Overall management response to the evaluation:

The Conference of INGOs ("the Conference") of the Council of Europe is composed of around 300 INGOs with participatory status. It has undergone an important reform in 2020 with the adoption of its new Rules of Procedure on 16 December 2020. With these rules, the Conference is operating under a new more flexible structure and is governed by a new Standing Committee elected in April 2021.

The interaction of the Council of Europe with civil society is not limited to the Conference. The existing framework was presented in the Secretary General's proposals as a follow-up to the Helsinki decisions on civil society (<u>SG/Inf (2020)8</u>) and <u>the subsequent decision</u> of the Ministers' Deputies of 8 July 2020, the implementation of which is currently underway (GR-DEM, 9 September). <u>Subsequent decisions</u> adopted at the 131st session of the Committee of Ministers in Hamburg (21 May 2021) will further guide this process.

The present evaluation is therefore appreciated against this background and the managerial response has been prepared accordingly.

The Secretariat recognises the utility of the recommendations issued as a result of this evaluation with a view to further enhancing the Organisation's activities not only in relation to the Conference but to our work with civil society as a whole. They have all been accepted and the actions envisaged for their implementation are set out in the Action Plan below.
