

The Council of Europe is organising a conference in Moscow “*Integration processes in Europe and Eurasia: role of the Council of Europe’s conventions*”

The Conference “*Integration processes in Europe and Eurasia: role of the Council of Europe’s conventions*” dedicated to the 20th anniversary of the membership of Russian Federation in the Council of Europe is organised on 2 June 2016 by the Council of Europe and the Institute of Legislation and Comparative Law under the Government of the Russian Federation.

The Conference addresses the legal issues of integration processes in Europe and Eurasia. It may lead to further research on possible ways to avoid conflicts between legal instruments of the Council of Europe and the law of regional integration unions, and thus to preserve the existence of a common denominator in the ongoing integration processes on the continent.

The Conference is attended by renowned experts, representatives of the Council of Europe, the European Union and the Eurasian Economic Union, governmental and judicial authorities, leading scientific and educational institutions.

The opening session includes the interventions of the Director of the Institute of Legislation and Comparative Law under the Government of the Russian Federation - Talia Khabrieva, the Director General, Directorate General Human Rights and Rule of Law of the Council of Europe – Phillipe Boillat, the Deputy Chairman of the State Duma of the Federal Assembly of the Russian Federation - Sergey Zheleznyak, the Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Russian Federation - Alexey Meshkov, a member of the Board (Minister) for main directions of integration and macroeconomics of the Eurasian Economic Commission - Tatiana Valovaya, Chairman of the Federation Council Committee on Constitutional Legislation and State Construction - Andrey Klishas.

The conference is composed of the opening session and two working sessions: “*Human rights dimension of the integration processes in Europe and Eurasia*” and “*Judicial dialogue and interaction: crossed perspectives from Strasbourg, Luxembourg and Minsk*”.
