efforts and investment in DCE to empower learners of all ages to face the challenges created or amplified by digital technologies and harness the benefits to thrive.

The Forum will provide a platform to enhance cross-sector cooperation through tackling current challenges that can be and should be collectively prioritised by digital citizenship education. Plenary sessions and parallel forum talks are projected to reflect on the experiences and progress from the Council of Europe member states, to summarise key ideas and ask questions, to provide expert insights and to foster dialogue between the stakeholders with the prospect of improving the current state. The Forum will also contribute to the development of the road map for the future of digital citizenship education as a holistic approach.
