## Overall management response to the evaluation:

The final project evaluation has been carried out at the request of the regional action "Human Rights Education for Legal Professionals (HELP) in the Western Balkans" implemented within the framework of the EU/CoE Joint Programme "Horizontal Facility for the Western Balkans and Turkey — Phase II. The final evaluation report is comprehensive and provides a systematic and impartial assessment of the project outcomes and impact. The findings and recommendations made by the evaluators highlight the efficiency of the activities, the added value of the project and its real impact in the context of the Western Balkans. The evaluators took into consideration the fact that the Council of Europe is implementing a follow up project and framed under the broader Strategy and Logframe of the HELP Programme and provided a series of useful recommendations for the next phase. Most of these are relevant, and confirm the main project aims of providing e-learning courses on human rights for legal professionals, and to integrate these courses as far as possible into the formal training through bar associations, judicial training academies, and other such institutions. It has to be mentioned though that this follow-up project, funded by the HRTF thanks to outreach efforts of DPC, is of 500,000 EUR when the total budget of the previous EU-funded HELP in the Western Balkans project was of 800,000 EUR.

The report was already presented at the 1<sup>st</sup> Steering Committee meeting of the new phase of the project held in February 2023. The members of the Steering Committee are contact points of the partners/justice training institutions (JTI) and Bar associations (BA) in the project, so-called HELP focal (JTI) and info (BA) points respectively. The hybrid meeting was also attended by a Finish representative (being Finland one of the key contributors of the Human Rights Trust Fund/HRTF that funds the current project) as well as representatives from DG NEAR and DG JUST s as the Horizontal Facility II "HELP in the Western Balkans" action was funded jointly by EU and CoE.

This evaluation report will be also disseminated not only throughout the Justice and Human Rights Training Division (that hosts the HELP Programme) but also to relevant Department colleagues and other DGI and DGII colleagues active in the Western Balkans and that may be interested in the impact of HELP in their respective fields, including for future implementation of their respective cooperation actions using HELP courses.
