Evaluation questions

- To what extent has the work of the Conference of INGOs been effective?
- To what extent are the objectives of the Conference of INGOs relevant?
- What is the added value of the interventions of the Conference of INGOs?



Methodology

- ocumentary analysis
- **70** INGO respondents to an online questionnaire
- 57semi-structured interviews
- Responses to open-ended survey by national and international NGOs
- benchmarking including 9 international organisations
- 6 case studies
- The Conference's work has contributed to strengthening interactions between civil society and the Council of Europe; however, level of participation, diversity in membership and resources available need to be enhanced
- Conclusions
- The Conference has deepened interactions between civil society and the Council of Europe; however, dispersion of its activities presents a risk considering the limited resources and shows a need for strategic direction
 - The Conference's activities are consistent with the Council of Europe priorities, but the relevance is difficult to establish without a clear mission statement and focused objectives
- The Conference is a unique consultation mechanism calling the attention of the Council of Europe to civil society's concerns and interests

Recommendations

At strategic level

1. Set out a Mission statement

- 2. Allocate adequate resources to meet priorities and objectives
- Improve the alignment between the Conference's Action plan and the Council of Europe's Programme and Budget

At operational level

- 4. Strengthen online co-operation during and between sessions
- 5. Re-assess eligibility criteria by including geographical and thematic priorities
- 6. Enhance collaboration with national NGOs
- 7. Define a communication strategy to improve visibility
- 8. Conference takes on a more active role for INGOs in PACE
